54th ANNUAL REPORT - 1983

1. INTRODUCTION

This has been a big year for Victorian table tennis. Both on and off the court, we led the way for others to follow.

At the Australian Junior Championships in Sydney, Victoria's teams won all their age teams events - for the second year in a row. As well as this, Victorians played in nine of the ten individual finals, winning all five under 15 events, but we lowered out colours in the finals of the under 17 boys and girls singles, girls doubles and the mixed doubles. Of the 14 players sent to Sydney, 11 of them were ranked in the top 10 of their particular age/sex group. Two players were ranked in both under 15 and under 17 age groups. Full details are contained later in this report.

The Australian Senior Championships held in Perth proved beyond all reasonable doubt that Victoria is the number one State in Australia. We won both mens and womens team events, our players competed in seven out of eight individual finals, won four and were runners-up in six of the finals. Three of the finals were played between Victorian opponents. All eight team members sent to the championships gained a National ranking. Shelley Munday was the recipient of the Victor Barna Award for the outstanding senior player. These championships are covered in more detail later in this report. So, in summing up our big year on the table, Victoria won the six team events, competed in 16 out of 18 individual finals, provided nine Australian Champions and, out of 22 teams members sent to the championships, provided 19 Nationally ranked players.

Every Victorian interested in the game would wish to see a continuation of such classic performances for many years to come.

Talented junior players are coming from everywhere. One only has to pay a visit to the Centre on Saturday afternoon, whether it be a tournament or the normal Saturday afternoon junior coaching session, to see firstly the number of junior players involved, and secondly the level of skill and potential possessed by these youngsters. This is where Victoria and Australia's playing future lies. Just think of an Australian champion of the future who will have been coached in the basics of table tennis at Albert Park one Saturday afternoon. This junior would suffer from a lack of expert tuition and other ancillary benefits if it were not for the fact that Victoria is winning off the table as well.

Apart from the successes at the National Championships the following players represented Australia at the Commonwealth Championships in Kuala Lumpur, and the World Championships in Tokyo:

Men - Glenn Tepper, Robert Tuckett, Tommy Danielsson (N.P.C.)
Women - Nadia Bisiach

Following the return of Mrs. Joan Guggenheim to her previous clerical duties, the VTTA appointed Mr. Rod Lindroth to replace Mrs. Guggenheim as Development Officer. The experience gained by Mrs. Guggenheim in this position has proved invaluable in the introduction of Mr. Lindroth to his new position, and we thank Mrs. Guggenheim for her services over six years in the position.

Mr. Lindroth had previously held a similar position with the Victorian Rugby Union, and he has brought a new outlook to the VTTA. He has already visited several country and metropolitan affiliated associations, helped introduce a business-persons pennant, and commenced several other projects which should benefit table tennis in the future.

The Metropolitan Schools Championship, 'Tabten', is now causing one of the most pleasant of problems - it has become too big! This year 50 schools entered 221 teams which competed in 37 grades, and 40 tables were just not enough! It is problems like this that we would like to see more of.

The Association Coach, Igor Klaf, under the guidance of our Development Officer was able to reach more children and help spread table tennis in this area. Igor has worked extremely hard this year on many facets of table tennis in Victoria, and his dedication to the game undoubtedly helped bring about the outstanding results at the National Championships.

Unfortunately, Igor has transferred to the USA and so his expertise will be lost to us. The VTTA will appoint a successor to Igor in the very near future.

In 1984 Victoria will send teams to the Australian Junior Championships in Perth, which will be conducted in May.

In late September Melbourne will stage the first Australian Closed Championships and this will be followed by the staging of the Australian Open Championships. The best players in Australia will compete at Albert Park over the duration of these championships.

2. MANAGEMENT

2.1 EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE

Our other new face is Karol Javor. Karol will be known to most people around the Table Tennis Centre as a Master-Coach, and statistician (Karol is records officer for the ATTA). Karol has had a long association with table tennis and will bring a new outlook to the Committee.

Two Executive Committee members decided not to stand for re-election - Mrs. Val Gay from Geelong, and after almost 50 years of service to table tennis, Mr. Alan Cleaves decided to give up his active interest in table tennis in favour of genealogy. We wish both Val and Alan the best of luck and sincerely thank them for their efforts over the years.

Due to business and personal reasons Mr. Herman Rockefeller tendered his resignation from his position as Vice-President. We thank Herman for his work in the past and wish him well for the future.

Mrs. Rosario was granted leave of absence for four months to coincide with her long-service leave, and Messrs. Tuckett, Tabone and Haycraft were given leave of absence to attend the World Championships in Tokyo, Japan, in May.

2.2 TABLE TENNIS CENTRE OF VICTORIA

1983 saw an increase in revenue of the Centre even though the VTTA metropolitan pennant teams showed a slight decline. There was also an increase in revenue from the amusement machines in the Centre.

Victorian Public Service TTA, Victorian Railways Institute TTA and Eastern Suburbs TTA continued to use the Centre's facilities. We welcome the newly formed Combined Hospitals TTA to the Centre. The Australian Public Service Championships were also conducted at the Centre.

The inaugural National League conducted their finals at the Centre, and Coburg and Super Action Saints Clubs played the majority of their National League home matches at the Centre.

This year saw an inaugural Sports City Table Tennis Business Pennant competition sponsored by the Melbourne City Council. This was conducted at the Centre on alternate Wednesdays between 5.30pm and 7.00pm, and over 30 teams competed.

Mr. Leon Lau continued with his excellent management of the combined snack bar and table tennis equipment shop. The VTTA certainly appreciates his excellent service to our patrons and he is continually called upon by the VTTA to cater for our various tournaments and training camps.

A study was commissioned by the State Government to advise them on the feasibility of redeveloping the sports centres at Albert Park. The report recommends, among other things, that the Table Tennis Centre be demolished and replaced. We now await a decision on the implementation of the plan.

2.2.1 STAFF

In order to reduce expenditure the Executive Committee decided that the VTTA staff should be reduced to two full-time members. This meant that our regular part-time worker, Mrs. Judy Dougall, was no longer required. Our thanks go to Mrs. Dougall for her efforts over the years.

Once again, Mrs. Joan Guggenheim and Mrs. Chris Moore conducted the daily activities of the VTTA office, and we wish to thank them both for their effort in this area.

As reported elsewhere, Mr. Rod Lindroth joined the staff as Development Officer.

2.2.2 RECEPTIONISTS

We had another good year with our receptionists - Rosanne, Dorothy and Suzy. We were sorry to lose Lorraine, Gay, Carol, Charles and Robert. We gained the following new faces - Kerrie, Gina, Vanessa, Vicki and Richard.

As usual, our receptionists have given prompt service to our patrons in a pleasant and efficient manner. Also due to the re-organisation of our full-time staff, the receptionists have been allocated extra duties to perform.

2.3 AFFILIATED ASSOCIATIONS

1983 saw an overall loss of ten associations from 1982. The country associations totalled 47 (1983 - 56) - we lost Ararat, Birchip, Echuca, Kyabram, Lakes Entrance, Phillip Island, Smythesdale, Stawell, Wahgunyah-Corowa, Warracknabeal, Whittlesea, Wonthaggi and Wycheproof, but gained Mt. Beauty, Rochester, Terang and Tullaroop.

The metropolitan associations totalled 15 (1982 - 16) - we lost Northern Suburbs (formerly Essendon & Broadmeadows Churches Association) and Monash University, but welcomed Combined Hospitals Association. The two South Australian bordertowns of Mt. Gambier and Narracorte did not affiliate this year.

The three major schools organisations affiliated once again and they make a major contribution to our participation in school sport.

2.4 INTERNATIONAL EVENTS

The main events in 1983 in which Australia participated were the Commonwealth Championships in Kuala Lumpur and the World Championships in Tokyo. Victorian players selected were Bob Tuckett, Glenn Tepper and Nadia Bisiach, whilst Angelo Tabone was accepted by the Japanese TTA as an official umpire.

The Australian teams found matches difficult to win - the Mens team finished in 7th place in the Commonwealth and 18th in the World, whilst the Women finished at No.9 in the Commonwealth, but maintained their position in the Second Division in the Worlds by finishing 29th. Bob Tuckett obtained No.15 Commonwealth ranking.

The ITTF Congress elected Len Haycraft as Vice President for Oceania for a two year term, and as a member of the Rules Committee, and selected Nuremburg, Germany, as the venue for the next meeting of the Council in May 1984.

Substantial changes to the rules were approved by Congress - the main change being a requirement that, as from 1/1/84, in World, Continental and Open International Championships, the surfaces of the two sides of the racket, whether used for striking the ball or not, and whether the two surfaces are the same or not, are to be of clearly different colours. The ATTA subsequently decided to introduce this rule as from 1/1/84 to the 1st Grade of Pennant Competition in each State, and to all grades of competitive play as from 1/1/85.

The first Asian Junior Championships will be held in Bahrain from December 14 - 23, and Victorian country players, Paul Tonkin and Kerri Tepper, have been selected in the teams, which will be managed by Angelo Tabone - who will also be Captain/Coach of the boys team.

An invitation was received from the Chinese TTA for Australia to enter two men in the First Asian Cup, which was played in Wuxi City, China, from October 8 - 11. Through the generosity of the Australia-China Council air fares were made available for these players, and Victorians Bob Tuckett and Tommy Danielsson were selected and, though neither player reached the second round, reported the tournament a great success, and the hospitality overwhelming.

Tommy Danielsson and National Champion, Gary Haberl, have been selected to play in an elimination tournament at Hutt Valley in New Zealand on March 17, 1984, to decide the representative for Oceania to compete in the World Cup. The New Zealand players chosen are Barry Griffiths and Peter Jackson.

The Pakistan TTA have advised that the next Asian Championships will be held in Islamabad from 17 - 25 September, 1984, and Australia is likely to send a Mens and Womens team, plus a Manager and two team Captains/Coaches.

Another important event listed for 1984 is the Second World Championships for Veterans (40 and over) which will be held in Helsinki, Finland, from 6 - 10 June.

Prospective tours of Australia in year 1984 which are being negotiated are in August, by two leading Japanese men players, and a Chinese 'Sports Spectacular' to be hosted by the Australia-China Council in September.

2.5 COACHING

Coaching within the senior and junior ranks is widespread throughout Victoria. Several associations conduct their own coaching programs, and the VTTA is working towards ensuring that coaches who have been accredited with the ATTA Coaching Level be utilised for these programs.

The coaching programs that are conducted directly by the VTTA are - adult sessions, Friday night and Sunday morning; and a junior session on Saturday afternoon.

I.Klaf, the Association coach has been heavily involved in preparing our players through these sessions of squad and team practice to compete at National and International level.

The result of our intensive training programs can be seen in the overwhelming success Victoria has had in the Senior and Junior National Championships.

2.5.1 COACHING IN SCHOOLS

Coaching in schools has escalated in the past few years and this is due mainly to the fact that we are able to use our Association Coach in schools on a regular basis. Besides this, school coaching is also catered for at the Albert Park Centre.

Thirtysix metropolitan schools received coaching while a further 12 schools were included in country coaching visits. During these sessions the teachers are also taught the basic techniques of coaching. I.Klaf conducted two in-service Education Seminars for Physical Education Teachers during the year.

2.5.2 COACHING CAMPS

Five junior camps were held during the year for players of various playing abilities. The first was held in January and was made up of players recommended by their respective affiliated associations. The second was made up of invited players having good potential. The third and fourth camps were confined to players who were selected to play for Victoria in the Australian Championships.

This year saw the first camp for country juniors who were selected by their respective associations. It was a good exercise from our point of view because we were able to observe up and coming juniors and to offer them further opportunities to improve. This camp, with 40 juniors, proved a tremendous success.

2.5.3 TRAINING SQUADS

Senior and junior squad and team training sessions are an important part of our calendar and as such are commenced for players selected by the senior and junior selectors as soon as is reasonably possible. Every effort is made to provide these players with the opportunity to be exposed to various conditions of play. The video recorder which is operated by the Table Tennis Coaches Association of Victoria, is being extensively used at all training sessions.

All coaching sessions carried out directly by the VTTA are manned solely by members of the TTCAV. Besides coaching in the metropolitan areas these coaches go to the country associations and conduct junior and senior coaching sessions. The VTTA is grateful to the TTCAV for providing the necessary expertise.

2.5.4 TABLE TENNIS COACHES ASSOCIATION OF VICTORIA

Pre-Level 1 courses were held with 10 successful coaches. These courses are conducted by Level 1 and Level 2 coaches, as it one of the many requirements for upgrading to the next level. Besides, lectures and seminars are also organised to help coaches with every facet of coaching.

This Association has built up a library of video equipment and has used the equipment at training sessions and to tape important matches.

The Victorian register on the ATTA Accreditation Scheme has 1 Master Coach, 4 Level 3, 3 Level 2 and 27 Level 1 coaches.

2.5.5 THE NATIONAL COACHING COMMITTEE

The National Coaching Committee, which is made up of the Coaching Co-ordinators of each of the six States, met in August in Victoria.

The various items that were discussed were Budget Priorities, National Accreditation Scheme, requirements of a National Director of Coaching, Australian Institute of Sport (submission requesting admission), forthcoming National Junior and Under 21 Camps, and the Acton Awards.

Following the resignation of Mr. Mike Johns the NDC, the position has been filled, on a part-time basis, by Ron Moule of South Australia.

2.6 UMPIRES LEAGUE

The Victorian Table Tennis Umpires League has had another active year. Not only have they supervised draws and provided referees and umpires for all major tournaments and VTTA Pennants, but this year they had to provide officials for all the Victorian National League matches. Another highlight of the year was the televised exhibition match at Mornington where a professional presentation undoubtedly contributed to enhancing the game's reputation in Victoria.

Individual members have travelled extensively in the interests of table tennis. In particular, Mr. Angelo Tabone who officiated at both the Worlds and Commonwealth Championships, and Fran and Ron Keyhoe to the Australian Championships where Ron took his National Umpires examination.

Courses for umpires were held at Leongatha, Croydon and the VTTA Centre by Ruth Singer, Peter Ward and Richard Hutson.

During the year five probationary State Umpires were appointed and two passed their probationary period.

With the Australian Championships being held in Melbourne in 1984 the umpires have already supplemented their membership with these courses, and in addition, have already prepared most umpires for the new rule changes which will come into force in 1984.

2.7 AUSTRALIAN TABLE TENNIS ASSOCIATION

2.7.1 FINANCIAL

The Treasurer reported a deficit of \$2828 for the year 1982-83. The Balance Sheet at June 30, 1983, showed accumulated funds of \$6109. Federal Government grants totalled \$42,000 and sponsorships \$3241, in a total income of \$81,766.

Principal items of expenditure were salary, travel and other expenses of the National Director of Coaching, which totalled \$30,138. The Newsletter, less advertising, cost \$8674, the National Junior Training Camp \$3023, and the General Personal Meeting, less travel levy paid by States, \$233.

Participation in the 1982 Commonwealth Games, the 1982 Commonwealth Table Tennis Games Demonstration, the 1982 Oceania Championships, and the 1983 Commonwealth and World Table Tennis Championships totalled \$20,354.

The General Levy of \$17,400 was set as follows:- Victoria \$6000, NSW \$3300, Queensland \$3300, South Australia \$3300, Tasmania \$750 and West Australia \$750.

At the 1983 GPM the following items were carried:-

1. That the present method of fixing the ATTA levy be replaced by an individual player registration fee throughout Australia, collected by each State body.
2. That the Player Registration Fee be fixed by the ATTA Council from time to time.
3. That the Player Registration Fee registers a player for a calendar year - 1 January - 31 December.
4. That the Player Registration Fee be collected by States and paid by each State to the ATTA not later than 30 June each year, then 30 September and 31 December, as further players become registered.
5. That the Player Registration Fee be paid by all players playing in any senior pennant competition, i.e. junior and school competitions are exempt.
6. That the Player Registration Fee be \$2 for 1984.

The following motion submitted by Victoria 'that no State pay less than in 1982-83' lapsed for want of a seconder.

2.7.2 PROCEDURAL CHANGES

1. The Classified Players fee was abolished.
2. A system of State nominations for the individual events, commencing with the 1984 Championships, was carried.
3. Commencing in 1984 the 1st Australian Veterans Championships will be conducted in Hobart, Tasmania, from 19 - 23 November. This will include Mens and Womens Teams events and individual events, singles and doubles, for men and women players over 40 years. Also there will be mens and womens singles events for players over 50, 60 and 70 years.
4. An Australian Closed Mens and Womens Singles Championship will be conducted in Melbourne on 29 - 30 September, 1984, prior to the Australian Open Championships in Melbourne.
5. Commencing in 1985 in Hobart the Australian Junior and Senior Championships will be held in the same State and same City, and on consecutive weeks, with the Junior Championships being conducted first.
6. The ATTA will apply for membership of the Australian National Olympic Committee as soon as four States are accepted as members of their State Olympic Committee.
7. At future Australian Championships 'Players Numbers' for identification purposes must be provided by the home state.
8. Effective from 1/1/84 all members of the Umpires Committee and all accredited Coaches, must be members of the ATTA through a State Association.

2.7.4 ATTA COUNCIL

In March 1983 Victoria appointed Mr.A.Tabone as its Delegate, to replace Mr.A.Cleaves who had retired.

During the year NSW replaced its Delegate, Miss N.Callinan, with Mr.K.Bowler.

3.4 COUNTRY EVENTS

3.4.1 VICTORIAN COUNTRY CHAMPIONSHIPS

The 32nd Championships were conducted from June 11 - 13, 1983. Three venues were utilised to cater for 119 teams - 94 mens, 25 womens - 13 less than 1982 - from 30 associations. The individual events attracted 97 players in 15 events.

Five teams, 4 men and 1 women's team, withdrew and two events were cancelled due to insufficient entries.

Sponsorship was received from The Weekly Times, Acton Manufacturing Co., Chabek Pty.Ltd., City Park Motel, and floral/fernery were once again provided by courtesy of the ANZ Bank. We thank all those companies for their support.

A pleasing feature was the number of teams (13) entered by Shepparton which was almost as big as the large associations such as Geelong and Ballarat, who fielded 15 and 14 teams respectively. A disappointing feature was the fall off in 'A' grade entries by Geelong and Ballarat in both men and womens teams. The womens D1 Peg Curtis Shield was not competed for in 1983.

Geelong's playing strength was shown by their winning the Mens A Grade Shield and providing both finalists in the Mens Singles. Eaglehawk/Bendigo took out three mens shields - B2, C2 and E2. Ballarat won three shields - C1, D3 and Womens D3.

The Horsham/Shepparton combination won the Womens A Grade Shield for the third time in succession.

Sports bags, donated by Chabek Pty.Ltd., were presented to Michael Absalom of Camperdown and Nicole Freeland of Geelong as the most promising players and as encouragement awards. TSP balls were used for these Championships.

Despite the long drought and economic recessions, these Championships continue to maintain a high entry, and be a focal point for all areas of the country table tennis fraternity to meet in competition and a social atmosphere.

4.3.5 TABTEN - SCHOOLS TEAMS CHAMPIONSHIPS

M.Johns won the Western Australian Open Mens Singles from T.Masel, and C.Maisey took the Womens Singles against C.Boyse. The two singles winners paired to win the Mixed Doubles, and C.Maisey made it three by winning the Womens Doubles with M.Padley.

Shelley Munday and Glenn Tepper entered the City of Adelaide Tournament and were successful in winning their respective singles events. With M.Johns, Tepper won the Mens Doubles and Shelley Munday the Mixed Doubles.

Eddie Kasser participated in New Zealand in their National Championships and won the Under 16 Boys Singles, Doubles and Mixed.

Victorian players did not take part in many interstate championships this year, but they performed very well on the few occasions when they did.

6. ADMINISTRATION REVIEW

This Committee has been active during 1983 and the situation is now approaching which will culminate in firm proposals to all metropolitan pennant clubs..

The two main facets this year were the adoption of a 'model' constitution drawn up by Mr.John Strantzen and approved by the Executive Committee, and the forming of a steering committee to form a Melbourne Table Tennis Association, and take the proposals back to the VITA Executive Committee. The time has now arisen when the pennant clubs have to make the decision to be a separate entity or continue to be an adjunct of the VTTA.

There are an innumerable number of individuals who work tirelessly for the game. People in associations, clubs, committees, referees, coaches, umpires, and of course the players - all combine together to work for, enjoy, and promote table tennis.

Without all of these individuals we would not be here. Thanks very much to everyone for their efforts throughout the year.

8. ADDENDUM

1983 saw marked changes in the administration of Table Tennis, both at the Executive and Staff levels. After 17 years service Alan Cleaves, some time Chairman of Selectors and Affiliated Associations Sub-committee, Honorary Secretary and ATTA Delegate decided to retire. His affiliated association duties have been taken over by Mr. Peter Mascall and Mr. Alby Walker, our new ATTA Delegate is Mr. Angelo Tabone, and it is pleasing to report that they filled these arduous positions most capably. We gained two new committee members, Mrs. Karen Danielsson and Mr. K. Javor and they settled into their duties, but lost Mrs. Val Gay and Mr. Herman Rockefeller.

The Association took a major step when it appointed Mr. Rod Lindroth as full-time Development Officer to allow Mrs. Guggenheim to return to full time office duties. The benefits of these changes are now becoming apparent and will be of increasing value to the VTTA in 1984.

The top players, both senior and junior, excelled in their various representative spheres, and this bodes well for the future of the sport. Much of the credit for this success must go to our Association Coach, Mr. Igor Klaf, and we will miss his efforts in this area in 1984 as he has transferred to the U.S.A.

Perhaps the most important decision to be taken for many years has been to make a radical change in affiliation of associations/clubs and registration of players. There seems certain to be some problems in the early stages, but the overall result should see a strengthening of the VTTA.

By the 1985 AGM it is almost certain that the VTTA will have become an incorporated body which will involve changes to our Constitution, and a separation of the Table Tennis Centre as a separate incorporated company. The above moves should mean a better administrative basis for the VTTA.

To all those who have assisted us in 1983 I extend the thanks of the Association.
