Presidents Report

TTV has had a remarkable year as a sporting body and as a membership organisation. Our playing membership has passed 4,000 for the first time, an increase of 5%, and we now have 46 affiliated associations, some of which have multiple clubs.



On the close of 2013 we de-commissioned our membership system in preparation for an introduction of a new membership system,

now in the early days of implementation that provides us with a modern marketing tool and with key data to run our business. It also provides us with specific table tennis capabilities to allocate rating points to players, which they can access in graphic form via the web. Tournament software, which is linked to both the membership and player point's modules, is well developed and should be implemented in the next six months.

Our Finance and Audit Committee continues to provide strategic financial direction and we will achieve a healthy surplus this year. On the cusp of 2014 we also upgraded our financial system to Xero, which we are finding just as capable as MYOB, but easier to use. At the same time we have adopted a strategy of using an external accounting firm to assist us on a regular basis with financial accounting.

Our enhanced grant performance in 2012 and 2013 assisted in obtaining new financial grants and project funding including a substantial 'Access All Abilities' grant for 2 years, and we have undertaken a number of initiatives, particularly with regard to Culturally and Linguistically Diverse participants. Grants to review membership and to conduct coaching were also received. We thank the Victorian government and in particular the support of our outgoing Minister, Hugh Delahunty, and Sport and Recreation Victoria for having faith in our ability to deliver.

The approach of the Board in becoming more strategic and empowering the CEO and staff to attend to operational matters has continued to produce results, with more timely operational decisions and a broader approach by the Board to policy issues. The Board re-affirmed its policy of providing the opportunity for affiliates to conduct major championships, rather than having TTV run these events and we have seen affiliates, particularly Croydon and Ballarat this year, run excellent and profitable events.

TTV adopted a new Constitution in 2013. It was necessary to do this to comply with changes in the Victorian Association Act, and to tidy up a few areas, which had become

outdated. The changes were passed unanimously and TTV has now prepared and provided all clubs with a template constitution, which will meet the new requirements.

Another significant improvement in 2013 was in branding of the organisation. We were fortunate to have a major advertising agency provide us with *pro bono* assistance with this branding which flows across all mediums, including our new state uniforms for 2014.

I would like to thank all Board Members for providing balance and sound judgment across a range of issues in 2013. Sporting bodies are riddled with politics and people seeking personal advantage. Finding a group that collectively is unselfish and genuinely dedicated to providing sound stewardship to the organisation is enormously rewarding. The assistance of our Finance and Audit Committee members in the detailed financial management of the sport has also been greatly appreciated by all the Board.

Finally, I would like to thank the dedicated staff of TTV. Anne King and her team of Brinnen Reiss and Brad Clements worked tirelessly over extremely long hours to provide services to members over the last year. Anne's passion for TTV to be the best sporting organisation in Victoria has seen a distinct change in the recognition our sport is gaining from government and other stakeholders. With Brinnen leaving us early in the New Year we wish him all the best in his future ventures.

Chief Executive Officer Report

As an organisation and with the support of our Associations we felt confident enough to implement a new Constitution, which was unanimously endorsed at the 2013 AGM. It aligned Table Tennis with best practice governance principles and provided the much needed foundation to strengthen our position as a State Sporting Body along with our peers.



The commitment of the Board under the Chairmanship of Phillip Carruthers, and the supportive environment of the Board members provided direction, wise counsel and leadership to extend our strategic thinking and progress initiatives earlier than anticipated. I would like to take this opportunity to thank Phillip and the Board members for their personal support, as well as their involvement in various committees and projects. A special mention of Phil Davis who was a major contributor to the various operating functions and someone who was always available and willing to assist.

Advocating and lobbying for table tennis as a priority sport with local and state government is a key activity and one that our associations and members may not see. However, the benefit is for all as without this action, we would not receive consideration when local councils and government are allocating limited space for the competing sports. Whilst some of our associations are comfortable in their facilities, others struggle for space and time allocation. Mornington and Werribee are two of our associations who have been endorsed and will benefit from expansion. We know there are more people playing social table tennis and our aim is to ensure that there are venues to capture this active recreation space.

Whilst under consideration for some time, we were delighted to receive the support and pro bono assistance from the internationally recognised firm of R-Co, who developed our new logo. After many months of research and consultation the design was finally endorsed and features the connection of the bat and ball in a V shape. The clean and corporate look has been accepted well within the industry and has been used as an example for other organizations looking to update their brand.

We have received good support and guidance from Sport & Recreation Victoria with being awarded a significant grant under the Access All Abilities funding program, which we will implement in 2014. I would like to acknowledge the Department of Transport, Planning & Local Infrastructure (Sport & Recreation Victoria) for providing much needed funding, and

VicSport for their ongoing support and supplementary grants. Our relationships have further grown with the Victorian Olympic Committee including table tennis in their Meet the Olympians program, School Sport Victoria, La Trobe University as well as many other partners and supporters.

A special mention of Robert and Andrea Kapsipis, and their family at Affordable Table Tennis. As well as being our gold sponsor, Robert and Andrea are also generous in their support to the table tennis community by providing scholarships to our junior and aspiring athletes, discounts to associations and players, and truly have the best interests of table tennis at heart. I would also like to thank our other sponsor Cyngler Kaye Levy Lawyers who provide much needed wise counsel on our compliance requirements.

Our membership numbers reached the magic 4,000 in 2013 and this could not have been achieved without the wonderful and dedicated tireless work of the volunteers who run our Associations. It is always left to the too few to carry out the majority of the work and this is very evident across all our Associations.

We could not operate and exist without the members of our various committees of Finance & Audit, Information & Communications Technology, Junior, Senior, Veterans, Points, the Junior, Senior & Veterans Selectors, the Tournaments Directors and helpers, the Country Championships Committee, the Umpires & Referees, together with the Senior, Veterans and AWD Team Managers. These dedicated and loyal table tennis people are the ones you can always count on to do the extra when asked. A special mention of Bob Grattidge, Lois McConnell and Pam Tait whose names keep on coming up and are on speed dial. A big thank you to Belgin Bennett who is providing the Veterans with much appreciated communication and to Helen Pottage for being the tournament voice.

Whilst we had been looking for a solution to our website, membership, competition and points system for some time, it became clear that there was no easy solution for all three, and if there was, the cost would be prohibited. With the retirement of Phil Davis and a clear strategy that we would expand our partners and providers, and look to piggy back off the financial development that the other sports had invested, we acted to introduce a new system. We understood that it was not going to be easy and a big change for our Associations. The Board made the tough decision to look to the long term and with the interest of current and future players. We engaged Interact Sport understanding that there needed to be further development and refinement, but knowing that we would be creating an interface which would keep pace with the industry and expectation of our members, particularly the young who are the key to our future. A thank you to Edwin Cotter who had been a long standing member of the Points Committee, and who continues to ensure that knowledge is not lost as we move forward.

Our President's forum is now firmly in our calendar and an opportunity for the Board to receive input and the associations to share best practice. Phillip and I continue to make club visits where possible and I know I always take away a "light bulb' moment and enjoy the feedback whether positive or negative.

Our successful country week keeps on growing and this would not be possible without the hard work of Jennifer Mee, chair Bill Freeman and the work of the committee. We continue to look for ways on how we can improve this showcase for our country associations.

As a state we are punching above our weight with our talented and dedicated athletes. Our athletes whether junior, senior or veterans continue to inspire us and are role models for the rest of us, and the wider community. We understand the personal and financial sacrifices they make to pursue their sport.

A special mention to Croydon & District Table Tennis Association, for hosting the very successful National Junior Championships, and an acknowledgement to John Mackey, Greg Bristow, Sue West and their team for their contribution and organisation. A special mention also to Bendigo & Districts Table Tennis Association for hosting the successful Oceania Cup. A big welcome also to our first cultural group, the Vietnamese Table Tennis Association. VTTA have brought a new dimension to our organisation and we hope and look forward to welcoming a lot more in the future.

There were two new initiatives from our Committees, the State Referee Course and the Foundation Level Coaching certificate. For the URC, I would like to thank Graham Ireland and Neil Montfort and Coaching, Keith Mundy and Vicki Reid (independent Board member) who presents at the ACHPER Conference and other for a demonstrating to teachers how to introduce table tennis to their school.

Finally, I was fortunate to be working with two nice and dedicated professionals of Brinnen Reiss and Brad Clements, part time data helper Simone Chuah, and Dave Powell who runs our Coaching clinics, Metro League pennant and provides important technical and player feedback and consultation. I would like to thank them for their support and ensuring that we worked as a cohesive and happy team, and am sure the new office team of Luci Galea and Rosie Murphy will be just as productive.

A.W.D. AUSTRALIAN CHAMPIONSHIPS APRIL 13th-16th 2013 BALLARAT

CLASSIFICATION DAY FRIDAY 12th APRIL

I had 4 athletes to be classified this day, one had to cancel due to medical reasons. Watching Jake Ballestrino , Daniel Ratanapintha & Trevor Hirth go through their classification procedures gave me an insight to the movements and non-movements on what they can or cannot do, that I might not have seen before. The three got their classifications and were reassessed the following day (which is normal procedure). Daniel however was declined due to being too mobile. Trevor was dropped from a class 7 down to class 6. Jake stayed as a Class 7.

START OF THE OPEN STANDING SINGLES SATURDAY 13th APRIL

Victoria had 6 players in this event, Barak Mizrachi [class 8], Jake Ballestrino [class 7], Rory Carrol [class 11], Trevor Hirth [Class 6], Biagio Pitruzzello [class 6] and Steven Watts [class 6&11].

Barak had played well to win his group with straight set wins. Jake had a great 4 set win over SA's Yasir Hussaini but a loss to Michael Louey ACT, saw him come second in his group, but not enough to go through to the next round. Rory had straight sets wins to move to the next round, Steven with just one win, was not enough to move to the next round. Trevor playing in his first Australian Championship played well to move into the next round, and unfortunately Biagio [Aus. No 1 class 6] wasn't having a good day losing in a tough 5 setter and be put out of the Open. Barak had won through to the final but lost to a new class 11 Samuel Von Einem from SA to take the silver and Rory came third to pick up the bronze.

WOMENS OPEN STANDING SINGLES

We had Melissa Tapper [class10] Aus. No 1, World No 4. Mel went through undefeated to take the Gold, and then teamed up with Nathan Cawley ACT to take Gold in the mixed open doubles.

CLASS 11 MENS SINGLES

We had three Victorians in this event, Rory, Steven and a new class 11 player Kevin Chen.

Kevin played really well in his first Australian Championship to push a couple of the players but failed to win a match. Steven played well but with just one win over his fellow Victorian wasn't enough to go onto the next round however Rory won through to the semi final only to lose to South Australia's Samuel to pick up the Bronze.

CLASS 11 WOMENS SINGLES

Adele Pye a new class 11 was playing her 1st Australian Championship. This event was played in a Round Robin. She had comfortable wins in all of her matches except Kate Juillerat from Queensland. She went down in a tough 5 setter and took Silver.

Class 1-5 open wheelchair singles

We had Chris Addis [class 4], Rosalie Turnbull [class 3] & Catherine Morrow [class 5] With Chris showing why he's Aus No 1 to go on to win the gold and Catherine taking the silver. Catherine also took out the gold in the open women's event over fellow Victorian Rosalie. Chris and Rosalie also teamed up to play in the Open Wheelchair Doubles but went down 13/11 in the fourth to take the silver.

Class 4-5 singles

Chris playing really well again to take the Gold & Catherine picked up the silver.

Class 3 singles

Rosalie was the only female in this event so she did really well to pick up the Bronze.

Sunday Class 8 Singles

Barak was the only Vic in this event. He had a couple of really tight 4 setters but was strong enough to go through undefeated to take Gold.

Class 6-7

We had 5 in this event, Biagio, Steven, Trevor, Jake and Ken Mathieson. But unfortunately for Biagio he was unable to defend his title after serving 5 faults in the 5th set in the semi final to lose it but picked up the bronze. Trevor Hirth was playing excellently for his first Aus champs and went through undefeated to pick up the Gold. Steven and Jake had some tough games but couldn't get to play off for the medals.

Junior Class 6-11 Standing Singles

Jake was the only Vic in this event as he pushed a lot of the more experienced players but failed to play off for any of the medals.

Class 6-11 and Deaf

We had 4 Vic's in this event, Barak was playing well but not good enough to take Gold so he had to settle for silver, and Rory playing in form picked up the Bronze.

Class 11 Mixed Doubles

Rory and Adele played brilliantly together to go through undefeated to take the well deserved Gold.

Class Deaf

We had Justin Morgan team up with Michael Louey [ACT] and Henri Anastasi [NSW] to win the Gold in this event.

Monday Teams Event

We had three teams in the Open wheelchair teams. Chris Addis and Rosalie Turnbull. They had some tough matches on their way to the final but fell short and picked up the Silver.

Class 6-7 Standing. Trevor and Jake playing for the first time together showed that they will be a team to beat in the future. They played so well together they went through undefeated to take the Gold.

Class 11 Standing. Rory Carroll and Adele Pye. This is another couple that were playing together for the first time. They teamed up together so well they only dropped one game on their way to pick up a well-deserved Gold.

Medals tally. in the Teams 2.5 Gold and one Silver. In the Class events 6 Gold, 5 Silver and 2 Bronze. In the doubles 1.5 Gold and 2 Silver.

Teams summary

We were down on players for this event due to some retirements, injuries and not enough players entering, otherwise we would have done a lot better. Those who did enter played excellently and did Victoria proud and fully deserve their achievements.

And as a coach I was proud of the work they did and listening to the instructions they were given to be able to take their Gold, Silver and Bronze Medals. The entire groups were well behaved during the whole tournament and I was proud to have been their manager/coach.

As for next year there will have to be some changes. The players will need to play at least 3 AWD tournaments to qualify to represent Victoria, there may be some exceptions made for those who have been selected in the P.P.P, as in Melissa, Nathan and Barak who go through intense training and play a lot of able body tournaments and are representing

Australia in overseas tournaments and as some of the other players do. A copy or the original copy of the entry forms to be filled out 6 weeks before the Championships and to go directly to the Manager/ Coach on the due date or the day after, so the Teams and Uniforms can be selected. The reason for this is that I as Manager/Coach did not see an entry form until Simon showed me on the starting day of the Championships even though I had requested them two weeks earlier. Those that have been selected to represent Vic must play in all events they're eligible for.

Over all I believe the Tournament was a great success. It was well run by Simon and Joe Gerada with the guest speakers Sam Soliman and Madeline Hogan to hand out the medals and the door prizes I thought was fantastic. The food was well prepared and organised [delicious as well] by Miranda Pellissier and Laura Gerada; the canteen people did a great job. Neil Monfort as Referee and Angelo Tabone did a terrific job as well.

I was proud to have been the Manager /Coach of the Victorian team.

APPOINTMENT OF SCRUTINEER AND RETURNING OFFICER:

Fanny Ho volunteered for the position of Scrutineer. All were in favour.

MINUTES OF THE PREVIOUS ANNUAL GENERAL MEETING:

Max Coulthard moved that the minutes be accepted as a true and accurate representation of events, Seconded by Greg Bristowe, All were in favour.

ALTERATION OF THE CONSTITUTION:

The Chairman introduced this item, noting that all voting members have been made aware of the proposed changes prior to the AGM and that the reasons for the new Constitution were as a result of the changes in the Associations Act in late 2012 and to provide TTV with powers to govern the sport in the interests of its member. Joan Guggenheim raised the question as to why the new Constitution stated that non-voting members were unable to speak at the AGM. Richard Redman from Lander & Rogers lawyers answered on behalf of TTV, stating that those members were only unable to debate during the AGM. The Chairman further elaborated, stating that members with any concerns could raise these with their association who could then debate those concerns on behalf of the member at the AGM. Chris Horwood raised a question regarding clause 13.6 sub clause B, in which it states that an appeal can be lodged only if there was new evidence. Chris Horwood felt that unfair process should also be included. Richard Redman again answered on TTV's behalf, stating that TTV is under no obligation to include any form of appeal, but have still included one. The Chairman expanded, noting that this clause is only relative to TTV's internal process and that appeals could still be filed through external bodies. He noted that there have only been two or three disciplinary hearings in the past ten years and no appeals.

MOTION: Max Coulthard moved the special motion that the new Constitution be accepted; Gary Brooker seconded it. The Chairman asked for a show of hands. THE MOTION WAS CARRIED UNANIMOUSLY.

PRESENTATION OF THE 2012 ANNUAL REPORT, THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS AND THE INDEPENDENT AUDITOR'S REPORT

The Chairman noted the following:

- A 6% growth in membership from the previous year as well as more clubs affiliated.
- Competitively there were some great performances but it was acknowledged that there is greater competition from other States, especially in the juniors.
- There has been an increase in volunteers, which has allowed TTV to establish more committees, however there is still more development required with the committees but it is a positive start.
- The Chairman outlined the four pillars of the strategic plan and progress. The Board is also taking a more strategic approach, while there has been some operational distractions, the Board is continuing to be more strategic than they used to, due to the confidence in the CEO and staff carrying out the operations of the organisation.
- From the financial report there was an increase in income of \$40,000, which resulted in a surplus of \$18,635. This was a great turn around of \$29,000 from the previous year. The surplus does not encapsulate just how strong the year was as there was the inclusion of annual and long service leave provisions, an increase in the depreciation costs, and an un-forecast legal bill of \$10,000.
- Greg Bristowe questioned how the MSAC bonus worked, as there was such a dramatic increase from previous years. The Chairman explained that TTV received a bonus rebate on the hall use when the income reaches a certain level due to a contract renegotiation between the previous CEO and MSAC. The CEO advised that TTV now receives revenue consideration from the area used by badminton at the back of the TT Hall, which had previously not been the case.
- Gary Warnest questioned if there was any scheduled training or a rollout date for the new IMG website. The CEO responded that the website was planned to be launched at the end of June. No training has been scheduled at this point as the main focus was getting the website operational. The Chairman further elaborated, stating that the new website database will allow for greater communication with members. Gary Brooker

questioned if the new database would be able to be accessed by every club and if the training for the website will be for everyone. The Chairman responded saying that clubs can only access their own database information, and that the training will be available for everyone free of charge.

- Gary Warnest recommended that the Proxy Form be amended, as it could be confusing. The meeting concurred.
- A finance and audit committee was established which had made very a valuable recommendations to meet accounting standards and provides great strategic oversight. The CEO pointed out that the sponsorship was not clearly identified in the financial report under the current chart of accounts as some that had been placed under tournaments.

Joan Guggenheim moved that the financial report be accepted. Seconded by Kelvin Putt.

MOTION CARRIED

ELECTION OF TREASURER/ BOARD MEMBER

Phillip Carruthers listed the outgoing Board members and thanked each of them for their contributions.

As there was only one nomination for the Treasurer position. Mr Jack Cyngler was appointed unopposed.

The Chairman advised that in accordance with the Constitution the Board had determined the election of Board Member would be taken by ballot paper on a simple first past the post basis.

There were two nominations for Board member positions: Chris Horwood and Jim Montgomery.

JIM MONTGOMERY WAS ELECTED

The Chairman thanked Mr Horwood for his nomination and congratulated Mr Montgomery on his re-appointment. Heather Letwin moved that the ballot papers be kept for six months and then destroyed, Seconded by Kelvin Putt.

MOTION CARRIED

CLOSURE OF MEETING

The Chairman declared the meeting closed at 12:1

TABLE TENNIS VICTORIA 5-YEAR MEMBERSHIP COMPARISON 2009-2013


