## 34th ANNUAL REPORT - 1963

Ladies and Gentlemen,

The year of 1963 will be remembered as the year in which the International Table Tennis Federation confirmed the option of the 1967 World Table Tennis Championships to Australia, with Melbourne as the host city. The proposed venue for the World Titles is the Olympic Swimming Stadium and negotiations are now under way to secure this site.

Once again the performance of the Australian Teams sent to Prague for the 1963 World Championships brought great credit to this country, and your Association shares in this, through the outstanding performances of the leading Victorian Women players, Mrs. S. Javor and Mrs. A. O'Brien.

### PENNANT COMPETITIONS

Unfortunately there was a decrease of 33 teams in the Winter Pennant, compared to the record entry of 381 teams last year. However, the 348 teams this year does exceed the entries for 1961.

The Summer Pennant entry of 288 teams was the lowest for some years and caused some concern within the Committee. The Promotion sub-committee has, however, taken definite steps in an endeavour to promote new teams and recover lost ground in 1964.

With many additional entries received for admission to the top grades, your Committee created a new "A" grade. "A Reserve" and "A Special" being replaced by "A2", "A3" and "A4".

The deletion of Doubles Matches in the Mens "A" grades, proved a great success with matches finishing much earlier and proved popular with the players.

The new method of playing Pennant Finals was introduced this year, and although opinions may differ as to which of many systems is the best, the innovation this year was quite satisfactory.

Fixture books, including Match Regulations were again distributed to all registered players of both Winter and Summer Pennant Competitions, and Pennants were presented at the conclusion of the Grand Final matches in the Committee-room where supper was served.

The statistics regarding Pennant Competitions are listed and congratulations are extended to the winners. It is hoped that all who participated in these competitions gained valuable experience and enjoyed their sport.

### UMPIRES' LEAGUE

The year of 1963 was not one of spectacular achievement by the League, indeed in its prime function of providing official umpires for Table Tennis events the whole weight of this task was carried out by a mere handful of stalwarts. Only one newly qualified umpire, Miss Ruth Singer, was added to the League's ranks, and it is hoped that there will be many more lady umpires before the World Championships of 1967.

In the period immediately prior to the 1963 Winter Pennant Season, a school designed to acquaint players with the basic rules of the game was held on the Centre Court of the Table Tennis Centre. The almost complete lack of support by players and club officials was a bitter blow to those who had put a great deal of time and thought into the arrangements.

The administrative side of the League's activities is now being carried on by an Executive Committee thus the General Meetings are now spending almost all of their time on discussions of umpiring methods and techniques.

The League extends its congratulations to Mr. W. Harratt who in Sydney this year was one of only two candidates out of eight to pass the National Umpires Examination. Mr. Harratt becomes the fifth Victorian so qualified in a total of seven in all Australia.

The League appreciates the valuable assistance given at tournaments by a number of interested people who have not as yet become qualified.

### SPECIAL EVENTS

#### 1. NEW ZEALAND WOMENS TEAM

At the conclusion of the National Titles held in Sydney in 1963, a match was arranged between Australia and New Zealand Womens Teams.

## 2. MOOMBA

Sixteen teams representing their former countries competed in the Skolnik Cup which was won by Hungary. There were 32 players in the Lord Mayors Invitation Singles which was won by R. Lim (Malaya) who defeated J. Kilderry. (Australia).

## 3. NEW SOUTH WALES COUNTRY TOURS

Again in conjunction with the N.S.W.T.T.A., two tours by country players from both states were organised.

A combined NSW Country Mens team visited Victoria and played matches at the following country centres, Benalla, Northern, Traralgon, Geelong and Mt. Macedon finishing at the Table Tennis Centre of Victoria where they defeated a combined Victorian Country Mens team.

A Victorian womens team consisting of D. Sanders (Captain-Manageress) - Traralgon, T. Gilbert - Ballarat, J. Newnham - Numurkah, and R. Thomas - Hamilton, toured N.S.W. and were undefeated. They won 9-2 at Canberra, 10-1 at Goulburn, 11-0 Mittagong and then in Sydney they defeated a team of Sydney juniors 9-2. On the final night Victoria downed a combined N.S.W. country side 9-2 to complete a very successful tour.

## 4. EXHIBITIONS

Every year there is a large demand for Exhibition Matches from organisations of all kinds, and without the co-operation of leading players it would be impossible to meet the demands. We thank all of the players, and members of the Umpires League, who gave their services to provide interesting entertainment and help in promoting table tennis.

### A. T. T. A.

At the Australian Table Tennis Associations' Annual Meeting in Sydney in September, Mr. R.H. Jones of Victoria was re-elected Australian President, and Mr. R. Carlile also of Victoria was re-elected Honorary Secretary.

Mr. K. Bowler of New South Wales was re-elected Honorary Treasurer. Mr. K. Bowler (NSW), Dr. J. Jackson (S.A.) and Mr. C. Shaw (Qld) were elected as Australian Selectors.

## SUSPENSIONS

As a result of alleged charges of misbehaviour by a number of Victorian Junior players attending the 1963 Australian Championships in Sydney, certain players after investigations by the Executive Committee and in one case by the Independent Tribunal, were given penalties ranging from severe reprimands to twelve months complete suspension.

EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE

Following the resignations at the 1963 Annual General Meeting of Mr. M. Rundle as Honorary Secretary and Messrs. E. Moy, B. Preston and T. Horsfield as Committeemen, the Executive Committee filled the vacancies as follows:-

All defeated candidates and those who resigned at the 1963 Annual Meeting were invited to serve on V.T.T.A. sub-committees.

Unfortunately before Mr. Senior became fully familiar with the work of the Association his efforts were interrupted by ill-health, and he tendered his resignation on the 18/7/63. His illness caused a temporary set back in our administration. We place on record our thanks for his efforts.

Mr. Brian Preston was appointed Acting Honorary Secretary on 19/7/63 and appointed Honorary Secretary on 23/9/63. Mr. Spence Williams was appointed to fill the vacancy on the Executive Committee.
