Firstly, I wish to thank our Board of Management who provide both expertise and an appreciation of what is required to grow the sport of Table Tennis. A special thank you to Paul Healey who has provided me with good counsel throughout the year.



Thank you to Ritchie Hinton, our CEO, and the TTV staff for their tireless work and enthusiasm. Ritchie commenced in February 2019 and hit the ground running with the implementation of our four-year strategic plan. Well done Ritchie.

Thank you to all our Affiliates, members and stakeholders who provided excellent feedback to McLaughlan Sports Consultants who assisted us in facilitating the TTV Strategic Plan.

The programs which TTV have initiated and will initiate going forward are, and have been, directed towards the three pillars set out in the Strategic Plan: Participation, (High) Performance and Profile. Examples include an emphasis on digital marketing, our high-performance program and entry level programs.

In changing times and new challenges for the sport, we particularly wish to engage with our Affiliates and members and provide assistance and expertise where possible.

On a personal note, I wish to express my thanks to all members and Affiliates who give up their time voluntarily, without fanfare, who just love the sport and wish it to thrive.

JACK CYNGLER

It is my pleasure to provide my first CEO report to TTV affiliates and members.

Since joining TTV in February 2019, I have had the opportunity to visit many clubs in person, and met with countless numbers of table tennis players, coaches, officials and volunteers throughout Victoria who made a strong impression on me through their passion and commitment to the sport.



Highlights have included:

- finalizing TTV's 2019-2022 Strategic Plan, 'Our Future Now!' (see more details below);
- attending the Victorian Country Championships in Bendigo;
- launching TTV's High Performance program;
- witnessing strong Victorian performances at national level;
- moving to a new, smoother online registration process, and;
- Victorian venues hosting Olympic Qualification competition.

Overall membership numbers increased by 338 (7.41%) from 4570 in 2018, to 4908 in 2019.

However, it is important to note that this increase is due to the introduction of a new State-specific Associate Member class to capture non-club players, such as some school associations and industry groups.

In real terms, traditional membership was down by 132 (↓3.1%) from 4570 in 2018 to 4438 in 2019. Nationally, traditional membership declined from 10,636 in 2018, to 10,077 in 2019 (↓5.25%). These numbers also do not take into consideration the continued steady growth in population numbers, which means that our market share is actually dropping.

It is crucial that we acknowledge and address this trend, which is exacerbated by increasing societal moves away from traditional membership models, to ensure the on-going viability of the sport.

Therefore our 4-year Strategic Plan is unashamedly bold, as is Table tennis Australia's, as they need to be if table tennis is to not just survive but thrive for future generations of enthusiasts.

With all this in mind, 2020 will be an incredibly exciting and important year for table tennis in Victoria.

We welcome new staff members for 2020, Sean Sturrock (Participation & Programs Officer) and Jason Bast (Media & Marketing Officer).

In addition to the existing tournament structure and High-Performance program, planned initiatives for 2020 include:

- EPIC table tennis (Enhancement Program in Clubs – governance, child safety, MPIO, systems) – aimed at helping all clubs to become sustainable, efficient and compliant;

- TTV Primary School Cup, in conjunction with School Sports Victoria and Sporting Schools programs – attempting to create meaningful connections between clubs and the next generation of players;
- Entry Level Program ('Spinneroos') support – creating a contemporary junior program for juniors as an easy entry point into the sport, supported centrally by TTA and TTV;
- Pulse Pub League – taking the sport to new non-traditional markets to increase registered participation;
- Social Pop-Up Programs – creation and testing of tailored pilot schemes to develop 'Best Practice' models to increase registered participation in key markets, and;
- Volunteer Recognition Program – formally recognizing the efforts and achievements of our hard-working volunteer cohort through an annual event.

I would like to personally thank the board members, past and present, for their support and input over the year.

It is important to note that this is provided on a voluntary basis, and TTV is fortunate to benefit from the guidance of senior professionals from backgrounds including legal, finance, governance, marketing, tourism, and sport from both inside and outside table tennis to add their valuable context, knowledge and insights.

Special thanks to Claire Montgomery (Events & Clubs Officer) who has been an invaluable resource for me, and the wider TTV community as whole, during 2019 and will continue to add significant value to the organization in the future. Thanks also to Marie Karekla for her efforts prior to her departure in late 2019.

To all our members, good luck with your table tennis endeavours for 2020, and I look forward to your on-going support as we work with you to improve the table tennis landscape, and safeguard the future of our sport as we seek to "connect more people in Victoria with more forms of table tennis, more often".

Pennant Table Tennis is a club's greatest strength as it is a perfect display of bonding with your fellow team members, working together to achieve team success and formulating strategies to give everyone the best chance to contribute to their team. There are only so many different permutations possible depending whether you are ABC or XYZ!!!

For a bit of background to those who might be unaware of the history, Victoria's first major pennant competition was introduced as the 'State Pennant' in the early days where TTV stalwart, Bob Grattidge, ran it for some 40 years. Even to this day the TTV Premier League is often graced by Bob to observe how the competition is managing in his absence! However, it was back in those days that notable players (national and international representatives) such as William Henzell, Glenn Tepper, Barry Griffiths and Alois Rosario have all participated at some point. However, as clubs established their own centres, only a few clubs based in Albert Park have continued such traditions (you only need to look at St Kilda and Maccabi to know!)



After a few years under different management(s), the State Pennant was returned to Table Tennis Victoria and was reborn as the TTV Premier League in May 2018; where I was appointed as its Competition Manager to ensure the traditions were maintained yet modernising the sport. One such initiative that I brought in 2018 was the technological enhancement of the traditional pennant operating system where a powerful software with Ratings Central integration and compatibility provided a much-needed efficiency over multiple spreadsheets and macros. Thank you very much to Gerard McCarthy of Eastern Suburbs & Churches Table Tennis Association for workshopping with me over the years to create the program that it is today.

2019 was a real chance for the TTV Premier League to grow. A real, concerted effort to bring in further new participation and existing Victorian representatives brought the competition's numbers to 120-130 players in every season (up from ~70) across 36-39 teams (up from ~25) in 6-7 divisions (up from 4). We were also fortunate to have some real superstar players participate throughout the year where we had 2 marquee showdown matches between National Squad members David Powell and Dillon Chambers in Season 1; and again, in Season 3 with Trans-Tasman legend, Barry Griffiths and Mexican Junior representative, Alberto Romo.

A competition on this scale would simply not be possible without clubs such as Balwyn United, Croydon, Dandenong, Geelong and HWATT joining existing MSAC based clubs (Albert Park, Maccabi and St Kilda) AND students from Melbourne, Monash and RMIT universities to produce a competition reminiscent of the days of old. In particular, Season 3, 2019, was perhaps a personal highlight for me where juniors and students constituted to over 36% of total participants. It just highlights that innovating the sport through new flexible competition formats is a key determination for busy people to still find a way to connect with our great sport.

At the conclusion of Season 3, 2019, I have passed on the banner of 'Competition Manager' to Rahul Mathew citing increased time commitments. I would like to thank Table Tennis Victoria as well as Jack Cyngler, Claire Montgomery and Warren Seaman for providing me the opportunity and putting their faith in me over the last 2 years to grow the competition to what it is today. But most importantly, thank you to the clubs and players for participating in the reborn TTV Premier League and providing me your confidence to be your Competition Manager.



NOTES TO THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS FOR THE YEAR ENDED 31 DECEMBER 2019

NOTE 1: SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

The financial statements are special purpose financial statements prepared in order to satisfy the financial reporting requirements of the Associations Incorporation Reform Act 2012 (Vic). The Board has determined that the association is not a reporting entity.

The financial statements have been prepared on an accruals basis and are based on historic costs and do not take into account changing money values or, except where stated specifically, current valuations of non-current assets.

The following significant accounting policies, which are consistent with the previous period unless stated otherwise, have been adopted in the preparation of these financial statements.

a. Income Tax

The association is a not for profit entity and is exempt from income tax.

b. Property, Plant and Equipment (PPE)

Leasehold improvements and office equipment are carried at cost less, where applicable, any accumulated depreciation.

The depreciable amount of all PPE is depreciated over the useful lives of the assets to the association commencing from the time the asset is held ready for use.

Leasehold improvements are amortised over the shorter of either the unexpired period of the lease or the estimated useful lives of the improvements.

c. Impairment of Assets

At the end of each reporting period, the Board reviews the carrying amounts of its tangible and intangible assets to determine whether there is any indication that those assets have been impaired. If such an indication exists, an impairment test is carried out on the asset by comparing the recoverable amount of the asset, being the higher of the asset's fair value less costs of disposal and value in use, to the asset's carrying amount. Any excess of the asset's carrying amount over its recoverable amount is recognised in the income and expenditure statement.

d. Employee Provisions

Provision is made for the association's liability for employee benefits arising from services rendered by employees to the end of the reporting period. Employee provisions have been measured at the amounts expected to be paid when the liability is settled.

e. Provisions

Provisions are recognised when the association has a legal or constructive obligation, as a result of past events, for which it is probable that an outflow of economic benefits will result and that outflow can be reliably measured. Provisions are measured at the best estimate of the amounts required to settle the obligation at the end of the reporting period.

f. Cash on Hand

Cash on hand includes cash on hand, deposits held at call with banks, and other short-term highly liquid investments with original maturities of three months or less.

g. Accounts Receivable and Other Debtors

Accounts receivable and other debtors include amounts due from members as well as amounts receivable from donors. Receivables expected to be collected within 12 months of the end of the reporting period are classified as current assets. All other receivables are classified as non-current assets.

h. Revenue and Other Income

Revenue is measured at the fair value of the consideration received or receivable after taking into account any trade discounts and volume rebates allowed. For this purpose, deferred consideration is not discounted to present values when recognising revenue.

NOTES TO THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS FOR THE YEAR ENDED 31 DECEMBER 2019

NOTE 1: SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

Interest revenue is recognised using the effective interest method, which for floating rate financial assets is the rate inherent in the instrument. Dividend revenue is recognised when the right to receive a dividend has been established.

Grant and donation income is recognised when the entity obtains control over the funds, which is generally at the time of receipt.

If conditions are attached to the grant that must be satisfied before the association is eligible to receive the contribution, recognition of the grant as revenue will be deferred until those conditions are satisfied.

All revenue is stated net of the amount of goods and services tax.

i. **Leases**

Leases of PPE, where substantially all the risks and benefits incidental to the ownership of the asset (but not the legal ownership) are transferred to the association, are classified as finance leases.

Finance leases are capitalised by recording an asset and a liability at the lower of the amounts equal to the fair value of the leased property or the present value of the minimum lease payments, including any guaranteed residual values. Lease payments are allocated between the reduction of the lease liability and the lease interest expense for that period.

Leased assets are depreciated on a straight-line basis over the shorter of their estimated useful lives or the lease term. Lease payments for operating leases, where substantially all the risks and benefits remain with the lessor, are charged as expenses in the periods in which they are incurred.

j. **Goods and Services Tax (GST)**

Revenues, expenses and assets are recognised net of the amount of GST, except where the amount of GST incurred is not recoverable from the Australian Taxation Office (ATO). Receivables and payables are stated inclusive of the amount of GST receivable or payable. The net amount of GST recoverable from, or payable to, the ATO is included with other receivables or payables in the assets and liabilities statement.

k. **Financial Assets**

Investments in financial assets are initially recognised at cost, which includes transaction costs, and are subsequently measured at fair value, which is equivalent to their market bid price at the end of the reporting period. Movements in fair value are recognised through an equity reserve.

l. **Accounts Payable and Other Payables**

Accounts payable and other payables represent the liability outstanding at the end of the reporting period for goods and services received by the association during the reporting period that remain unpaid. The balance is recognised as a current liability with the amounts normally paid within 30 days of recognition of the liability.
