VICTORIAN TABLE TENNIS ASSOCIATION43rd ANNUAL REPORT - 1972

Ladies and Gentlemen,

The year 1972 was in most ways a continuation of 1971. In fact it was even busier as, in a period of two months, the Victorian Championships, a tour by a team from the Peoples Republic of China, and the Australian Championships, were all held in Melbourne.

Victorian teams at National Championships took a fair share of honours, winning four shields out of a possible eight. Again we had to bow to the very strong New South Wales mens team, but our womens team maintained the supremacy which it has held since 1958 i.e., fifteen years in succession. In the individual events, Victorian players won, or shared in winning, twelve events out of a possible fourteen including every senior and junior title. Congratulations are due to our players, State Coach, team leaders and coaching committee members.

The Barna Award for the Australian Senior Player of the Year went to Joy Brown of New South Wales and the Junior Player of the Year to Kay Chigwidden of South Australia. The Trudek Award, given annually to the State which is foremost in Australia, was again presented to Victoria.

Only one international party came to Victoria in 1972, but when such a party comes from the world's champion table tennis nation and consists of twenty-one persons, we are well satisfied. An account of the tour is given in Item 5.1 of this report.

Affiliated Associations continued to prosper in 1972, particularly in the country, where interest is at a high level. The most pleasing feature is the number of new halls being opened in the country. In 1972, modern facilities were built in Shepparton, Traralgon, Yarrawonga and Sale. However, facilities in Melbourne, apart from the Table Tennis Centre, are very poor in quantity and quality. It is hoped that the new Ministry of Youth, Sport and Recreation will assist with funds to establish new suburban centres and/or improve existing ones.

In junior table tennis the position was similar to that in 1971, very strong at the higher levels but somewhat lacking in depth in comparison with some earlier years. Coaching in schools has been recommenced in part, through the help of Table Tennis Promotions, who have been sending players to a number of interested schools. In addition, Mr. Clive Gadd has been appointed Schools Liaison Officer and a schools pennant, introduced in 1971, has continued.

Interest in Winter and Summer pennant competitions run by the VTTA was high in 1972 with a greater number of teams competing than for some years past. Much concern was felt in connection with womens pennant, where there was a large variation in team strengths. Suggestions to overcome this situation have been put to clubs and players concerned.

The Table Tennis Centre of Victoria continued to be a popular venue for pennant teams and the general public. Increased charges for 1972 were applied so that a fund, to assist Victorian players selected to represent Australia, could be created. It is also intended to use money from this fund to subsidise any player who, being considered worthy of subsidy, is going overseas for coaching, or to assist in bringing a top international coach to Victoria. The fund has had an auspicious beginning with subsidies being given to the four players and team manager, all Victorians, who have been selected as members of the Australian teams for the 1973 Commonwealth and World Championships.

PENNANT COMPETITIONS

1.1 METROPOLITAN WINTER PENNANT

This was conducted from 18th April to 17th August. There were 38 mens grades and eight womens grades, making a total of 364 teams. This represented an increase of 31 teams over the 1971 entry. The 1972 competition was run on the same basis as the 1971 competition. Two possible changes for next season were investigated by means of questionnaires put to teams that would be likely to be affected by the changes. These were:

1. The deletion of doubles in Womens A2 Grade (arising from a recommendation made at the 1971 AGM), and
2. A change of night for Mens and Womens A Grade (arising from the overbooking of the Table Tennis Centre on Wednesday night by 10 teams who, as a result, were obliged to change nights, find another home ground or withdraw).

The clubs questioned were 5 to 2 in favour of retention of doubles in Womens A2 Grade and almost unanimously opposed to a change of A Grade pennant night.

Further matters currently under investigation owing to a number of reasons are:

1. Re-structuring of Womens A Grade
2. Re-introduction of Monday night pennant, and
3. Scheduling of all A Grade matches at the Table Tennis Centre.

Pennants were again presented at the Presentation Night supper dance at 9 Darling Street, South Yarra.

5. SPECIAL EVENTS5.1 INTERNATIONAL EVENTS

Probably the most publicized visit of table tennis players ever to come to Melbourne commenced at midday on Thursday 27th July 1972, when the Chinese Table Tennis Delegation of the Peoples Republic of China arrived at Tullamarine Airport.

The Delegation comprised five officials, two coaches, ten players (six men and four women), two newsmen, a television man and a doctor - 21 persons in all.

Accompanying the Delegation were the Australian TTA President, Mr. Laurie Wharmby, two Australian players, Paul Pinkewich of NSW and Anne McMahon of South Australia, two members of the Commonwealth Government and two representatives of the sponsors.

Sponsorship of the tour was organised by the television station TVW7 of Perth, in Victoria the local station GTV9 represented the sponsors.

An itinerary, listing all activities on an hour to hour basis, was drawn up and taken to Sydney by the VTTA Honorary Secretary and discussed with the Delegation leaders on their arrival from New Zealand on the Saturday prior to the Melbourne visit. General agreement was reached but the presence of a Taiwanese womens basketball team in Sydney caused tremendous concern to the Chinese Delegation. At one stage the visitors were adamant that they would depart without a match played and only protracted negotiations by ATTA officials in almost night-long sittings prevented this tragedy. The fact that the Taiwanese were due to arrive in Melbourne on the same day, Wednesday 26th July, as the Chinese Delegation added fuel to the discontent and, only by postponement of their arrival in Melbourne by one day, could the Delegation be prevailed upon to continue with their Australian itinerary.

Matches were held at the Dallas Brooks Hall, Victoria Parade, East Melbourne, the first time this venue has been used for table tennis. Admission was \$2, \$3 and \$4 in various sections and virtually all seats were sold in advance.

The matches played on both the Thursday and Friday evenings consisted of two womens singles and two mens singles before an interval; then a mixed doubles, a womens singles, a mens singles and finally, a mens doubles exhibition between two Chinese pairs.

Victorian players participating were C. Wuvanich, M. LeGassick and L. Morrow, whilst P. Pinkewich and A. McMahon completed the Australian representation. The standard of play was excellent and the capacity crowds, the great majority of whom were probably strangers to table tennis, were most appreciative.

On Thursday evening a direct telecast of one hour's duration was made by GTV9, resulting in wide exposure and excellent publicity.

On Friday morning a 1½ hour exhibition session for school children was held at the Dallas Brooks Hall. Admission was 40 cents and again the hall was packed.

Friday afternoon was intended to be a free period with provision for shopping, walking etc., but a request was made to visit the Waterside Workers Federation recreation hall and this was arranged. A small crowd was in attendance but spectators and players appeared to enjoy themselves.

With the scheduled matches completed, Saturday morning was used as a leisure period. An official luncheon was given by one of Melbourne's Chinese Community groups, after which all members of the visiting party boarded the coach for a trip to the Healesville Fauna Sanctuary where the kangaroos in

particular received great attention. Those Victorians fortunate enough to be in the coach were entertained on the way back by some very pleasant Chinese singing.

On Saturday evening there was a reception, entertainment and supper organised by the VTTA, the Australia-China Society, the Chinese Fellowship and the Students Chinese Cultural Club. This reception was also held in the Dallas Brooks Hall and, to defray the costs, tickets were on sale at \$1.00 each. A large crowd, predominantly local Chinese, attended. The evening was particularly pleasing to the VTTA officials because it was organised by a combination of people from each of the four groups mentioned and a great many new friendships resulted. Some speeches were made, the entertainment was unusual and first class and culminated in a song from the Delegation delivered from the foyer steps to the mass of people all around.

One very noticeable feature of all appearances by the visiting players was the spontaneous and enthusiastic cheering and clapping given when they entered or left the hall.

On Sunday morning the Chinese players visited the Table Tennis Centre of Victoria, and spent an hour practising with the Victorian State Junior players. Then, after a light lunch at the motel, it was time to leave for the airport. And it was at Tullamarine at 1.30pm on Sunday 30th July that another large crowd farewelled them.

Although the language barrier made organisation difficult, every question having to be asked through an interpreter, and it being necessary to follow strict protocol at all times, it is undoubtedly true to say that the Chinese Table Tennis Delegation of the Peoples Republic of China were keen to be friendly and anxious to be co-operative. In both of these aims they were very successful and they left behind the strongest feeling that we would like to see them again in the near future.

5.2 EXCHANGE OF TEAMS WITH SOUTH AUSTRALIA

For some years the Victorian Table Tennis Association has been subsidising teams and players to go to the City of Adelaide Championships, which are held in late January each year. Similarly, the South Australian Table Tennis Association has been a staunch supporter of the Riversdale-Halex Easter Tournament held each year in Melbourne. During the 1972 Easter period, discussions were held with South Australian officials with a view to increasing this exchange of players between the two States. The aim being to foster interest among players and provide greater experience against more varied opposition for those selected.

With these aims in mind, to obtain the greatest value with the least cost it was agreed to the following:

That a team of two men and two women would be sent from South Australia; the four players would compete in the Victorian Championships and then play a combined match against a mixed Victorian team on the day following the Victorian Championships, the match to consist of four mens singles, four womens singles and one mixed doubles.

The following week a Victorian team of two men and two women would be sent to Adelaide and similarly play in the South Australian Championships and then against a South Australian team on the day after these Championships. Each State would provide fares and meal allowances for its own players.

The Victorian team which subsequently played in Melbourne on Saturday evening, 15th July, comprised A.Savidge, J.Williams, V.Woodward and L.Morrow. The South Australian team was A.Frankenburg, R.Kelly, L.Hourigan and J.Chigwidden. The match resulted in a 8/1 win to Victoria.

The Victorian team which played in Adelaide on Saturday evening, 22nd July, comprised G.Munday, J.Williams, V.Woodward and R.Greenwood. This match resulted in a 7/2 win to Victoria.

6.3 FRENCH AWARD

For 1972 this award went to Mary LeGassick. Mary commenced the year slowly, still suffering from the after effects of a serious illness in 1971, but she finished brilliantly with a magnificent treble in the Australian Championships. It is the first time this award has been made to Mary and is a fitting honour to a great sportswoman.

6.4 JUNIOR PLAYER OF THE YEAR AWARD

Andrew Savage was the worthy recipient of this award for 1972. He has been in the forefront of our very strong junior players for several years, and has some excellent wins in open company to his credit. As with the French Award winner his conduct on and off the court is exemplary.

7. TOP PLAYERS LADDER

This scheme was introduced to encourage metropolitan players to participate in Country Championships. In 1971 it became evident that it was not achieving the desired aims and it was accordingly dispensed with in 1972.

8. TABLE TENNIS CENTRE OF VICTORIA

The Table Tennis Centre was again the venue for all major events conducted in Victoria with the Australian Championships being the highlight of the year.

8.1 BUILDING

During the year the major improvement to the building was the separation and decoration of the foyer area. In addition, a great deal of repainting was done which generally brightened the Centre. Of considerable concern is the amount of wanton destruction which has occurred this year. Apart from the nuisance value of such damage, the cost of repairs places a heavy burden on the Centre's finances.

8.2 STAFF

Once again the day to day running of the Centre has been in the capable hands of Mrs. J.Guggenheim, who was ably assisted by Miss D.Moore and Mrs.J.Dougall.

8.3 DUTY OFFICERS

We wish to thank all those who have worked as Duty Officers this year. Special mention must be made of the valuable services of Mrs.B.Bibo and Mrs. L.Lemke.

8.4 ALBERT PARK COMMITTEE OF MANAGEMENT

We extend our thanks to Mr.P.J.Kennelly and his Committee for their help during the year.

9. WESTERN SUBURBS TABLE TENNIS CENTRE

The building is in Garden Street, Williamstown. It is operated by the Western Suburbs TTA which is doing a fine job under difficult conditions. The Centre is catering for approximately 66 teams and is maintaining a venue for players in nearby areas. Unfortunately the building is in rather a poor state of repair and requires a large capital outlay to bring conditions up to a satisfactory level. During the latter quarter of 1972 an investigatory committee was set up to enquire into, and make recommendations upon, the requirements of this centre and to consider the possibilities of alternative accommodation. As the balance of monies outstanding on the centre, approximately \$11,000, is due during 1973 and the amount of money necessary to improve the Centre is likely to be quite large, the Executive Committee is faced with a serious problem concerning the future of this Centre. It is however determined in its desire to maintain table tennis in the Western Suburbs area.

10. COACHING

On 18th October 1971, the Coaching Sub-committee, which had been defunct for some years, was reformed with Dr.Bayly as chairman. In the re-organisation of sub-committees after the 1972 Annual General Meeting Mr.Ward became chairman of this sub-committee until his retirement in November '72.

On 15th November 1971, Mr.C.Wuvanich was appointed as VTTA Coach. His task was to conduct 14 hours of coaching per week, nine with a squad of senior players and five with a squad of junior players.

Also on 15th November it was decided to invite senior players of top class and those with promise to form a "senior squad". The invitation made known that certain strict regulations would be applied concerning attendance, punctuality, application etc. and that the squad would meet on three occasions per week until pennant re-commenced when it would be reduced to two sessions per week. The squad commenced on 29th November, 1971 and over the following months fifteen men and five women participated.

A squad for juniors was also formed at this time.

On 22nd May 1972, the normal type State Squad commenced operations. Whereas the earlier senior squad contained players whose prime qualification for being coached was enthusiasm and a willingness to work, but whose playing ability was not likely to obtain them a berth in the State Teams, the State Squad contained only players from whom the State Teams would be selected or players whose practice form was useful to the others.

The State Squad comprised twelve men and twelve women and attended training on one night per week under coach C. Wuvanich. In addition, all members were invited to join the senior "top" squad, which continued its practice sessions, whenever they desired. From 5th February to 25th March the usual mass coaching of juniors was held over a seven week period on Saturday afternoons. This scheme was made self-supporting by players paying 50 cents each. There were eight coaches who each had about ten players in their care.

Coaching of juniors on a more limited scale continued on Saturday mornings and afternoons throughout the year.

During the August school holidays a week of free coaching for school children was held. An expense allocation of \$200 was made for coaching fees, balls, bat and table hire. Television Channel GTV9 supported this session by TV news coverage, and this publicity was the direct result of capacity crowds of children on each day. It is hoped that, with the help of GTV9, a similar week will be held in 1973.

The Association wishes to record its appreciation of the untiring efforts of the coaches who are doing so much to lift the standard of our young players.

1. AFFILIATED ASSOCIATIONS

Affiliations for 1972 showed a slight drop from 64 to 61, in spite of a boom in country table tennis. The decline is mainly due to the failure of some well known associations to re-affiliate.

This matter is all the more serious because some of these associations have participated in competition with affiliated associations which believed the offenders to be affiliated. Also their leading players have competed in open tournaments conducted by affiliated associations.

The Victorian TTA intends to enforce the VTТА and ATТА regulations on this matter, which could lead to certain associations and players being declared "not in good standing".

It is totally unfair that any association should claim the privileges of being affiliated while declining to contribute towards the cost of maintaining and expanding our sport.

It was pleasing to receive affiliations for the first time from Fish Creek, Cobden, Underbool and Mansfield. For the first time since the ATTA permitted double-affiliation by border associations, Finley in the Riverina joined in our Country Championships.

These Championships drew 103 entries, and we are grateful to the "Weekly Times" for its continued sponsorship.

An interesting development in the country was the formation of the Warrnambool Minor Associations teams and individual championships, which were decided at Warrnambool in May, for the Bill Edwards Shield (presented by the VTTA) and the John Bowers Shield. Many Western District associations took part.

In the North East region, an inter-association pennant competition had a successful second season, with a zone championship held at Myrtleford.

A fine multi-sports centre was opened at Shepparton, with leading Victorian table tennis players giving exhibitions, and new table tennis stadiums were completed at Yarrawonga and Traralgon.

St.Arnaud and Bairnsdale Councils are investigating the construction of multi-sports centres including table tennis.

With the creation of a State Ministry of Youth, Sport and Recreation, more money should be available for table tennis stadiums and we hope to hear of more such developments in 1973.

For the first time, the Metropolitan Atlas Shield contest was conducted at a weekend in August, with 20 teams competing in three grades.

Late in October, an Atlas Shield team of J.LeGassick, R.Connell and J.Loughnan spent a long weekend as guests of the Table Tennis Council of North West Tasmania, the VTTA providing air fares.

Open tournaments were held in 1972 by the following affiliated associations:- Geelong (2), Ballarat, Yea, Donald, Yarrawonga, Horsham, Echuca, Sunraysia and Shepparton. All were well supported by local and Melbourne players.

Ballarat were hosts for the Victorian Subjunior Teams Championships in September

During the week commencing August 20, a New South Wales Country Womens team of Mesd. M.Cook, D.Selmes and Misses L.Manser and R.Poon, with Mr.Ron Poon as manager, toured Victoria. They defeated a North-Eastern team at Yarrawonga and lost to Shepparton, Ballarat, Warrnambool, Geelong, Traralgon and a combined Victorian Country team of S.Campbell (Geelong), S.Gilbert and K.Woodward (Ballarat).

At the same time a Victorian Mens Country team of C.Campbell and C.Johnston (Geelong), P.Kluge (Traralgon) and K.Eyers(Ballarat) manager-driver, toured NSW country centres. They had an unbeaten tour, beating Goulburn 8/3, NSW Country (at Maitland) 6/5, Newcastle 7/4, Woolongong (Illawarra) 9/2, Berrima 9/2 and Southern NSW at Goulburn 7/4.

Separate Annual Meetings of Country and Metropolitan Affiliated Associations were held at the Table Tennis Centre of Victoria in June and October respectively.

11.2 ATLAS SHIELD FOR METROPOLITAN ASSOCIATIONS

At the Annual Meeting of Metropolitan Affiliated Associations in October 71, it was recommended that instead of being held over a series of consecutive Fridays, Atlas Shield in 1972 should be held during one weekend.

This recommendation was accepted by the VTAA and on 3rd May 1972, entries were invited for the weekend of 28th - 30th July.

The Chinese tour arrangements caused a clash of dates, so the Atlas contest was changed to the weekend of 4th - 6th August.

Twenty teams representing nine metropolitan associations were entered, but one Public Service team in C Grade was withdrawn, leaving 19 to compete. This was a reduction of 7 teams from 1971.

The eight entries in A Grade was the best for many years, and Public Service retained the Shield after a close contest with Insurance in the play-off.

Shields and pennants were presented at the Annual Meeting of Affiliated Associations on 6th October. The meeting recommended that individual championships be added to the contest in 1973, to be played at a weekend after the teams event.

12. PROMOTION

1972 will go down as a good year for Victorian table tennis promotion. It commenced under the guidance of Ron Atkin, who unfortunately due to pressure of outside commitments had to resign from the Executive Committee, and continued under Peter Mascall.

During the year our major tournaments were sponsored. The Easter Championships, as usual, were sponsored by the Riversdale Manufacturing Co.; the Victorian

Championships by the Nittaku distributors, Table Tennis Promotions and by Theo Moratis; the junior titles by the Shell Company of Australia and the Australian Championships by Patra Fine Foods, with whom we are establishing a very valuable link.

Many other companies have assisted us in smaller but still valuable ways during the year, and this has kept our trophy account to reasonable proportions.

The tour by the Chinese Delegation was by far the biggest promotion of 1972. It has been dealt with elsewhere in this report.

We say "thank you" to each sponsor, company and individual who came to our assistance in the past twelve months and hope that we will continue to meet in sport in 1973.

13. PUBLICITY

Publicity-wise, this year must surely go down as the most successful ever, owing to the amount of coverage given to our sport by the press, radio and television. This of course was brought about by the Australian tour of the Delegation from the Peoples Republic of China.

"Ping Pong Diplomacy" enjoyed top nationwide news coverage from the moment the delegation arrived in Sydney. This was followed with an excellent coverage of their visit to Victoria.

Special mention should be made here in appreciation of the television stations. HSV7 showed film of the Chinese exhibition in Hong Kong which created a tremendous amount of interest and was an excellent forerunner to the visit by the Chinese. GTV9 gave an excellent coverage of the friendly match played at Sir Dallas Brooks Hall between Australia and China, and then followed up with their sponsorship of a Junior Coaching Clinic in the week prior to the Australian Championships. ABV2 then added to our publicity bonanza with an excellent coverage of the Australian Championship finals night. These championships had to compete with the Olympic Games for publicity, and unfortunately suffered accordingly, although some coverage was given by the Herald and Age.

The Age continues to give year round space to our sport, highlighted this year by Leanne Morrow being awarded the "Age Caltex" sports star for the month of May.

The "Weekly Times" continues to support and cover the Country Championships. Their help is warmly appreciated.

Colour photographs were featured in the new magazine "All Sport" and regular coverage of our sport will be featured in this publication in the coming year.

Gathering publicity, and obtaining its coverage, is a time consuming task, and help from anyone who feels they may have something to offer in this field would be most appreciated.

14. UMPIRES LEAGUE

Once again the League continued to carry out its task to the full. Led by C.Gadd, President and Miss R.Singer, Honorary Secretary, the League has provided referees on Tuesdays, Wednesdays and Thursdays for both winter and summer pennants. It also provided two umpires for the Centre Court on Wednesdays during winter pennant.

Clive Gadd was referee for the Australian Championships and the Chinese matches in Victoria. The League also provided referees and umpires for all VTTA tournaments, the City of Coburg Championships and most country tournaments.

Three State umpires qualified this year, these being Miss H.Dent, L.Oates and Mrs.P.Price. R.Chadband and C.Gadd were Victoria's representatives on the National Umpires Committee.

In conclusion, the League thanks the VTTA for its support and encouragement.

15. A.T.T.A.

The outstanding event of the Australian Association year was the visit to Australia of a table tennis delegation from the People's Republic of China. (see 5.1)

This visit gave the sport of table tennis extensive publicity and should benefit the funds of the ATTA and participating States.

Another event, the result of which is not yet known, was the disintegration of the Asian Table Tennis Federation, of which Australia and New Zealand have been Associate Members. With Japan and China as the prime movers, a new Asian Table Tennis Union was formed and held its first Asian Championships in Peking, China, from 2nd - 13th September. Australia was not invited to join the Union. It is probable that the future of Asian table tennis will be prominent on the agenda of the International Table Tennis Federation in April 1973 at Sarajevo, Yugoslavia.

At the General Personal Meeting of the ATTA, held in Melbourne from 28th August to 1st September, life-membership of the ATTA was conferred upon Mr.Keith Bowler, Honorary International Secretary.

The ATTA decided to send to the 1973 Commonwealth Championships in Wales and the World Championships in Yugoslavia official mens and womens teams, and voted \$2,500.00 to the expenses of the teams.

At the Annual General Meeting, Messrs. Savige, Leder, Cleaves, Somogyi and Beer retired in accordance with the Constitution. With the exception of Mr.Somogyi, all stood for re-election and were returned to office. Mr.Trevor Munday was elected to the vacancy caused by the retirement of Mr.Somogyi.

During May, Mr.R.Atkin retired because of the pressure of business. Mr.Len Haycraft, an ex-Treasurer of the VTAA and the present Treasurer of the ATTA, was appointed by the Committee to fill the vacancy until the 1973 Annual General Meeting.

Whilst remembering the achievements of those at the pinnacle of the pyramid, the much greater number who provide the rest of the structure must not be forgotten because adequate competition in all grades is a prerequisite for a champion in any sport.

As usual, I would like to conclude with a genuine "thank you" to all the

friends and relations, and others who just like table tennis, who have helped the players in so many ways or who have helped and encouraged the committees by their very presence.
