#### 33rd ANNUAL REPORT - 1962

#### Ladies and Gentlemen,

The year 1962 can be recorded as a year of progress. After a drop in 1961 our Pennant figures reached an all time high. A successful tour by a New Zealand Men's Team was made during 1962 and the usual large number of Tournements were conducted by the V.T.T.A.

The increasing number of clubs using our head-quarters at the Table
Tennis Centre as their home ground during the Pennant Season at concession
rates contributed to some extent to a drop in revenue at the Centre. Your
Committee is concerned about this and is endeavouring to maintain concessions
for clubs using the centre and also to improve the revenue from other sources.

#### PENNANT COMPETITIONS

We can report that the 1962 Winter Pennant broke all previous records as 381 teams entered this competition.

The Summer Season entry of 319 teams was not as high and was 24 teams less than 1961. However, in total 1962 represented a year of increase in Pennant teams.

Considerable thought and discussion has been given to the problem of late finishes of Pennant Matches. This problem is not new and becomes worse as the standard of play improves. Associations in other countries have experienced the same problem and with success have deleted doubles from team matches. Doubles are not played in Mens Teams matches at the World Championships and were deleted with success in the teams matches at the last Riversdale Easter Tournament and the Australian National Championships at Hobert.

Your Committee will submit a recommendation to the forthcoming Annual Meeting regarding the deletion of doubles from Pennant Matches.

Fixture books, including Match Regulations, were again distributed to registered players of the Pennant Competitions, and Pennants were presented at the conclusion of the final matches as was done in the 1961 Summer competitions.

The statistics concerned for the Pennant competitions are listed and congratulations are extended to the winners.

It is hoped all who participated in these competitions gained valuable experience and enjoyed their sport.

#### 1. WINTER.

Conducted from 9th, 10th and 11th April to 23rd, 24th and 25th July. 51 grades of 8 teams divided into 8 Women's grades and 43 Men's grades. 581 teams entered and this was an all time record for the Association.

Northern No. 2 won the "A" Grade and Sunshine won the "B" Grade in this competition, both teams are to be complimented on their wins.

Seventeen teams entered representing 9 Affiliated Associations and your Committee thank all concerned for their support.

#### UMPTRES' LEAGUE

Valuable service was again given to your Association by this League and its members.

In 1962, members of the League acted as scrutineers at the Annual Meeting of the Association, and during the year several recommendations on umpiring matters were made to the Australian Association through the State body, the majority of these recommendations being adopted. On the courts, the various Tournaments conducted by the V.T.T.A. were fully supported and the League was also represented at most of the country events. Senior and Junior State Team squads were visited on request during the year and advice, particularly on service procedure, was given. Unfortunately, no similar requests for attendance were received from any of the Pennant Clubs - secretaries are reminded that such a service is available.

For the Pennant Competitions, a Tuesday night Duty Referee was provided, but the number of umpires available each week was insufficient to provide any but the sketchiest of service to umpire the matches.

The total number of regularly practising umpires did, in fact, fall during 1962, due mainly to wastage of "fringe" members and the unpalatable fact that only two new members qualified as State Umpires during the year. Conversely, the administration of the League has been improved due to the combination and team work of the hard core of enthusiastic members remaining.

A recruiting campaign is in hand and all interested parties and possible new members are urged to contact the League as soon as possible.

#### SPECIAL EVENTS

#### 1. VISIT BY NEW ZEALAND TEAM

For the first time since 1939, a Men's team from New Zealand visited Australia and played matches in Victoria, the high light being a televised Test Match, Australia v New Zealand, played at the Centre on July 5.

The teams were: - Australia - V.Hirsch (V), M. Wilcox (N.S.W.)

K. Bowler (NSW), non playing Captain.

New Zealand - M. Dunn, A. Tomlinson and resulted in a win for Australia, 3 - 2.

In addition, a City of Melbourne Championships Invitation event was played - (Winner: V. Hirsch. Runner-up: A. Ma.), and matches were also played at Wonthaggi, Moe, Geelong, Traralgon, and Mt. Evelyn.

# 2. MOOMBA

During the 1962 Moomba festivities, the International Tournament for the Skolnik World Cup was again contested, and we congratulate the winning team. Hungary.

The Lord Mayor's trophy for a Singles competition was again won by V. Hirsch. All matches were played at the Centre.

# 3. NEW SOUTH WALES COUNTRY TOURS

Again, in conjunction with the N.S.W.T.T.A., two tours by country players from both States, were organised.

A Victorian Men's team, consisting of W. Hawley (captain), L. Elliett; both of Traralgon, and two Geelong players, J. Stabanack and N. Drake, visited New South Wales.

The Victorian team lost at Canberra and Goulburn, and won at Maitland and Newcastle. In the main match, New South Wales defeated Victoria, 7-4.

A New South Wales Women's team toured Victoria and played matches at Cobram, Shepparton, Traralgon and Geelong. N.S.W. won at Cobram and Shepparton but lost at Traralgon.

On 25th May, at Geelong, the Victorian team of F. Gordon, L. Gilbert, and T. Gilbert, defeated N.S.W., 10 - 1.

#### 4. CHADSTONE

For the second successive year we were fortunate in securing the Myer Auditorium at Chadstone to stage Exhibitions and Coaching Clinics during the recent Christmas school holidays.

The scheme was under the control of Mr. Roy Warrior, who was ably assisted by Mr. David Koone, a master at McLeod High School. The Clinic was held on Thursday, 31st January, Friday and Monday, 1st and 4th February respectively.

The scheme was most successful and a number of young players were invited to attend the Junior Coaching Classes at the Centre.

Our thanks are due to Myers at Chadstone, the Junior Coaches who attended on Thursday, the players who participated in the Exhibition, and to B.P. Australia, who provided the equipment and projectionist to show the film, "Science of Table Tennis".

#### 5. EXHIBITIONS

Every year there is a large demand for Exhibition matches from organisations of all kinds, and without the co-operation of leading players, it would be impossible to meet the demands. We thank all of the players, and members of the Umpire's League, who gave their services to provide interesting entertainment and help in promoting table tennis.

#### A.T.T.A.

At the Australian Table Tennis Association's Annual Meeting at Hobart in September, Mr. R.H. Jones of Victoria was re-elected Australian President, and Mr. R. Carlile, also of Victoria, was re-elected Honorary Secretary.

Mr. K. Bowler, (N.S.W.) was re-elected Honorary Treasurer.

#### LIFE MEMBER

At our last Annual Meeting, Mr. V. French was elected a Life Member of the Victorian Association. Such an honour has been given on only seven previous occasions.

Mr. French founded the Ceburg Harriers Club in 1948, was President for ten years, and is still a member of the Club. He has also served on the Executive Committee of the V.T.T.A., and was Vice President at the time of his retirement in 1959.

#### EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE

1962 was a year of extensive activity for your Executive Committee, Sub-Committees, and co-opted members.

The great amount of detail work necessary for an organisation of the size of the V.T.T.A. has been taking a tremendous amount of time of the honorary officials, and it is thought that their experience and time could be put to better advantage.

In an endeavour to remedy this position, the Executive Committee has appointed a full time girl, whose duties are typing, general clerical duties, and book-keeping. A part-time Duty Officer was also appointed, and his duties between 2.30 p.m. and 7.30 p.m. include keeping records, etc., of the Pennant Competitions. Both of these employees have their office at the Table Tennis Centre.

Investigations were made as to the possibility of employing a full time Secretary/Manager for the Association; however, at present finances will not permit the appointment of a suitable person.

As Honorary Treasurer for 15 years, he was invaluable in his advice on the finances of the Association.

Mr. M. Rundle resigned as Honorary Secretary on November 19th. He was elected to the Committee in 1950 and was appointed Honorary Secretary in 1958, and it is desired to record appreciation to him for services given to table tennis in Victoria.

#### FINANCIAL STATEMENT

The financial affairs of the Association have continued on a sound basis.

The Accounts and Balance Sheet have been prepared and completed for the

twelve months ended 30th November, 1962, in accordance with procedures adopted in the past years.

A decline in revenue from the Centre is causing concern and is to some extent brought about by the popularising of other indoor sports.

Additional table tennis facilities in various suburbs has also had an adverse effect on Centre takings.

As a result of these activities, your Committee has carefully scrutinised all forms of expenditure consistent with providing adequate facilities at the Centre and the promotion of table tennis generally.

The bank balance as at 30th November, 1962, indicates a substantial increase over the previous year. However, this must be held in reserve to meet expenses for the early part of the new year and to offset the continued falling off in revenue.

#### THANKS

Our sincere appreciation is offered to those members of the Press, Radio and Television, who have recorded our events and given us publicity during the year. This help has played a major part in promoting table tennis.

To the many others who in different ways have helped the Association during the year, we acknowledge the help that has been received.
