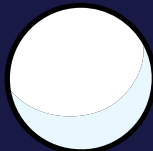

TTV CHIEF EXECUTIVE OFFICER REPORT

I am delighted to provide my first CEO report for our Victorian Table Tennis community.

Since commencing in February 2022, it has been wonderful to visit so many affiliates and tournaments, and meet so many of our TTV members. I would like to sincerely thank everyone for the warm welcome to the sport and all of the advice and support during the year.



2022 was a year of getting back to playing table tennis and having a full year of competition after two years that were affected by COVID-19. It was also the final year of our 2019-2022 'Our Future Now!' Strategic Plan and saw us able to focus on the key strategic objectives around Participation, Profile and Performance.

Participation

Thanks to the great work of our affiliates in re-engaging their members post-COVID we were able to record membership numbers in 2022 which have crept back up to the 4000-member mark.

Participation initiatives that the TTV office focused on during the year included:

- Encouraging affiliates to run the Spinneroos junior table tennis program with a subsidy to assist in paying coaches;
- Running the inaugural TTV School Sport Victoria Primary Schools Cup across metro and regional districts culminating in a Primary Schools Cup Final at MSAC in October;
- Establishing two new para programs at Croydon & Districts Table Tennis Association and Coburg Table Tennis Club;
- Piloting a quick-form Ping Pong Rush social competition and developing marketing assets for affiliates;
- Continuing to deliver Enhancement Project in Clubs (EPIC) workshops across Victoria to assist affiliates to better understand governance and policy requirements; and,
- Delivering many come and try pop-up events.

Profile

Developing the profile of table tennis is something I am particularly focused on and there were several initiatives that took place in 2022 and will be built out further in 2023.

- Logos were developed for some of our key Table Tennis Victoria programs including the State Tournament Circuit, the Victorian State Team, TTV Premier League and Ping Pong Rush;
- A Workplace Partnership corporate offering was developed to promote the benefits of table tennis in engaging staff and promoting wellbeing at the office;
- Our social media channels received record engagement during the Junior/Senior/Para Australian Championships thanks to daily coverage of results;
- Victorians received award recognition with Alois Rosario named Vicsport Coach of the Year and Disability Sport and Recreation Coach of the Year and

the Victorian Para team named the Disability Sport and Recreation Team of the Year; and,

- The 2022 Corporate Cup was run in November, sponsored by NWR Communications, with 13 teams competing at MSAC to be crowned champion.

Performance

Victoria continued to excel in the area of performance with incredible results recorded at state, national and international levels.

STATE TOURNAMENTS

- It was excellent to have a full calendar year of competitions including State Tournament Circuit events, Victorian Open Championships, Victorian Closed Championships, Country Championships and Metro Championships. Further details on these events can be found throughout this Annual Report.

AUSTRALIAN CHAMPIONSHIPS

- Para squad members won 25 medals including 11 gold, 10 silver and 4 bronze.
- Senior & Youth squad members won 19 medals including 7 gold, 7 silver and 5 bronze.
- Junior squad members won 45 medals including 18 gold, 16 silver and 11 bronze.
- Best Player Awards went to Nicholas Lum (Men's, Under 21 & 17), Jake Ballestrino (Para Class 6-10 category), Finn Luu (Under 19), Connie Psihogios (Under 17 & 15) and Alice Xia (Under 11). Nicholas Lum was also awarded Michael Szabados Award for the Australian Junior Player of the Year.

- During the year, Nicholas Lum was the first ever Australian to reach number 1 in the world rankings in able-bodied (Under 17 Boys').
- Qian Yang finished the year ranked as number 1 in the world (Class 10 Women's).
- Li Na Lei finished the year ranked as number 2 in the world (Class 9 Women's).
- Ma Lin finished the year ranked as number 3 in the world (Class 9 Men's).
- Melissa Tapper finished the year ranked as number 4 in the world (Class 10 Women's).
- Nicholas Lum finished the year ranked as number 42 in the world (Men's Senior)

All of this wonderful TTV work during 2022 could not have been achieved without a dedicated staff group. Thank you to Participation and Programs Officer Sean Sturrock, Media and Marketing Officer Jason Bast and HP and Competitions Coordinator Yugandh Zende for all of their support and all the best with their future career endeavours. A BIG thank you to Events and Club Officer Claire Montgomery who has been my brains-trust of all things TTV and made sure things were managed until I started as CEO, we wish her all the best in her new role with Table Tennis Australia.

Finally, I would like to thank the TTV Board for their support of me as a first-time CEO and for giving me the opportunity to lead the sport of table tennis into the future. Bring on an exciting 2023!

TTA CHIEF EXECUTIVE OFFICER REPORT

2022 will go down as arguably one of TTA's greatest ever years, especially in relation to high performance and international results.

It's important to look back and reflect on some of the achievements throughout the year. Highlights from 2022 include, but are not limited to:



HIGH PERFORMANCE AND PATHWAYS:

- Our best ever Commonwealth Games results were achieved, winning 1 gold, 3 silver and 2 bronze medals, plus 2 x 4th place results.
- Our best ever World Para Championships results were achieved, winning 2 gold, 2 silver and 2 bronze medals, plus 1 x 4th place result.
- Our best ever World Youth Championships results were achieved, winning 1 silver and 1 bronze medals, plus 2 quarter final results. This was the first time we have ever won medals at the World Youth Championships in the 20-year history of the event.
- Our best ever ITTF-Oceania Championships results were achieved, winning 28 out of 28 gold medals on offer and 67 medal in total. These are the best ever results by any country in the 44-year history of the event.
- Australian athletes competed in a record 33 international events throughout the year, winning a record 125 medals.
- 5 Australian athletes finished the year in the top 100 world rankings (senior), including Yangzi Liu (WR31 in Women's) and Nicholas Lum (WR42 in Men's) achieving the best ever world rankings by Australian athletes.
- 5 Australian athletes finished the year in the top 10 world rankings (para), including Qian Yang finishing 2022 ranked as number 1 in the world (Class 10 Women's).
- During the year, Nicholas Lum was the first ever Australian to reach number 1 in the world rankings in able-bodied (Under 17 Boys').
- National Squad training continued to go from strength to strength, with record training hours continuing to be offered in Melbourne and Sydney.
- Hopes Programs and Talent ID initiatives were held in 7 States/Territories, attracting more than 230 participants and served as an important vehicle in providing opportunities for all parts of the high performance pathway.
- The Para Pathways Program was rolled out across 12 centres in 7 States/Territories, delivering 150 new participants; plus the first ever National Para Pathway Camp was conducted with 9 new Para Pathway athletes.
- 14 new para athletes were classified ahead of the 2022 National Championships and the new provisional classification process was also successfully rolled out across all States/Territories.
- Player of the Year awards went to: Yangzi Liu (Senior – Victor Barna Memorial Trophy), Qian Yang (Para – Arthur Wilks Award), Nicholas Lum (Junior – Michael Szabados Award), and Craig Campbell (Veterans – Ken Cole Trophy).

PARTICIPATION AND DEVELOPMENT:

- The TTA Equipment and Facilities Grant Program was successfully rolled out for a fifth consecutive year. 15 clubs/associations from 7 States/Territories received grants, which resulted in more than \$95,000 worth of equipment and facilities being injected into the table tennis community, including Sunbury and District

Table Tennis Association. Cumulatively across the five years of the program to date, more than \$440,000 worth of equipment and facilities have been distributed to 69 clubs/associations across all 8 States/Territories.

- 12 outstanding contributors to the sport were honoured through the National Volunteer and Coaches Awards Program, including Joe Gerada and Rahul Mathew (joint winners of High Performance Coach of the Year), Don Cheyne (50 Years of Service Award) and Brian Zammit (Administrator of the Year). Mick Coughlan (QLD) had the honour of being awarded the Bev and Brian James Trophy as the 2022 National Volunteer of the Year.
- Membership rebounded strongly to exceed pre-COVID-19 numbers with 10,440 members being recorded through the 2022 Census. Victoria retained the highest membership in Australia.
- A new participation record was set, with the 200,000 participants mark being exceeded for the first time through the 2022 Census.
- Our entry level program, Spinnerroos, continued to be rolled out at both club and school level throughout Australia.
- Our Sporting Schools program continued to be rolled out across Australia, with more than 22,000 students undertaking the program.

NATIONAL EVENTS:

- 2022 saw the return to a full calendar of national events for the first time since 2019, with 8 highly successful national events delivered across 6 States/Territories.
- The National Senior, Youth, Junior and Para Championships were combined into one all-inclusive event for the first time. The event attracted 445 competitors and nearly 1,900 individual event entries from all States/Territories.
- The National Veterans Championships was played and attracted 310 competitors and nearly 1,200 individual event entries from all States/Territories and New Zealand.
- After a pilot event in 2021, the TTA Tour was expanded to cover 4 events in 2022 (Canberra, Melbourne, Sydney and Brisbane). Overall, the event series was a roaring success, attracting nearly 600 competitors and more than 1,100 individual event entries from 7 States/Territories plus New Zealand.
- The National Hopes Week & Challenge attracted a record 76 entries from 7 States/Territories and continues to set the benchmark in terms of sourcing the next generation of players.
- The Commonwealth Games Qualification Tournament was played and served to determine the final men's and women's places on the 2022 Commonwealth Games team and provided high calibre table tennis throughout.
- 7 national events were livestreamed with outstanding statistics being generated. 91,000 unique viewers and 118,000 total views watched 318,000 minutes (5,300 hours) of footage in more than 30 countries. Social media posts (Facebook) reached 482,000 people across more than 206 posts. Finally, 560,000 website hits were achieved.

GOVERNANCE AND FINANCE:

- The 2019-2022 TTA Strategic Plan came to an end, with significant and sustainable progress being made across all elements of the plan. A summary of all achievements can be viewed by clicking here: <https://www.tabletennis.org.au/news/fta-2019-2022-strategic-plan/>
- The 2023-2025 TTA Strategic Plan was finalised and is now ready to be rolled out over the next three years. TTA is working with all States/Territories to ensure that State/Territory Strategic Plans align with TTA's, but maintain a localised focus where beneficial. This will ensure that a unified strategic direction will be in place across the sport for the next 3 years, which will underpin collaboration across the sport.

- 2021-2022 MOUs that TTA entered into with TTA, TTNSW, TTNT, TTT and TTWA concluded. TTA is hopeful to enter into MOUs with all States/Territories for the 2023-2025 period to further strengthen collaboration between TTA and States/Territories.
- A fifth consecutive surplus was delivered and the TTA Cash Reserves Target of \$575,000 has been met by the end of 2022. The 2022 financial result underlines the financial reforms implemented in recent years and demonstrates that TTA's business model continues to be robust.
- Importantly, with the TTA Cash Reserves target being met, it is anticipated that the need to generate surplus results will diminish, meaning more resources can be put into further developing the sport.

RECOGNITION INITIATIVES:

- Five players made their international debut (Able-Bodied) and were recognised as Official Australian Representatives. Congratulations to Min Hyung Jee, Yangzi Liu, Nicholas Lum, Finn Luu and Alex Lee. The Official Australian Representative tallies now sit at 78 (Able-Bodied Men), 70 (Able-Bodied Women), 73 (Para Men) and 31 (Para Women).
- Two icons of Australian table tennis were inducted into the TTA Hall of Fame: Russell Lavale (Athletes – Open) and Noel Shorter (Coaches). Congratulations Russell and Noel, you're most worthy inductees.

Delivering results of this nature requires the help and support of a broad network of people and organisations and it is important to thank those who have contributed along the way.

Sincere thanks go to all funding partners and peak bodies, namely the Australian Sports Commission and the AIS, Commonwealth Games Australia, Australian Olympic Committee, Paralympics Australia, ITTF and ITTF-Oceania. TTA enjoys a positive working relationship with all parties and looks forward to this continuing in 2023 and beyond.

Thank you also to all TTA's commercial partners. In particular our long-term partners Nittaku and DHS, plus Table Tennis World through the backing of Paul Pinkewich, plus all others who supported TTA throughout the year.

Of course, special thanks must go to all players and also the parents of junior players. We run the sport to provide opportunities for people to play, and the sport would not function without you playing from the highest level, right through to grass roots level.

Thank you also to State/Territory Associations for working collaboratively for the betterment of the sport once again in 2022. The work that all parties have put into strengthening relationships between National and State/Territory level in recent years has undoubtedly been beneficial for the health of the sport overall. It is clear the underlying theme is a willingness to help each other maximise the finite resources available across Australian table tennis and the increased sense of unity is appreciated by TTA.

The work at club/association and State/Territory level, by volunteers and staff, to grow participation and deliver local competitions and activities is the bedrock of the sport – thank you, we couldn't progress without you.

High praise is deserved by all TTA staff, who once again performed with distinction. TTA are fortunate to have staff who are both extremely dedicated and

exceptionally capable. They always focus on the job at hand to service stakeholders and maximise finite resources. The passion, work ethic and commitment of the TTA staff is both acknowledged and appreciated.

Special mention goes to everyone who serves on TTA Board Sub-Committees. It is not lost on TTA that you all volunteer your time to help the sport you love and, in some instances, this can be a thankless task. However, I express my sincere thanks for your ongoing contribution.

Finally, the TTA Board must be recognised. Advancing Australian table tennis remained firmly at the forefront of all decision making and the Board continued to function effectively and efficiently in a cohesive manner. The Board-CEO relationship is pivotal to the success of any organisation and the mutual trust and the ongoing strong working relationship is an essential element of TTA's strength.

Thank you once again to everyone for your contribution to our great game throughout 2022. Here's to another successful year in 2023.

In my time at Table Tennis Victoria, I feel that I have contributed to the progression and enhancement of the sport, and I hope that my contribution will have a legacy for years to come.

Enhancement Program in Clubs for Table Tennis (EPIC.TT)

In 2022 I had the great pleasure in getting on the road, visiting multiple Affiliates and running workshops with them as a part of the Enhancement Program in Clubs for Table Tennis (EPIC.TT).



When I started working at TTV in 2018, I was receiving a lot of phone calls and emails from the Affiliates about things like what policies they should have, meeting procedures, how they can do different things, what did they actually have to do legally as Incorporated Associations, the list went on.

I soon realised that one major way that TTV could help the Affiliates and bring value to their Affiliation with TTV would be having all of those answers in one place for them. We started putting together an idea of being able to go out to the clubs to sit down and talk through all of their question, and to have those resources available at anytime for the Affiliates. Thus, EPIC.TT was born back in 2019. We worked through all the different policies and laws that are floating around and distilled it down to the essential ones for Table Tennis. We then developed a set of templates that all of our Affiliates can use with step-by-step guides on how to implement them.

We were about half way finished when the first lockdown happened, and then the second one and we realised that to be able to deliver this new program to the Affiliates, we would have to pivot on how we presented them. EPIC.TT was split into 2 parts and the first part (Policies) was delivered on Zoom, with the second part (Governance) to be delayed until it could be done in person. During the lockdowns, EPIC.TT Part 1 was delivered almost all Metro Affiliates and quite a number of Country Affiliates. We were able to get in one road trip through North East Victoria visiting running workshops and visiting Unaffiliated Clubs in hopes of getting them to join us.

During 2022, I was finally able to go on the road again and visit the remaining Country Affiliates and also other Metro Affiliates. Four country road trips were completed – North West, South West, Outer Gippsland and Inner Gippsland. I had the pleasure of sitting down in person with almost every TTV Affiliate Committee in 2022. It was mutually benefitting for both sides, feedback from the Affiliates was that they felt appreciated, valued and they learnt a lot. Feedback from TTV was improved relations with the Affiliates and personally I loved every minute of the feeling that I was helping contribute to the success of the Affiliates.

RevSport Websites

As I mentioned earlier, I have been getting over the years a multitude of calls and as I was listening to all of them, something that really shone through to me, was that it was getting harder and harder for Affiliates to get new volunteers and old volunteers were retiring from burnout. Processes were antiquated and when

someone who had been doing the job for 20+ years was looking to move on, the new people coming in would be overwhelmed and wouldn't stick around.

As someone with an IT background, I could see clearly that how we were doing things like memberships was overly complicated, time consuming and triple or quadruple handling of the same task. With people having less time to contribute to volunteering roles due to factors such as traffic, family time, kids participating in multiple sports, the burden on our volunteers was getting to be too much for them.

So, step one in mid-2018 was to first institute a login to the TTV website for all Affiliates where they could enter their members details directly into the database and invoices were auto generated. This saved the Affiliates from having to maintain their own database of members. This worked well and Affiliates were feeling that there was less of a burden on the whole process.

Step two came about two years early (in the plan in my head!) while we were all stuck in lockdowns. For TTV to provide each Affiliate with their own RevSport portal as a part of the Affiliation benefits, so they could do more than just process their memberships. We saw the perfect opportunity during the lockdowns to advance the plan as all of a sudden, the whole world had to jump forward in embracing technology to be able to keep going.

These portals were rolled out at the end of 2020, along with a series of training webinars that were recorded for reference. These training webinars are still, to this day, being used by every Club in Australia for new volunteers or clubs newly adopting their own RevSport portal.

While I was the one to push hard on rolling out and adopting the RevSport websites and I did have resistance, it is gratifying now to hear now from the Affiliates that by having these portals, their workload has been drastically reduced and they are enticing younger, tech-savvy, volunteers on their committees who are taking on the tech roles and running with them.

Thank you to all the Victorian Affiliates for embracing the technology and advancing our sport ahead of schedule, so much so that now all the other States are rushing to catch up!

State Tournament Circuit

Those who know me well know that I have been involved with Tournaments since I started playing in them as a young junior and running them after various injuries took me out of competition. In the last 5 years I have worked hard in making Tournaments run more efficiently, standardising the processes to reduce the workload for the volunteers to run them and so that the player experience is similar at every event.

Over the past 5 years we have moved from posting entry forms with cheques to online entry forms with online payment. From Affiliates having to print and post hundreds of entry forms out to all the other Affiliates to online entry forms that every member in Australia can access at the click of a mouse using their National Member ID. From Affiliates making a loss running a Tournament to making small profits that they can then reinvest into their members. From having no Umpires at Tournaments to having half a dozen at almost every event. From having Tournaments with 100 or so entries finishing at midnight to having Tournaments of over 150 finishing at 7:00pm.

The progress we have made over the last 5 years has been a steep learning curve for all of us, but if we keep working together in the future, our State Tournament Circuit events are sustainable well into the future.

And lastly, THANK YOU to everyone in the TTV Community for making my time at TTV one of the most satisfying and rewarding experiences of my life. We made so much progress and I am SO SO SO proud of all of us for a job well done!

TTV PARTICIPATION & PROGRAMS OFFICER

After two COVID affected years, it was great to see so much of the participation and programs planned activity come to life in 2022.

While the focus for our affiliates was getting back to running weekly competitions and coaching sessions, we were excited to be able to offer several different initiatives to help increase participation in table tennis.



Spinneroos Junior Program

In 2022 there was a focus on increasing the number of junior players across the state and getting affiliates to adopt the national Spinneroos junior table tennis program. Six Spinneroos Programs ran during the year with an average of 6 participants per session. The creation of a TTV club subsidy allowed more clubs to benefit from the program's goal of creating more children learning the foundations of Table Tennis in the local communities.

Social Pop-Up Events

During the year TTV took part in 18 Social Pop-Up events. Numbers for these events saw over a thousand additional participants in Table Tennis activity across the year. TTV also ran two Pub League locations with the 2022 Season average of 8 participants per venue. These pop-up activities have been great to engage casual table tennis participants with an aim of engaging with those outside the traditional membership/club model and capturing a new participation market.

School Sport Victoria Primary School Cup

In 2022, after several years of planning, TTV was able to successfully hold the School Sport Victoria Primary School Cup with 42 participants in attendance for the State Final at Melbourne Sports and Aquatic Centre. The TTV Primary School Cup aims to maximise table tennis participation for all primary aged students in a round robin format across 8 regional locations. All 8 locations across Victoria (4 metro, 4 regional) recommitted for 2023 with planned delivery in Term 3, 2023.

All-Abilities Programs

With table tennis being recognised as one of the most inclusive sports on offer, during 2022 it has been excellent to establish more participation pathways with para programs introduced at two additional clubs: Croydon & Districts Table Tennis Association and Coburg Table Tennis Club. We also took part in many all-ability come and try sessions and festivals including the Disability Sport Australia Pop-Up at the Royal Melbourne Show and the Victorian Disability Sport and Recreation Festival.

I look forward to continuing to see table tennis participation grow in the coming years and knowing that I'm finishing up at the end of 2022 I wanted to thank everyone in the community for their support over the last three years.

TTV MARKETING & MEDIA OFFICER REPORT

In 2022 Table Tennis Victoria made some exciting strides forward in our media coverage and communications goals, we continued our focus on key areas of our strategic plan whilst also gaining more national and local media coverage.

Some highlights of the year include;

- Full coverage of the 2022 Table Tennis Australia National Championships
- Facebook and Instagram growth
- Coverage of the 2022 Commonwealth Games
- Coverage of the 2022 Victorian Country Championships
- Consistent release of TTV's Monthly EDM / Pingbitz Newsletter
- Increased mainstream media coverage regarding international, national and state level events as well as exciting news such as TTV's partnership with GRISS



Social Media Following & Reach

During 2022, the Table Tennis Victoria social media platforms have seen a promising amount of growth. Our Facebook reach increased by 133.7% with Instagram reach seeing a 131.6% uptick. Our Facebook and Instagram pages saw a 121.6% and 15.7% increase in page visits respectively whilst followers on Facebook grew by 30.9% and Instagram by 27.37%.

'PingBitz' TTV's Monthly Newsletter

The PingBitz TTV Monthly newsletter had 11 editions in 2022. Over 110 stories and updates were shared with over 50,000 recipients between February and December.

Key Events

2022 Table Tennis Australia National Championships

The Table Tennis Australia National Championships was a major focus in 2022. After two years of covid cancellations we wanted to ensure we provided as much coverage for TTV members and fans as possible. During the period spanning the National Championships TTV's Facebook page saw 2,971 page visits (+249.1%) with Instagram having 574 (+485.7%). The reach across these two platforms also saw a 242.4% (FB) and 198.1% (IG) increase.

2022 Birmingham Commonwealth Games

During the 2022 Birmingham Commonwealth Games we strived to keep our members updated as quickly as possible with results and highlights from the Games. We saw 2,008 page visits on Facebook (+61.4%) and 252 on Instagram (+29.2%) while our reach increased by 70% (FB) and 32.8% (IG).

2022 Victorian Country & Metro Championships

The 2022 Victorian Country and Metro Championships were another major event that we were thrilled to see run again after a two-year hiatus. We experienced a huge increase in page visits during Country Week this year with 1,879 (FB) and 277 (IG) page visits. The event also resulted in a 130.7% reach increase on Facebook and 134.5% on Instagram

2022 has been a great year for content and event coverage for TTV. With new staff members and a new strategic plan set for 2023 we are hopeful our members are excited for continued growth and improvement across TTV's communication channels.

TTV HIGH PERFORMANCE & COMPETITIONS COORDINATOR REPORT

It was great to be able to work as the Table Tennis Victoria High Performance and Competitions Coordinator in 2022.

A summary of the key activity during the year can be found below.

High Performance

On Sundays during 2022 we held High Performance sessions at Melbourne Sports and Aquatic Centre to help with junior talent development. During the year the average number of attendees at these sessions were 25 juniors and we'd like to thank coaches Peter Tretinik, Dennis Makaling and Jennifer Langridge for their coaching assistance.



The 2022 Victorian State Team travelled to Caloundra, Queensland on the 2nd of July for the National Junior, Senior and Para Championships 2022 with a strong 135-member squad competing in various teams and age groups securing a strong haul of 89 medals distributed among various age categories and abilities.

Out of the 10 State circuit tournaments including the Victorian Open (State Title) held this year, all the senior event finals were contested by HP members (12) out of which 6 belong to the National Squad. Out of all the junior finals conducted in the 10 tournaments including the Victorian Open and Victorian Closed (State Title), 7 out of 8 girls are HP members (1 from the National Squad). From the boys' events, 6 out of 8 are HP members (2 from the National Squad).

According to the end of the year Australian National Rankings, 9 of the top 20 Senior men and 9 of the top 20 Senior women are Victorian. An HP highlight was Nicholas Lum becoming the first Australian to become World No.1 in the Under 17 Boys category.

Competitions

It was a pleasure to over see the Tuesday and Wednesday night competitions at Melbourne Sports and Aquatic Centre. After two years of interruption due to COVID it was great to see Premier League resume with five divisions playing across three seasons – congratulations to all of the division champions who are listed later in this annual report.

It was also great to work with Daisy and the Melbourne Veterans to develop the Veterans Pennant into Central Melbourne Tuesdays during the second half of the year and trial some different competition formats. A Lighting Pennant of six weeks of competition was a big success and something we will encourage more affiliates to adopt in future.

I have enjoyed the opportunity to work with TTV in this role and look forward to seeing the future of the TTV State Pathways Program.

2. GENERAL BUSINESS

2.1 MOTION TO ACCEPT MINUTES OF THE 2020 ANNUAL GENERAL MEETING

RESOLUTION: *That the Minutes of the TTV Annual General Meeting held on 15 May 2021 provide a true and accurate reflection of the meeting.*

Max Coulthard (Mornington Peninsula and Frankston City Table Tennis Association) moved that the minutes of the 2020 Annual General Meeting be accepted as submitted.
Damian Taranto (Geelong Table Tennis Association) seconded the motion.

There being no objections to the resolution, it was unanimously passed.

2.2 TTV CHAIR ADDRESS

The Chair noted the following:

- Thanks to the TTV Board of Management over last twelve months which were once again challenging due to effects of COVID-19 pandemic.
- Thanks to outgoing CEO Ritchie Hinton and the TTV staff for their work throughout the year with a focus on innovation and connection with the Victorian Table Tennis community throughout another tough year.
- Welcome to new CEO Gen Dohrmann with Gen sharing and introduction and initial observations in the role.
- Membership was up 30% compared to 2020 but still down 20% on pre-COVID numbers, however member registrations in 2022 have been promising.
- TTV's State Tournament Circuit ran in the first half of 2021 under a unique COVID format which is now continuing in 2022.
- Future focus on non-traditional participation initiatives to reflect

changing society trends, which will include a reliance on data to assist informed decision making.

- Continued liaison with TTA and affiliates to encourage a 'One Sport' approach where possible.

2.3 PRESENTATION OF 2020 TTV ANNUAL REPORT, INCLUDING 2020 TTV AUDITED FINANCIAL STATEMENTS & AUDITOR'S REPORT

The Chair noted that copies of all documents had been distributed in advance and provided an overview of the various reports.

There was a deficit of \$19,167 for the FY. For a second year, the Covid-19 pandemic had a significant impact on the activities of the organisation which affected the financial results for the 2021 year.

Key points:

- Tournaments and events were cancelled in the second half of the year, and this resulted in a loss of budgeted revenue.
- Membership numbers did increase from 2020 but numbers were down from budgeted targets as a result of Covid restrictions which resulted in a reduction of membership revenue.
- Federal and State Grants somewhat offset the decline in revenue by operational cost savings in the form of JobKeeper wage subsidies and Business Support Grants.
- Victorian Government's 'Together More Active' funding unable to be spent due to the restrictions on activity. These have been rolled into the 2022 year.
- As noted at the 2020 AGM, we have been on a cycle with the 2020 FY \$86,940 surplus and predicted a deficit in 2021 to reflect the related over-spend of grant monies.

RESOLUTION: *That the 2021 TTV Annual Report, including the 2021 TTV Audited Financial Statements and the 2021 Auditor's Report be accepted.*

Phillip Savige (Werribee Table Tennis Club) moved that the resolution be accepted and was seconded by Gary Warnest (Bendigo and District Table Tennis Association).

There being no objections to the resolution, it was unanimously passed.

2.4 Special Resolutions

Special Resolution D1 was a motion to bestow TTV Life Membership upon Suzy Javor.

The Chair outlined that Suzy Javor is one of the greatest ever Australian table tennis players with a career both lengthy and exceptional at international, national and state level.

Motion that:

“Ms. Suzy Javor be awarded Life Membership of Table Tennis Victoria for her service to TTV”.

All pre-cast votes supported the motion and there were no objections from the room.

Special Resolution D1 was therefore **approved** unanimously.

Special Resolution D2 was a motion to bestow TTV Life Membership upon Kerri Tepper.

The Chair outlined that Kerri Tepper is regarded as one of the finest female table tennis players Australia has produced. After a decorated playing career representing, Kerri continued her commitment to sport as CEO of Table Tennis Victoria and Board positions with Table Tennis Victoria, the Victorian Olympic Council and the Victorian Institute of Sport.

Motion that:

“Ms. Kerri Tepper be awarded Life Membership of Table Tennis Victoria for her service to TTV”.

All pre-cast votes supported the motion and there were no objections from the room.

Special Resolution D2 was therefore **approved** unanimously.

2.5 ELECTION OF BOARD MEMBERS

The Chair noted his personal involvement in this agenda item, and therefore passed the matter to Gen Dohrmann (CEO) to address.

The CEO noted five spots were due for election, relating to the Chair position, Deputy Chair position plus three Elected Director positions.

- Re: **Chair** position, only one nomination was received, that being from Mr. Daniel Moloney.
- Re: **Deputy Chair** position, only one nomination was received, that being from Ms. Meredith Kelly.
- Regarding the three **Elected Director** positions, three nominations were received:
 - Mr. Nandakumar Alavandar for a 2-year term
 - Mr. Dan Hamer for a 3-year term

- Mr. Greg Bristowe for a 3-year term

By virtue of pre-cast voting, all nominees had secured the necessary votes and there were no objections from the room.

Therefore:

Mr. Daniel Moloney was therefore duly elected for a further 2 -year term as Chair until the AGM in 2024.

Ms. Meredith Kelly was therefore duly elected for a further 1 -year term as Deputy Chair until the AGM in 2023.

Mr. Nandakumar Alavandar was therefore duly elected for a further 2 -year term as an Elected Director until the AGM in 2024.

A show of hands in support of the motion was sought, with all Members in favour.

The resolution was therefore **approved** unanimously.

A – Yes. There is a scheduled Affiliates Forum in September, and we will also explore whether we can schedule quarterly catch-up opportunities in future to keep Affiliates across planning and encourage knowledge sharing.

- **Gary Warnest** (Bendigo and District Table Tennis Association)

Question – Can Table Tennis Victoria provide an update about the Lease and License discussions with MSAC?

A – It has been a priority for new CEO Gen to resume the lease and license discussions with MSAC. Currently going month to month on old, expired agreement but looking at a new agreement to be implemented in line with the next financial year which involves return payments on licensed space as opposed to a lump sum payment.

Negotiating the right return payment rate to ensure it is equitable to current lump sum.

- **Gary Warnest** (Bendigo and District Table Tennis Association)

Question – Observing the financial report, the table hire expense is approx. \$43K while income recouping seems to be about \$15K. Is there a plan to address this?

A – We are looking at taking some of the larger events currently held at MSAC out to regional community stadiums where the councils are wanting to attract sporting events to encourage economic growth and prepared to fund venue hire and table costs.

- **Gary Warnest** (Bendigo and District Table Tennis Association)

Question – Observing the financial report, why is the government stimulus income higher than the government stimulus expenditure?

A – Given the impact of COVID, the government funding couldn't all be spent so it has been rolled into the 2022 budget.

- **Damian Taranto** (Geelong Table Tennis Association)

Question – Are we able to be more strategic when planning the tournament calendar considering Easter and putting events like the Vic Open over one day of a weekend instead of two?

A – We work on an annual calendar that is set in advance, so we engage affiliates as part of this process and also work with Table Tennis Australia so that there are less scheduling conflicts.

- **Max Coulthard** (Mornington Peninsula and Frankston City Table Tennis Association)

Question – Can TTV explain the process about register members in advance for the following year so that other Affiliates may benefit from it?

A – The RevSport database doesn't allow pre-registration of members for the following year but there is a work around. By creating an event titled '2023 Membership' and taking pre-paid membership as part of that – the member can sit on the database as unpaid if they are new. Then in the new year, you renew the member profiles with the 2023 payment class on the database.

- **Damian Taranto** (Geelong Table Tennis Association)

Question – Is there an easier way to streamline tournament entry instead of the two-step process?

A – The process has been improved however each member still needs to register on the system before they can register for a tournament. We will investigate if any further improvements can be made.

- **John Wright** (Wangaratta Table Tennis Association)

Question – Can you tell us about the Spinneroos subsidy TTV are offering?

A – To encourage Affiliates to adopt the Spinneroos entry level program, TTV are offering a \$400 subsidy for Affiliates to run the program, to assist them to pay a coach or allocate towards the hiring of tables.

NOTES TO THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS FOR THE YEAR ENDED 31 DECEMBER 2022

NOTE 1: SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

The financial statements are special purpose financial statements prepared in order to satisfy the financial reporting requirements of the Associations Incorporation Reform Act 2012 (Vic). The Board has determined that the association is not a reporting entity.

The financial statements have been prepared on an accruals basis and are based on historic costs and do not take into account changing money values or, except where stated specifically, current valuations of non-current assets.

The following significant accounting policies, which are consistent with the previous period unless stated otherwise, have been adopted in the preparation of these financial statements.

a. **Income Tax**

The association is a not for profit entity and is exempt from income tax.

b. **Property, Plant and Equipment (PPE)**

Leasehold improvements and office equipment are carried at cost less, where applicable, any accumulated depreciation.

The depreciable amount of all PPE is depreciated over the useful lives of the assets to the association commencing from the time the asset is held ready for use.

Leasehold improvements are amortised over the shorter of either the unexpired period of the lease or the estimated useful lives of the improvements.

c. **Impairment of Assets**

At the end of each reporting period, the Board reviews the carrying amounts of its tangible and intangible assets to determine whether there is any indication that those assets have been impaired. If such an indication exists, an impairment test is carried out on the asset by comparing the recoverable amount of the asset, being the higher of the asset's fair value less costs of disposal and value in use, to the asset's carrying amount. Any excess of the asset's carrying amount over its recoverable amount is recognised in the income and expenditure statement.

d. **Employee Provisions**

Provision is made for the association's liability for employee benefits arising from services rendered by employees to the end of the reporting period. Employee provisions have been measured at the amounts expected to be paid when the liability is settled.

e. **Provisions**

Provisions are recognised when the association has a legal or constructive obligation, as a result of past events, for which it is probable that an outflow of economic benefits will result and that outflow can be reliably measured. Provisions are measured at the best estimate of the amounts required to settle the obligation at the end of the reporting period.

f. **Cash on Hand**

Cash on hand includes cash on hand, deposits held at call with banks, and other short-term highly liquid investments with original maturities of three months or less.

g. **Accounts Receivable and Other Debtors**

Accounts receivable and other debtors include amounts due from members as well as amounts receivable from donors. Receivables expected to be collected within 12 months of the end of the reporting period are classified as current assets. All other receivables are classified as non-current assets.

h. **Revenue and Other Income**

Revenue is measured at the fair value of the consideration received or receivable after taking into account any trade discounts and volume rebates allowed. For this purpose, deferred consideration is not discounted to present values when recognising revenue.

NOTES TO THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS FOR THE YEAR ENDED 31 DECEMBER 2022

NOTE 1: SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

Interest revenue is recognised using the effective interest method, which for floating rate financial assets is the rate inherent in the instrument. Dividend revenue is recognised when the right to receive a dividend has been established.

Grant and donation income is recognised when the entity obtains control over the funds, which is generally at the time of receipt.

If conditions are attached to the grant that must be satisfied before the association is eligible to receive the contribution, recognition of the grant as revenue will be deferred until those conditions are satisfied.

All revenue is stated net of the amount of goods and services tax.

i. **Leases**

Leases of PPE, where substantially all the risks and benefits incidental to the ownership of the asset (but not the legal ownership) are transferred to the association, are classified as finance leases.

Finance leases are capitalised by recording an asset and a liability at the lower of the amounts equal to the fair value of the leased property or the present value of the minimum lease payments, including any guaranteed residual values. Lease payments are allocated between the reduction of the lease liability and the lease interest expense for that period.

Leased assets are depreciated on a straight-line basis over the shorter of their estimated useful lives or the lease term. Lease payments for operating leases, where substantially all the risks and benefits remain with the lessor, are charged as expenses in the periods in which they are incurred.

j. **Goods and Services Tax (GST)**

Revenues, expenses and assets are recognised net of the amount of GST, except where the amount of GST incurred is not recoverable from the Australian Taxation Office (ATO). Receivables and payables are stated inclusive of the amount of GST receivable or payable. The net amount of GST recoverable from, or payable to, the ATO is included with other receivables or payables in the assets and liabilities statement.

k. **Financial Assets**

Investments in financial assets are initially recognised at cost, which includes transaction costs, and are subsequently measured at fair value, which is equivalent to their market bid price at the end of the reporting period. Movements in fair value are recognised through an equity reserve.

l. **Accounts Payable and Other Payables**

Accounts payable and other payables represent the liability outstanding at the end of the reporting period for goods and services received by the association during the reporting period that remain unpaid. The balance is recognised as a current liability with the amounts normally paid within 30 days of recognition of the liability.
