1. INTRODUCTION

Table tennis in Victoria during 1982 has shown us that the potential of our junior players will pay dividends for the future.

At the Australian Junior Championships in Adelaide, Victoria's teams won all the respective age group teams events - a magnificent effort considering only two of the four teams were thought to have a chance of winning.

In the individual events too, Victorian juniors showed their strength. Karl McKernan was runner-up in the Under 17 Boys Singles, Nadia Bisiach defeated Wendy Hughes in the Under 17 Girls Singles, Karl McKernan and John Schreenan were runners-up in the Under 17 Boys Doubles, Nadia Bisiach and Wendy Hughes defeated Kerri Tepper and Jan Tepper in the Under 17 Girls Doubles and Nadia Bisiach teamed with NSW's Gary Haberl to win the Under 17 Mixed Doubles from John Schreenan and Wendy Hughes.

The Under 15 events proved to be successful also. Kerri Tepper won her second Under 15 Girls Singles, Markus Kampl and Geoff Latimer were runners-up in the Under 15 Boys Doubles, Kerri Tepper and Jan Tepper won the Under 15 Girls Doubles and, finally, Markus Kampl and Jan Tepper took out the Under 15 Mixed Doubles event. This represents Victorian juniors competing in each title, except for the Under 15 Boys event, producing 6 winners and 6 runners-up with three of the events being an all-Victorian affair.

With this success fresh in our minds, we turned to the senior Nationals in Sydney, looking for similar success. Unfortunately, with the visiting Korean players competing in the individual events, winning individual events was very difficult.

The womens team once again retained the R.H.Jones Shield and the Victorian men were runners-up to NSW for the second year in a row. Shelley Munday won her first senior open title when she partnered NSW's Gary Haberl to win the Mixed Doubles. Wendy Hughes was runner-up in the Womens Under 21, while State Coach, Igor Klaf, took off his third Veterans Singles trophy by defeating George Puchlenko. The Womens Consolation Singles was won by Kerri Tepper, who had to defeat a strong field of competitors. Nadia Bisiach capped off a great year by winning the Michael Szabados Award.

In Victoria, the Metropolitan Schools Championship - 'Tabten' - was a great success with last year's number of teams, 120, rising to 176 this year. The Weekly Times Country Championships also proved to be a success but, as has been the trend of late, VTTA-conducted tournaments and metropolitan senior pennant continued to decline. During this coming year, we must lift this area of our operation to again enjoy the success it once had. To do this will take the energy and expertise that not only the Victorian Committee has to offer, but every Affiliated Association as well.

During the year we had the pleasure of entertaining teams from Italy, Japan and Korea. Reports on these tours appear later in this Annual Report. The number of people who attended these matches show that the Victorian public wants to see overseas teams compete in this State. Apart from the promotion of the sport to those outside our regular sphere of activity, these tours provide our players with much-needed experience against world-class players.

Once again Igor Klaf has promoted the sport through his many visits to schools in his role of Association Coach.

The arrival of former Swedish international, Tommy Danielsson has inspired our top players to strive to counter his phenomenal feat of remaining undefeated in Victoria. In some players the standard of play has improved notably, and this can be attributed directly to Tommy's influence.

For most of the year, the Executive Committee has operated with two members short. Perhaps it is apathy or else each and every member of our Affiliated Associations and metropolitan pennant clubs are too busy to give assistance to their State Association. At the Annual General Meeting in 1983, a total of nine positions become vacant, mostly through expired terms of office. It is the responsibility of every member of an Affiliated Association or metropolitan pennant club to ensure that your State Executive is manned fully at all times. In the next few years, many of those currently holding positions on the Executive Committee will retire and these positions will need to be filled. The time to enter the administration of the VTTA is now so that we may prepare ourselves for the time when these members' expertise is lost to Victoria.

Looking to the future, there is great potential for Victorian Table Tennis. In 1983, we see the introduction of a National League which will promote the sport nationally, and four teams from Victoria have been included in the initial season. 1985 is the 150th anniversary of Victoria and the VTTA has applied to the International Table Tennis Federation for permission to hold the World Cup to help celebrate this event.

We look forward to a big year in 1983, with Australia competing in the Commonwealth Championships in Kuala Lumpur and the World Championships in Tokyo. We also look forward to a visit by the Chinese team in August, and duplicating our successes in the Australian Junior Championships which will be held in Sydney and improving on our performances in the Australian Senior Championships which will be held in Perth.

2. MANAGEMENT

2.1 EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE

In October, the Honorary Secretary, Mr. Alan Cleaves, was granted a three month leave of absence from his position. The position of Acting Secretary was filled by Mr. Peter Nedeljkovic.

Mr. Ron Keyhoe who had filled an earlier casual vacancy on the Executive Committee resigned for business reasons.

Mr. Jack Oke, who had given the VTTA many years of excellent service, decided not to stand for re-election at the A.G.M. and retired from the Executive Committee.

Mr. John Beer resigned from his position as Assistant Treasurer and left the Executive Committee after many years of service.

At the 1982 A.G.M. all nominated members were elected to their positions unopposed. These elections resulted as follows:-

Newcomer, Mr. Brian Perry (Rinnai TTC) was also elected unopposed as a Committee member.

Mr. Bob Pappalardo (University TTC) was appointed to the Executive Committee to fill the vacancy left from the A.G.M. Mr. Perry resigned as a Committee member due to ill health after two month's service to the VTТА.

In mid-year Mr. Cleaves resigned as Honorary Secretary, also due to ill health. He was then appointed as a Committee Member to replace Mr. Nedeljkovic, who resigned as a Committee Member upon his appointment to replace Mr. Cleaves as Honorary Secretary.

From November 1st, 1981, to October 31st, 1982, the Executive Committee on 17 occasions, plus 2 adjourned and one special meeting. The attendances, not including adjourned or special meetings, were as follows:-

2.2 TABLE TENNIS CENTRE OF VICTORIA

This year saw a reduced usage of the Centre due to a further drop in pennant teams and the effects of Melbourne's long hot summer. There was a slight increase in income, bearing in mind that the table hire charges had been increased. To balance the ledger, however, despite rising costs, the expenditure was contained and an improvement over 1981 was attained.

The Victorian Public Service TTA continued to use Thursday nights exclusively for their winter and summer pennant competitions and the Victorian Railways Institute TTA also continued to use Monday nights for their pennant competition. Eastern Suburban TTA again used the Centre for all their pennant grand finals. The Victorian Public Service TTA, the Victorian Railways Institute TTA and the Victorian Insurance TTA all held their Closed Championships at the Centre. The Australian Insurance Championships were conducted at the Centre, and the Australian Railways First Aid Competitions were also conducted at the Centre.

Overseas teams from Italy, Japan and Republic of Korea also competed in various matches at the Centre.

Mr. Leon Lau continued with his excellent management of the combined snack bar and table tennis equipment shop. The VTТА certainly appreciates his excellent service to our patrons and he is continually called upon by the

VTTA to cater for our various tournaments, training camps etc.

Our amusement machines are being supplied to us by a new vendor, who promptly service the machines, and as a result the takings have more than doubled for the corresponding period last year.

In conjunction with the landlords, the Albert Park Committee of Management, the VTTA is currently examining all aspects of the Centre. These matters are of a confidential nature at this stage, but will be released as soon as possible.

Once again we place on record our appreciation of the assistance of the Albert Park Committee of Management.

2.2.1 STAFF

In order to reduce expenditure the Executive Committee decided to dispense with the services of a junior in the office. This meant extra work for the remaining staff, and to their credit they have managed to give the Association efficient service.

Our thanks go to Mrs. Joan Guggenheim who, in addition to continuing to do the work of Development Officer, also supervised the daily duties of newcomer Mrs. Chris Moore and regular part-timer Mrs. Judy Dougall. In the coming year Mrs. Guggenheim, at her request, is to return to full time office duties and the Association is currently seeking the services of a new full-time Development Officer.

2.2.2 RECEPTIONISTS

We have had another stable year with our receptionists - Rosanne, Lorraine, Gay, Carol, Dorothy and Charles. We were sorry to lose Kathryn. We gained two new faces in Suzy and Robert.

As usual, our receptionists have given prompt service to our patrons in a pleasant and efficient manner.

2.3 NEW CENTRES

During the past year a number of clubs have been negotiating with their Councils and Youth Sport & Recreation for new facilities in their areas. Good news is that Bendigo will open in 1983 a new stadium after a number of years of planning, raising funds and acquiring financial support from the Youth, Sport & Recreation Department and the area council. Congratulations!

The VTTA New Centres Subcommittee is more than pleased to help any local organisation in their quest for facilities using either premises now in existence or making application for new Table Tennis Centres with various governmental authorities.

2.4 AFFILIATED ASSOCIATIONS

In 1982 there were 56 country (a decrease of five) and 16 metropolitan (down one from last year) associations affiliated. The total of 72 affiliates was a fall of six.

Associations which re-affiliated after a long time were Bairnsdale and Orford. Kyneton and Kyneton Ladies Association amalgamated.

The three schools associations who affiliated have almost 13,000 players in organised competition.

Mt. Gambier is affiliated with both Victoria and South Australia.

2.5 VISITS BY OVERSEAS TEAMS

2.5.1 ITALIAN TEAM

A team of two men, one woman and a manager representing Italy toured Australia in May and played four matches, including two Test Matches, in Victoria. In the Second Test, played at the Table Tennis Centre, Australia defeated Italy 4/3 before a big crowd which included the Italian Consul General. In the next Test held at Geelong the Italians managed to reverse the result in an exciting match.

Australia was represented by Bob Tuckett, Paul Pinkewich and Glenn Tepper, Adele Morrow and Kerry Thompson, with Mike Johns as Non-playing Captain.

The Italian team was Massimo Costantini, Renato Appolini and Paola Bevilacqua with Mr. Fabio Acampora as Team Manager.

The Italians also played two matches against Victorian teams. In the first match at the Table Tennis Centre Victoria had an easy 6/1 victory with Tuckett, Tepper and Morrow representing Victoria. The second match was staged by the Dandenong Table Tennis Association in their new centre. Newcomer to Victoria, Tommy Danielsson, was added to the team and Victoria narrowly won 4/3.

A reception for players and officials of both teams was given by the Italian Consul General.

The VTTA were pleased to have G.J.Coles & Company and Acton Table Tennis as sponsors for this tour.

2.5.2 JAPANESE TEAM

A party of three men and two women from Japanese universities visited Victoria from August 29 to September 4. They played matches against Victoria at Ballarat and at the Table Tennis Centre. Japan won both matches 7/- and 5/4 respectively. At Ballarat Victoria was represented by Jamie Bartolo, John Schreenan, Nadia Bisiach and Wendy Hughes, while the team in Melbourne was Glenn Tepper, Tommy Danielsson, Adele Morrow and Shelley Munday.

The Japanese team was Mr.M.Nomoto (Manager), H.Nagase, M.Imafuku, Misses T.Ikeda and E.Kawahara.

The Japan Foundation sponsored the tour and matches were attended by their officials, Mr.Kaneki (Consul General of Japan) and Mr.Kono (Director, Japan Information Service). A reception for players and officials was given by the Consul General of Japan.

The Japanese players also visited Shepparton where they conducted a most successful series of exhibitions and coaching sessions for local players.

2.5.3 KOREAN TEAM

In September Victoria hosted a visit by seventeen players and officials from the Chiel Wool Textile and Chiel Synthetic Textile Companies from Korea. The delegation was led by Mr.Park Sung In who has visited us previously as coach of Korean teams and as Rothmans coach.

A large crowd witnessed some excellent matches in an International Tournament played at the Table Tennis Centre. Prior to the matches the Koreans gave exhibitions at the Executive and Staff gymnasiums of G.J.Coles & Company.

The Korean men visited Geelong where they gave exhibitions to over one thousand school children, while the women players coached over two hundred school children at the Table Tennis Centre. The visit concluded with an exhibition and coaching session at the Croydon Table Tennis Centre.

2.7 COACHING

Coaching in Victoria is not confined only to Albert Park and the metropolitan associations. Now more and more country associations have been seeking the expertise of coaches in order to provide their players with the opportunity to improve their game.

During 1982 the Victorian Table Tennis Coaches Association and the National Director of Coaching have conducted coaching clinics at Ararat, Ballarat, Hamilton, Benalla, Colac, Camperdown and Warrnambool. These clinics also incorporate coaching in schools. The National Director of Coaching has also conducted coaching classes at Dandenong and Croydon.

Coaching of squads and teams within the junior ranks continues to feature very strongly in the preparation of players for major interstate and international championships under the guidance of the Association Coach, Igor Klaf.

1982 has seen the commencement of an Under 13 squad which was formed from players who had been recommended by their respective associations. The aim was to form a broader base of players and also to provide the Association with variety in numbers and ability.

At Albert Park, coaching for seniors and juniors is available during the week and weekends. The main thrust for seniors was Friday nights and Sunday mornings, and for juniors on Saturday afternoons. These coaching sessions are held throughout the year and are aimed at teaching beginners (of all ages) and also helping players to improve their game.

It is hoped that all affiliated associations will bring this availability of coaching to the attention of their members.

2.7.1 COACHES ASSOCIATION OF VICTORIA

The Coaches Association has continued to work with the VTTC by providing coaches for all coaching programs. This includes coaching at club, association and national levels. Our coaches train players to become coaches by conducting courses in theory and practice at Level One.

In order to keep in touch with the varied aspects of coaching, the Association organises seminars and lectures for its members. The coaches also spend time improving their own game by attending special practice sessions.

The video equipment purchased in 1981 is being put to very good use. Juniors are being filmed during coaching sessions and match situations and they are given the opportunity to discuss their games with their coaches.

The coaches take every opportunity to improve their knowledge of the game and sport in general, and we look forward to continued financial support.

2.7.2 NATIONAL COACHING COMMITTEE

When Mr. E. Coster was appointed the National Director of Coaching, he devised a four level State Awards and a two level National Awards program which was adopted by the ATTA and all State Coaching bodies. It was submitted to the Commonwealth Coaching Advisory Body and was rejected. The new program was developed by the current N.D.C., Mr. M. Johns, so that it conformed with the Commonwealth Coaching Scheme and was approved by the Government in 1981.

The current situation is that the scheme has been approved and adopted at State and National level. It is a National Scheme in which States participate:

1. States make submissions and recommendations on behalf of its coaches.

- 8
2. The National Coaching Committee considers those submissions and makes various awards after discussion and consideration of information placed before it.

It was considered that Levels should be aimed at active and currently participating coaches. A long history of coaching has some relevance but does not give an automatic entry into higher levels of the National Coaching Scheme. The coaching awards is not considered as a reward for service or past ability and contribution. They must be seen as stepping stones to a coaching career for practising coaches.

The Coaches Register for Victoria reads as follows:- 8 Level 3 coaches, out of which number one is the National Director of Coaching; 1 is a Master Coach and 2 will have to be re-assessed for 1983; 4 Level 2 coaches, out of which 3 have to be re-assessed, and 79 Level 1 coaches, of which 62 have to be re-assessed.

2.8 TRAINING CAMPS IN VICTORIA

The criteria for holding camps has been:

- (a) To serve as an incentive to players who have been seen to be putting in the effort at matches and coaching sessions.
- (b) To build up and intensify team spirit among players in preparation for championships when they represent the State.

With these criteria in mind a junior camp was conducted in January when players were invited to attend on the recommendation of selectors, coaches and associations.

A camp was also held in May which was exclusively for players who would be representing Victoria in the Australian Junior Championships. While most of the camps are a 'live in' at Albert Park, this particular camp arranged for players to be billeted.

Another weekend camp was also conducted for juniors in July. This was taken by the National Director of Coaching, the Association Coach and volunteers from the Coaches Association.

2.9 UMPIRES LEAGUE

Members of the Victorian Table Tennis Umpires League have once again been kept busy providing Referees for pennant nights and tournaments, in addition to providing umpires for these events.

At the Annual General Meeting the following were elected as office bearers:-

Mr.Clive Gadd was elected as Delegate to the ATTA Umpires Committee.

The positions of Assistant Secretary and Ordinary Member were left vacant.

On the National scene, Mr.Clive Gadd was once again re-appointed as Chairman of the ATTA Umpires Committee, and Mr.Ron Chadband was appointed Referee for the Commonwealth Games exhibition match in Brisbane. Mr.Angelo Tabone also officiated at this match as an umpire, and has been chosen as Australia's

sole representative to officiate at the 1983 World Championships in Tokyo, Japan.

The results of examinations for International umpires also brought good news and our congratulations go to Dr. Bob Augusteyn and Mrs. Val Gay on passing their examinations.

Probationary umpires who attained full status as State Umpires were Miss Sharleen Johnson, David Gordon and Peter Nedeljkovic.

After a full and satisfying year the VTTUL looks to 1983 in anticipation that the year will prove as successful as 1982.

2.10 STATE GOVERNMENT GRANTS

The VTTA was again the recipient of a grant from the Department of Youth, Sport and Recreation. \$16,000 was received to assist in many facets of the Association's activities. These include the salary of the Development Officer, coaching at the Centre, in affiliated associations and schools, training of coaches and umpires and assistance for travel of Victorian State teams.

2.11 AUSTRALIAN TABLE TENNIS ASSOCIATION

2.11.1 FINANCIAL

The Treasurer reported a surplus of \$2428 for the year 1981-82. The balance sheet at June 30, 1982 showed accumulated funds of \$8,936. Federal Government grants totalled \$33,300 and sponsorships \$3098, in a total income of \$58,151.

Principal items of expenditure were the salary, travel and other expenses of the National Director of Coaching which totalled over \$32,000. The Newsletter, less advertising, cost \$1914, the General Personal Meeting (less travel levy paid by States) \$2056.

Participation in the 1981 Pacific Games in New Zealand, the New Zealand Championships, 1982 Asian Championships and preliminary expenses on the 1982 Commonwealth Games demonstration totalled \$5341.

Two motions carried at the 1982 General Personal Meeting - (a) to increase the National Levy from \$7,300 to \$18,000 and (b) to institute from 1/1/1984 a registration fee of \$2 per annum on every Australian player, senior or junior (except those in school competitions) were subsequently defeated on voting by States, leaving the ATTA's sources of income in jeopardy.

2.11.2 PROCEDURAL CHANGES

1. Classified members who are in arrears as at 30th June and declared unfinancial shall, in addition to the \$20 annual (late) renewal fee, be required to pay a \$40 fine before the ATTA Council will consider lifting their automatic suspension.

2. Nominations for the National Junior Committee will in future be called for at the same time as National Selectors.

2.11.3 NATIONAL TABLE TENNIS LEAGUE

Approval was given at the 1982 General Personal Meeting for a National League to be formed with the National Director of Coaching as organiser with power to co-opt organising committee members. The organisers will be responsible to an ATTA subcommittee consisting of Dr.J.Jackson (SA), Mr.K.Bowler (NSW) and Mr.N.Bell (SA) and this committee will select the League teams.

Competition is scheduled to begin in May 1983 and four teams from Victoria are competing - Coburg, Geelong, Ballarat and St Kilda Cricket/Croydon.

2.11.4 COMING EVENTS

1. New South Wales will host the 1983 Australian Junior Championships at Macquarie University, Sydney, from May 15 - 20.
2. Western Australia will hold the 1983 Australian Open Championships in North Perth from September 4 - 9.
3. Australia will be represented by mens and womens teams at the Commonwealth Championships in Kuala Lumpur from April 18 - 23 and the World Championships in Tokyo, Japan from April 28 - May 9.
4. An Under 21 team of two men and a woman will be invited to tour Papua-New Guinea from June 22 - 27 and play three Tests.

2.11.5 ATTA COUNCIL

In March 1982, Victoria appointed Mr.A.Cleaves as its Delegate, replacing Mr.H.Rockefeller. Mr.J.Beer (Vic) resigned as ATTA Honorary Treasurer in March 1982 and was replaced until the G.P.M. in Sydney by Mr.K.Bowler (NSW).

Other changes were that Mr.J.Padley resigned as West Australian delegate and Mr.L.Hitchen resumed that office.

At the 1982 GPM Mr.Steve Pardey (SA) was elected Honorary Treasurer, and subsequently Mr.David Parker replaced Dr.J.Jackson, who had retired as South Australian delegate.

During the illness of Vice-President Mr.L.Wharmby (Tas) Mr.N.Harwood acted as delegate. We are happy that Mr.Wharmby's health has greatly improved as the result of heart surgery.

3.6 FRENCH AWARDS

The French Award for the Victorian man player of the year was awarded to Tommy Danielsson of Coburg Table Tennis Club. Tommy, since arriving from Sweden, has carried all before him in Victoria.

He has not lost a tournament or pennant match to a Victorian. He has won the following open singles titles - Victorian Open, Victorian Closed, Croydon Masters, Riversdale-Halex, Geelong, Leongatha, Caulfield 1, Toyota Open (Brisbane), and the International Tournament featuring the visiting Korean players. Tommy was a member of the Victorian State team to the Australian Championships in Sydney. He also represented Victoria versus the visiting Italian and Japanese teams. The French Award for the Victorian woman player of the year was awarded to Miss Nadia Bisiach, also of the Coburg Table Tennis Club.

Nadia won the Geelong Open Singles title and was runner-up in the Victorian Closed, Riversdale-Halex and Leongatha Open Singles. Nadia was a member of the Australian team at the 1982 Commonwealth Championships and was also selected in the Australian team at the 1982 Asian Championships. However, as these were postponed, Australia was not represented by a womens team. Nadia has been chosen for the Australian team to the 1983 World and Commonwealth Championships. She also represented Australia versus the visiting Italian team. Nadia represented Victoria versus the touring Japanese team and was a member of the Champion Victorian State team to the Australian Championships in Sydney. 6. ADMINISTRATION REVIEW

1982 has seen several meetings held to pursue the aims of planning for the possible separation of pennant competition from the activities of the VTTA.

The Executive Committee has agreed that at some date to be arranged, it will not conduct a pennant competition. The Review Committee has also proceeded to draw up a 'model' constitution should a separate Association be formed. This constitution was approved by the Executive Committee. The model constitution was examined by the VTTA Honorary Legal Officer for any errors in its drafting.

The situation now stands ready for the next major move which is a meeting of Metropolitan Pennant Clubs to decide if they want to conduct themselves as an Affiliated Association with its inherent advantages and disadvantages. The advantage is the right to be an autonomous body standing as an equal with all other affiliated associations, large or small, within the framework of the VTTA Constitution. One disadvantage is to remain as a disenfranchised group whose voting rights are divided against each other.

Another disadvantage would be the financial administration of the largest Association created being responsible for the conduct of three pennant seasons, publishing results, news sheets and probably a paid administrator.

There has been doubt expressed that an executive working committee could be found to take on such a task. Further talk as to the wisdom of allowing such a large voting block (one vote per team) to be created has been aired.

Under the rules of the VTTA any group of people can create an Association regardless of its size at its formation. Such a body can only be hindered in its formation and aims, but if it is the wish of its members and is legally constituted it cannot be stopped.

Our thanks must also go to the hard workers in the various associations, clubs and subcommittees, the coaches, referees, umpires and the players - all needed to make our sport the great game that it is.

8. ADDENDUM

1982 may best be looked upon as a year in which no major advances were made and much time and energy was expended in holding our position. Our junior players improved on the previous year's results which indicates that the development and coaching in this area is achieving the desired results, but in the senior ranks we were dependent mostly upon the same proven players who have given much to the game for several years.

On the administrative side it was pleasing to note that Peter Nedeljkovic, a comparative newcomer to the Executive, was prepared to accept the position of Secretary when Alan Cleaves stood down, but again the bulk of the work has been undertaken by those tried and tested members of several years' experience.

Special mention must be made of the work of our Honorary Treasurer, Eric Leder, who, in a time of tightening finance, has kept the Association's funds in a healthy state. Our inability to find an Assistant Treasurer also meant increased work for him.

Despite requests at the 1982 AGM and in the News Sheet, two positions on the Executive remained unfilled and this placed a greater burden on other members. If people are unwilling to serve in an honorary capacity then the choice is either to reduce services or to use more paid staff, and the consequence of the latter choice should be clear.

To all persons who have assisted our sport both on and off the table in 1982 I extend our thanks and we look forward to their continued support in the coming year.
