TREASURER'S REPORT

HONOUR ROLL

1. SECRETARY'S REPORT

Victoria once again set a remarkable standard of organisational ability in 1989. In conducting both the Australian 'Closed' Championships, the Australian 'Open' Championships and the Australian Junior Championships in the space of 6 months - an international tour through Victorian country and metropolitan Associations by an Italian team under the Olympic auspices was quite a workload for all concerned.

In July we said farewell to our Executive Director Rod Lindroth but said hello to Bob Ferguson who has taken the position of Executive Director. July was not a good time to try and find ones feet but Bob has done well.

Our Association with the Victorian Health Promotion Foundation, and the Arthritis Foundation of Victoria have renewed their partnership with table tennis. The funding received enables this Association to provide the best support to our member associations which is the envy of every State.

The Association's basic activities pennant, tournaments, Tabten for schools, Commonwealth Bank Schools Championship and Veterans competition continue to thrive through the efforts of our office management and the efforts of voluntary officials.

The Executive Committee has had to struggle at times due to members taking leave of absence for extended periods due to family and work commitments. A vacancy did not get one response despite regular notices asking for someone to come forward.

It would be remiss not to mention our players superb performances in 1989 and the success was well deserved.

The Mens Team's victory to win the K Bowler Shield was outstanding considering there were five players overseas at the time of the Championships which could have finished in at least second place. They will be back in 1990.

The Country Championships adopted a different format by creating three new grades and so avoiding play offs for the Grade shields. Regretably the 'A' Grade Womens shield is virtually defunct and will not be contested in 1990.

Our wide group of sponsors will be remembered elsewhere in this report but without their support our activities would be curtailed.

Our members are no doubt aware that Melbourne is applying to conduct the 1996 Olympic Games. Table Tennis will be staging a major international team and individual tournament in May 1990. The venue is expected to be at the Melbourne Town Hall. This venue was highly successful for the 1975 Commonwealth Championships. Invitations have been sent to many of the major countries and acceptances are being waited upon.

The prospects of a new playing venue in the Albert Park Reserve is dependant on obtaining the Olympic Games in Melbourne but if not successful it will depend on State Government finances to redevelop the Centre as money and time permits.

2. MANAGEMENT

2.1 EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE

The Executive Committee operated one member short for the whole year. Members were called on to serve on the various sub committees to conduct the affairs of the Association. Unfortunately Mrs P. Holden and Mr. R. Tuckett were unable to attend in a regular basis and were granted leave of absence. Other members were absent due to work commitments and Australian official capacities.

Generally the centre catered well to the many players that participated in the two Australian titles conducted here in 1989 along with the Olympic backed tour of the Italian Table Tennis team.

The office space on the other hand has become quite congested particularly at peak times and has been earmarked for change in 1990.

With the upgrading of the computer facilities and the aquisition of a Fax machine, Table Tennis now has quite up-to-date office facilities.

2.5 COACHING

2.5.1 COACHING FOR ALL

Coaching is made available on Mondays and Fridays. This is also conducted in groups. The Friday session is taken by I. Klaf and Monday sessions have been taken by R. Pappalardo and G. Thomas. These sessions cater largely to pennant players who wish to improve their grading. Beginners too are made most welcome and are given individual attention.

Coaching for Junior Squads for State Teams and for Teams to play against N.S.W. at Wagga are under I. Klaf.

The effects are self evident from the excellent results we have achieved in the Under 15 and Under 17 age groups at the Australian championships.

The Under 14 and Under 12 juniors also had a resounding victory against N.S.W.

The Ron Chadband Memorial Trophy for 1988 was won by Glenn Tepper.

Angelo Tabone was one of two Oceania umpires at the World Championships in Dortmund, West Germany and the Commonwealth Championships in Cardiff, Wales.

Two major Australian events were held in Melbourne. In July, the Australian Junior (U15 and U17) Championships, with referee Ruth Singer and assistant referee Peter Ward; in October, the Australian Open Senior, refereed by Clive Gadd, assisted by Ruth Singer. Also the Australian Closed Championships were conducted in Ballarat where the referee was Rob Godfrey. Assistants were Ruth Singer and Angelo Tabone.

During the Australian Open Championships, a short seminar was held, the main purpose being discussion of the rule changes which will take effect in Australia from 1st January 1990. The umpires room was also well utilized for informal discussions and refreshment breaks.

Umpiring courses were conducted by Ron and Fran Keyhoe at Bendigo and Shepparton.

In the middle of the year, an Italian team toured and our members officiated at several of the venues.

A new umpiring certificate - Associate Umpire - was formulated, intended for those who only want to increase their knowledge of the laws, or to be used as a stepping stone if someone does not wish to tackle the State Umpire level directly.

Also we officiated at VTTA pennant matches throughout the year as well as at VTTA and Affiliated Associations conducted tournaments at Senior, Junior and Veteran levels.

New umpires are urgently required and all the necessary assistance will be given to interested persons.

Barry who was New Zealand's top player, moved to Victoria early in the year and has since been appointed Assistant Coach of the ATTA Academy. He was also appointed Captain of our succesful state team at the National Championships. His results are as follows Mens Singles Champion - Yasaka Easter Classic, Ballarat, Geelong, Brighton (SA), NSW Open as well as NZ Open. He also won the Australian Open Mens Doubles Championship with Alois Rosario. In the Nationals he won 17 matches and forfeited 1 (due to sickness) whilst representing Victoria. He competed amongst the top elite players in the World Cup and finished a creditable 14th out of 16 players. His rankings are as follows - VICTORIA 1, AUSTRALIA 2, OCEANIA 1 AND WORLD 134. Barry is the current Oceania Singles Champion.

The French Award for the Victorian Female Player of the Year was awarded to Kerri Tepper. Kerri has now won this award for a record 5 times in succession. Kerri represented Australia with distinction in the World Championships in Dortmund, West Germany and in the Commonwealth Championships in Cardiff, Wales. She was by far Australia's best player in both Championships with the highlight being a recipient of a silver medal with Wendy Hughes in the Womens Doubles at the Commonwealth Championships. Her results are as follows - Womens Singles Champion - Moomba, City of Melbourne, Croydon and Dandenong. She also won the Australian Open Womens Doubles Championships with her sister Jan Tepper as well as the Australian Closed Mixed Doubles Championships with Peng Huy Quach. 7. EXECUTIVE DIRECTORS REPORT

1989 saw the winds of change blow through table tennis with the resignation of long serving Executive Director Rod Lindroth.

Rod had placed table tennis on a good footing in Victoria and wished to move into another area of sports management.

This past year also saw an increase in activity for the Association with the hosting of The Australian Closed, Australian Junior Open, Australian Senior Open and a visit from the touring Italian Olympic Team. Needless to say the office worked to its limit to meet deadlines associated with these events.

In addition to the above our usual Schools and development programs continued to grow particularly the Commonwealth Bank Schools Table Tennis Championships and Tabten. Much of this growth can be directly attributed to the excellent work done by Table Tennis's Development Officer Alois Rosario.

1989 also saw a change in the direction of The Arthritis Awareness Program. The focus this year was expanded beyond the Over 40 Program of 1988 to become a much more comprehensive one, encompassing all areas from School children to aged persons.

The main promotional activity of this program was 'The Arthritis Awareness Australian Open Table Tennis Championships', which was most successful in conveying the message about Arthritis and the nature of this ailment to the general public.

Joan Guggenheim, the Executive Officer of the Arthritis Awareness Program has worked tirelessly over the past 18 months to ensure this program is successful and table tennis is indeed reaping the benefits of her work, not only through the promotion of our sport, but through the increased profile we have with the Victorian Health Promotion Foundation.

1990 proves to be no less exciting or busy for that matter, what with the Melbourne Olympic Bid culminating in September, the new look Australian Open being held in May and the advent of a Womens Program in table tennis this new decade promises much, particularly in the way of progress and expansion of our sport.

In closing, as the still relatively new Executive Director, I would like to take this opportunity to personally thank all who have welcomed me to this position and helped me (& boy have I needed it) over the past 8 months. I would especially like to thank Rod, The V.T.T.A Executive and the Office Staff at the Table Tennis Centre of Victoria for helping make this transition so easy. I look forward to a long association with table tennis and hope to meet in time, all who work throughout this State in support of their chosen sport.

8. ALBERT PARK RESERVE DEVELOPMENT

Following yet another government instigated enquiry on the future of Albert Park and the Sports Centres in Albert Park, a recommendation has been made to the Department of Conservation, Forests and Lands that the existing four centres be relocated in the South Melbourne Cricket Ground area. No firm dates/plans have been decided but a minimum 7-10 years period has been mentioned.

The VTTA made a detailed written submission to the enquiry and attended numerous private and public meetings to put its views on development.

The announcement and subsequent planning of Melbourne's bid for the 1996 Olympic Games has overtaken the above enquiry and a major development, estimated to cost \$250 million, will take place in the cricket ground area if Melbourne gains the Olympic Games.

The Minister for Major Projects, Mr. Evan Walker, has publicly and privately given assurances that new centres will be developed regardless of whether or not the Games come to Melbourne.

Is it possible that there is finally a recognition of the need to replace these aged but valuable sporting assets?

10. ADDENDUM

It is again pleasing to report that the revenue and usage at the Centre at Albert Park increased. Most funding for the sport in Victoria comes from the Centre and its importance as a venue and administrative centre for table tennis cannot be over emphasized.

The members of the Executive Committee and Centre Staff staged two Australian Championships - the Senior and Junior - in 1989 and gave strong support to the Closed event held in Ballarat. All table tennis players owe a great deal to both the honorary and professional workers who work for the sport and, on your behalf, I thank them for yet another year of achievement.

The success of the 1988 Arthritis Foundation of Victoria programme led to renewal of the grant for 1990 which could be used in the wider area of table tennis and both the Senior and Junior National Championships benefitted from these grants.

Again all our players - Junior, Senior and Veteran - performed well at National Championships and Victoria is fortunate to have a large group of dedicated players to represent it at these events.

The major administrative change for 1989 was the retirement of Rod Lindroth as Executive Director and his replacement with Bob Ferguson. The changeover went smoothly and was a tribute to both persons and the VTТА office staff.

Already 1990 has the potential to be great for table tennis as a major change in the Senior National Championships format and timing is envisaged and this can only be important in raising the public perception of our sport.
