SECRETARY'S REPORT

This report will be the last to be made by an Honorary Secretary of the Victorian Table Tennis Association. The association has adopted a new style of administration comprising a three member Executive Council with the Executive Director in attendance and six Executive Committee members.

The nine member committee will conduct the many and varied activities of the Association through greater use of the expertise existing in the membership at large, under the direction of an elected portfolio chairperson. It is a radical change of roles for all concerned and will throw extra responsibility on a newly elected President and his/her Board.

At the 1990 Annual General Meeting the President Dr. R. Bayly advised members of his intention to retire from the Executive Committee in late 1990, this became effective on 31st October, 1990. A group of Executive Committee members were asked to seek a candidate to lead us through the interim period up to the 1991 Annual General Meeting. Mr. Nick McConnell was approached to fill the vacancy and was duly elected by the Executive Committee. Mr. A. Tabone was also a nominee for the position.

The 1991 Annual General Meeting will see a whole new format for the elections as all positions will become vacant. Office Bearers will be President, Vice President (1), Treasurer and six Board Members seeking periods in office (2) three year terms (2) two year terms (2) one year term.

I will not be seeking election for any position on the new Board so this will be my final report to the members of this association.

It has always been a pleasure to report on the success achieved by players who have represented the State both overseas and at Australian Interstate levels. Officials only provide the structure and opportunity for players but it is they who have to work for it and then grasp that opportunity as it is made available.

If we start with our Under 15 and Under 17 teams who competed in Adelaide - Victoria won three teams events and five individual titles and shared two others. The youth teams Under 19 years and Under 21 years held in Sydney - Victoria won two teams titles and one individual title and shared one title. Our senior teams were successful in one team event, two individual titles and shared one title. The Veterans teams swamped the opposition winning four teams titles, seven individual titles and shared three events. The annual Riverina Trophy match at Wagga Wagga between New South Wales and Victoria Under 12 and Under 14 teams saw a comprehensive victory to our young players by a record score.

The first Australian Open Championships were played at the Melbourne Town Hall in May as part of the Melbourne Olympic Bid and was attended by Mr. Ichero Ogimura President of the International Table Tennis Federation. The playing conditions and standard of play was excellent with China, South Korea, New Zealand, Japan challenging Australian teams.

Regrettably the public failed to support the titles, (as did many of the Table Tennis fraternity), ticketing arrangements were not as successful as we hoped and publicity did not reach the level the event deserved. China and South Korea gave exhibitions in Ballarat and Geelong following the championships. The new format Australian National Championships were conducted at Albert Park and proved very successful.

The Country Championships saw a slight increase in team numbers once again which shows our country members are keen competitors and look forward to the annual battles against old foes. A new format saw three new grades and an earlier finish to the event, having no play-offs on Monday afternoon.

The Table Tennis Centre of Victoria still continues to provide facilities for the general public which ensures our income has a sound base for our many activities. With Melbourne not being successful in its bid to host the 1996 Olympic Games and the current financial woes of the State Government it would appear likely that our prospect of a new centre is unlikely till the late nineties. Your Executive Committee will consider the value of money required to improve the current facilities.

Table Tennis' entry into the Victorian Sports Institute is a welcome boost for the sport and its future.

A new venture was a match between a group of South Australian Under 15 players (non state team members) and the Victorian Junior League players played at the Hamilton Table Tennis Stadium. South Australia were far too strong for their Victorian opponents. But it is hoped that this event will equal the status of the NSW v Vic U12/U14 series.

The Australian representative teams continue to be dominated by players from this state as do most of the National rankings.

Finally, I recommend you to delve into this report for it presents the full range of activities conducted by your Executive Committee; it is also an historical record of this Association's members.

I commend this report for adoption.

The President Dr R Bayly informed the meeting that he would be resigning from the position later in 1990 (31/10/90), and urged members to consider a suitable person to fill the premature vacancy.

All members of the Committee carried out their many functions for the benefit of the membership. The Executive Council continued to carry out the day to day decisions with regard to the smooth running of the Association.

SPECIAL GENERAL MEETING

On September 21, 1990 a 'Special General Meeting' was held. The matter in question was put to a vote and carried, this being a change in structure and operation of your Committee and the duties of the Executive Director as set by that Committee.

The changes are to be incorporated into the Constitution and will come into effect for elections at the 1991 Annual General Meeting. While the Association will continue to be run under the auspices of an Executive Committee (Board of Management), this Committee as per the motion will be reduced in number from 15 to 9, with each member having a clearly defined role. He/She will be responsible for a particular area of management to which they are considered best suited.

The Sport of Table Tennis is moving into the realm of professional management and the structural changes will bring our Sport into line with other Sports who will move with ease towards the 21st Century. These changes will benefit players and officials now and far into the future.

EXECUTIVE DIRECTORS REPORT

The past year has again seen Table Tennis grow in popularity and participation.

Successes was achieved not only in Junior and Senior ranks but also with our ever growing contingent of Veterans.

Victorian Table Tennis experienced an increase in both Junior and Senior organised events in 1990 and in addition to its Schools program, providing us with encouragement for the future of our Sport in this State as well as showing the VTTA that it is on the right track in regard to Junior Development and promotion of our Sport.

The continuation of the Arthritis Awareness Table Tennis Program, through assistance from the Victorian Health Promotion Foundation, on a broader base in 1990 further developed the scope of our Sport in Victoria. The past year saw this program develop from essentially an Over 40 base to becoming more comprehensive in its delivery, covering areas from Primary Schools through to Veteran programs continually promoting Table Tennis as a means of assisting people to have a healthy lifestyle and specifically as a means of promoting and developing an awareness of Arthritis and its associated problems.

Victoria continued to be the most successful State competing at National titles. In 1990 we won 3 of 4 Junior teams titles and 7 individual events. We were winners of the Australian Mens teams event and runners-up in the Womens event, also capturing 3 individual events.

And not to be outdone by their younger counterparts our Veteran competitors captured the Over 50 & Over 60 Mens titles, Over 50 & Over 60 Womens titles and 10 individual titles.

The highlight of the year had to be the acceptance of Victorian Table Tennis into the Victorian Institute of Sport as one of its 13 full scholarship sports.

This is the culmination of many years development and work by players and administrators alike and provides athletes with access to elite coaching, sports science, National and International competition, which should all combine to further enhance Victorian Table Tennis and the position it holds in the Sport Nationally.

Other successes for our sport in 1990 were the continued growth of the Commonwealth Bank Schools Table Tennis Championships, already regarded as one of the largest single Table Tennis activities in the World and by far the largest in Australia, boasting almost 5,000 competitors and in excess of 120 Victorian Secondary Schools.

Tabten continued its phenomenal popularity as our Schools teams competition to the point where our resources both physically and human are stretched to the limit. This event we no longer promote, there is no need to as it promotes itself.

On the International scene Victorians again featured, with 12 Victorians representing Australia both here and overseas. Some notable events were the 1st Australian International Open, French Open, Yugoslavian Open, the World Team Championships and the World Doubles Championships.

This level of representation is indicative of the hard work and dedication given to Table Tennis by our players, many of whom are products of the excellent development programs introduced in the last couple of years. Based on this the future of Table Tennis in Victoria can be nothing but rosy.

In closing I would like to take this opportunity to thank all who have worked hard over the past 12 months to further develop our Sport throughout Victoria. I would specially like to thank the VTTA Board and Staff, Mrs Joan Guggenheim and the Executives of all the Clubs and Associations throughout Victoria for their continued support.

SPORTS DEVELOPMENT OFFICERS REPORT

Table Tennis in Schools took on a new aspect, with many requests being made for Coaching, Exhibitions and Clinics during 1990. During the year, several visits were undertaken to Moe, Sale, Orbost, Traralgon, Albury/Wodonga and Yarrawonga, to mention only a few. Mrs Joan Guggenheim and I conducted these Clinics which were in conjunction with the Vichealth Program. This program included exhibitions by the Table Tennis Clowns (Ping & Pong) who also did an exhibition in the Bourke Street Mall. This type of exhibition was also performed at Regional Shopping Centres and as part of the School holiday program. The availability of Brett Clarke who was able to perform/coach at short notice was a major factor in the success of this particular program.

Table Tennis participated in the Victorian Sports Experience Program (VSEP), in Country areas such as Geelong, Ararat etc. This year also saw the upgrading of exhibition matches in Schools with priority being placed on this type of interest as opposed to full Coaching Clinics, which tend to reduce the interest of students.

Table Tennis was requested to participate once again in the State Bank Youth Sports Expo with particular emphasis on Table Tennis in Schools.

Once again, the Commonwealth Bank Schools Table Tennis Program proved to be a great success, this event took up a large portion of my time along with the various Tabten Tournaments. The overall entry for the CBSTTC was in excess of 100 Schools.

My thanks to all who helped to lighten such a huge workload over a very busy year and thanks also to the Department of Sport & Recreation for making my position available through their funding under the Sports Development Officer Scheme.

PUBLICITY REPORT

Difficulties associated with publicity for what is considered a minor sport in Victoria continued to be evident during the last 12 months with main media outlets only interested in featuring international quality events or performances.

The Australian International Open being such an event received television, print, and radio coverage with a flurry of activity when the Australian Womens team defeated Japan. By contrast the Australian Closed almost went unnoticed by the media where there was an approach of "we gave table tennis a go last month".

The Sun/Herald, Age and Sunday Observer all provided features of elite performances by individuals but this was always on a reactive ad-hoc basis and occasionally dropping an article at the last minute to give the space and priority to some last minute event in a higher profile sport.

The only semi-regular news on Table Tennis appears in the Sunday Sun in Graham Burke's Sports of All Sorts column and although usually only a paragraph or two it does provide news of local activities and achievements.

On the other hand the VTTA's newsletter provides Victorians with regular and local coverage and all credit to the Editor, Val Bartolo. I am surprised that affiliated associations do not take advantage of this publications for their own news and benefit.

Likewise the ATTA Magazine has given the Victorian State good coverage although it is sometimes dated by the time it is distributed.

The Vic-Sport magazine also caters for Table Tennis and has featured the sub juniors Wagga event. Unfortunately this publication reaches a very limited audience.

Within the VTTA, I must thank Prisca Rosario for always providing tournament results to use for AAP and Angelo Tabone who has on many occasions either provided me with background material or pointed me in the right direction to obtain it.

The Veterans pennant and tournament results get published regularly in the Sun and Age through AAP.

Looking ahead, the reduction in the number of main newspapers in Melbourne will make competition for space between sports events more difficult and the VTTA will have to become even more pro-active to get any coverage.

A pro-active approach to publicity, means numerous telephone calls and visits to agencies and to be successful more than one publicity officer is necessary. A long term target may even be one publicity person for each agency, to develop contacts and press for coverage. I will certainly propose a re-structuring of publicity arrangements to the incoming board, for the coming years.

As this will be my last message as President and a member of the VTTA Executive Committee I would like to thank the Association and its members for the support which I have been given in carrying out various tasks in a range of positions since 1964. It is always invidious and dangerous to particularise but there have been some whose advice and help has been invaluable. At the risk of leaving out some who perhaps should be named I feel that I must mention Len Haycraft, Tom Horsfield, Eric Leder, Alan Cleaves, Peter Mascall, Angelo Tabone and John Beer without whom much less would have been achieved. At the staff level Joan and Max Guggenheim and, in later years, Rod Lindroth, were a tower of strength

I trust that the Association will give the same support to my successor, Mr. Nick McConnell and I wish him well.

Finally I must express my thanks to my wife, Rosemary, and my family who gave me great support over the period in which I have been privileged to serve Table Tennis.

The Ron Chadband Memorial Trophy for 1989 was presented at the Yasaka Easter Tournament to Jenny Langridge.

Overseas Ruth Singer was one of two Oceania umpires at the inaugural TSP World Teams Cup, Japan (May), where she umpired matches in a mens and in a womens semi-final. Ron and Fran Keyhoe umpired at the Butterfly World Doubles Cup, Seoul, Korea (November), where Ron umpired a mens semi-final and the womens final. Angelo Tabone and Ruth Singer (and two other Australian Internationals) attended an ITTF referees' seminar and the first International referees' examination, held in Kuala Lumpur, Malaysia (December) just prior to the 10th Asian Championships, at which Ruth umpired matches in mens and womens teams semi-finals and the womens teams final.

Sadly, Peter Ward, who had been a member of the League for many years, passed away in February.

In May, Melbourne hosted the inaugural Australian International Open Championships at which we were honoured by the presence of the ITTF President, Ichiro Ogimura, himself an International umpire and a former world champion. Clive Gadd was assistant referee and the umpires came not only from all over Victoria and from interstate but also included eight international umpires from Japan.

An ATTA umpires seminar was held in Melbourne during the Championships.

Also in May, just after the International, Angelo Tabone was referee for two qualifying tournaments which were held in Melbourne, one for the 555 World Cup (mens singles) and the other for the Butterfly World Doubles Cup (mens and womens).

In August, the Australian National Championships were held in Melbourne, at which Ron Keyhoe was the referee, assisted by Clive Gadd, Ruth Singer and Fran Keyhoe - and a strong field of Victorian umpires officiated as well as some interstate umpires.

VTTUL members also officiated at all VTTA and several Affiliated Association conducted tournaments at Senior, Junior and Veteran levels, and during the three seasons of VTTA pennant matches, including the pre-season New Club's Nights.

Fran Keyhoe conducted umpiring courses at Horsham, Ballarat, Croydon, Mornington and Melbourne, the last being held in the umpires room.

Several umpires improved their grading during the year: Ron and Fran Keyhoe to International, Russell Glasson and Peter Nedeljkovic to National, John Huysmans to State. Four people started off on the umpiring ladder - Graeme Ireland, Alan Peel, Ray Ring and Margaret Tonkin qualified for the Probationary State Umpires Certificate.

3. COACHING

COACHING FOR ALL

Coaching is made available for Adults of all playing abilities. Bob Pappalardo on Mondays from 7.30 - 9.30 and on Fridays by Don Boughton from 7.00 - 9.00. The Juniors are coached by Trevor Barr on a Saturday afternoon from 1.30 - 3.30.

JUNIOR SQUADS AND TEAMS

Junior Squads and teams for the State titles is taken by Igor Klaf and assisted by P. Rosario (co-ordinator), Bob Pappalardo and Roy Jones. There is also a squad of Under 14's who train to go to Wagga and play against the NSW players.

Besides these coaching sessions which are conducted at Albert Park there are several Accredited Coaches who run similar programs in their respective Associations. Next year it is hoped that reports on this network of coaching throughout the Affiliated Associations will be made available.

We now have 6 more Level 1 Accredited Coaches. Alois Rosario has trained another 9 Level 0 Coaches from the Moe Association.

SCHOOLS

Once again the schools coaching and exhibition program was very active this year.

The areas covered included Yarrawonga, Steels Creek, Gisborne, Red Hill, Albury/Wodonga, Tatong and Ararat.

We also attended a few Victorian Sports Experience Programs around the country.

A lot of the work was done in the metropolitan area with a lot of schools requesting exhibitions requiring the use of other people to help out. Much thanks must go to these willing workers who sometimes have to be called on at very short notice.

FRENCH AWARDS

The French Award for the Victorian Male Players of the Year was awarded to Peng Huy Quach. This year Quach has represented Australia in the following:- First Australian International Open in Melbourne, Oceania Championships in New Zealand and the Asian Championships in Malaysia. He also competed in the inaugural Butterfly World Doubles Cup in the Republic of Korea with his partner Alvin Cheang as the Oceania zone representative pair having previously competed in the qualifying tournament in Melbourne. He also represented Victoria in the National Championships with distinction. His results are as follows:- Australian National Championships Teams 13/2, Australian Singles Champion, Australian International Open defeated Oceania Champion Peter Jackson (New Zealand) in a teams match. He is the current Oceania Doubles Champion with Glenn Tepper. He was undefeated in the Oceania teams matches winning 6/0.

He is the Victor Barna Australian Player of the Year. He is ranked 1 in Victoria and Australia, 3 in Oceania.

The French Award for the Victorian Female Player of the Year was awarded to Kerri Tepper. In winning the award for a record 6 times Kerri has broken her own record of 5 wins in a row which she created last year. Kerri has represented Australia in the following:- First Australian International Open in Melbourne, TSP World Teams Cup in Japan and the Oceania Championships in New Zealand. She also competed in the inaugural Butterfly World Doubles Cup in the Republic of Korea with her partner Ying Kwok (NSW) as the Oceania zone representative pair having previously competed in the qualifying tournament in Melbourne. At the conclusion of the Oceania Championships in September Kerri went to Sweden to compete in the Elite League competition as well as the major Open Championships in Europe for a period of eight months.

She also represented Victoria in the National Championships with distinction. Her results are as follows:- Australian National Championships teams 14/1. Kerri was the Victorian Captain. She won a bronze medal in the Singles and won the Doubles with Ying Kwok (NSW). Australian International Open defeated A. Muroshige (Japan) both in the Teams and Womens Singles. Pairing with Ying Kwok (NSW) they defeated A. Muroshige and S. Hosokawa (Japan) in the teams match to record an historic 3/1 best ever performance by Australia. She won a bronze medal in the Doubles with Ying Kwok (NSW). She also won the following Open Singles titles in Victoria:- Yasaka, Moomba, Ballarat, Mornington and Dandenong. She is the current Oceania Doubles Champion with Ying Kwok (NSW) Her results in the teams matches in Oceania were 9/1.

She is ranked 1 in Victoria, 3 in Australia, 3 in Oceania, 9 in the Commonwealth and 97 in the World.

TED SOKOLOWSKI MEMORIAL AWARD

For the third successive year, Igor Klaf was named the Victorian Male Veteran Player of the Year.

Igor had an outstanding year taking an unprecedented 6 gold medals at the Australian Championships, winning the Over 40 Singles for the 11th time and the Over 50 for the 3rd time. His record is outstanding and will be very hard to emulate.
