56TH ANNUAL REPORT 1985

INTRODUCTION

The highlight of 1985 was the conducting of the A.N.Z. International Table Tennis Classic in August, at the Melbourne Sports & Entertainment Centre.

The World's number one and two Countries - China and Sweden - plus three other Countries ranked in the top ten - Japan, Korea and England together with Australia, showed us a feast of Table Tennis. Four years of preparation, negotiation, frustration and then jubilation marked our sports contribution to Victoria's 150th celebrations.

Victoria's players again dominated the National Championships at Junior, Senior and Veterans levels. Winning 26 titles out of the 40 events entered. Our thanks must go to the Department of Sport & Recreation for funds granted to assist some of the Victorian players through the Sports Foundation Scheme.

Administration areas have seen a big change, not only in our office staff, but through the Executive Committee. Mrs Val Bartolo has now settled admirably into the routine of sports administration following the retirement of Mrs. Joan Guggenheim. Finding suitable backup has been difficult, but Mrs. Chris Moore has returned to us on a more permanent basis and has proved to be an inportant part of our service to our members.

Judge Cleaning Service have the contract to clean the vast and difficult building, and I am pleased to say they are doing the job well. Casual cleaners look after the centre at weekends and at major tournaments. We miss the handiwork of Max Guggenheim around the centre, which kept our aging building in as good a condition as possible. Some light repairs have been completed by Committee Members, Trevor Barr and Len Kenna, but major items have had to be done professionally.

The 1984 A.G.M., saw a full Committee elected which was a first for some time. Unfortunately, we lost the services of Mr.Len Haycraft due to his retirement, Len was Vice President, he also held the position of Hon. International Secretary for the A.T.T.A. Mrs.Prisca Rosario became the first woman Vice-President of the V.T.T.A., when elected to fill the vacancy left by Mr.Haycraft. A just reward for her services to the Association.

The proposed reconstruction and re-development of the Albert Park complex has been stopped by an appeal from the South Melbourne City Council and the whole matter is now in the hands of the State Government who are carrying out a review of all activities in Albert Park.

The number of affiliations is falling, and player registrations are also less than expected. This is a matter of concern for your Committee and also to the A.T.T.A., when endeavouring to prepare budgets. It would appear from research done with other sporting associations, that our \$5, player registration fee shared by the association and the A.T.T.A., to be miniscule and innapropriate for a sport with International and Olympic expectations, and yet many associations seem to deem it too big an amount, and a problem to collect the fee.

Our Development Officer Mr.Rod Lindroth, has once again been kept busy serving all our members, arranging coaching programmes throughout the State and Schools and Shopping Centre promotions. Tabten has now developed into a major promotion for Junior Table Tennis, and looks likely to continue to expand.

Rod was a key person in the latter stages of the International Classic, where he co-ordinated publicity and promotions with our Marketing Companywhere he co-ordinated publicity and promotions with our Marketing Company-Zenith Marketing - and during the event, hosted the media and V.I.P's. Obtaining major sponsorship is proving to be a frustrating exercise in the Current economic climate. The securing of individual event sponsorship current economic climate. The securing of individual event sponsorship will be pursued in 1986, and may lead to a more successful result.

Major activities of this Association - Pennant, Coaching and Tournaments, (Junior & Senior), still take up considerable time and effort from the sub-committee members. It is anticipated that a revised sub-committee autonomy will operate during 1986, and lead to a general lightening of the Executive Committee role. However, the Executive Council will take a much stronger role in the day to day conduct of the affairs of the association.

Victoria supported the major re-structuring of the Australian Table Tennis Association into a Board of Management system following the appointment of Mr.John Ostermeyer as the National Executive Director. The A.T.T.A Council will still consist of six State delegates, but will include the Board of Management which will consist of - President- Mr.L.Wharmby; Vice-President- (Technical) Mr.K.Bowler; Director of Finance Mr.P.Males; Vice-President- (Technical) Mr.K.Bowler; Director of Finance Mr.P.Males; Director of Coaching & Development- Mr.N.Harwood and Director of International Affairs- Mr.N.Bell; the National Executive Director as secretary to the Board.

The Association owes a debt of thanks to many people who are not listed in the Annual Reports or do not achieve prominence on committees. Our particular thanks must go to Mr.Jack Mack who was Chairman of the media committee. Jack and his fellow members have constantly worked at bringing Table Tennis to the public notice in local and daily newspapers, radio and television. Our hosting and entertainment of the media personalities has been a primary function of the Media Chairman, and his work will be missed in 1986 as he has intimated that he cannot continue in the position.

The Executive Committee has introduced a new award - "Honorary Member", to be made to persons who have made a major contribution to Table Tennis who would not normally be nominated for "Life Membership", of the Association. The first award will be made at the 1986 A.G.M.

We look forward to 1986 as a year to concentrate on bringing more players into the sport, tighten our financial base and promote our sport at every opportunity.

MANAGEMENT

2.1 EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE

The Committee in 1985 saw three changes, these being the retirement of Len Haycraft from the Vice-Presidency - Len's work, dedication and sense of fair play will long be remembered by all who associated with him during his long and fruitful period of service to the V.T.T.A., and the A.T.T.A. Mrs.Prisca Rosario was elected to fill the vacancy, and became the first woman Vice President of the V.T.T.A. Mrs.Pamela Holden was subsequently elected to fill the casual vacancy on the Committee. Three new members were elected to the Committee for 1985, Mr.Tommy Danielsson - Mr.Len Kenna - and Mr.Brian Perry. It was most pleasing to have a full Committee for 1985 (15 Members).

Our thanks go to those who served on the many V.T.T.A., Sub-Committees throughout 1984/85. All Committee members were involved with many Sub-Committees which required them to attend meetings and conduct the many facets of Table Tennis administration in which members participate. The State body conducts coaching programmes, major tournaments, pennant competitions, as well as participating in many community activities.

There is a very large workload for Honorary Officials to carry but they are supported by a very professional staff.

2.2 TABLE TENNIS CENTRE OF VICTORIA

Once again there was a drop in V.T.T.A Metropolitan Pennant teams entries, which resulted in less teams using our centre for bookings.

No major repairs or renovations were undertaken pending the result of the proposed re-development scheme but, after an occupancy of 27 years, the Centre is badly in need of complete modernization. Unfortunately, this is not possible at present due to the uncertain future of the entire sporting complexes at Albert Park following the successful appeal against the redevelopment plan by the South Melbourne City Council. A decision on this matter will be forthcoming from the State Government in due course. A new Hot Water System is being installed in the dressing rooms.

Regular patrons, the Victorian Public Service T.T.A., and the Victorian Railways Institute T.T.A., continued to use the centre for all their matches and the Sport City pennant competition promoted by the Melbourne City Council was continued in 1985. The Schools Tabten and Mini-Tabten competition continued to grow to such an extent that a Summer Tabten competition was conducted, and these competitions result in major usage of the centre.

During the Winter, an inaugural Masters Pennant was conducted on Friday nights, and it proved so popular that an additional pennant was conducted in the Spring.

Our Canteen proprieter, Mr.Leon Lau continued his long association with us. His excellent management and service to all patrons of his combined snack bar and Table Tennis equipment shop is a well known feature of the centre. The V.T.T.A appreciates his service.

2.2.1 STAFF

After a long association with us Mrs.Joan Guggenheim, our Office Manager, together with her husband Max, our Caretaker both retired. They rendered a great service to the V.T.T.A., over the years and the V.T.T.A., thanked them with a presentation at the 1985 A.G.M. Mrs.Val Bartolo replaced Joan as Office Manager and together with Mrs.Chris Moore, competently conducted our office affairs for the year. There was an increased work responsibility due to the A.N.Z International Classic being conducted.

Our Development Officer Mr.Rod Lindroth continued with his duties in his usual efficient and businesslike manner. He carried a far greater responsibility with the conducting of the A.N.Z. International Classic and the increased Tabten Schools competitions.

The Cleaning of the Centre has been contracted to Judge Cleaning Services, while casual cleaners look after the centre at weekends and at major Tournaments.

2.2.2 RECEPTIONISTS

1985 saw a much larger turnover than usual, resulting with only Mrs.Dorothy Hemingway and Suzy Javor remaining with us. We were sorry to lose Gina and Vicki. Our new faces are Maxine, Dianne, Karen, Mark and Teanua. As usual they have given prompt and efficient service to our patrons and we look forward to their continued service.

2.2.3 HONORARY MEMBER

Mr.Frank Woodward of Ballarat was made the first "Honorary Member" of the V.T.T.A. Membership nomination is open to all persons affiliated with the V.T.T.A. - Pennant Clubs - Victorian Table Tennis Umpires League - & Table Tennis Coaches Association of Victoria. Presentation of this award will be made annually.

2.3 AFFILIATED ASSOCIATIONS

The number of Associations affiliated in 1985 was Metropolitan 8 (9)-Country 28 (37) a drop of ten. This fall off is most disturbing in view of the finance being made available from the State Government for the promotion and development of Table Tennis.

Never before has any affiliated body been able to conduct coaching programmes, training camps, seminars for Junior & Senior players, promotional visits by the Development Officer or State Coach at a minimal cost. Each Association contacted after failing to renew affiliation advises practically the same answer, no one is prepared to take on the duties of Secretary or Treasurer and promote Table Tennis. Everyone wants to be a player but no one wants to be a 'dooer'. There are some areas even a governing body cannot help with, one of them being able to help find good officials.

The Executive Committee looks forward to a revival of interest in 1986 by all past members and already we have one new association for 1986.

2.4 INTERNATIONAL EVENTS

The 8th Commonwealth and 38th World Championships were conducted by the Isle of Man Association in Douglas, and by the Swedish Association in Gothenberg respectively. Australia was represented by both Mens and Womens Teams which included a top junior player in each team. The teams finished in the following positions:-

Eric Coster (N.S.W) was elected to the Commonwealth Board of Management and to the Council of the I.T.T.F.

At the I.T.T.F.congress, three major decisions were made:-

- To abolish the current teams category system.
- To create a Board of Management comprising the I.T.T.F Officers and the Continental Vice-Presidents, with the Board to meet every 2. six months.
- In International competitions, to restrict the colors of rubber on the respective sides of the racquet to red and black, as from 3. 1st July 1986. With the scientific specifications for red to be announced at a later date.

The 1985 Oceania World Cup Qualifying Tournament was conducted in Sydney by the N.S.W. T.T.A. Tommy Danielsson (Vic) and Gary Haberl (N.S.W.) represented Australia, whilst two other players represented N.Z. winner was Tommy Danielsson who went on to represent Oceania. Tommy finished 12th in the event, which was held in China.

A Victorian Mens State Team, comprising Tommy Danielsson, Glenn Tepper, Alois Rosario with Robert Tuckett as non-playing captain defeated the visiting English team, which competed in the ANZ International Classic, 3/2 at the Eaglehawk/Bendigo Table Tennis Centre. This may well rank as the best ever result by a Victorian Team.

A Victorian combined Mens Team, comprising Rod Carlyle, Paul Tonkin, Glenn Tepper and Alois Rosario, with Robert Tuckett as non-playing captain, lost to the visiting Swedish Team, which competed in the ANZ International Classic - 0/5 at the Ballarat Table Tennis Centre.

Len Haycraft, the International Secretary for the A.T.T.A. for 10 years retired after the 1985 G.P.M.

VICTORIA CUP - ANZ INTERNATIONAL CLASSIC 2.4.1

The first major Multi-National event since 1975 was the highlight of the year. Despite problems of securing early sponsorship - in fact, the event was officially launched to the media at the Southern Cross Hotel without a named sponsor - our marketing advisors, Zenith Marketing securing the ANZ Banking Group - International Division who joined in the promotion 100%.

The five countries invited to send two player teams and manager were in the top 10 in the World ranking - China (1), Sweden (2), Japan (4), Korea (9), England(10). Their support with top players of the calibre of Wang Hui Juan Hui Jun- Erik Lindh- Ulf Carlsson- Alan Cooke- Skylet Andrew and others made the Victoria Cup - International Classic a major event to start the World 1985/1986 season.

The final placings in the teams were 1. Sweden - 2. China - 3. Korea -4. England - 5. Japan - 6. Australia.

The individual event for the Victoria Cup with a prize pool of \$5000, was another triumph for Sweden with Lindh defeating Wang, and Carlsson taking out third place from Jun.

A feature of this event was the opportunity for four local players to qualify for the 16 player draw - the successful players were J.Cooney (Qld), A.Jakubczak(Vic), R.Carlyle(Vic), G.Tepper(Vic), none survived against their International opponents.

The Victorian Table Tennis Umpires League again provided impressive quality of umpiring, and the youngsters who compete in the Junior Regional Competition of Victoria were score recorders - ball persons, and did a fine job throughout the four days of the competition.

The Australian Broadcasting Commission recorded highlights of both teams and individual events for viewing in 1986.

It is intended that the Victoria Cup shall become a regular event on the Victorian Table Tennis calendar.

2.5 COACHING

Coaching in all areas of sport is today leaning very heavily on the sports sciences, i.e. Sports Psychology and Sports Medicine. The Table Tennis Coaches of Victoria are fully aware of this and are working towards educating themselves through several coaching courses conducted by the National Coaching Accreditation Scheme, and also attending lectures and seminars arranged by the Coaches Association. The newly formed Victorian Scientific Coaching Assembly, which consists of all sports science organisations, has added to the education of coaches through talks, discussions and visits to sports performance units.

Victorian Table Tennis elite players have been tested in a research program to determine which energy systems are pertinent to elite table tennis performance. It is hoped that the results from such a study will provide a basis on which training programmes could be devised. This area is of prime importance to coaching. This testing was made available by the Footscray Institute of Technology.

Another area of testing is the Talent identification program which is being conducted by Dr.Noel Blundell, a sports Psychologist and Prof. B. Cade of Melbourne University. It is looking at aspects of 70 players I system, i.e. the psychom-motor testing and visual characteristics. The results of these programmes will certainly aid coaches and players alike in their approach to the game.

2.5.1 COACHING FOR ALL

This is provided at the table Tennis Centre for juniors and seniors. These sessions were conducted by the Association coach, Igor Klaf and were available throughout the year. In addition, coaching was also provided by Tommy Danielsson at Geelong, Ballarat, Croydon and Warrnambool. Nobody is too old to take advantage of these sessions. Paul Bronstein continues to conduct coaching at Caulfield. Beside this, coaching is undertaken by several other coaches in the Metropolitan area and Country Clubs, and Associations such as Diamond Valley, under Prisca Rosario and Coburg Club under Keith Keane and Alois Rosario.

2.5.2 SQUADS AND TEAMS

Coaching for State Squads, U/17 and U/15 were conducted by Igor Klaf. Coaching for State Squads, 0/1/ and U/12 players were also conducted. Additional squads for promising U/14 and U/12 players were also conducted.

CAMPS

Two camps were organised for juniors at the Table Tennis Centre - one for Two camps were organised for juntos country players. The teams camp was non-elite players, and the other for country players. The teams camp was held at Geelong.

In recent years Table Tennis has made significant inroads into Victorian Schools. Considerable time, money and effort is put into this important area.

During 1985 activities were conducted at about 100 schools throughout the State. Many of these involved multiple visits. Some employed our coaches on a professional basis right throughout the year. There were occasions, particularly during second term, when three or four coaches were in different schools at the same time. On one occasion this involved six people.

The increase in teams competing in Tabten (121 - 445 since 1983) has been a direct result of our schools programme.

The schools Table Tennis development is a highly successful aspect of VTTA activities. The next step is to arrange a means by which these youngsters can transfer easily into our Clubs/Associations.

THE COACHES ASSOCIATION 2.5.5

This Association, under the Chairmanship of Mrs.J.Guggenheim has as its Treasurer, Mr.O.Davies and Secretary, Mr.R.Pappalardo. A pre-level 1course has been conducted by T.Barr, with three persons being successful.

2.5.6 NATIONAL COACHING FORUM

This forum was held in August 85' in Melbourne with Victoria represented by the coaching co-ordinator, Mrs.Prisca Rosario. Mr. Shien, the Chinese International player and coach, was in Victoria for 21 days on a coaching assignment where he went to various centres to coach junior and senior players. With so much activity in the coaching area, our sport should go ahead.

UMPIRES LEAGUE REPORT 2.6

Rule changes kept the umpires busy this year. Courses for new umpires were conducted at Geelong by Mr.R.Rowe and at Croydon by Mrs.F.Keyhoe and Peter Ward.

Don Boughton and Bob Jackson became State Umpires.

Various Umpires from the League officiated around the World. Ruth Singer at the World Championships and Macabi Games, Ron Keyhoe at the Asian Championships.

Highlight of the year was the International Classic conducted by Angelo Tabone, and assisted by Clive Gadd and Ron Chadband. Angelo introduced into Australia a concept of Teams of umpires for conducting the matches. The League is prospering with 45 financial members.

2.7 AUSTRALIAN TABLE TENNIS ASSOCIATION

2.7.1 FINANCIAL

The A.T.T.A Treasurer reported a loss of \$16,233 for the financial year ended 30th June, 1985. However, as he explained, this is not the true figure as the previous Treasurer did not allow for unexpended Government grants of \$30,165. All grant monies are now held in a separate grant account, and do not reflect the general funds position whatsoever. Accumulated funds of \$25,462 is the true and actual total assets as at 30th August, 1985.

Player registrations as at 30th August, 1985 are \$5,553. Victoria's share of this figure is \$2,025.

2.7.2 PROCEDURAL CHANGES

- (a) Commencing from 1st January, 1986 the ATTA will be managed by a Board of Management consisting of the President, Vice-President (Technical) Director of Finance, Director of Coaching and Development, and Director of International Affairs, with the National Executive Director as the Board Secretary.
- (b) Future General Personal meetings will be held at a time other than during the Australian Championships.
- (c) The financial year of the ATTA will now be the calendar year.
- (d) The State Affiliation fee has been raised to \$500.
- (e) The travel levy is discontinued.
- (f) The new ITTF rule on the restriction of the colors used on bats (black & red) will apply to the 1986 Australian Closed, Open and Junior Championships and to all other Open Events in Championships/ Tournaments other than Veterans, Special or graded events as from 1st January 1987.
- (g) Players entering Junior events shall be required to produce an extract of birth certificate.
- (h) There shall only be 10 rankings in all Open and Junior categories with no equal ranking positions.
- (i) The Australian Closed Championships will be conducted at times other than at the Open Championships commencing in 1986.

- The ATTA will appoint Vice-Patrons in future. (i)
- Mrs. Suzy Javor was awarded Life Membership of the ATTA for her mrs. Suzy davot man the manner in contribution to Table Tennis as a player, and for the manner in (k) which she conducted herself during her illustrious career. Suzy is the first woman to be honoured by Life Membership of the ATTA which makes her The first Lady.

NATIONAL TABLE TENNIS LEAGUE 2.7.3

Unfortunately after an excellent year in 1984, and despite a concerted effort by the Organising Committee, the 1985 National League competition did not eventuate. The reasons were twofold: Firstly, despite the object-

ions of the NTTL Sub-Committee, the ATTA decided on several changes at the 1984 GPM which severely limited the scope of the competition as it applied at the time.

Secondly, the apathy of some of the clubs in either not replying to correspondence or even indicating their willingness to participate. Only two existing clubs, namely Ballarat and Brighton (S.A.) submitted teams by the closing date, whilst no new teams entered. This resulted in the organising committee resigning. The National Executive Director has initiated discussions for reintroducing a similar competition in 1986.

A.T.T.A. COUNCIL 2.7.4

During the year, the following changes occurred. The Office Bearers appointed at the GPM will remain in office until the 31st December, 1985, after which the council will consist of the Board of Management plus the State delegates.

Mr.L.Haycraft, the International Secretary retired and was replaced by Mr. N. Bell who is also the acting secretary. Mr. R. Robertson, delegate for S.A. resigned and was replaced by Mr.G.Goss.

3.6 FRENCH AWARDS

6. ADMINISTRATION REVIEW.

This committee continued to meet in the early part of the year. Financial figures given by the Association Treasurer on the cost of conducting pennant led the Committee to believe metropolitan pennant could be a viable proposition.

7. DEVELOPMENT OFFICER.

Mr.Lindroth has continued to be a valuable member of the YTTA staff. The Schools coaching programme again proved a great success and, due to the success achieved in 1984, a special grant was obtained from the Department success achieved in to extend this work. A grant in excess of \$2,000 of Sport & Recreation to extend this work. A grant in excess of \$2,000 was obtained to assist in the preparation for 'School's starter kit', which will be available early in 1986.

Much of the YTTA's good image with the Department of Sport & Recreation is due to the high regard in which Mr.Lindroth is held by that Department's Officers. This has also resulted in him being asked to serve on various sub-committee's of the State Sports Council such as that connected with the problem of retention of Juniors in sport. A considerable portion of the Development Officers time in 1985 was spent in various aspects of the arrangements for the ANZ International Classic, and he deserves much praise for his efforts in this area.

While major sponsorships have again proved difficult to obtain, a steady flow of smaller amounts has been obtained. A new and late addition has been that of the Nestle' Company who have agreed to assist in the Schools' programme. The grants received from Sport & Recreation for assistance to players in several areas must also be attributed at least in part, to the Development Officers role.

8. IN APPRECIATION.

The Victorian Association has always been fortunate in having the support of many organisations, both Commercial and Government. Such support enabled the Association to provide services to our members at a reasonable cost - without this support fees and rates would rise dramatically.

Staff members give great help and advice to this Association, especially Peter Phair, Scott Chapman, Michael Scott, to name a few, and particular thanks to Mr.N.Tresize.

The Media gave us good support during the year, particularly during the ANZ International Classic - our Media Committee was most active.

To the many individuals who gave their time and energy to our sport during the year, we offer our thanks - but they are too many to list in this report.

9. ADDENDUM.

As forescast in the 1984 Annual Report, your Executive took strong steps to reverse the adverse financial result of 1984 and it is pleasing to report that close supervision of all aspects of expenditure and a reduced budget for some aspects of the sport resulted in a much improved report. However, losses of affiliated associations, presumably because of the player registration fee, and pennantteams was still evident and efforts will be made to reverse this trend.

The ANZ International Classic and the Victoria Cup event gave Table Tennis an enhanced public image and again showed that the YTTA has the capability to stage successfully international events of the highest calibre. It was pleasing to see the support given to this event by table tennis players, and preliminary plans are in hand to stage a similar event in 1987.

Once again our top Senior and Junior players brought success to Victoria in both the Teams and Individual events at the National Championships. While a large measure of credit for this success must go to the dedication of the players, we should also note the work done by our coaches and officials in preparing the Teams.

1985 Saw the loss of valued members of the VTTA. In February, Mrs.Joan Guggenheim retired from our administrative staff after seventeen years of valuable service. Joan's dedication to the VTTA went well past that required of a loyal employee, and her media title of Mrs Table Tennis was well deserved. August saw the retirement of Len Haycraft from the VTTA and ATTA, both of which he served with distinction in senior positions. Len will be sorely missed from both bodies and his experience will be hard to replace.

At the 1985 Annual General Meeting three new members were elected to the Executive Committee to bring this body to full strength. Asthese and other comparatively new members gain experience the VTTA should continue to be well served by the Executive.

The proposed redevelopment of the Centre together with Badminton, Squash and Basketball has been stalled by a successful appeal by the South Melbourne City Council against a planning permit for the project. However an enquiry into all aspects of Albert Park has been instigated by the State Government and it is expected that the impasse will be overcome in 1986.

Late in 1985 the VTTA was offered a subsidy by the Department of Sport & Recreation to employ a part-time Sports Promotion Officer. Such positions are offered only to State Associations who can fulfil quite stringent requirements and it is a further measure of the standing of Table Tennis that the VTTA was chosen. This position should compliment the work of our Development Officer, especially in Schools, and further spread the message that Table Tennis is a sport well worth playing.

I wish to thank all those Executive Committee members who have supported me in 1985, especially the Executive Council members, who work so hard to keep the Association functioning at the level which keeps Victoria as the Premier Table Tennis State.
