26th ANNUAL REPORT

To be presented to the Annual Meeting of the Association to be held at Earl's Court, St.Kilda, on the 7th March, 1956, at 8 p.m.

Ladies and Gentlemen:

The following is a report of the work undertaken by your Association for the Season 1955.

Main feature this year was the conducting of the 10th Australian Carnival, by your Association, at Earl's Court, St. Kilda.

INTERNATIONAL WORLD CUP -

There were 16 countries represented in this first International tournament for the Skolnick World Cup; it proved a great success. In the semi-finals, Australia defeated Israel, and Lithuania defeated Latvia. Lithuania then went on to win the event, defeating Australia, in the final.

PENNANT COMPETITIONS -

The Pennant Competitions this year saw an entry of 255 teams competing in 33 grades (26 men, 7 women).

The standard of play was very high, and all matches were played in a most sporting spirit. It was noticeable that dressing of players was much improved, also full benefit was taken of your Committee's experience in regard to advice on playing conditions.

It was found necessary on some occasions to penalize clubs for various breaches of match regulations, particularly late results, and it is requested that all clubs bring themselves up to date by obtaining copies of the Regulations from any sports store, or in the case of Affiliated Associations direct from the V.T.T.A.
