VICTORIAN TABLE TENNIS ASSOCIATION38th ANNUAL REPORT - 1967

Ladies and Gentlemen,

The year 1967 was one of general progress throughout most of the State. The Association, with its affiliates and its membership, can be reasonably well satisfied with the activities during this year.

The highlight was the first ever appointment by the Association of a full time Promotion Officer/Coach. This position was advertised in Australia and overseas late in 1966 and the successful applicant, Mr. Henry Thomas (Harry) Venner, was appointed early in 1967. Mr. Venner, an English Table Tennis Association coach and an ex International player, arrived in Melbourne on 30th June, and took up his duties immediately. Mr. Venner's initial appointment is for a term of three years.

If the highlight of the administration was the appointment of Mr. Venner, then the highlight on the field of play was equally certainly the achievement of the Victorian State Teams in winning both the Mens Team and Womens Team Shields at the 1967 Australian Championships. This was our first double success since 1962 and was the tenth year in succession that our Womens Team have won the Ron Jones Shield.

As previously reported, the 1967 World Championships, which were to have been held in Melbourne, were lost to us. Not dismayed by this severe blow, the V.T.T.A. and the A.T.T.A. commenced negotiations in 1967 to conduct the inaugural South East Asia Pacific Area Table Tennis Championships.

The preliminary organising for this great event was carried out during the latter months of 1967.

During 1967 a sub-committee of the VTTA Executive Committee was formed to inquire into, and make recommendations upon, the types of materials which should be used in the construction of table tennis tables. Materials approved by this sub-committee were listed and made available to manufacturers and to bodies interested in the purchase of tables.

Another innovation in 1967 was the subsidy offered to schools for the purchase of tables. Sixteen schools benefited by this subsidy and a total of \$317 was given.

PENNANT COMPETITIONS1. METROPOLITAN WINTER PENNANT

This was conducted from 1st May to 30th August.

The later start was planned in the hope that Clubs would furnish in full all details that are required for grading, but this move was only partly successful and finally resulted in fixture books not being available until three weeks after Pennant commenced.

There were 7 womens grades and 34 mens grades making up a total of 321 teams. The system introduced in 1966 again formed the basis of grading, and while this system entails a considerable amount of office work, it should result in a more even grading of teams in the future. A further development in grading was the use of experienced Pennant players whose opinions were sought on the grades where they have considerable knowledge of the players concerned. JUNIOR ACTIVITIES

Once again, progress has been made in all phases of Junior activities. Two pennant competitions were conducted on Saturday mornings on the same pattern as for 1966. As usual the Junior sub-Committee assisted in conducting junior and sub-junior events of the main V.T.T.A. Championships. There were two innovations - Moomba Invitation Junior Girls and Boys Singles held in March, and sub-junior boys and girls championship held in December at Geelong.

A party of Victorian juniors travelled to Adelaide in January to compete in sub-junior interstate teams matches between Victoria and South Australia. Each State fielded three boys and three girls teams.

Mr.Vawdon Huggins kindly donated a perpetual shield for the winners of the match between the respective No.1 boys teams, while a shield for the winners of the girls match was given by Mr.Jack Gilbert.

The Victorian team of T.Polachek (captain) D.Bates, R.Sutherland and T.Taylor won the boys shield. South Australia proved too strong for the Victorian girls team of S.Campbell, M.Bates and S.Gilbert.

In the individual events, L.Pascoe won the Junior Boys Singles, while T. Polachek won the Under 16 Singles.

PUBLICITY

We wish to thank the many correspondents for the interest they have shown in the News Sheet and for using it as a medium to bring many interesting matters before other table tennis players. The Association continued its regular segment in 3KZ World of Sport.

In October table tennis news was published in conjunction with soccer and tennis news in a paper which is now called "Sporting News".

DRESS

The standard of dress during pennant play in 1967 varied from excellent to deplorable; during tournaments conducted by the V.T.T.A. the overall standard was better, the improvement being almost certainly due to stricter supervision in these events. It is evident that only rigid enforcement of the regulations governing dress can raise the standard to a satisfactory level.

CHAMPIONSHIPS AND TOURNAMENTS

1. WORLD CHAMPIONSHIPS

The 1967 World Championships, formerly to have been held in Melbourne, were eventually held in Stockholm, Sweden. Official Australian teams were not sent by the A.T.T.A., but several men and women players were accredited by the A.T.T.A. and were entered in the teams competitions as Australian teams. Miss Lyn Gilbert of Ballarat was the only Victorian to make the trip. Her later performances in the Victorian and Australian Championships indicated the benefit of the experience gained.

2. EASTER TOURNAMENT AND TEAMS COMPETITION

The period of 24th-26th March saw the Riversdale-Halex Easter tournament staged for the 10th successive year. A record entry in individual events was countered by a drop in the number of entries in the teams competition. The large entry in the individual events meant that time available for these events was more than fully occupied and it is certain that restrictions will have to be placed on entries in order to confine the matches to a reasonable period of time. Pascoe defeated T. Polachek in the Junior Boys Singles. T. Polachek and Miss L. Ross were invited to compete in the Tasmanian State Championships and won the Mens Singles, Junior Boys Singles, Mixed Doubles and Junior Girls Singles. R. Tuckett and A. Savage won the Under 15 and Under 13 singles in the New South Wales State titles. L. Gilbert won the Womens Singles, Doubles and Mixed Doubles in the South Australian State titles. In fact Victorian players distinguished themselves wherever they competed during the year.

FRENCH AWARD

The French Award is made in recognition of those qualities by which in addition to playing ability the prestige and reputation of table tennis is established. The winner in 1967 is Mrs. Lorraine Nicholson of Hakoah.

JUNIOR PLAYER OF THE YEAR

This perpetual trophy was instigated and donated by the Coburg Harriers Table Tennis Club. The conditions are similar to those of the French Award. The winner for 1967 was Sharyn Campbell of Geelong who is the first country player to receive this award.

TOP PLAYERS LADDER

At the beginning of the season a scheme involving a players ladder points system was suggested by leading player Graeme Stirling and was subsequently adopted by the Executive Committee of the V.T.T.A.

This scheme takes into consideration performances in V.T.T.A. Metropolitan Pennant and in Country, State, Interstate, Australian and World Championships.

The ladders are normally reviewed and published each week and they have proved very helpful to the selectors for seeding and ranking purposes.

The top eight men and top five women were each entitled to a payment of \$2 from the V.T.T.A. and \$2 from the Country Association when playing in a 3-star country tournament. These amounts were a subsidy towards the players out of pocket expenses.

The scheme was designed to encourage the leading Melbourne players to play in the country tournaments and appeared to be a highly successful innovation.

TABLE TENNIS CENTRE OF VICTORIA

During the year the headquarters for table tennis in Victoria was again the venue for many important events including:

- Victorian Championships
- Country Week
- Pennant Finals
- Riversdale-Halex Easter Tournament
- Inter-University Championships
- Victorian Junior Closed Championships
- Victorian Junior Open Championships

One of the most pleasing developments during the year was the increase of use of the Centre for Junior activities.

Because a number of improvements to the Centre are to be completed in time for SEAPATT 1968 the only major work completed in 1967 was the enclosing of the back of Stand B in the Centre Court.

In the beginning of October 1967 the snack bar was let to a new tenant and we are pleased to report a marked improvement of service to Centre patrons.

The accounts for the Centre are recorded in the Revenue Account printed at the end of this report.

Administration and maintenance costs have increased, and parking fees introduced by the Albert Park Committee of Management have had an effect on income. In 1968 all costs will be closely examined and an increase in table hire fees will be made only if found to be necessary.

DUTY OFFICERS

Our thanks are recorded to the Duty Officers who carried out their work in a satisfactory manner.

STAFF

As during the past few years our full time staff have given valued and loyal service and we extend thanks to Mrs. Judy Wedgwood (Administration) and Mr. I. Duke (Building Superintendent) for their full co-operation. In April Mrs. Joan Guggenheim commenced part-time employment with the Association as early evening duty officer and assistant in administration. Thanks are given to Mrs. Guggenheim for the service she has willingly given.

ALBERT PARK TRUST

We again thank Senator P.J. Kennelly (Chairman) and members of the Albert Park Committee of Management and staff, for their co-operation during the year.

STATE PROMOTION OFFICER/COACH

During the first six months of his employment Mr. Venner concentrated on visits to schools and on coaching the State Squad. As a result of the former the number of students using facilities at their schools and at the Table Tennis Centre has greatly increased. Mr. Venner did not have a great deal of time with the State Squad nevertheless both teams were successful. The training of coaches was commenced in October and this should have both immediate and long term effects.

AFFILIATED ASSOCIATIONS

The number of Affiliated Associations this year was 49, a drop of 5.

However, four new centres affiliated and three which had lapsed renewed their affiliation. There were 11 metropolitan and 38 country affiliated associations.

Country Week team entries were higher at 40, including four associations not previously represented. This revival of interest was cheering. The greatest advance in country table tennis was the opening of the new Ballarat Centre. Opened with 8 tables, this well-appointed centre was later extended to 11 tables, and a centre-court is planned.

For the first time, an attempt was made to organise the circuit of country open tournaments so that there was an interval of at least two weeks between c tournaments, and so that dates could be announced in the Metropolitan Winter Pennant fixture book.

The institution of the Top Players Ladder Scheme caused great interest in the three star tournaments, particularly among men players. Six three-star tournaments were approved, Geelong, Shepparton, Traralgon, Horsham, Warrnambool and Benalla. Unfortunately, Shepparton and Benalla later cancelled their tournaments, but Ballarat took over Sheppartons date and conducted at short notice the seasons most successful country tournament. Other successful tournaments were conducted by Yea, Sunraysia and Ballarat.

A Victorian country womens team toured New South Wales from 28th August to 1st September playing matches at Armidale (local and combined NSW) Newcastle, Goulburn and Canberra. The team of Mrs. K.Latimer (Traralgon) Misses S. Campbell and M.Bates (Geelong) and V.Woodward (Ballarat) was managed by Mr. F.Woodward (Ballarat) and won all its matches with the greatest of ease.

A mens team from the New South Wales Country League toured Victoria from 21st to 25th August. The team consisted of C.Standish and L.Hirst (Newcastle) K.Sands (Goulburn) and M.Schwarzbaum (Canberra).

Matches were played in order at Shepparton, Ballarat, Geelong, Melbourne (v. combined Victorian Country), Traralgon and finally at Melbourne against a Victorian team. The visitors won easily at the first three country centres, defeated the combined country team 6-5, lost (without Standish) to Traralgon 4-7, and lost to the Victorian side of W.Bates, D.Lindsay and A.Webb, 3-6. It is noteworthy that Colin Standish was unbeaten in Victoria.

Separate Annual Meetings of Country and Metropolitan Associations were held at the Table Tennis Centre and gave delegates the opportunity of discussing many ideas for the betterment of table tennis.

The V.T.T.A. is grateful to the many hard-working officials throughout the State whose enthusiasm keeps our sport progressing.

The Association is aware that there are in Victoria table tennis associations which are not yet affiliated, and trusts that they will soon join with us in a united effort to bring more and more Victorians into table tennis.

UMPIRES LEAGUE

The possibility of staging the World Championships in Melbourne resulted in an upsurge of recruitment which kept senior umpires very busy training these prospects, with the result that every candidate passed their examinations quite creditably.

Unfortunately the loss of the Championships saw a marked "drop out" of these qualified umpires with the result that the staffing of Pennant and Tournament events fell to the usual squad. Many of our newer umpires are young and are still playing and although this must be considered good for the game, it becomes more difficult for the older non-playing umpires who always endeavour

to fulfil the League's commitments to table tennis generally.

With SEAPATT looming so near, it is vital that we gain more recruits to staff this most important event. The V.T.T.U.L. is organising itself to contact all members, and will form a training sub-committee for new recruits.

Enrolment of new umpires still continues slowly but at least such volunteers are good material since they come forward of their own choice and are anxious to qualify.

The V.T.T.U.L. recently lost its Secretary, Robin Devries, causing difficulty at this time of organising for SEAPATT - but there is hope that another efficient person will come forward.

However the V.T.T.A. can be assured that the umpires available, even if limited in number, will continue to fulfil the needs of table tennis in this State.

COACHING

Junior Coaching sessions were conducted in February and March. Approximately 120 pupils attended each session and were coached by experienced top players under the guidance of Karoly Javor. These coaches had regular meetings to ensure the highest possible standards of teaching would be given. A number of players were introduced from the Junior Coaching scheme into the Saturday morning Junior Pennant.

The coaching committee as usual established coaching classes for promising juniors and Messrs. K.Javor and W.Bates helped these young people to improve their game.

After the teams for the Australian Junior Championships were announced, both girls and boys teams continued with Saturday sessions until leaving for the Championships.

On four days (28th - 31st August) of the school vacation, coaching classes were held by Mr.H.Venner for country juniors. Several promising juniors from Portland, Swan Hill, Geelong, Warrnambool and Warragul attended. Regular junior coaching classes were held on Saturdays (morning and afternoon) during October and November.

STATE SQUADS

The Selectors again kept to their policy of including some juniors in the State Squads and it proved a good move helping these young players to increase their knowledge of the game.

Squad training commenced in April under the guidance of Mr. W.Bates and continued until July at which time Mr.H. Venner took over control.

Training was continued until the Australian Championships in September. With some deletions and additions the squad was continued after the Australian Championships with the prime object of providing first class practise for Victorian members of the Australian squad for SEAPATT.

SPECIAL EVENTS

MOOMBA

This event was again conducted as part of the Moomba Festival. The regulations for both the teams event (the Jack Skolnik Cup) and the Mens Singles event (the Lord Mayors Moomba Bowl) were amended in regard to the eligibility of players. In addition a new event, the Moomba Singles Championship for Women, was introduced, and the entries were of sufficient number and standard to make it worth-while to continue with this event.

The Jack Skolnik Cup was won by "Israel", who defeated "Australia" 4 rubbers to 1. In the individual events the Lord Mayors Singles Championship for Men was won by V.Sirvic (who retained his 1966 title) by defeating W.Bates. The Moomba Singles Championship for Women was won by S.Javor who defeated L.Micholson.

Junior Boys and Junior Girls Invitation Singles events were added to the Moomba programme.

SEAPATT

The South East Asia Pacific Area Table Tennis Championships will be held in Melbourne 8th - 15th April 1968.

This event, which is being held in lieu of the World Championships which were lost to Melbourne, will feature players invited from eight Asian countries, New Zealand and Australia. It will be the largest international table tennis event ever conducted in the Southern Hemisphere.

Organisation in the main is being carried out by V.T.T.A. officials and has taken a considerable amount of their time during the past few months.

All preliminary rounds of team and individual events will be played at the Table Tennis Centre of Victoria. The finals of both team and individual will be played at Festival Hall.

SEAPATT will give local players and enthusiasts the opportunity of seeing in action some of the best players in the world and will give table tennis a big boost in Victoria. It will also result in improvements being gained for the Centre.

A.T.T.A.

The Annual Meeting of the Australian Table Tennis Association was held in Adelaide in September.

Mr. R. Jones of Victoria did not stand for re-election as President. Dr. J. Jackson of South Australia defeated Mr. L. Wharmby of Tasmania in an election to fill the position. Mr. Jones remains on the A.T.T.A. Council as Victorian Delegate. Mr. P. Mascall was elected as Honorary Assistant Secretary.

EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE

At the 1967 Annual Meeting Dr. W. Savige was elected to the post of Vice-President, replacing Mr. B. Gibbins who had retired during the previous November. Mr. P. Mascall was elected to the Committee and became the Public Relations Officer of the Association. This was the only change to the committee during 1967. There was thus much more stability in government than in recent years when retirements and replacements during the course of the year have been all too frequent.
