55th ANNUAL REPORT - 1984

1. INTRODUCTION

1984 will be remembered for a number of important events, which include a serious downturn in our financial situation, all of which will have a large influence on the future activities of the Association,

During the year the VTTA became an incorporated association under the Associations Incorporation Act. You should all be aware that the incorporation of the Association imposes a number of legal requirements, such that clubs and associations nominate members who will act for them and that imposes a legal requirement for resignations etc. It will take time for us all to become familiar with our new procedures, but incorporation has given a measure of protection to all those who serve the Association.

The players registration fee introduced by the Australian Table Tennis Association has enabled both this association and the ATTA to obtain a far more accurate indication of the number of players in registered competition. We have lost some small associations but overall it has been accepted by everyone. Efforts will be made to regain those association in 1985.

The expansion by metropolitan associations and clubs has been good for the sport, but is depriving the headquarters of the State of players/teams, and is resulting in loss of revenue to the VTTA. Such losses can only effect the services offered to all registered clubs and associations and is one of the main areas which the Executive must address in the next year.

The Development Officer, Mr. Rod Lindroth, has been extremely busy on behalf of all members by co-ordinating coaching programs, organising exhibitions, addressing clubs/associations, and representing the Association at Youth Sport and Recreation meetings, Olympic Council meetings and visiting potential sponsors.

Victoria hosted a world class men's team from Japan, and conducted an International match at the Table Tennis Centre of Victoria and a Victoria versus Japan match at the Geelong Table Tennis Centre. Both matches attracted excellent crowds which proves, that top table tennis can still pull in spectators.

The Australian Championships were played at the Table Tennis Centre and for the first time an Australian Closed Mens and Womens Singles was conducted as well as the normal teams and individual titles.

Victoria's results at the National level was very good. The Junior titles in Perth saw us victorious in the U17 Girls and U15 Boys Team events and, at senior level, Victoria won both Mens and Womens teams events. Individual titles went to Andrew Moore in the Boys Under 17 singles, the first time a non-team member has taken out this title, and Jan Tepper won the Under 17 Girls title. Tommy Danielsson completed a magnificent season with a great double, taking out both the Australian Closed and Open Singles, Nadia Bisiach won the Australian Open Womens Singles and Myung Hee No the Closed Singles. The Australian Championships finals was almost an all Victorian night.

The various sports complexes in Albert Park are under review for redevelopment to international standards for each sport, but the State Government has not yet made a final decision on the project. It would appear that it will be 5 - 6 years before we have a home with conditions likely to attract back our patrons.

1985 will be a testing year with concentration on financial restraint, combined with more promotion of table tennis activities which will show a better financial return.

The major promotion of the VTTA will be the Victoria Cup, an International Mens Singles Invitation Tournament which will be Table Tennis's contribution to Victoria's 150th Birthday Celebrations. This event is scheduled to be held from 15 - 18 August at the Sports and Entertainment Centre.

In previous Annual Reports we have drawn attention to the difficulty in obtaining suitable replacements for Committee Members who retire for various reasons. This has again been the situation and your Association needs your support in this area.

2. MANAGEMENT

2.1 EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE

The Committee in 1984 saw a number of changes which affected considerably the workload for the sitting members. In a year which saw a lot of preparation for the National Championships, and also an International Tour by a Japanese mens team, new members were tested very quickly. Mr. Peter Nedeljkovic resigned as Honorary Secretary on 9th April, 1984, and Mr. Peter Mascall was appointed to the position.

Four new members joined the Committee - Mr. Alan Peel and Mrs. Marlene Bronstein on 2nd April 1984, Mr. Joe Elisha filled the Assistant Treasurer's position as from 4th June 1984, and Mr. Trevor Barr joined on 2nd July 1984. Despite these appointments there still remained one vacancy during the year.

Seventeen meetings of the Executive Committee were held in 1984. These included one adjourned meeting and three special meetings held in connection with the Players Registration Fee and the Procedures for Incorporation, and thirteen Executive Committee meetings. Attendances were as follows:-

All Committee members were involved with many subcommittees which require them to attend meetings and conduct the many facets of table tennis administration in which members participate. The state body conducts coaching programs, major tournaments, pennant competitions, as well as participating in many community activities.

There is a very large workload for Honorary Officials to carry but they are supported by a very professional staff.

Considerable time was devoted during the year to the work involved in having the Association incorporated and to the implementation of the Players Registration fee imposed by the ATTA.

2.2 TABLE TENNIS CENTRE OF VICTORIA

1984 saw a continued decline in VTTA Metropolitan Pennant teams using the Centre and this is worrying for the future as it involves a loss of revenue to the Association.

Much of the Centre was renovated due to the National Championships being conducted there in 1984.

A major item which caused expenditure of approximately \$5000 was to "possum-proof" the Centre and repair damage to the ceiling due to their presence.

The Centre Court flooring was replaced and twelve new tables were purchased.

The Victorian Public Service TTA and the Victorian Railways Institute TTA continued to use the Centre's facilities on a regular basis.

The Sport City Table Tennis pennant competition sponsored by the Melbourne City Council continued for its second year.

Mr. Leon Lau continued with his excellent management of the combined snack bar and table tennis equipment shop. The VTTA appreciated his continued service to our patrons and he is often called upon by the VTTA to cater for our various functions, tournaments and training camps.

There is no further progress at this time on the proposed re-development of the Table Tennis Centre.

2.2.1 STAFF

Once again Mrs. Joan Guggenheim ably managed the Office in her usual efficient manner. At the close of 1983 Mrs. Chris Moore left us, and we gained the services of Miss Cathy Jongebloed. We thank both ladies for their work during the year especially with the increased workload during the National Championships.

Our Development Officer, Mr. Rod Lindroth carried out his duties in a business-like and cheerful manner.

Our Caretaker, Mr. Max Guggenheim, looked after the Centre and helped to get it in top condition for the National Championships.

2.2.2 RECEPTIONISTS

We had another good year, our receptionists being - Dorothy, Suzy, Gina and Vicki. We were sorry to lose Rosanne, Kerri, Vanessa and Richard. We gained the following new faces - Lynette(s), Elizabeth and Robert.

As usual, our receptionists have given prompt service to our patrons in a pleasant and efficient manner. Due to the re-organisation of our full-time staff the receptionists have been allocated extra duties.

2.3 AFFILIATED ASSOCIATIONS

1984 was always going to be a difficult year for affiliations. The introduction of a Players' Registration Fee in line with other sports, set the VTTA a 'hard sell' program to persuade all players it was a worthwhile contribution to the National Sporting body. The Development Officer was kept busy explaining that State and Federal Governments expected each sport to contribute to its own financial well being and not count on 'hand-outs' for its development. We gained some new associations, others re-joined us, and of course we lost some. It is probable that we did not lose all of them because of the registration fee, but because, in many smaller associations, they cannot find suitable and dedicated officials among their members.

Indoor cricket, the current 'in' sport has made inroads into membership of some associations and will no doubt have a continued appeal for some time.

The Federal Government's 'non-elite' coaching grant enabled the VTTA to conduct coaching sessions at many small associations who normally could not have supported such programs.

2.4 INTERNATIONAL EVENTS

Through the courtesy of the Japan Foundation, a party of 4 Japanese, 3 players and a manager, toured the eastern States of Australia during the month of August 1984.

Additional sponsorship for the Victorian section of the tour was received from Ansett Airlines and Australian Motor Industries (Toyota).

An International match - Australia versus Japan - was played at the VTTA Centre on Wednesday, 22nd August, and resulted in a 8 to 1 victory for the Japanese. The matches were video-taped by Channel 0/28 for subsequent telecasting, and featured the great win by Tommy Danielsson over Japan's Masahiro Maehara. It is pleasing to record that there was a 'full house.'

On Thursday, 23rd August, Geelong TTA staged a match between the Visitors and Victoria and this was won by Japan 7/2, with Danielsson defeating both Maehara and Ichiro Hoshino.

The Japanese Manager, Mr. Yaoita, subsequently wrote expressing the appreciation of the tourists for the hospitality received in Victoria.

An elimination tournament to decide Oceania's representative for the 1984 World Cup was held at Hutt Valley, New Zealand, with T. Danielsson and G. Haberl of NSW representing Australia. Danielsson won each of his matches easily, and subsequently finished in 15th position in the field of 16 when the event was contested in August in Kuala Lumpur.

The Asian Championships were held in Islamabad, Pakistan and Australia was represented by both Mens and Womens teams. Victorian players chosen were R. Tuckett, G. Tepper, Miss N. Bisiach and Miss B. Benli, and they were led by Mr. A. Tabone as Manager and Mr. V. Matison as Captain/Coach of the mens team.

The mens team finished in 7th position and the women in 8th position, both found the leading Asian teams far too strong.

The ITTF Biennial meeting was held at the Adidas Sports Hotel in West Germany in May, and Australia was represented by the Vice President for Oceania, Len Haycraft. Much of the proceedings related to proposed rule changes to go before the Congress at Gothenburg and to the 1988 Olympics. Our delegate was successful in having a motion carried giving two places to Oceania in the field of 64 in the Mens Singles, and 1 place for one woman in the field of 32 in the Womens Singles. However this motion will need to be carried by the 1988 Congress before becoming effective.

2.5 COACHING

Victoria has several programs in order to provide the young and old with opportunities to improve their game so as to give them more satisfaction in leisure time activities. This area takes up a great amount of time and the results are most satisfying.

Victoria lost Mr. Igor Klaf, who went to the U.S.A. in December. At about this time, Mr. John Tannerhill, a former American World Championship player and coach, spent six months here and assisted with coaching. Since then, John has gone back to America and Igor has return to Melbourne.

Victoria appointed three coaches - David Brand for Schools and Country Associations, Alek Jakubczak for Juniors and Adults, and Tommy Danielsson as Seniors (squads and teams) coach.

The special allocation of funds for non-elite coaching by the Federal Government has seen many new areas exposed to coaching where previously they could not afford such an activity. Coaching is provided in various ways - Mass Junior and Senior coaching, Squads, Camps, Clinics and Coaching of Coaches.

2.5.1 MASS COACHING

This is available throughout the year for anybody who would like to learn the game or are keen to improve performances in competitions. A person could virtually walk off the street and come to be coached. Alek Jakubczak was given the task to look after Juniors on Saturday afternoons and Adults on Friday evenings. These players come from all over Victoria, which proves the popularity of these sessions. The Junior's ages range from 8 - 18 years and the Adults from 18 up to over 60 years.

Keith Keane also conducts coaching classes for Adults on Sunday mornings, so that through the week Adults could get coaching from two to four hours and the Juniors for two hours. The numbers vary and are up to 20 in the Adults and between 30 and 50 in Juniors.

In order to cater for the needs of these large numbers, we have a number of unpaid coaches who come regularly and spend time with individuals. Now that Igor Klaf is back, he provides a strong back-up to the whole system. His expertise and dedication to the game is of great value.

Besides these sessions at Albert Park Centre, coaching is carried out at several other venues. Tommy Danielsson coaches at Ballarat, Geelong and Croydon. Paul Bronstein, who runs the Caulfield Table Tennis Centre is almost a full-time coach. He spends a major part of his time helping people to attain the standards they have set for themselves. Paul's special interest is Juniors, and he will soon be reaping the fruits of his dedicated work. Several other Metropolitan and Country Associations also conduct coaching sessions and Victoria tries to ascertain that members of the Table Tennis Coaches Association of Victoria are given these jobs. Some of these Associations are:- Diamond Valley under Prisca Rosario and Roy Warrior, Dandenong and VRI under David Brand and Coburg under Keith Keane.

2.5.2 SQUADS

Up to this year, coaching for Squads was organised in the U13, U15, U17 and Seniors age groups. This year a special U12 and U14 Squad was formed. It was felt necessary to encourage these age groups as the Victoria versus N.S.W. matches at Wagga has now become an annual event. This gave the Selectors an opportunity to observe the players and for the players to improve the standard of their game.

The U15 and U17 Squads commenced about three months before the Australian Junior Championships. After the team selection, the players continued to attend coaching sessions. Alek Jakubczak was in charge and he was assisted by Bob Pappalardo.

The Senior Squad started training under Tommy Danielsson and continued to train under him after team selection for the Australian Championships.

2.5.3 CAMPS

Weekend camps have been conducted for Elite and Non-elite Juniors. In January two camps were held. The first was for players nominated by their respective Associations, and the second was for players nominated by the State Junior Selectors. A third camp was held for the Junior teams. The fourth camp was held for Country Juniors, with players nominated by their respective associations. The fifth camp catered for the non-elite players whose abilities ranged from beginner to those who showed some potential in the game. Most of these players would never have been to a Table Tennis Camp before. The response to this last camp was overwhelming, and we had the largest number ever to attend a camp at Albert Park. There were 40 boys and 14 girls.

All these camps were organised and co-ordinated by Prisca Rosario and the Coaching Committee, and were staffed by T.Danielsson, A.Jakubczak, I.Klaf, R.Pappalardo, T.Barr, D.Boughton, J.Ebejer, R.Gassin, R.Warrior and K.Mundy.

2.5.4 SCHOOLS

Schools in the metropolitan and country areas were well catered for by the Schools Association Coach, David Brand. David worked in conjunction with the Development Officer, and was assisted by Roy Warrior and Ron Thomas.

Demonstrations are given, films and videos shown and individual coaching is given to students and teachers. In the country, the schools coaching is combined with the local association and Juniors and Seniors get the benefit of the coaching. Besides, small clinics are conducted for those who are interested in coaching. This area of coaching has been a tremendous success judging from the excellent reports that have been received.

During the period 1983-84, the number of school periods was 84, servicing a total of 58 schools. Many schools receive multiple visits. No doubt, this is the most time-consuming and expensive area but, however, the overriding criteria is that we reach so many children who could spend their time enjoying table tennis. The schools contribute as best as they are able towards the costs. In 1984 we provided the first coaching session free of charge.

The VTTA is heavily committed to 'Sport in Schools' and will continue to make every effort to promote the game throughout Victorian schools.

School children participating in these events were invited to a coaching session by the visiting Japanese team of Maehara, Abe and Hoshino. The school holidays will be remembered for the enthusiasm of the 150 children who crowded into the Centre to be coached by the Japanese. After a scintillating exhibition, the players spent 2½ hours with the children helping them with their game. Here again, six coaches were on hand to assist them.

2.5.5 THE COACHES ASSOCIATION

This Association now has as its President, Mrs.Joan Guggenheim, whose experience in everything that spells Table Tennis is invaluable. It has a membership of 33. The Secretary is R.Pappalardo and the Treasurer is O.Davies.

Victoria has - 1 Master Coach, 6 Level 111 coaches, 5 Level 11 coaches and 30 Level 1 coaches.

Courses for Pre-Level 1 have been conducted at regular intervals as follows - Don Boughton at Albert Park for four, Roy Warrior at Kilsyth for six and Tommy Danielsson at Geelong for five.

Of these, five candidates sat for a written test and passed. Those wishing to apply for Level 11 accreditation sat for a 2½ hour exam and four were successful.

At the Australian Coaches Seminar held at Canberra in June, Victoria was represented by five coaches.

The TTCAV now has a video collection of 42 tapes of various exhibitions and matches. This has been built up mainly through the efforts of Trevor Barr, who also video-records players at coaching sessions and matches for future viewing and assessment.

In conjunction with the Victorian Weightlifting Association the TTCAV held a series of lectures on Sports Science - Lecture/Workshops on Transcutaneous Electrical Nerve Stimulation, Recovery from Exercise, Cryotherapy and Sports Psychology.

With continued allocation of funds from the Federal Government and Youth, Sport and Recreation, it is hoped that through coaching the game of table tennis will be enjoyed by many more people in Victoria.

2.6 UMPIRES LEAGUE

The Victorian Table Tennis Umpires League has had another active year. Not only have they supervised draws and provided referees and umpires for all major tournaments and VTTA Pennants, but this year they had to provide officials for the Australian Closed and Open Championships.

Their Secretary, Mr. Ron Keyhoe, travelled to Islamabad, Pakistan, to umpire at the Asian Championships. Whilst there was invited to take over Umpires Control for the Championships.

Miss Ruth Singer has won selection as an International Umpire to officiate at the Commonwealth and the World Championships.

2.7 AUSTRALIAN TABLE TENNIS ASSOCIATION

2.7.1 FINANCIAL

No financial statement was received at the 1984 GPM by the Treasurer, Mr. S. Pardey (SA), who did not attend the meeting. The statement has yet to be received as at the 6th December.

1. The players registration fee, instituted in 1984, totalled \$17000 - 8500 players. This was expected to increase slightly before the end of the year.

2. It was decided to appoint a National Executive Director from 1st July, 1985.

3. The players registration fee will remain the same at \$2 per player in 1985, but an increase is foreshadowed for 1986.

4. A junior development squad of four boys and two girls would be formed for special training with a view to participation in the 1988 Olympic Games.
5. Eligibility for juniors to represent their States at the National Junior Championships has been changed from 1st January to 1st April to bring it into line with the seniors.
6. Player of the year award conditions have been changed, the criteria being that players must be eligible to represent Australia at the World Championships.
7. Australia is now a member of the Australian Olympic Federation.
8. A junior boy and a junior girl of suitable standard was chosen to accompany the Australian teams to the 1985 Commonwealth and World Championships for training and international experience.
9. The ATTA has commenced proceedings to become an incorporated body.

2.7.3 ATTA COUNCIL

During the year the following changes occurred. His Excellency the Right Honourable Sir Ninian Stephen, A.K., G.C.M.G., G.C.V.O., K.B.E. was appointed as the ATTA Patron. The Hon.Treasurer, Mr.S.Pardey (SA) did not renominate and was replaced by Mr.P.Males (NSW). Mr.D.Parker, delegate for SA resigned and was replaced by Mr.R.Robertson. Mr.L.Wharmby (Tas) vacated his position as delegate, although he remained on the Council as President. He was replaced as delegate by Mr.N.Harwood. Mr.L.Hitchen (WA) resigned as a delegate and was replaced by Miss B.Punch.

3.6 FRENCH AWARDS

The French Award for the Victorian male player of the year was awarded to Tommy Danielsson of Albert Park Sports Contact Club. Tommy has created a record by being the first to win this award for the third successive year, and confirmed that this has been Tommy's most successful year since arriving in Victoria.

For the record Tommy won the following Open Singles titles - Australian Open, Australian Closed, Victorian Open, Victorian Closed, City of Melbourne, Riversdale Easter, Moomba, Dandenong, Warrnambool, Croydon Masters, Ballarat, South Australian Open, Auckland Open, and Albert Park Club Championships. He is undefeated in Victorian Spring, Summer and Winter pennants, and was also undefeated in National League singles matches as well as being the leading player.

He has represented Australia in the Test Match against the visiting Japanese team played at the Table Tennis Centre of Victoria, and was successful in defeating Masahiro Maehara. He captained Victoria in the Australian Teams Championships in which he was undefeated and also captained Victoria against the visiting Japanese team at the Geelong stadium, and defeated Maehara and Ichiro Hoshino. Tommy is currently ranked No. 1 in Australia and Victoria.

The French Award for the Victorian female player of the year was awarded to Miss Nadia Bisiach of the Coburg Table Tennis Club. Nadia had previously won this award in 1982.

Nadia won the Australian Open, Victorian Open, Victorian Closed, Croydon Masters and Ballarat Open Singles titles.

She represented Australia in the 1984 Asian Championships in Islamabad, Pakistan, where she was our leading player. She also represented Victoria in the Australian Teams Championships and was one of our leading players. Nadia is currently ranked No. 1 in Australia and Victoria.

4.3.5 TABTEN - SCHOOLS TEAMS CHAMPIONSHIPS

'Tabten 84' was held on August 8 and 16. A record entry of 232 teams from 53 schools was received - an increase of 11 teams and 3 schools over 1983. This competition is one of the largest table tennis teams events in the world.

The Under 15 section, once again, so large that two venues had to be used (40 tables at Albert Park and 7 at Caulfield). There were 113 teams in 19 grades in the Under 15 Boys, 30 teams in 5 grades in the Under 15 Girls, 74 teams in 13 grades in the Open Boys and 15 teams in 3 grades in the Open Girls competition. 6. ADMINISTRATION REVIEW

This committee continued to meet in the early part of the year. Financial figures given by the Association Treasurer on the cost of conducting pennant led the Committee to believe metropolitan pennant could be a viable proposition. The Executive Committee agreed that the review should be held over pending the finalisation of Incorporation of the Association.

7. DEVELOPMENT OFFICER

The Development Officer, Mr.R.Lindroth, completed his first full year with the Association. In his word it 'has been one of learning, adjustment and one with a few highs and a number of lows.' Much of his time was spent in public relations aspects of the position, the liaison with the media, potential sponsors, administrators of clubs and affiliated associations, the organisation of a schools program, and work in conjunction with the Department of Youth Sport and Recreation and with the Sports Federation of Victoria.

In a period in which the introduction of a Players Registration Fee raised so many questions from affiliated associations, the D.O. visited numerous associations to explain the new scheme and was responsible for maintaining their affiliation to the VTTA. It is certain that these associations are much more aware of what the VTTA can do for them than they were before his visits.

The schools program of coaching and exhibitions showed a marked upswing during the year and our results in this area is looked upon by the Department of Y.S.R as being a model for other sports to follow. This work was recognised by Vicsport when our D.O. was asked to serve on a committee looking into the introduction of sports in schools.

The D.O. was instrumental in obtaining some new, albeit small, sponsorships during the year, but submissions for major sponsorships have not been successful, although several companies have expressed some interest for the future.

The D.O. also organised a Media Subcommittee and was able to attract some past players with experience into this field. This has resulted in increased publicity in both radio, television and newspapers.

Preliminary work on sponsorship for the Victoria Cup in August, 1985, has also seen some success and this event will be an important facet of 1985.

8. IN APPRECIATION

For many years the Department of Youth, Sport and Recreation has provided funds for a number of VTTA activities. Our expansion into schools and into many coaching activities has been due to this financial assistance. Without this help it would be impossible to maintain the current positions of 'Association Coach' and 'Development Officer'. Our thanks are extended to the Minister and his staff, especially Michael Scott and Peter Phair.

We also acknowledge the assistance and co-operation of the media, the Radio Stations, TV Channels and the Newspapers, and we keep a close liaison with the Albert Park Committee of Management.

There are innumerable number of individuals who work tirelessly for the game. People in associations, clubs, committees, referees, coaches, umpires, and of course the players - all combine together to work for, enjoy, and promote table tennis.

Without all of these individuals we would not be here. Thanks very much to everyone for their efforts throughout the year.

9. ADDENDUM

In the 1983 Annual Report: I wrote of the changes in administration which had, and were about to occur. 1984 certainly saw the effects of the changes forecast. In August, the clubs, affiliated associations and members voted to accept a new set of rules and, in September, the association became an incorporated body under the Association's Incorporation Act 1981. The effect of the change is to give members of the Association a new measure of legal protection while they are engaged in work for table tennis. It also brings with it legal responsibilities for the manner in which the Association is administered and we must all learn to accept the changes which incorporation will bring about.

The changes in the registration of players and the affiliation of clubs and associations caused some upheavals amongst our members, but excellent public relations work by our Development Officer managed to smooth the introduction of what was, for table tennis, a radical change.

The most disturbing downward trend in our financial position highlighted the fact that more and more players and teams are playing away from the Centre at Albert Park. Your committee has already taken steps which are intended to redress the situation and to balance the 1984-85 budget, but it is apparent that new initiatives are required to obtain additional revenue for the Association. While it is of no comfort to table tennis, the drop in income has not been uncommon in other sporting bodies.

Once again the Association had an enforced change of Honorary Secretary when Mr. Nedeljkovic resigned his position. It is pleasing to report that the arduous task has been filled capably by Mr. Peter Mascall.

The real success story of the year was the excellent performances of our players, both as individuals and in teams, at the Junior, Senior and Veterans National Championships and of the selection of so many Victorians as players and officials in the Australian teams for various championships. Congratulations to all those persons involved.

It has again proved difficult to obtain suitable persons to fill Executive and Sub-committee vacancies. In these days of quasi-professionalism and paid staff it is still essential that the sport be administered by honorary officials. The only reward I can promise such officials is the personal satisfaction and enjoyment they will obtain from seeing their sport advance.

To all those officials, players and staff who worked for Table Tennis in 1984 I extend the thanks of the Association.

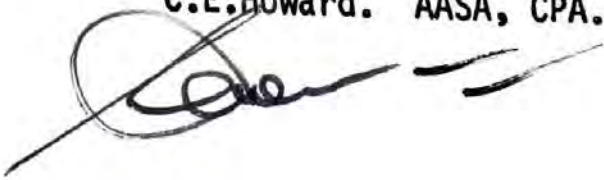
