#### ANNUAL REPORT

To be presented to the Annual General Meeting of the Association to be held on the 1st April, 1953.

Ladies and Gentlemen,

The following is a report of the work undertaken on behalf of the Association for the season 1952.

Features of the season were, continuation of Headquarters Club at Wirths Olympia, inauguration of Country Week, including Men and Women's individual Championships, Metropolitan Atlas Shield, and the record number of open Tournaments approved by this Association.

### PENNANT COMPETITIONS.

192 teams with 916 registered players competed in 24 Grades. (20 Men, 4 Women).

During the season it was found necessary to penalize a number of clubs for various breaches of Match Regulations, and it is recommended that all Club Secretaries and players become fully conversant with the Regulations, by studying the Official A.T.T.A. Handbook Complete with V.T.T.A. Match Regulations, obtainable from all Sports Stores, or in the case of Affiliated Associations, direct from the V.T.T.A.

## AUSTRALIAN CARNIVAL:

The 7th Australian Table Tennis Carnival was held at Hobart, Tasmania 8th - 12th September, 1952. Men and Women's Teams from every State competed. In addition to the official teams, many Victorians, both players and officials paid their own expenses to participate.

For the first time in the history of the Carnival there was a triple tie. In the Men's team matches N.S.W., Queensland and Victoria were the teams concerned. For the playoff it was decided that each of the three teams play each other. N.S.W. won the shield by defeating both Queensland and Victoria. Victoria finished second by defeating Queensland.

ATLAS SHIELD COMPETITION. Early this season, the final match for the 1951 Atlas Shield was played between the two inter-zone winners, Geelong and Williamstown-Footscray Table Tennis Associations, and to the winner of this event, Williamstown-Footscray District, we tender our congratulations.

The 1952 Atlas Shield competition was conducted along different lines for the first time. With the donation of another shield, it was made possible to divide this event into two sections, country and Metropolitan, this being very successful. In the final of the Metropolitan Atlas Shield, Northern Suburbs Table Tennis Association defeated Williamstown-Footscray Districts, 9-19 to 2-9.

COUNTRY WEEK. For the first time it was decided to conduct a Country Week, and we have very much pleasure in announcing that this was an unqualified success, due in no small measure to the Sub-committee who handled the whole programme, Messrs. Haycraft, Rundle and Murphy, and also to the Affiliated Associations who wholeheartedly co-operated in this scheme. The programme was for three days and the dates were arranged so that the players, if they so desired, could participate in the Victorian Championship events. Turing these three days, team matches for the Country Atlas Shield and the individual Country Championships were played. INTERNATIONAL TOUR. Unfortunately this year, there was not a tour by overseas players, but negotiations are under way for International players to visit here in 1953, as your Executive feels that these visits by International players materially help our players and popularize the game.

V.T.T.A. HEADQUARTERS CLUB. The response this year to the Headquarters Club was very disappointing. There were 101 members only, and your Association suffered a very severe financial setback. We thank the club Committee who worked so hard, and put in much of their valuable time by being in attendance every night on which the club was open, and arranging Pennant Teams for the members. It was unfortunate that very soon after the start of the season Mr. K. Williams found it necessary to resign as Honorary Secretary. This position was taken over by Mr. Ken Harrison, and we feel that 1953 will put the Headquarters Club back on it's feet.

A new feature during the season was the innovation of a Picture Night showing sporting films. This was held at the Headquarters Club and proved a great success.

A noticable feature this year from the Victorian Championships onwards, was the special lighting over each table which was installed at great expense and made the ideal playing conditions. Also, during the season provision was made for the serving of supper and cool drinks each night.

The success of the Headquarters Club is in each and every Table Tennis player's own hands, and we ask you to rally round to all club functions that are held and bring along any intending new members.

Particularly do we wish to make mention of The Sporting Globe and Staff, whose co-operation was all that could possibly be desired, and we look forward to a renewal of their interest for the coming season.

AUSTRALIAN TABLE TENNIS ASSOCIATION. Delegates to the A.T.T.A. were again in constant meeting by correspondence throughout the year, and all delegates were present at a General Personal Meeting held at the time of the Australian Carnival at Hobart in September 1952. At this meeting a decision was made that an Australian team be sent to the world Championship Series and play in the Swathling Cup, to be held in London 1954.

Mr. R. Vardon, (Sth. Aust.) resigned as President of the A.T.T.A. and Mr. J. Nies (N.S.W.) was elected to fill the vacancy.

Mr. R. H. Jones was again elected Honorary Secretary of the A.T.T.A.

FINANCIAL STATEMENT. On reviewing the financial position of the Association, it can be seen that the Association is in a sound position, even though financially, 1952 was a very tough and lean year.

Costs of equipment, service and administration have materially increased, and the upward spiral of costs can no longer be borne solely by the Association, so very reluctantly we must ask for your support by having occasion, for the first time in many seasons, to increase your pennant fees for the coming year.

In conclusion Ladies and Gentlemen, your Executive are determined that 1953 shall be another year of increasing popularity of Table Tennis, and be instrumental in bringing to everyone concerned, the goodfellowship that goes hand in hand with our game.
