42nd ANNUAL REPORT - 1971

Ladies and Gentlemen,

The year 1971 was an extremely busy one and great demands were made on players, officials and supporters alike. In addition to the usual major tournaments and championships there were the various pennant competitions and no less than three sets of international visitors.

The World Table Tennis Championships were held in Nagoya, Japan and were immediately preceded by the inaugural Commonwealth Table Tennis Championships in Singapore. Victorian members of the Australian teams which played at both venues were "Charlie" Wuvanich (mens team) and Vicki Woodward (womens team). Another Victorian to participate at the "Worlds" was Stephen Knapp. Stephen also toured China as a member of a party headed by Dr. Jackson. This tour was one of the first permitted into China since their "cultural revolution" and made headlines in the Australian press and other media.

On the national front, Victorian teams were again very successful, winning five shields out of a possible eight. In the individual events Victorian players won, or shared in winning, nine events out of a possible fourteen. The Barna Award for the Australian Senior Player of the Year went to Paul Pinkewich of NSW and the Junior Player of the Year was won by Stephen Knapp of NSW, formerly of Victoria. In recognition of our efforts in all phases of table tennis throughout the year, we were again presented with the Trudek Award which is given annually to the premier State.

International touring parties to Victoria commenced with the New Zealand Mens and Womens World Championship teams in March. This was followed by the England team of Brian Burn and Tony Clayton in July. Our final visitor was Park Sung In who, as one of three South Korean National Coaches, is among the foremost table tennis coaches in the world. Mr. Park visited Victoria on two occasions, in late July and in late September, and left an indelible mark on our players, coaches and officials.

Major tournaments and championships now include the Moomba and City of Melbourne tournaments, and join with the Riversdale-Halex Easter Tournament and the Victorian Championships as the top individual events of the year.

The record entry established for the Country Championships in 1970 was exceeded in 1971 and the event was very successful in all respects. Affiliations were slightly down but a number of small Associations are now forming and it is hoped to welcome them into the family at an early date. The latest addition to country table tennis facilities is the new multi-sports centre opened at Stawell in August. The centre at present has six tables.

In Junior table tennis the ability of the players was excellent at the higher levels although some concern is felt about lower levels and in schools. Since the departure from Australia of erstwhile coach Harry Venner it has not been possible to arrange for an adequate replacement in visiting schools.

The table subsidy to schools was continued although at a lower level, six schools being subsidised \$20 each for the purchase of tables.

It is extremely gratifying to record that there has been an upsurge of interest in both Winter and Summer pennant. A new sub-committee has been formed whose responsibility has been promoting pennant and it would seem that its efforts have borne fruit.

Also on the bright side is the quite considerable increase in the use of the Table Tennis Centre of Victoria, resulting in increased table hire. Both pennant and table hire have continued the pleasing trends noticeable in 1970.

PENNANT COMPETITIONS

1.1 METROPOLITAN WINTER PENNANT

This was conducted from 20th April to 25th August. There were 36 mens grades and seven womens grades, making a total of 333 teams. This represented an increase of 36 teams on 1970. Five innovations were introduced following the 1970 AGM.

1. To keep a consistent standard throughout the A grades, Mens A grade consisted of 10 teams and Womens A grade of six as against the usual eight teams per grade. (To avoid byes WB1 and WC2 were also six-team grades).

2. Two complete rounds were played in the eight-team and ten-team grades, which necessitated four extra Friday night rounds in Mens A grade. Three complete rounds were played in the six-team grades.

3. No doubles were played in Womens A grade.

4. Runner-up pennants were introduced.

5. Leading player pennants were introduced.

Pennants were again presented at the Presentation Night supper dance at 9 Darling Street, South Yarra.

1.3 PENNANT PLAYER OF THE YEAR AWARD

This award, open to the one thousand plus pennant players, has become an annual event. It is judged by the pennant sub-committee who keep in mind such worthy attributes as behaviour, sportsmanship, dedication, improvement and enthusiasm in making their selections.

The award for 1971 went to A.Evans of Coburg Harriers.

1.4 PENNANT PROMOTION

The hard working activities of this sub-committee, formed in 1970, have been quite fruitful as the increased number of pennant teams shows. The sub-committee's work in analysing team losses and gains in pennant over the last 10 years has been quite exhaustive, and has led to several promotional ideas. Amongst the successful promotional lines are:-

1. Contacts made to clubs who have withdrawn from competition to ascertain the reason for their withdrawal and to offer assistance and advice where needed.
2. The business houses in the Albert Park area were canvassed for new teams.
3. A Club Secretary's night was held, so that Secretaries could get to know members of the Pennant Sub-Committee and discuss pennant problems.
4. Individual sub-committee members had a number of new clubs assigned to them for a season in order that these clubs could make a smooth entry into pennant competition.

2. UNDER 20 PENNANT COMPETITIONS

Under 20 Pennant was held on Saturday mornings as usual. One season only, of seven rounds plus finals, was conducted for A Grade, no matches being played on those Saturdays when country tournaments were held. The season extended from 20th March to 14th August. Two seasons (Autumn and Winter), consisting of five rounds plus finals, were held for other grades.

2.1 AUTUMN SEASON

The Autumn season extended from 20th March to 6th June. Thirty teams entered (including A grade) in four grades. This was a marked decrease on 1970 entries. It seems paradoxical that such a low entry should occur in a year when the overall junior standard is at the highest level ever. Many of the top juniors who had played in the Under 20 Pennant competitions regularly for the past several years did not do so this year, preferring to concentrate on Senior Pennant. However the keenness of those players who did participate is shown by the fact that many were prepared to travel from distant centres such as Ballarat, Geelong and Monbulk.

J.Williams, playing in his first championships in NSW caused a shock in the mens singles when he defeated the highly rated D.Cowell in the mens singles, and went on to be runner-up to G.Livesey. He combined with A.Tabone to win the Special Doubles.

CITY OF ADELAIDE

Once again a large contingent of Victorian players travelled to South Australia for the annual interstate sub-junior teams titles and the City of Adelaide championships. A.Savidge caused the major upset of the year when he defeated two members of the Australian team prior to their departure to the Commonwealth and World Championships to win the mens singles.

Victoria helped to create a record entry for these titles (over 1000). Our juniors dominated all events, defeating many of the more experienced players in the senior events.

In individual events, A.Savidge won the Mens Singles, V.Woodward the Womens and Junior Girls Singles. The Junior Boys Singles was won by R.Tuckett. The Mens 2nd Singles was won by J.Williams from C.Ervine. The Womens Doubles was won by R.Greenwood and H.Morrow while A.Savidge and S.Quixley were runners-up in the Mens Doubles.

3.14 CENTRE HANDICAP TOURNAMENTS

These popular monthly tournaments were held 10 times during the year from March to December. The annual aggregate points score was won by J.McCabe, and the December event was for a seasonal hamper. Over 162 different players competed for the monthly trophies and the continued success of this event is due to the hard work put in each month by R.Grattidge of the Rainbow Club. They provide a good opportunity for new players to learn about clubs and playing opportunities in Melbourne.

3.15 METROPOLITAN SCHOOLS TEAMS CHAMPIONSHIPS

The event was played later in the year than previously following a survey of schools facilities and conditions, which provided information useful for the promotion and development of table tennis in Melbourne schools.

Sixty three teams from 26 schools competed for the seven sections (there was no boys under 15 B section). Many schools have players keen to enter the competition but they are limited to one team per section. In 1972 the rules may have to be amended to allow more than one team per school into each section and so provide more opportunity for students to play.

Congratulations once again to Melbourne High on winning the Boys Open "A" grade section for the third year in succession. They also won the boys "B" grade. Fitzroy won the under 15 boys title again, and St.Leonards won the girls open "A" grade and under 15 "A" and "B" grades.

5. SPECIAL EVENTS

5.1 WORLD CHAMPIONSHIPS (NAGOYA)

The major news was the entry of China into the World Championships for the first time since 1965. They reaffirmed their strength by winning the Swaythling Cup for mens teams, and were runners-up to Japan in the Corbillon Cup for womens teams. Stellan Bengtsson of Sweden, 18 years old, became the first European player in 18 years to win the world mens singles title. Lin Hui Ching (China) defeated Cheng Min Chih (China) in the final of the womens singles. Australia was ranked 29 in the mens section and 18 in the womens section.

It is the intention of the VTTA to give opportunity for the best players in Victoria to make themselves available for selection on ability with reasonable financial support assured. For too long Australia has been unable to field its top teams. With the support of all players and officials in this State an improved situation should lead to better ranking in world table tennis.

5.2 COMMONWEALTH CHAMPIONSHIPS (SINGAPORE)

Australia was represented at the inaugural Championships by a mens and womens team en route to the World Championships. Eleven countries were represented. England, as to be expected, dominated the titles but not without one or two shocks. Australia won a bronze medal in the mens singles when C.Wuvanich defeated Jagannath of India in a play off for third place. Wuvanich had lost to the winner, T.Taylor of England, in a semi-final.

Australia went close to another medal when Wuvanich and V.Woodward lost in the semi-finals of the mixed doubles to Hyde and Piddock who won the event.

Australia finished in third place in the mens teams section 'B' after a shock loss to New Zealand. In the womens teams Australia failed to win a match in

the 'B' section. The rankings of the countries at the end of the Championships were:-

5.3 NEW ZEALAND TEAM VISIT

On the 13th and 14th March the New Zealand teams, en route to the Commonwealth Championships and World Championships, played matches in Melbourne against Victorian teams.

The New Zealand mens team was Alan Tomlinson, Gary Murphy, Richard Lee and James Morris, and the womens team was Neti Traill, Yvonne Fogarty and Kathryn Fraser.

The programme commenced on Saturday afternoon with a Junior International match. Representing New Zealand were: R.Lee, J.Morris and K.Fraser and representing Victoria were: R.Tuckett, S.Quixley, A.Savidge, H.Morrow and S.Gilbert. The match consisted of four boys singles, one girls singles, one boys doubles and one mixed doubles and was won by Victoria five rubbers to two.

On the Saturday evening the Senior International match was played with G.Murphy, A.Tomlinson, N.Traill and Y.Fogarty representing New Zealand and A.Savidge, C.Wuvanich, M.LeGassick, S.Campbell and V.Woodward representing Victoria. This match consisted of four mens singles, four womens singles and one mixed doubles, all best of three games. It was won by Victoria six rubbers to three. Television coverage was provided by ABV 2.

On the Sunday evening an invitation tournament was held with separate sections for men and women. There were eight competitors in each section with G.Yeo, C.Wuvanich, J.Kilderry and A.Savidge joining the four New Zealand men in one section and M.LeGassick, S.Campbell, V.Woodward, L.Nicholson and L.Chong entered with the three New Zealand women in the other section. Rubbers were best of three games. C.Wuvanich won the Mens Singles with A.Tomlinson runner-up. Neti Traill won the Womens Singles with V.Woodward runner-up.

5.4 ENGLISH TEAM TOUR

Victoria received a visit by an English team of T.Clayton (Yorks) and B.Burn (Warwicks) during the week of the State Championships.

Our guests played matches against Victoria at Whitefriars College and Ballarat, and a Test Match against Australia at Albert Park as well as playing in the State titles.

They proved themselves to be worthy ambassadors and we enjoyed excellent displays of aggressive table tennis throughout their stay.

5.5 PARK SUNG IN VISIT

During the period 3rd May to 14th November, Mr. Park Sung In, one of three National Coaches in South Korea, was brought to Australia by the ATTA. This visit was sponsored by the Rothmans Sports Foundation which was also responsible for subsidising the earlier coaching visit of Mr. Harry Venner in 1966. A debt of gratitude is owed to Rothmans for their policy of bringing top-ranking coaches from overseas so that Australian players may have the advantage of learning techniques used in countries where the sport in question is one of major national participation.

Mr. Park spent two 2-week periods in Victoria. These were from 26th July to 2nd August and from 27th September to 4th October.

The majority of Mr. Park's time was spent in two avenues:-

The first of these was a series of classes in which existing and prospective coaches were taught coaching techniques successfully used by Mr. Park in Korea. There were three separate classes, each with from eight to twelve members, and each class met twice weekly. Tuition included get-fit exercises, warm-up exercises, practice methods, stroke production and service. Quite a number of country representatives attended from Geelong, Ballarat, Traralgon, Maryborough and Dandenong.

The second main avenue consisted of coaching junior players and four afternoons weekly were spent on this group. Weekday sessions ran from 4.00pm to 6.00pm, and on Saturdays and Sundays the whole afternoon was used although, due to other events, only two of the four Saturdays and Sundays could be used.

In addition to the above, the following activities were held:-

- (a) Five sessions, prior to the Australian Championships, with the State teams.
- (b) A weekend camp at the Anglesea National Fitness Camp over 2nd/3rd October. This was open to players of all ages and abilities. Despite poor weather, the camp was hailed as an outstanding success by the 36 who attended. Complete participation in the various activities, mainly sporting with an absence of table tennis, was the notable factor achieved.
- (c) Teachers Colleges and Universities were visited for lecture, training and discussion sessions.
- (d) A thirteen page set of notes drawn up by Mr. Park before his arrival in Melbourne was edited and produced in quantity. All members of coaching classes were issued with a copy.

Probably the most far reaching effect of Mr. Park's visit was the great enthusiasm he was able to instil into those with whom he came into contact. This applies equally to players, coaches and officials. An immediate result was the re-institution of a Coaching Sub-Committee which had not been formed as such for some years. Comprising the three State selectors, other key members of the Executive Committee and experienced players outside the Committee, this

newly reformed sub-committee will have the control of all aspects of coaching in Victoria.

5.6 EXHIBITIONS

During the year we had many requests for exhibitions. These requests included one for the official opening of the new sports stadium at Stawell. Four of our players put on an excellent display on the Saturday night and on the Sunday afternoon.

We also staged a series of lunchtime exhibitions at Northlands and Southlands Shopping Centres. These exhibitions were both very successful and our thanks are due to the players and officials who spent so much time at these exhibitions.

Other exhibitions were held at Kerang and Korumburra and we expect that we will visit other centres before the end of the year. These exhibitions by our players help to promote table tennis and to show the public that our game is much more than 'ping pong'.

6.3 FRENCH AWARD

6.4 JUNIOR PLAYER OF THE YEAR

The winner for 1971 of this trophy, donated by Coburg Harriers Table Tennis Club, was won by Leanne Morrow. The achievements of this twelve-year-old player in junior and senior spheres have been remarkable for one so young.

7. TOP PLAYERS' LADDER

Winners of the 1971 Top Players Ladders were R.Tuckett and L.Nicholson. Tuckett won by four points in the closest mens ladder for several years, and Mrs. Nicholson had a comfortable victory in the womens section.

The ladders, representing players' performances in VTTA Winter Pennant and selected open tournaments, are to be discontinued in 1972 due to the lack of support by top players in attending the selected championships.

8. TABLE TENNIS CENTRE OF VICTORIA

Visits of two international teams - New Zealand and England - were the main table tennis features of the Centre. Test matches were played against both countries and their players also competed in tournaments. All other major events in the table tennis calendar were also played at the Centre.

The Centre was used again to hold a Sportsmens Dinner to raise funds for overseas tours.

8.1 BUILDING

Further improvements were made to the Centre facilities during the year. Two additional courts were floored and this enables an area of six adjoining courts to be used for social purposes. Major improvements were made when the shower rooms were fully tiled.

The accounts for the Centre are recorded in the Revenue Account at the end of this Report.

8.2 STAFF

The Centre staff has again been well served by the work of Mrs. J.Guggenheim who has been assisted by Miss D.Moore and Mrs. J.Dougall. Mr. N.Katsiris has continued as Building Superintendent.

8.3 DUTY OFFICERS

The Association has again been well served by its Duty Officers who officiated during the year.

8.4 ALBERT PARK COMMITTEE OF MANAGEMENT

We extend our thanks to Senator P.J.Kennelly and his Committee for their help during the year.

9. WESTERN SUBURBS TABLE TENNIS CENTRE

The Association purchased this centre, which is in Garden Street, Williamstown, three years ago to preserve a venue for table tennis players in this area. As you will see from the financial report this represents a large capital investment by table tennis players in this State. The local association administers the centre on our behalf with great success. They are promoting winter and summer pennant competitions, and have now commenced a junior competition for the

first time. An 'internal' club has been formed to assist players with coaching, and a coffee lounge is in the planning stage to improve the centre amenities. Because of the need to pay rent to our association the local body is not as financial as some other associations, but they are doing a sterling job for table tennis, not only in their area, but as part of the table tennis fraternity in Victoria.

We thank the officials and players for keeping table tennis going in the Western Suburbs.

10. PROMOTION OFFICER/COACH

In May 1970 the three-year contract between Mr. Harry Venner and the Victorian Table Tennis Association expired, Mr. Venner returning to England. Subsequently the Association has been without a full time Promotions Officer, these duties having been carried out in 1971 by the Promotion Sub-Committee and by the Table Tennis Centre Office Staff. The task of coaching State Squads and Juniors has been similarly a part-time occupation and Chayanond Wuvanich has been the coach primarily concerned. Very able support has been rendered by Messrs. D. Cheyne, K. Keane and J. Oke.

11. AFFILIATED ASSOCIATIONS

Affiliations in 1971 showed a slight drop from 66 to 64, there being 50 Country Associations and 14 Metropolitan Associations. Registered teams were 1280 country and 640 metropolitan. With 333 teams in Melbourne winter pennant, this means that six-sevenths of Victorian table tennis is in affiliated associations.

It was pleasing to see two strong country associations in Colac and Maryborough return to affiliation after some years, and take part in the Country Championships.

The VTTA was able to fill some of the gaps in the list of District Representatives, and the work of the following in promoting our sport is appreciated:

Mr. B. Breuer, Horsham (Wimmera), Mr. W. Costello, Kerang, (Kerang & North West), Mr. P. Nener, Charlton (Bendigo), Mr. G. Ward, Shepparton (Shepparton), Mr. L. Bassett, Yea (Highlands), Mr. W. Freeman, Leongatha (South Gippsland), Mr. W. Edwards, Warrnambool (Western), Mr. G. McIlvena, Geelong (Geelong), Mr. R. B. Goodchild, Myrtleford (North East), Mr. W. L. Oates, Maryborough (Ballarat), and Mr. A. Walker (Metropolitan).

A representative is needed for North Gippsland.

The twentieth Country Championships (the third held at Queen's Birthday weekend) drew a record 107 team entries and a sharp increase in individual entries.

The VTTA is grateful to the National Mutual Insurance Group for the use of the sports room at its Collins Street Centre, and to the "Weekly Times" for sponsoring the tournament again.

Entries in the Metropolitan Atlas Shield equalled last year's record at 26. It was pleasing to see a woman player in the winning A grade team and a team of women in C grade.

An "Atlas" team of A. Tabone (captain-manager), A. Coustley, and G. Pascoe, spent three days as the guests of the North West Tasmanian Table Tennis Council, winning matches at Burnie and Devonport, and taking a prominent part in the North

West Tasmanian Open Championships.

At the end of July, three junior boys from N.W.Tasmania (A.Saul, C.Clements and P.O'Hern) were hosted by North Western, Northern and Western Associations. They defeated junior teams from Western and North Western, and attended the football at the M.C.G. as guests of Northern TTA.

Open tournaments were held in 1971 by the following affiliated associations:- Geelong (2), Ballarat, Horsham, Warrnambool, Donald, Yea, Mildura and Yarra-wonga.

Geelong were hosts for the Victorian Sub-Junior Teams Championships in September.

A Victorian country womens team of T.Jones (Mornington Peninsula), P.Woodward, K.Barclay and M.Fischer (Ballarat), with Mr.F.Woodward of Ballarat, as driver/manager, toured NSW country centres from August 23rd to 27th. They defeated Tamworth, Newcastle, Goulburn and NSW Country (at Bowral) all 11/0, but were beaten 11/0 by the Sutherland team which included State players J.Brown and V.Wheller.

At the same time a NSW Country mens team of G.Spackman, K.Sands, D.Lai and G.Wubbels toured Victorian country centres. They defeated Shepparton, Ballarat, Warrnambool, Traralgon and Orbost, but lost to Geelong and a combined Victorian Country team at Geelong. The combined team was W.Hawley (Traralgon), Craig Campbell and C.Johnston (Geelong).

An inquiry was received late in the season from South Australia, regarding the possibility of establishing regular exchanges of country tours between South Australia and Victoria.

The Australian TTA in September approved rules to permit affiliated associations within 50 miles of the border of their State to affiliate also in an adjacent State for the purpose of taking part in competitions.

A multi-sports centre including a table tennis floor, was opened at Stawell in August, and similar centres are to be built at Shepparton and Lilydale.

Separate annual meetings of Country and Metropolitan Affiliated Associations were held at the Table Tennis Centre of Victoria.

The sport of table tennis is receiving increasing attention from television, radio, the Press and business sponsors, as its importance as a world sport and a force for peace is realised. Within our State we can build up the image of our sport by increasing the number of associations and players who compete within the organisation of the VTTA. We therefore urge all players and officials to do their utmost to persuade those associations still unaffiliated to join with us, not merely for what we can do for them, but so that together we can advance the sport of table tennis.

12. PROMOTION

Promotion covers a wide field and it is pleasing to record that our efforts in a number of directions have been fruitful. We are hopeful that in 1972 we will achieve still better results.

In 1972 we will hold the National Championships in Melbourne and our good friends and supporters Patra Fine Foods have agreed to sponsor these championships as well as the Victorian Open Championships. With this kind of support we expect to make these championships the best ever.

During 1972 we expect to do more promotion in the schools and this will supplement the schools pennant which has been so successful during the past two or three years. This is an area of great importance to us since once young people learn to play table tennis they frequently continue to be interested in this sport after they leave school.

In conclusion might we suggest to players that they show their appreciation of the support given to us by our sponsors and supporters by buying their products when possible.

13. PUBLICITY

With so many people and organisations seeking publicity it is not possible to obtain as much publicity as we would like. However, when we had something to sell we were able to achieve press, radio and television coverage. Obtaining publicity is a time consuming job and we need some assistance from anyone with an interest in this area.

We would particularly like to record our appreciation of the excellent television coverage given us during the year by ABV 2 and the telecast of overseas matches by HSV 7. Both programmes were first class and received very favourable comment throughout the State.

Once again the Press supported us with photographs and stories, and the coverage of the "Weekly Times" Championships was exceptionally good. Our sincere thanks go to all those concerned in these various activities.

14. UMPIRES LEAGUE

The League has enjoyed another successful and very active year. Led by C.Gadd, President, and Miss R.Singer, Secretary, the League has provided Referees on Tuesdays and Wednesdays for both winter and summer VTTA pennants. It also provided two umpires for the Centre Court on Wednesdays during winter pennant. It also provided Referees for several country tournaments namely Yea, Horsham and Yarrawonga, and several attended as umpires at most of the tournaments.

The League also provided referees and umpires for all VTТА tournaments, the England and New Zealand matches and the City of Coburg and Intervarsity Championships.

Mr. W.Harratt, National Umpire, attended the Australian Championships in Perth and did a sterling job of umpiring teams and individual matches. At the Australian Championships C.Gadd was appointed Chairman of the National Umpires Committee and he and R.Chadband are Victoria's representatives on this body.

Four State Umpires qualified this year, these being Mrs. J.Dougall, F.Habbe, R.Neville and E.Williams.

Next year the Australian Championships will be played in Melbourne and the League is anxious to recruit more members. All clubs are urged to help in this regard.

In conclusion, the League thanks the VTТА for its continued support and encouragement.

15. STATE SQUADS

In a change of policy for 1971 the Selectors did not conduct general State Squad practices until the Victorian Teams were selected in July. Other incentives, including reduced table hire for prospective team members, were used to encourage players to practise. Several coaching sessions were conducted by Mr. Park Sung In.

16. A.T.T.A.

16.1 OVERSEAS CHAMPIONSHIPS

Australia participated in the first Commonwealth Table Tennis Championships at Singapore on 20th - 26th March, with the team continuing on to the World Championships at Nagoya, Japan, from 28th March - 7th April.

Team members were - Men: C.Wuvanich(Vic), P.Pinkewich (NSW), A.Frankenburg and P.Powell(SA). Women: A.McMahon(SA), V.Woodward(Vic).

ATTA officials who accompanied the teams were: Dr.J.Jackson(President), K.Bowler(International Secretary) and J.Hannon(General Secretary), who managed the teams.

The ATTA contributed \$325 each to the men's fares, and \$100 manager's allowance. Women players and officials travelled to the Championships at no cost to the ATTA.

Mr.N.Shorter(NSW) accompanied the team as mens captain. S.Knapp(NSW) attended the championships privately.

Following the World Championships, the Australians were invited to visit China. Those who went were Dr.J.Jackson (team-leader), P.Pinkewich, S.Knapp, A.McMahon and N.Shorter.

16.2 ENGLISH TOUR

The English team of A.Clayton and B.Burn toured Australia for six weeks. Test Matches were played in Adelaide, Melbourne and Sydney (3), with Australia winning all five. P.Pinkewich (NSW) played in all five tests and was unbeaten.

Others to represent Australia were C.Wuvanich (played 6 won 5) and Lee Mun Chew of NSW (played 4 won 2).

16.3 PARK SUNG IN TOUR

Sponsored by the Rothmans Foundation, Mr. Park Sung In, top coach of South Korea, spent six months in Australia training coaches and instituting a National Coaching Scheme.

16.4 NEW ZEALAND VISIT

On its way to the Commonwealth and World Championships, the New Zealand contingent visited Melbourne and Sydney, playing junior and senior matches.

16.5 ATTA CHANGES

Organisational changes which occurred during 1971 were the division of the Australian secretaryship between International and General Secretaries, with K. Bowler (NSW) and J. Hannon (Tas.) being elected to these posts.

Another change was the appointment of a Records Secretary, with Mr. L. Wharmby (Tas.) being first appointed and replaced by Mr. K. Javor (Vic) at the 1971 General Personal Meeting. The main change in officials at the GPM was that Mr. L. Wharmby (Tas.) replaced Dr. J. Jackson (SA) as ATTA President.

Dr. Jackson and Dr. W. Savige (Vic) did not seek re-appointment as National Selectors. Their places were filled by Messrs. P. Anderson (SA) and V. Matison (Vic) with K. Bowler (NSW) remaining the third selector.

Other than the office-bearers mentioned above, members of the ATTA Council are delegates W. Postlethwaite (Q'ld), D. Tucker (SA), A. Cleaves (Vic), Vice-president L. Hitchen (WA) and Treasurer L. Haycraft (Vic).

Other changes of interest in ATTA affairs were the establishment of a Disciplinary Investigation Committee to act at Australian Championships and the naming of two sub-junior trophies. The Shield for the Under 14 Girls Teams was named the "Suzy Javor Shield", and the cup for the Under 16 Boys Singles was named the "Jack Gilbert Memorial Cup" in honour of the late Jack Gilbert of Ballarat (Vic).

17. EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE

1971 was a year of stability for the Executive Committee, there being no resignations or additions. Thus the period of influx of younger members has been followed by a period during which the committee has been able to develop team work with the newer members gaining experience and taking greater responsibilities.

At the Annual General Meeting, in accordance with the Constitution, Messrs. French, Bayly, Ward, Atkin and Warren all retired. With the exception of Mr. Warren all stood for re-election and were returned to office. Mr. Angelo Tabone was elected to the vacancy caused by the retirement of Mr. Warren. Mr. Warren continued to serve the cause of table tennis by becoming chairman of the newly formed Pennant Promotion Sub-Committee.

From 1st October, 1970, to 30th September, 1971, the Executive Committee met on twelve occasions plus two adjourned meetings. The attendances, not including adjourned meetings, were as follows:-
