2021 was another roller-coaster year for Table Tennis Victoria, just like 2020, with another year of COVID lockdowns and restrictions. Outgoing CEO Ritchie Hinton finished up in November of 2021, so it has been a team effort between incoming Chief Executive Officer Gen Dohrmann, Events & Clubs Officer Claire Montgomery and TTV Board Chair Daniel Moloney to pull this report together.



First and foremost, we give a big thank you to all of the TTV Board Directors of 2021 for their input and effort throughout the year. TTV has an excellent Board that assisted greatly as our community adopted the ever-changing government requirements.

In 2021 TTV welcomed new Board members Molina Asthana, Nandakumar Alavandar and Dan Hamer. These new Board members joined Greg Bristowe, Leanne Conrad, Meredith Kelly, Daniel Moloney, Deborah Niccol, and Andrew Weiss. We farewelled Kimberley Brown, Jack Cyngler and Paul Healey from the Board in 2021 - we extend TTV's thanks for your valued time and effort and we wish you all the best.

On behalf of the TTV Board and staff, we extend a huge thank you to outgoing CEO Ritchie Hinton for his inspiring dedication to ensuring TTV made it through the tumultuous COVID period. We wish him well in his future endeavours and look forward to continuing the great work he had laid the foundations to deliver. The appointment of Gen Dohrmann as our new CEO is an extremely exciting one for our sport. Gen's experience in media, marketing and participation with other sports is key to building our presence in the social space to attract more players and sponsors to our affiliates regardless of metro/country Victoria.

We also commend the effort and dedication of the TTV office staff Claire Montgomery, Sean Sturrock, Jason Bast and Rahul Matthew (replaced by Yugandh Zende in Nov 2021), who continued to innovate and connect with the Victorian Table Tennis community throughout another tough year.

It was great to run some participation programs, such as Corporate Cup, Spinnerroos and Pop Up events in the first half of the year after a big year of planning in 2020 and we also managed to run 1.5 seasons of the TTV Premier League and a highly successful junior HP program before being locked down.

In the first half of the year, we were also able to get on the road and deliver several EPIC.TT workshops, an Enhancement Program for Clubs in Table Tennis, focused on increasing the governance knowledge within our affiliate network. We look forward to conducting more of these workshops in 2022.

Our social media channels and newsletters remained busy with interesting articles to keep the community engaged and it was great to be able to roll out website and database portals through RevSport for all Affiliates which has become a permanent part of the Affiliation package. A big well done to Claire Montgomery who assisted TTA with bring all States on board with RevSport as well as our affiliate network so that we now have a fully integrated National database and website system.

Membership numbers were understandably down after another disrupted year, especially in Melbourne. While membership was up 30% compared to 2020, it was still down 20% on pre-COVID numbers however member registrations in early 2022 have been promising.

With comprehensive data available through RevSport, TTV has identified a shift in member participation styles undoubtedly because of the pandemic. Pennant competition numbers decreased for the majority of Affiliates, however social participation, coaching, public hire and one-off tournament numbers all increased. The trend suggests that players are less willing to commit to a long season, and more willing to commit to a week by week or one day at a time approach to play Table Tennis.

TTV took note of these changing participation trends and began to put a greater emphasis on raising the social profile of the sport. The majority of the second half of the year in lockdown was spent planning and preparing two new social products of Table Tennis to launch in 2022: Ping Pong Rush and Lightning League.

Ping Pong Rush is a week-by-week social competition based on the popular training/school's activity "Top Table". Lightning League is competition with a five week and final season, two person teams and the best of three matches. Having played in last years iteration of Lightning League, I highly recommend it for good games and a shorter night. . Some clubs have piloted this format and it has proved successful, so TTV will be launching on a larger scale in 2022.

TTV's State Tournament Circuit was able to run in 2021 under a unique COVID format for the first half of the year, were restricted to age groups, played in larger round -robin groups and consolation singles. This format was well received by players, and it will be continued in 2022, gradually moving back to the pre-COVID format when the pandemic restrictions allow.

The inaugural TTV Primary School Cup was planned in 2021 but did not run due to COVID, we look forward to a revised version being run in 2022.

The TTV HP training sessions proved quite successful in the first half of 2021, averaging 48 players per session. TTV was also able to use these sessions to improve the coach accreditation and reaccreditation process by inviting accrediting and reaccrediting coaches to participate in the sessions as guest coaches. This allowed many coaches to complete their supervised hours and gain education points more easily with the added benefit of being a part of the HP environment. This will be continued in 2022.

TTV looks forward to an exciting 2022, working with Board, Staff, Affiliates, Members, and stakeholders. TTV will be reviewing the new Strategic Plan and engaging with affiliates for the next Strategic Plan We also look forward to continuing to strengthen relationships with Table Tennis Australia and all other States and Territories. We look forward to working with to connect more people with more forms of table tennis more often where COVID lockdowns are a distant memory.

**DANIEL MOLONEY**



I wrote in my notes for last year's Annual Report that 2020 was without doubt the hardest year in my career working as a professional sports administrator. Little did I know that 2021 would not be any easier!

I will not dwell on the challenges posed by the COVID-19 pandemic, as to do so would be to repeat my words from 2020. Suffice it to say here that the operational challenges faced by our sport, although significant, should be viewed in the context of the terrible human and economic cost of the COVID-19 pandemic.



As per 2020, Table Tennis Victoria managed to maintain its dedicated workforce throughout the crisis and resultant lockdown in 2021, and still delivered several initiatives to assist our Affiliates throughout the lockdown period and remain engaged with our Individual Members.

I would like to sincerely thank the State Government for their continued sector-specific financial support of the industry. Their support, along with that of TTV's dedicated membership cohort, will allow the organisation to bounce back stronger than ever in 2022, and allow it to provide a full suite of events and programs as sport re-opens its doors.

I would also like to acknowledge the on-going support of TTV's other key partners - S-Trend, AGMC Sports & Pongo. Their stoicism and pragmatism have been a comfort through these challenging times.

Thanks also to Sports Accounting Australia whose advice was once again crucial throughout the year in a seemingly never-ending cycle of forecasting and re-forecasting, planning, and re-planning. On a financial note, observers will recognise that 2020's surplus has been offset by 2021's similar deficit. This was expected as the lumpy effects of various government emergency payments, project funding, and membership refunds/reductions work themselves out over the period.

TTV is fortunate to benefit from a well-rounded and skilled Board of Directors whose experience spans the sports industry, and beyond. Their counsel and guidance were a welcome support during the year and will continue to serve the organisation well into the future.

As ever, a special mention to the TTV office staff. Claire Montgomery (Events & Clubs Officer), Sean Sturrock (Participation & Programs Officer), Jason Bast (Media & Marketing Officer) and Rahul Mathew (HP & Competitions Coordinator) are all to be commended for their efforts in another tough year of remote working.

I depart TTV in November 2021 after almost 3 years with the organisation and look forward to seeing the sport continue to grow under new leadership at both CEO and Chair level. I would like to think that I left the organisation in a better situation than when I arrived – after all, that is all we can hope to achieve as leaders of any State Sports Organisation where we are privileged to act as their temporary custodians.

**RITCHIE HINTON**

TTV Chief Executive Officer (departed TTV on Nov 5th, 2021)

Although 2021 was hampered again by COVID-19, particularly in NSW and Victoria, as a whole table tennis continued to fare much better than most other sports. Play continued throughout the year (unless lockdowns were in place) and the 'new normal' became embedded across the country. Ironically, given the ongoing travel difficulties, the biggest achievements of 2021 came on the international stage. Highlights from 2021 include, but are not limited to:



### HIGH PERFORMANCE:

- Australia enjoyed a record-breaking Tokyo Paralympic Games, with 11 athletes qualifying to compete and the team claiming 2 gold and 4 silver medals and finishing second on the table tennis medal tally, only behind China. Medals were achieved by: Qian Yang (Gold Class 10 Women's Singles), Lina Lei (Gold Class 9 Women's Singles), Sam von Einem (Silver Class 11 Men's Singles), Ma Lin (Silver Class 9 Men's Singles), Qian Yang/Lina Lei/Melissa Tapper (Silver Class 9-10 Women's Teams), Ma Lin/Joel Coughlan/Nathan Pellissier (Silver Class 9-10 Men's Teams). Moreover, team member Danni Di Toro had the honour of being named as Co-Captain of the Australian Paralympic Team.
- A group of 8 Australian athletes together with John Murphy (National Head Coach – Able-Bodied) undertook a hugely successful European Tour winning 8 gold, 3 silver and 5 bronze medals. As a result, big improvements in world rankings were realised, most notably Yangzi Liu reaching number 6 in Under 19 Girls and Nicholas Lum reaching number 8 in Under 17 Boys.
- Australia qualified the maximum quota of athletes for the Tokyo Olympic Games, with Jian Fang Lay competing in a record equalling sixth Olympic Games and equalling the best ever Women's Singles result by an Australian by winning through to the fourth round. Along the way she defeated former European Champion Li Qian.
- National Squad training continued to go from strength to strength, with record training hours continuing to be offered in Melbourne and Sydney.
- Player of the Year awards went to: Jian Fang Lay (Senior – Victor Barna Memorial Trophy), Qian Yang (Para – Arthur Wilks Award), Nicholas Lum (Junior – Michael Szabados Award). NOTE: The Ken Cole Trophy (Veterans) was not presented in 2021 due to no national or international events being held.
- Eva Jeler undertook a Coach Development Program with six identified coaches from around Australia, namely: Hongbo Liang (NSW), George Logothetis (Queensland), Franck Roguiez (Queensland), Maggie Meng (Victoria), and Peter Tretinik (Victoria) and Ajay Suwal (Western Australia).

## PARTICIPATION AND DEVELOPMENT:

- The [TTA Equipment and Facilities Grant Program](#) was successfully rolled out for a fourth straight year. 13 clubs/associations from 6 States/Territories received grants including Eastern Suburbs and Churches Table Tennis Association, LOOPS Table Tennis Club and Monbulk Table Tennis Association, which resulted in more than \$114,000 worth of equipment and facilities being injected into the table tennis community. Cumulatively across the four years of the program, more than \$354,000 worth of equipment and facilities has been distributed to 54 clubs/associations across all 8 States/Territories.
- 13 outstanding contributors to the sport were honoured through the [National Volunteer Awards Program](#). From Victoria, Jack Cyngler and Keith Keane were presented with awards. Greg Bungey (SA) had the honour of being awarded the Bev and Brian James Trophy as the 2021 National Volunteer of the Year.
- Membership rebounded strongly to pre-COVID-19 levels, with the 10,000-member mark being surpassed.
- Overall participation rebounded strongly to approach pre-COVID-19 levels, with more than 135,000 participants being realised.
- Our entry level program, Spinneroos, continued to be rolled out at both club and school level throughout Australia, including some new initiatives such as Girls Only Spinneroos.

## NATIONAL EVENTS:

- The National Hopes Week & Challenge was a huge success, with a record 60 players from 7 States/Territories attending the event at LOOPS Table Tennis Club. This event continues to lay the foundation for the next generation of Australian players and will continue to be a key focus moving forward.
- The inaugural TTA Tour – Sydney event was successful, with more than 150 participants and nearly 300 individual event entries. With singles events being held from Men's/Women's through to Under 11 Boys'/Girls', plus Para events, the formula for this pilot event appears to be right and TTA is looking forward to expanding the TTA Tour in 2022.
- Unfortunately, the National Senior, Youth, Junior and Para Championships, plus the National Veterans Championships and the TTA Tour – Melbourne all had to be cancelled due to COVID-19.

## RECOGNITION INITIATIVES:

- Undertook the [Official Australian Representatives \(Para\)](#) project, which identified the 73 men and 29 women who have represented Australia at senior level in para competitions, including identifying the complete career record for each athlete.
- 4 icons (including 3 Victorians) of Australian table tennis were inducted into the [TTA Hall of Fame](#): Karol Javor (Coaches – posthumously), Fran Keyhoe (Referees and Umpires – posthumously), Graeme Ireland (Referees and Umpires; Administrators) and David Delpratt (Referees and Umpires).

- The 50th anniversary of the Ping Pong Diplomacy Tour was celebrated on 21 April. The three surviving members of the team, Noel Shorter, Paul Pinkewich and Steve Knapp came together to [celebrate the occasion](#).
- The [Top 10 National Rankings](#) lists from 1948-2020 were collated and published.
- TTA's oldest Life Member, Cecil Shaw, [celebrated his 100th birthday on 27 August](#). TTA presented Cecil with a National Team shirt with the wording '100 NOT OUT' on the back to mark the occasion.
- The history of the first ever [National Championships in 1933](#) (held in Melbourne) was collated and published.

### GOVERNANCE AND FINANCE:

- TTA's governance rating through the Sport Australia Mandatory Sports Governance Principles Assessment reached a record high. TTA achieved a score of 3.2 out of 4.0, which is significantly higher than other similar sized sports (2.7) and all other sports combined (2.9).
- For the first time, TTA entered into MOUs with 5 State/Territory Associations, namely: Table Tennis ACT, Table Tennis NSW, Table Tennis Northern Territory, Table Tennis Tasmania and Table Tennis Western Australia. Through the MOUs, each party has clearly defined roles and responsibilities and TTA is able to provide a direct financial contribution for the first time ever. TTA is hopeful that MOUs with the remaining State/Territory Associations will be finalised in 2022.
- A fourth consecutive surplus will be achieved and TTA cash reserves continue to grow. This further underlines the strength of TTA's financial reforms and financial management over the past four years, where our business model has continued to stack up under difficult circumstances.
- Australia has significantly increased its reach within ITTF, with multiple people being elected/appointed to key ITTF positions, namely: Graham Symons (ITTF Executive Committee as a Vice President), Graeme Ireland and Scott Houston (ITTF Board of Directors), Alan Hopkins (ITTF Umpires and Referees Committee), Scott Houston (ITTF Veterans Committee).

I offer sincere thanks to everyone who contributed to our great sport throughout 2021; your contribution is both recognised and appreciated. Here's to a successful 2022!

### Key milestones

TTV's Facebook following has grown from 2075 in January 2020 to 2290 in October 2020. It is currently sitting at 2600 in December 2021.

Our goal was to grow to 2650+ by August 2021. While we have slightly missed this target the engagement online, especially during the Olympics was great and with a full return to events expected in 2022 we are excited for continued growth and engagement online.

TTV's Instagram following has grown from 509 in January 2020 to 630 in October 2020 and has grown to 900 by the end 2021. We were hoping to achieve 1000+ by January 2022 but with further event interruptions this fell short. Hopefully an uninterrupted event schedule will help improve our growth on the platform in 2022.

### Outcomes/Implementation

Between November 11 and December 10, 2021, TTV has had a 66% increase in post engagement while also consistently improving our engagement numbers from 2020 every month in 2021.

Our online engagement numbers have also continued to outperform similar pages. In comparison, TTV has had more weekly engagement than similar pages such as Badminton Victoria, VIS, Squash Vic, ITTF Oceania etc. despite having far less followers. Highlighting TTV's members and fans fantastic interaction with us and each other online.

Instagram has seen the best growth for TTV's social media. The increase of good quality photos from as many tournaments, events, and programs as possible have been well received.

We have been sharing relevant content via LinkedIn, with TTV's page seeing an increase of 42 followers (10%) in the last month of 2021.

The TTV Para Table Tennis Hub has been completed and rolled out onto the TTV website TTV's Tokyo 2020 content strategy was completed with increased engagement across all platforms during the Olympic and Paralympic Games.

The best performing content has continued to be event recaps and results articles; however Unsung Heroes articles and Olympic/Paralympic and International results have done very well in 2021.

We have had some recent success getting some of our pieces into the Clearinghouse Daily New.

Content regarding the Tokyo Olympics and Paralympics was engaged with very well online and received a lot of traditional media attention, in particular with Jian Fang Lay in Tokyo and our Paralympic success.

The TTV Monthly Newsletter has now been moved over to the Revsport platform and has continued to be released on a 4-6-week schedule.

**2. GENERAL BUSINESS****2.1 MOTION TO ACCEPT MINUTES OF THE 2019 ANNUAL GENERAL MEETING**

**RESOLUTION:** *That the Minutes of the TTV Annual General Meeting held on 11 July 2020 provide a true and accurate reflection of the meeting.*

Max Coulthard (Mornington Peninsula) moved that the minutes of the 2019 Annual General Meeting be accepted as submitted.

Helen Wright (Yarrawonga Mulwala) seconded the motion.

There being no objections to the resolution, it was unanimously passed.

## **2.2 TTV CHAIR ADDRESS**

The Chair noted the following:

- Thanks to the TTV Board of Management over last twelve months which have been very challenging due to effects of COVID-19 pandemic.
- Very pleased to have met 40% gender equity targets relating to board representation.
- Thanks to Ritchie Hinton (CEO) and the TTV staff for their work throughout the year, with particular emphasis on the recent 'EPIC TT' roadshow as part of the Club Enhancement Initiative which aims to help improve club operations, and provide an opportunity for mutual feedback.
- Pleased to have been able to refund 50% of membership fees during 2020 pandemic-affected season, and to increase our online presence during the period.
- Major event planning for 2021 confirmed, including a full State Tournament calendar, High Performance sessions, Primary & Secondary School Cups (in conjunction with School Sport Victoria). Excited to see impact of Spinnerroos & Corporate Cup.
- Future focus on non-traditional participation initiatives to reflect changing society trends, which will include a reliance on data to assist informed decision making.
- Continued liaison with TTA to encourage a uniform 'One Sport' approach where possible.

## **2.3 PRESENTATION OF 2020 TTV ANNUAL REPORT, INCLUDING 2020 TTV AUDITED FINANCIAL STATEMENTS & AUDITOR'S REPORT**

The Chair noted that copies of all documents had been distributed in advance, and invited Ritchie Hinton (TTV CEO) to provide an overview of the various reports.

The CEO highlighted two main areas:

### *i) Financial Performance*

The profit of \$86,940, while pleasing, was not to be considered in isolation.

Rather, it needed to be viewed as part of the pandemic cycle, which would see a forecast over-spend in 2021 as unspent grant money was outlaid.

The vital and welcome impact of various State and Federal survival funding was also highlighted.

Pleased and proud to have been able to retain all staff without head count or salary reduction, in addition to providing 2020 paid members with a 50% refund.

## ii) *Tournaments & Performance*

Noted that despite pandemic disruption, several State title and non-title events were able to be held.

Noteworthy performances included those of Ma Lin & Qian Yang at the Victorian Closed Senior Championships held in February 2020.

Delighted with on-going development of Para Program at The Hangar in Tullamarine, led by Mick Tomlinson, which TTV will seek to further support moving forward – especially pleasing to see the introduction of standing and wheelchair events in 2020 for the first time in a long while.

General acknowledgement of the considerable work undertaken by the TTV staff during the pandemic when the office was closed and no play was allowed, with special thanks to Claire Montgomery and Jason Bast for their online endeavours in the online club training and member engagement space.

**RESOLUTION:** *That the 2020 TTV Annual Report, including the 2020 TTV Audited Financial Statements and the 2020 Auditor's Report be accepted.*

*Richard Mielczarek (Sunbury) moved that the resolution be accepted and was seconded by Brian Zammit (Coburg).*

There being no objections to the resolution, it was unanimously passed.

## 2.4 **Special Resolutions**

**Special Resolution D1** was submitted by TTV, relating to the proposed amendment of s.27.3 (b) of the TTV Constitution which relates to the process surrounding casual vacancies on the Board.

### **Motion that:**

Clause 27.3(b) Casual Vacancies of the Table Tennis Victoria Incorporated Constitution be amended from:

“27.3(b) A director appointed in accordance with Rule 27.3 will hold office for the remainder of the period of office of the relevant director whose vacancy is being filled. “

**to read:**

“27.3(b) A director appointed in accordance with Rule 27.3 will hold office until the next annual general meeting when an eligible member of the Association is to be elected for the remainder of the period of office of the relevant director whose vacancy is being filled.”

Members were invited to speak either for against the motion.

**Max Coulthard** (Mornington) spoke in favour of the motion, suggesting that the proposed situation was common amongst many clubs, in his opinion.

**Chris Mainland** (SETTA) sought clarification that the proposed change would mean that someone who was successful at being re-elected at the first opportunity after their appointment via casual vacancy would serve the remaining term associated with the vacancy, rather than trigger a fresh 3-year term.

This interpretation was confirmed by TTV as being correct.

A show of hands in support of the motion was sought, with all Members in favour. Additionally, all pre-cast votes also supported the motion.

Special Resolution D1 was therefore **approved** unanimously.

**Special Resolution D2** was submitted by TTV, and related to the conferring of Life Membership upon James Edward (Jim) Montgomery:

**Motion that:**

“Mr. James Edward Montgomery be awarded Life Membership of Table Tennis Victoria for his service to TTV”.

The Chair spoke to recommend the motion, noting the significant contribution of Jim Montgomery to Victorian table tennis since the 1950's.

A show of hands in support of the motion was sought, with all Members in favour. Additionally, all pre-cast votes also supported the motion.

Special Resolution D2 was therefore **approved** unanimously.

## 2.5 ELECTION OF BOARD MEMBERS

The Chair noted his personal involvement in this agenda item, and therefore passed the matter to Ritchie Hinton (CEO) to address.

The CEO noted three spots were due for election, relating to the Chair position plus two Elected Director positions.

- Re: **Chair** position, only one nomination was received, that being from the incumbent, Mr. Jack Cyngler.

By virtue of pre-cast voting, Mr. Jack Cyngler had secured the necessary votes, but for the sake of transparency, a vote from a Member physically present was also requested from the floor to ratify this appointment.

**Max Coulthard** (Mornington Peninsula) provided this vote.

*Mr. Jack Cyngler was therefore duly elected* for a further 3 -year term as Chair until the AGM in 2024.

- Regarding the two **Elected Director** positions, only one nomination was received, that being from the incumbent, Mr. Andrew Weiss.

By virtue of pre-cast voting, Mr. Andrew Weiss had secured the necessary votes, but for the sake of transparency, a vote from a Member physically present was also requested from the floor to ratify this appointment.

**Chris Mainland** (South Eastern) provided this vote.

*Mr. Andrew Weiss was therefore duly elected* for a further 3 -year term as an Elected Director until the AGM in 2024.

The Chair noted that a process to appoint the remaining Elected Director spot by way of casual vacancy would be undertaken in due course , in line with the newly amended s. 27.3 (b) of the Constitution.

## 2.6 APPOINTMENT OF AUDITOR

The Chair noted that Mr. Geoff Morris of Billings & Ellis Pty Ltd had provided a very professional service in the preparation of the required audited accounts, and therefore recommended the following:

**RESOLUTION:** *That Mr. Geoff Morris of Billings & Ellis Pty Ltd be appointed the TTV auditor for 2021.*

This resolution was moved by Alex Morella (Croydon), and seconded by Richard Mielczarek (Sunbury)

A show of hands in support of the motion was sought, with all Members in favour.

The resolution was therefore **approved** unanimously.

## 3. ANNOUNCEMENT OF TTV ANNUAL AWARDS

The Chair was pleased to announce the following awards:

- **PRESIDENTS AWARD** (Distinguished Service Award)

Not Awarded for 2020 – no nominations were received this year, which was perhaps expected given the disruption caused by the pandemic.

- **FRENCH AWARD** (Senior Players of the Year- named in memory of Table Tennis Victoria former President, Vic French.)

Female: **Stephanie Sang**

Qualified for Tokyo Olympics, this will be her second after Beijing 2008, capping a remarkable comeback after having two children since the Beijing Games.

Male: **David Powell**

Qualified for Tokyo Olympics, his second games after Rio 2016.

- **COBURG AWARD** - (Junior Players of the Year - donated by Coburg TTC)

Female: **Parleen Kaur**

Recently elevated into TTV Junior Hall of Fame, a multiple junior State Champion and finished 7<sup>th</sup> in the second stage of the Olympic trials for Tokyo.

Male: **Nicholas Lum**

Another multiple junior State Champion, performed very strongly during the Tokyo Olympic trials finishing 3<sup>rd</sup>, and was runner up in the Melbourne Open.

- **SOKOLOWSKI AWARD** (Veteran Player of the Year – In memory of Ted Sokolowski. Perpetual trophies donated by Mr. Vic Matison and Mr. Roy Cintolo)

Female: **Jenny Langridge**

Vic Closed Vets O40 & O50 Women's Singles Champion. Also won 7 doubles events at the Vic Closed Vets & Croydon tournaments.

Male: **Craig Carter**

Vic Closed Vets O30 Men's Singles Champion, and Vic Closed Senior O30 Men's Singles Champion

- **ROSARIO AWARD** (Para Male & Female athlete of the Year - named after the Rosario family, an award which recognises the contributions made by Prisca, Eric and Alois Rosario to the sport of table tennis in Victoria.)

Female: **Daniela (Dani) Di Toro**

Vic Closed Para Class 1-5 Champion.

Her leadership qualities were also acknowledged through her appointment as Co-Captain of the Australian Paralympic Team in Tokyo for which she has qualified.

Male: **Ma Lin**

Qualified for 2020 Tokyo Paralympics, he also won the Victorian Closed Men's singles title.

- **GUGGENHEIM AWARD** - Volunteer of the Year (named after Joan Guggenheim)

Awarded to: **Yen Ngo**

A long-time Melbourne Veterans member, she has been their Treasurer for many years. Yen has also helped the Yarra TTC integrate into the TTV system and affiliate with us recently.

- **JAVOR AWARD** (Coach of the Year) - named after the late Karol Javor, an award which recognises the contribution made by him to coaching in Victoria.

Awarded to: **Rahul Mathew**

Recognised for his work with Balwyn TTC, noting his initiative in the online coaching space during the COVID lockdown– we are happy to now have Rahul in the TTV office assisting with the administration of the HP program and other TTV events.

## **4. MEETING CLOSE**

### **4.1 The AGM aspect of the meeting was formally closed at 2.46pm.**

## **5. Q & A**

The Chair invited questions to be asked on any subject to TTV, whether in front of the audience or personally during light refreshments.



- **Max Coulthard** (Mornington Peninsula)

Noted his own association's impending formal change to incorporate 'Frankston' into its name to reflect its current and future ambitions to grow participation over a wider geographical area.

**Question** - how do TTV plan to address the challenge of increasing non-traditional activity in an innovative manner?

A - TTV Chair responded, highlighting the need for the sport to consider more flexible formats to reduce the time required to play. CEO also noted the successful Croydon pilot here.

TTV also reiterated the need to understand and embrace the Sporting Schools and Spinnerroos programs in particular to increase junior participation at the bottom end of the 'participation pyramid'.

- **Damian Taranto** (Geelong)

**Question** – how are membership numbers tracking so far in 2021?

A - CEO responded that numbers are down by single digit percentage (8-9% based on latest figures). Noted this seemed to be a national trend, as was the fact that despite this slight decline, tournament numbers had actually increased.

Perhaps a little early to draw conclusions re: whole year results, as confidence will hopefully grow towards the end of the year, and some clubs may have started later than normal due to pandemic concerns, which could see numbers increase later.

**Neville Young** (Eastern Suburbs) & **Brian Zammit** (Coburg) noted some reluctance amongst some players from certain cohorts to rush back.

A – Try to counter these effects by using the opportunity to pivot to a junior focus (e.g. Spinnerroos).

- **Adam Pegg** (Ballarat)

Noted the increased professionalism of TTV in recent years, and the improved structure around High Performance (HP).

**Question** – do TTV have any plans to expand the current MSAC-based HP program to regional areas?

A - CEO explained the funding challenges here, noting an investment of tens of thousands of dollars, with no contribution from TTA in 2021.

Also noted the talent in regional Victoria and stated an intent to further explore regional expansion of the HP program as part of the next phase of its evolution.

- **Chris Mainland** (SETTA)

**Question** – do TTV envisage having a ‘No jab, no play’ policy re: COVID-19 vaccination?

A - CEO responded that it was difficult to imagine enforcing a policy which went over and above any legal requirements imposed by the government, noting the federal position was vaccination would not be made mandatory.

**Deborah Niccol** (TTV Board Director) added that Sport & Recreation Victoria (SRV) are also very unlikely to become involved by imposing sector-specific requirements, given that at State level the responsible department was Department of Health & Human Services (DHSS).

NOTE 1: SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

The financial statements are special purpose financial statements prepared in order to satisfy the financial reporting requirements of the Associations Incorporation Reform Act 2012 (Vic). The Board has determined that the association is not a reporting entity.

The financial statements have been prepared on an accruals basis and are based on historic costs and do not take into account changing money values or, except where stated specifically, current valuations of non-current assets.

The following significant accounting policies, which are consistent with the previous period unless stated otherwise, have been adopted in the preparation of these financial statements.

a. **Income Tax**

The association is a not-for-profit entity and is exempt from income tax.

b. **Property, Plant and Equipment (PPE)**

Leasehold improvements and office equipment are carried at cost less, where applicable, any accumulated depreciation.

The depreciable amount of all PPE is depreciated over the useful lives of the assets to the association commencing from the time the asset is held ready for use.

Leasehold improvements are amortised over the shorter of either the unexpired period of the lease or the estimated useful lives of the improvements.

c. **Impairment of Assets**

At the end of each reporting period, the Board reviews the carrying amounts of its tangible and intangible assets to determine whether there is any indication that those assets have been impaired. If such an indication exists, an impairment test is carried out on the asset by comparing the recoverable amount of the asset, being the higher of the asset's fair value less costs of disposal and value in use, to the asset's carrying amount. Any excess of the asset's carrying amount over its recoverable amount is recognised in the income and expenditure statement.

d. **Employee Provisions**

Provision is made for the association's liability for employee benefits arising from services rendered by employees to the end of the reporting period. Employee provisions have been measured at the amounts expected to be paid when the liability is settled.

e. **Provisions**

Provisions are recognised when the association has a legal or constructive obligation, as a result of past events, for which it is probable that an outflow of economic benefits will result and that outflow can be reliably measured. Provisions are measured at the best estimate of the amounts required to settle the obligation at the end of the reporting period.

f. **Cash on Hand**

Cash on hand includes cash on hand, deposits held at call with banks, and other short-term highly liquid investments with original maturities of three months or less.

g. **Accounts Receivable and Other Debtors**

Accounts receivable and other debtors include amounts due from members as well as amounts receivable from donors. Receivables expected to be collected within 12 months of the end of the reporting period are classified as current assets. All other receivables are classified as non-current assets.

h. **Revenue and Other Income**

Revenue is measured at the fair value of the consideration received or receivable after taking into account any trade discounts and volume rebates allowed. For this purpose, deferred consideration is not discounted to present values when recognising revenue.

Interest revenue is recognised using the effective interest method, which for floating rate financial assets is the rate inherent in the instrument. Dividend revenue is recognised when the right to receive a dividend has been established.

Grant and donation income is recognised when the entity obtains control over the funds, which is generally at the time of receipt.

NOTE 1: SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

If conditions are attached to the grant that must be satisfied before the association is eligible to receive the contribution, recognition of the grant as revenue will be deferred until those conditions are satisfied.

All revenue is stated net of the amount of goods and services tax.

i. **Leases**

Leases of PPE, where substantially all the risks and benefits incidental to the ownership of the asset (but not the legal ownership) are transferred to the association, are classified as finance leases.

Finance leases are capitalised by recording an asset and a liability at the lower of the amounts equal to the fair value of the leased property or the present value of the minimum lease payments, including any guaranteed residual values. Lease payments are allocated between the reduction of the lease liability and the lease interest expense for that period.

Leased assets are depreciated on a straight-line basis over the shorter of their estimated useful lives or the lease term. Lease payments for operating leases, where substantially all the risks and benefits remain with the lessor, are charged as expenses in the periods in which they are incurred.

j. **Goods and Services Tax (GST)**

Revenues, expenses and assets are recognised net of the amount of GST, except where the amount of GST incurred is not recoverable from the Australian Taxation Office (ATO). Receivables and payables are stated inclusive of the amount of GST receivable or payable. The net amount of GST recoverable from, or payable to, the ATO is included with other receivables or payables in the assets and liabilities statement.

k. **Financial Assets**

Investments in financial assets are initially recognised at cost, which includes transaction costs, and are subsequently measured at fair value, which is equivalent to their market bid price at the end of the reporting period. Movements in fair value are recognised through an equity reserve.

l. **Accounts Payable and Other Payables**

Accounts payable and other payables represent the liability outstanding at the end of the reporting period for goods and services received by the association during the reporting period that remain unpaid. The balance is recognised as a current liability with the amounts normally paid within 30 days of recognition of the liability.

### NOTE 12: IMPACT OF COVID 19 & SUBSEQUENT EVENTS

The Covid 19 pandemic had for a second year a significant impact on the activities of the organisation which affected the financial results for the 2021 year. Tournaments and events were cancelled throughout the year, and this resulted in a loss of budgeted revenue for the year of \$209,696.

Membership numbers did increase from 2,029 in 2020 to 3,507 in 2021 however numbers were down from budgeted targets as a result of Covid restrictions, resulting in a reduction of membership revenue of \$100,725.

The decline in revenue was somewhat offset by associated event and operational cost savings. Funding of \$72,300 was received from the Government in the form of JobKeeper wage subsidies and Business Support Grants.

The Board is aware that further Covid 19 restrictions on movement & quarantine requirements may have an effect on future revenue. Due to the uncertainty surrounding Covid 19, an estimate of this impact cannot be made.

Significant uncertainty remains regarding the organisation's on-going revenue stream via their tenancy with the State Sports Centre Trust at MSAC. Current lease and license agreements lapsed on 30 June 2020, and despite concerted efforts on behalf of the organisation, it is still yet to receive any formal renewal documents from the State Sports Centre Trust.


