ANNUAL GENERAL MEETING

The 1997 Annual General Meeting of Table Tennis Victoria was conducted at the centre at Albert Park on Sunday 6 April 1997 at 11am. The major item of business related to: the minimum junior residential qualifying term for national team selection to be set at 12 months (motion defeated - stays at 6 months); junior players in the U14 and younger age groups be allowed to play tournaments at silver registration level - motion carried; junior membership fees be set at 50% - motion carried.

The other significant items of business related to the impending demolition of "the centre" and the proposal to move the offices of TTV to the Melbourne Sports and Aquatic Centre and sign the necessary Licence Agreement with the MSAC Trust to effect this allowing use of the Table Tennis Stadium at the facility which, was endorsed by the meeting.

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PRESIDENT'S REPORT (Bob Tuckett)

1997 was a year of significant change with the employment of a new Executive Director and move to the Melbourne Sports and Aquatic Centre (MSAC).

Graham Lockwood commenced as Executive Director in January of 1997 and was immediately thrust into negotiations regarding the move to MSAC. These negotiations were successfully completed and endorsed by members at the 1997 Annual General Meeting. The Licence agreement ensured that TTV would be no worse off financially than in the old Albert Park Centre.

In the important financial area I am pleased to state that a break even situation was achieved, considering a total of \$10,000 was spent on legal fees during 1997. An extraordinary item (sale of equipment from old Centre) saw an increase of \$15,000, in members funds however this is purely a one off situation.

At the 1997 Annual General Meeting the following were elected to the Board of Management: John Mackey - Director of Senior Tournaments/Pennant; Jim Montgomery - Director Coaching/Technical; Bob Tuckett - President.

Dan Elliott resigned as Vice-President of TTV effective at the conclusion of the AGM. The position of Vice President was subsequently filled by Marc Huinink of the Greater Dandenong Table Tennis Association.

On 26 July a nostalgic farewell to the Albert Park Centre was held and was a resounding success with more than 400 people in attendance. Many Associations and Clubs contributed memorabilia and assisted in ensuring the success of this farewell day.

In August 1997 Table Tennis Australia circulated notice of a planning seminar to be held on 13 September to discuss the topic "If you were creating Table Tennis in Australia today how would you go about it?". Two delegates from each State and Territory were invited to attend this seminar and submit proposals.

Prior to the seminar TTV circulated the topic to all Affiliated Associations and Clubs requesting input. Disappointingly only two responses were received. The TTV Board of Management submitted a discussion paper with the objective:

"A National structure that is conducive to the most effective governance, management, marketing and development of Table Tennis" based on the principles that the National Association must have:

- sustained financial viability
- a business oriented Board
- responsibility for policy and strategy
- a National Vision

Subject to the requirements

- a structure that will allow Table Tennis to run in a cohesive, efficient and productive manner
- a structure that engenders a culture of continuous improvement in all aspects of the National Association's operations consistent with worlds best Table Tennis practices
- effective leadership and direction from the National Association
- optimum integration of management functions on a National level
- stronger National decision making processes
- streamlined communications
- elimination of duplication between National and State Associations
- stronger links between National Association and Associations/Clubs at local level
- recognition that Table Tennis at elite development and participation level are interdependent
- Associations/Clubs to retain autonomy and discretion on Association/Club matters
- to create an understanding that National and Association/Clubs interests are mutually served by the National Vision - ownership of National Vision at Association/Club level required to ensure structures at Association/Club level survive and effectively deliver grass roots development programs and competitions
- ensuring the viability of Associations/Clubs by adequate support and resourcing from National Association
- National Association and Association/Clubs to be customer oriented - responsive to their members needs, use resources cost effectively, have open and transparent procedures in doing business and have good communications with members and stakeholders
- National Board to comprise equal numbers of appointed members

To achieve the above it was envisaged the National Association be empowered in the following key areas:

- Membership Development
- Discretionary powers in finance area encompassing responsibility for imposition and collections of levy and/or individual registration fee
- Marketing/Promotion
- Sponsorship
- Coaching and Development
- Direct communication to Associations/Clubs
- Implementation of current information technology
- Insurance

The following proposal was submitted: "A suitable taskforce be formed to investigate the structure of Table Tennis in Australia taking into consideration the principles and requirement outlined". With a few minor additions to the requirements the proposal was endorsed by the delegates at the Seminar. TTV was represented at the Seminar by Graham Lockwood and Bob Tuckett.

The TTA Board of Management supported the proposal emanating from the seminar and formed the Taskforce comprising:

The Taskforce was given the task of producing a draft report for State and Territory Delegates to discuss at the TTA SGM on 15 February 1998. TTV has kept its Affiliated Associations and Clubs informed of the taskforce role.

The Australian Junior, Youth and Senior Championships were successfully conducted in Victoria in 1997. TTV conducted the Youth Championship in conjunction with the Yasaka Easter Classic and the Croydon & Districts TTA conducted the Junior and Senior Championships. Victoria won the interstate teams events in Under 14 Girls and Boys, Under 17 Boys and Under 20 Women and Men and Senior Women and Men. Congratulations to Australian Singles Champions: Mimi Lee (Under 14 Girls), Miao Miao (Under 17 Girls), Simon Gerada (Under 17 Boys), Wayne Gerada (Under 20 Men), Miao Miao (Womens) and Brett Clarke (Men).

Victoria was also represented with distinction at the Australian Veterans Championships winning the Over 60 Women and Over 70 Mens Team events. Congratulations to Australian Singles Champions: Joan Munn (Over 50 Women), Wally Poole (Over 70 & Over 75 Men) and Wal Savage (Over 80 Men).

Congratulations to the Melbourne (previously Croydon) Conquerors who retained their National League Championships. The Conquerors team comprised Russell Lavale, Mark Smythe, Trevor Brown and Shirley Zhou. Victoria was also represented at the Arafura Games in Darwin by Robin Moore, Andrew Gilbert, Michael Belot and Omar Habboucheh. Robin and Andrew distinguished themselves with a bronze medal in the mens doubles.

International events to be successfully conducted at MSAÇ were the Australian Open Championships and the 1st Asian Veterans Championships. The Victorian players and officials to represent Australian at International events overseas were: Russell Lavale, Mark Smythe, Simon Gerada, Trevor Brown, Miao Miao, Shirley Zhou, Yvonne Li, Graeme Ireland, Angelo Tabone, Ron Keyhoe, Russell Glasson, Fran Keyhoe and Ruth Singer.

A disappointing trend in 1997 was a drop in registration numbers of 213, especially the drop in junior numbers by 240. Junior development is the crucial foundation on which the future of table tennis is based. The TTV Board of Management is holding a workshop to discuss and plan ways to arrest this trend. The input of members is vital.

At this juncture I wish to express the appreciation of the Board of Management to Graeme Ireland who is standing down as Treasurer after 5 years. Graeme has played a pivotal role in turning around the financial fortunes of TTV. On behalf of all involved with TTV a heartfelt thank you Graeme.

In conclusion I wish to thank the TTV staff, Board members, and Affiliated Associations and Clubs who have devoted their time and energy to Table Tennis over the past 12 months.

EXECUTIVE DIRECTORS REPORT

Part funded by Sport and Recreation Victoria.

Greetings to all members of Table Tennis Victoria and their families. It has been a pleasure to meet many of you over the last twelve months and to become more acquainted with the sport which means so much to all of us for the pleasure and camaraderie it brings into our lives. During this period I have been able to visit many of the major Association and Club venues.

While the last twelve months have certainly been a challenging period of my working life, it has been without doubt one of the most pleasurable - being associated with people with a common interest in a sport; being associated with a sport I personally enjoy, and having a challenge before me to lift the profile of our sport and to develop the work of my predecessors to make TTV a viable, outward looking and successful sporting business enterprise.

As we head towards the 2000 Olympics in Sydney and the 21st Century we are at the threshold of an exciting future for Table Tennis one of the largest recreational sports in the world. At this stage, it is opportune that the sport in Australia is looking inwardly at itself with a view to assessing how it positions itself to go forward as a sport into the next millennium.

Table Tennis has now reached maturity as a sport having its "21st birthday" with admission as an Olympic Sport at Seoul in 1988. In many ways however, it is still a young sport and because of its family recreation and non contact rules, one that still has huge potential for expansion.

With the advent of the 21st century all sport in Australia may be in the situation where they will be expected to operate with little or no government support. The transition to this situation is occurring now and is expected to accelerate and hence it is incumbent on all table tennis players more than ever to work together nationally as a cohesive enterprise. To do this means managing the sport from "the top down", reducing the beauracracy and supporting and developing table tennis at grass roots level.

My report for the year would not be complete without some mention of the closure of the old centre and the move of TTV to its new headquarters at MSAC. With the closure of the old centre every effort was made to sell off as much as possible of equipment/furniture etc returning some \$15000 to Members Funds.

Following the move to MSAC I am conscious of the many members concerns relating to the table tennis stadium- lighting, heating/cooling etc., noise, and that it doesn't feel like our "home". The lighting has been a vexed question with the Trust and their contractors and hopefully with the recent computer re-programming of the lights to take place shortly much of the criticism of level and uniformity will be overcome. While temperature in the stadium has been a problem on a few occasions I think its fair to say the conditions generally are better than at the old centre. To make the stadium more like home MSAC have arranged for tiered seating to be positioned semi-permanently in the front half of the stadium. We are continuing to discuss with MSAC the possibility of some honour boards and memorabilia display cases being located in the stadium or at the entrance area.

As far as profiling our sport the relocation of the Albert Park Table Tennis Stadium to MSAC has resulted in something like 6-8% increase in Table Tennis played compared with the old centre and this trends appears to be increasing. The use of the western section of the stadium on Monday and Tuesday nights enables increased revenue to TTV and the inconvenience and noise factor has to be balanced against this benefit.

TTV were fortunate in securing a "once off" additional grant from Sport and Recreation Victoria for a Future Directions program to be conducted over the 1997/98 year focussing on involvement of more women, Non-English speaking background and Koori people in the sport. To this end Brian Berry and Jim Montgomery have been employed for the period to implement this program.

One of the major disappointments of the year was the collapse of the Victorian Academy. Unfortunately TTA's offer of sharing the coaching services of Nela Bran between the Olympic Athlete Program and the Victorian Academy did not work out as envisaged for both Victorian players or TTV. With the cost of court hire at MSAC and to pay a coach for the Academy it became prohibitive to continue the Academy especially as there was not a total commitment to it by all players concerned. If there had been sufficient player support and commitment TTV could have continued to subsidise the academy albeit perhaps at a higher player fee. Hence the Board decided to just concentrate on a program for the Victorian Development Squad on a Saturday and subsidise the cost for same. It is hoped that player support for this squad will continue through out 1998.

During 1998 TTV will be endeavouring to seek sponsorship and raise funds for its development programs, particularly for juniors as we must arrest the apparent decline in the area evidenced by registration over the last year.

One of the more pleasurable occurrences of last year I was involved with was in May with the winning by a Victorian Mens Team (Russell Lavale, Trevor Brown & Simon Gerada) of the Mens Team Event at the Inaugural Ho Chi Minh Inter City International Tournament and a quarter final result by the womens team (Miao Miao, Shirley Zhou & Yvonne Li). TTV was able to redirect Victorian members of the Australian World Championship team to play in this event to gain further international experience.

Considerable effort has been put into controlling costs throughout the year resulting in a near break even position after allowing for the extra-ordinary legal costs incurred earlier in the year.

During the latter part of the year a sponsorship and fundraising plan was prepared which is currently being implemented to ensure the financial viability of the Association.

In concluding this report I would like to pay tribute to the many volunteers across a wide spectrum of membership without which Table Tennis Victorian could not operate. I thank them and salute them. I want to also again thank staff of TTV for their dedicated, loyal and enthusiastic support. It has been a privilege and a pleasure to work with them.

DEVELOPMENT OFFICER'S REPORT (Alois Rosario)

Part funded by Sport & Recreation Victoria

1997 saw a change of focus for the Development Officer position towards more emphasis being placed on the establishment of long term programs in schools. This was done mainly through the Sport Education in Physical Education Program (SEPEP) Manual that was developed in 1996. With the assistance of this manual schools were able to run Term programs of Table Tennis and develop the skills of the students. Our next step is to encourage more of them to become involved with Clubs.

During 1997 Glenn Tepper and Wilhelmina Pruyn from TTA and I wrote the "TOPS" Table Tennis Manual (Modified Table Tennis Program for schools and clubs) which expands on the SEPEP model and incorporates the lower levels of Primary schools as well as extending the Secondary school levels. This will be of benefit to schools in the future. Apart from Lesson Plans the TOPS Manual also incorporates a Skills Award scheme, Basic Stroke Cards, Activity Cards, Skills Circuits, Competition Formats, Assessment Forms and Rules of Table Tennis. The TOPS manual was made possible by a special grant received from Sport & Recreation Victoria.

The year also saw a greater emphasis on the development of Disabled services with the establishment Come 'N Try sessions for Special Schools and older people with an Intellectual Disability. This program is designed to lead to participation in the Paralympics in Sydney 2000.

Once again there was an increase in the demand from schools for clinics as part of Sport Education. During the year I conducted clinics for approximately 4,800 students. This comprised 1900 students visited with Country Associations, 2,200 visited through school requests and 700 through Expos. With more schools taking on Sport Education an opportunity exists for Table Tennis through Associations/Clubs and through the TOPS Manual to increase the level of participation.

The regional Associations visited were Albury/Wodonga, Yarrawonga, Kerang, Myrtleford, Mornington, Warrnambool, Hamilton, Horsham, Traralgon and Geelong. There was also the increase in demand due to the new facility at MSAC. By linking with MSAC we have provided clinics for schools coming to the centre and also for school holiday programs, after school programs and corporate events.

Thank you to all the helpful people from Associations and Clubs around Victoria who assisted me with the many tasks during the year. Thank you also to Doug Sandiford, Kathy Tessier and Keith Grainger from Education Victoria for their support with the schools program and to Sport and Recreation Victoria for their continued funding and administrative support.

VICHEALTH PROGRAM REPORT (Joan Guggenheim)

Our thanks once again to the Victorian Health Promotion Foundation who funded the "Active For Life" Program with Arthritis Victoria as our health sponsor. This funding ensures that we can continue and enlarge our various programs.

These include sponsorships for Pennant, Tournaments, Coaching Camps, State League, Schools Championships, Inter Association Challenge, Women only events including coaching and tournaments, visits to Retirement Villages and Senior Citizen Groups, Interstate and Association visits. These events cover the entire range of players from juniors to veterans.

The Active For Life health message is continuously promoted with banners, posters, brochures, shirts, rulers entry forms and bags.

VETERANS REPORT (Joan Guggenheim)

With the moved to MSAC veterans events have not looked back, averaging 100 players each pennant season and 80 participants in tournaments.

Veterans table tennis continues to expand into various ideas. 1997 saw us involving Vietnam Veterans at Geelong and Sale. These days were run as family days and involved juniors as well. This is a difficult area but proved most rewarding.

Extra effort was put in at Bendigo, Mornington Peninsula and Traralgon. Many Retirement Villages were targeted. Whilst we do not get many registered players from these groups they are encouraged to use their own facilities to improve their lifestyle.

Senior Citizens Week saw a large group being coached at the Table Tennis Centre. The biggest event of the year is the International Day of the Elderly held at Caulfield Racecourse where 10,000 people attend. Working with the Over 30 Group from Princes the 2 tables were in constant use, with a line up always for the ball machine. People come from all over Victoria to attend this event and it is a great opportunity to showcase our sport and a chance to talk to people.

The other event where thousands attend is the finish of the VicHealth Sun Tour where we were a prominent feature.

The Tournament circuit caters for all standards of play with Open and Graded events at Croydon, Dandenong, Ballarat, Geelong, Mornington as well as the Victorian Open and Victorian Closed.

Victorians were once again in the winning circle at the Australian Veterans Championships in Darwin with Joan Munn winning 3 Gold and 2 Silver medals. Brian Berry and Bob Bergmanis won the Swaythling Award in their respective age groups (see details under Australian Championships).

It is good to see more Associations now running Veterans Pennant as they find more players keen to pit themselves against their peers. There is a different atmosphere at Veterans events, much more sociable. This is what it is all about - having fun while keeping fit and active.

COACHING REPORT (Jim Montgomery)

The Victorian Academy was formed to develop the next group of young players to progress to the Table Tennis Australia Academy where possible. While numbers were enough most of the year, the VCE and other studies reduced it to below economical numbers in the last quarter so it was reduced to Saturday and amalgamated with the Victorian Squad of mainly country players under Peng Quach. Some players have progressed to Table Tennis Australia and the position is being continually monitored to assess any future requirements for expansion.

The Riverina Trophy proved most successful and well supported from a Victorian point of view both with increased interest and good standard, but New South Wales formally withdrew as did some of their Associations. The Trophy was then played between South Victoria and a combination of Northern Victoria, the Riverina and Albury/Wodonga. The competition level actually improved as did support from the participants with over 60 young players. Coaching attendance used as one criteria for selection to interassociation or interstate selection is

proving very successful in gaining quality teams and keen competitors who then remain in the sport and proceed to tournament play.

Many associations have an increased awareness of the relationship between coaching and participation rates in juniors and therefore later in seniors. By their efforts, the numbers in regular coaching has considerably increased. It still requires more effort particularly with girls participating in the sport. Several large expanding sports now place considerable time, and financial commitment, to expanding either the female side of their sport or even amalgamating the social side of two sports with great success eg. Aussie rules and netball. We have a national advantage as our sport is already mixed; however, we have very low female participation. This is being addressed and must be corrected with urgency.

In this vein we organised a girls only two day Statewide coaching camp at Geelong which proved successful in two ways. Firstly, almost all of the girls were "new" or non tournament players. Second, the format created interest and enjoyment to the extent that all of these girls now play in district competition and several of the "older" ones have started playing tournaments. The format included a number of role models, from Olympian Kerri Pepper to young girls from our State teams, along with an intensive but enjoyable program run by Glenn Pepper and assisted by several coaches.

Several Level 1 coaching courses were run during the year and our present efforts are to get existing coaches to increase to Level 2 where possible.

At the National Juniors, I managed the team and was very satisfied with the efforts and professionalism of our State juniors. We defeated all States in the U14 Boys, U17 Boys and U14 Girls and were second to Tasmania in the U17 Girls. I am, however, concerned that we need to increase coaching support and standards if we are to retain this position, as other States are proceeding on these lines. Put in perspective, we did lose to Tasmania and certainly were defeated clearly by the Korean school teams. We need to improve our culture and training in the sport and not blame the talent of the participants. With the help of a Government grant, we are now targeting minority groups not well represented in our sport. These include, females, Kooris and people from non-English speaking backgrounds. The key to this is coaching as it enables role models to develop and initially the feeling of pride and confidence in your new skill, resulting in a feeling of belonging. We have given seven presentations to the Koori districts representing much of Victoria and have run several clinics as well. By winter 1998, we expect to be a participant in Koori sports carnivals and are working towards their participation in the Riverina Trophy.

I have limited my comments to subjects which affect our future rather than dwelling on the past and assure all Associations of my accessibility and willingness to assist them to develop our great sport.

SENIOR PENNANT/TOURNAMENTS REPORT (John Mackey)

Pennant

1997 saw the move from the Albert Park Table Tennis Centre to the Melbourne Sports & Aquatic Centre. It was a move which certainly brought a mixed reaction from members, however things are settling down and members are getting used to the new centre.

The Tuesday Pennant which was introduced last year is still going strong and still proving very popular. Players certainly appreciate the early finish and social atmosphere associated with the two a side pennant.

As always the Wednesday Pennant [three a side] remained as strong as ever. With the alterations to the name of the grades where we discontinued with A5, A6 & A7 in the Spring Pennant saw players who were playing low "A" Grade now playing high "B" Grades and having to play Doubles for the first time in a number of years. This was received with a mixed reaction from all B Grade players. A survey was undertaken with mixed results and it was decided to remove Doubles from "B" Grade for the next pennant.

State League was again held in 1997 and was run in-conjunction with the Spring Pennant. Six sides of two players competed in this pennant but it was disappointing that many of our Top Players did not play in the Pennant. Many thanks to VicHealth for their ongoing Sponsorship of the State League.

Tournaments

In 1997 four major tournaments were conducted by TTV [Yasaka Easter Classic, Australian Youth Championships, VicHealth Victorian Closed, Tattersall's Victorian Open and Watch Glass Australia City of Melbourne. Other open tournaments were held at Traralgon, Geelong, Ballarat, Mornington, Dandenong, Albury, Yarrawonga and Croydon.

All tournaments were well received and supported by the all players. Also in 1997 TTV brought back "D" Grade events to most tournaments, in an effort to encourage some of our beginner players to enter tournaments.

I need to thank ANGELO TABONE, BOB GRATTIDGE, MIKE KREDINAC, HELEN POTTAGE, GRAEME IRELAND, GARY IRELAND & KEITH HOLLEY for their help in conducting the Tournaments for TTV during 1997. Also thanks to the Victorian Table Tennis Umpires League for their services throughout the year.

I would also like to thank the work of our senior selectors BRIAN BERRY, MARY LE GASSICK & KEN KUHLEN for their work in doing the seedings for all Senior Tournaments during 1997.

JUNIOR DEVELOPMENT REPORT (Jack Stiglitz)

The number of juniors playing tournaments has remained steady yet disappointing over the last year. I have not been able to attract Under 10's to attend tournaments but, I am aware there are many Associations where there has been many Under 10 children playing and I do feel it essential that we continue trying to attract these children as they are the future of the sport.

I introduced a "novice" event which if encouraged by other Associations could be the medium to attract older children who wish to take up Table Tennis.

The introduction of a new tournament format has been accepted by both players and parents alike, and has certainly helped in making tournaments run more efficiently. The only tournament which can not be run in this manner will be the Easter Tournament which is by far our biggest event.

By moving to MSAC we have incurred some additional cost for table hire which has lead to an increased entry fee. As we are financially disadvantaged if we run over time, MSAC tournaments have to run very efficiently.

Juniors had a very successful Australian Championships winning the U14 Girls and Boys, and U17 Boys. We had Simon Gerada and Mimi Lee winning Australian Singles Titles. Although this is very flattering, I feel we have not got the depth especially in the young junior groups.

Junior selectors require more help from parents and or past players to help in forming a larger group of selectors who can distribute the work load more evenly and who can increase the efficiency and therefore ensure no selection mistakes.

Junior table tennis can only improve if the image of the game is elevated. This must first be done by TTA but followed up by local Associations. This can be achieved by having an Australian Junior or Senior perform well overseas and promoting his achievements. For example it has come to my attention that Simon Gerada has recently won several tournaments overseas, these achievements should have been publicised in the press.

The elite program should be reorganised so that it appeals to more players and it is flexible enough to accommodate the amateur status of the game and the importance of education.

The future of the sport is with sub juniors ie U10's because if we don't attract these children they will be lost to other sports.

AFFILIATED ASSOCIATIONS/CLUBS REPORT (Fran Keyhoe)

In 1997 we saw a reduction in registration to 3364 from 3577 in 1996.

Not all Associations/Clubs decreased in numbers. Many increased their memberships, those being Coburg, Nottingham, Melbourne Veterans, Ballarat, Camperdown, Croydon, Eaglehawk/Bendigo, Eastern Suburbs, Hamilton, Kerang, Leongatha, Orford, South Eastern, Sunraysia, Traralgon, Wonthaggi. It was good to see Kerang back on the list in 1997.

The Sportscover Country Championships were well supported in their final encounter at the Albert Park Table Tennis Centre. 78 teams participated from 15 Associations. The A Grade being won by Ballarat.

At the Affiliated Association/Club meeting which was held in November, it was noted that we need a better or different way of determining and calculating the registration fee. This will be discussed at the 1998 Annual General Meeting. It was disappointing that so few Associations and Clubs attended the Affiliated meeting. Many issues were discussed and would have benefited those who did not attend.

TABLE TENNIS CENTRE ALBERT PARK

The "Old Centre" closed its doors on Saturday 26 July with a Farewell Party attended by some 400 past and present players. The day provided the opportunity for a memorabilia display; exhibition matches of past and present champions; a roll of honour call of Life Members of the Association and of the Centre and a multitude of happy memories shared and old friendships renewed.

All the tables and other ancillary equipment were sold off at bargain rates to Table Tennis Associations and Clubs and to members and the other Centre equipment to sundry members and public resulting in a one off return of some \$15000, some of which, was required to be expended on office fit-out at MSAC.

It was well past the time for the "old centre" to close its doors and for a redevelopment of a Table Tennis Stadium and the other sporting stadiums elsewhere in Albert Park. While not having autonomous control of our own stadium and in many ways it does not feel like "home" it is an attractive and functional stadium as befits an Olympic sport and there is no doubt it is providing a great opportunity for us to better showcase Table Tennis to the public. We are continuing to work with MSAC to overcome some of the stadium operating problems to make conditions the best possible for players.

As reported at the last Annual General Meeting a satisfactory Licence Agreement was negotiated with MSAC for use of the stadium and we are working closely with that body to ensure stadium availability to meet TTV needs while at the same time maximising utilisation for optimum revenue to TTV. Indications to date show an increased Table Tennis use of the stadium by the public which is not only good for the sport but for revenue return to TTV which receives a percentage of the stadium revenue over an agreed base level.

NOTES TO FINANCIAL INFORMATION

This has been a year in which the overall basis of income and expenditure changed part way through the year. TTV went from a position where it had management control over usage of its own centre, to a new centre where we are now a customer. Accordingly a single set of accounts has been prepared for income and expenditure where previously it was differentiated between the activities of the Table Tennis Centre and general activities of the Association. A number of items therefore relate to only part of the year, whilst others relate to the full year.

The deficit of \$3,120 for the current year is slightly worse than anticipated (a break-even position was budgeted for). Fortunately this was offset by the sale of equipment from the Table Tennis Centre which realised a net surplus of \$15,200, thus increasing Members' Funds to in excess of \$100,000. This is a substantial improvement on the position existing 4 years ago when Members' Funds were only \$27,644.

Total staff costs for the year, including wages, superannuation, Workcare, expenses of Executive Director and S.D.O., were \$108,268. This has been allocated towards tournaments, championships, pennant, newsheet preparation, and development and promotion, with the major impact being in the latter area. This relates to the employment of 2 part-time Development Officers towards the end of the year, who are almost fully funded by a Government Grant, and the increased remuneration offered to secure the services of the new Executive Director.
