40th ANNUAL REPORT - 1969

Ladies and Gentlemen,

1969 was a year of mixed fortune, with great success in the field of play but with falling attendances at the Table Tennis Centre.

Pride of place must certainly go to the Victorian teams which competed for the Senior, Junior and Sub-Junior Championships of Australia. In a total of eight team events Victorian teams won seven, and in the eight singles titles held in conjunction Victorian players also won seven. These achievements speak volumes for the ability and dedication of our players and also for the Selectors, Team Managers, Junior Sub-Committee and last, but no means least, our State Coach. It was a real team effort and Victorian table tennis can be very proud of all concerned.

In addition, the premier awards of Australian table tennis went to Victoria when Mary Cleaves won the Victor Barna Award and Victoria, the Trudek trophy. This latter trophy has been presented for award to the premier State Association and is determined each year by the highest number of points which are allocated for items such as team and individual performances and successful administration.

On the administration front it is pleasing to record that new sponsors have been gained which materially helped to make the running of various championships a profitable effort. The Weekly Times sponsored the Country Championships and Shell Co. of Australia sponsored the Victorian Junior Championships. These sponsors now join with supporters of many years standing such as Riversdale Manufacturing Co., Melbourne Sports Depot and Hartleys Ltd. We hope that the support that we receive from all of these people will continue, and even increase, over the next few years. In addition, many trophies were provided by firms and by individuals.

Regretably, 1969 was again a year of falling income and lower general participation by players in VTTA Melbourne Metropolitan pennant. The number of pennant teams decreased in both winter and summer pennant competitions as did the number of entries in the championship tournament events. Public hire of tables at the Table Tennis Centre of Victoria was also down. This loss of income is the continual and ever-increasing concern of the Executive Committee. On the brighter side, records were made in the number of Affiliated Associations and in entries for Country Championships and the Atlas Shield. The battle for increased popularity of the sport in Melbourne is expected to continue into 1970.

The year closed on a pleasurable note when Victor Barna visited Melbourne from 18th to 23rd of November as a stage in his Australian tour. Special events to mark this visit included an invitation tournament, a junior tournament and several meetings between players, ex-players, officials and members of the trade. New friendships of significant value to the game were made.

PENNANT COMPETITIONS

1.1 METROPOLITAN WINTER PENNANT

This was conducted from 22nd April to 27th August. The finals dates were rescheduled by the Executive Committee to allow some of the top A grade teams to play at full strength as four players in these teams were representing Australia against New Zealand. There were 6 womens grades and 30 mens grades making a total of 288 teams, 6 teams less than in 1968. It was pleasing to see clubs take note of the request by the V.T.T.A. Executive and play more of their teams on Tuesday and Thursday nights. This co-operation is greatly appreciated. Further co-operation is requested to solve the problem of the shrinking pennant competition. The Executive Committee has been greatly troubled by this trend and would be pleased to hear any suggestions which will make the competition more enjoyable.

The competition was apparently satisfactorily graded, judging by the comments passed by players. Occasionally misgradings occur due to teams having strong players who have not played competition before and teams having rapidly improving players which is not always readily reflected by their last seasons performances. In cases like this, more often than not the strong team loses interest due to lack of adequate opposition. Perhaps teams in positions like this who would like to "try themselves out" could indicate this fact on their pennant entry form. Winners and runners-up were:-

2. JUNIOR PENNANT COMPETITIONS

The Junior programme for 1969 was even fuller than for 1968. A highlight of the year was the inaugural Australian Sub-junior Team and Individual Championships which were held at the Centre during the May schools vacation. Another innovation was the commencement of a Metropolitan Secondary Schools Team Championship.

2.1 AUTUMN UNDER 20 PENNANT

2.1 <u>Automatication</u> This was conducted on Saturday mornings from 12th April to 31st May and consisted of 5 rounds and finals. One only pennant season of seven rounds was conducted during the year for A grade, in order that the top juniors could attend the Three-Star Country Tournaments which were held during the season on every alternate Saturday. A grade pennant matches were not rostered for Saturdays on which country tournaments were held, so that the pennant season extended to August 16th.

For Autumn Pennant 54 teams entered - 44 boys teams (7 grades) and 10 girls teams (2 grades). There was a drop of 8 girls teams on 1968 entries. It was gratifying to see senior clubs such as University and Victoria Club sponsoring junior teams. The enthusiasm of the East Geelong team in making the journey to Albert Park every Saturday was commendable. Winners and runners-up were:-

4. AUSTRALIAN CHAMPIONSHIPS

4.3 AUSTRALIAN SUB-JUNIOR TEAM CHAMPIONSHIPS

The first Australian Subjunior Teams and Individual Championships were conducted by the Victorian Table Tennis Association at the Table Tennis Centre of Victoria from 15th to 17th May. South Australia, Tasmania and Victoria were represented in both boys and girls events, while New South Wales was represented in boys events only. Events were held for under 16 and under 14 age groups. Eleven-rubber matches were played in all team events. Victorian players dominated all sections except for Girls under 14. Victorian teams were :-

In order that more players should be given opportunity to participate in Inter-State team matches, it was stipulated that no player holding or having held an Australian Senior or Junior ranking should be eligible to represent any State in any Sub-junior teams event.

Furthermore, since Junior Ranking lists had not been issued for 1968 or previous years it was recommended that the ATTA Selectors issue a list setting out the names of those boys and girls who, in their opinion, would have been accorded junior ranking for the current season had such a ranking list been issued for 1968. Such list was duly issued, and three sub-juniors included therein were deemed ineligible to compete in sub-junior teams events. The players were:- Boys - P.Powell (SA), R.Tuckett (Vic). Girls - S.Gilbert (Vic).

The Victorian teams included several players from country associations -C.Campbell, S.Bellamy and J.Whitehead from Geelong, K.Barclay and P.Woodward from Ballarat and M.Vaughan from Warrnambool.

Finally, the train on which the South Australians were booked to return was cancelled, and they were obliged to incur the additional expense of air travel. 5. SPECIAL EVENTS

5.1 EXHIBITIONS

1969 saw many clubs and associations take advantage of the high standard of players available to play exhibitions. This valuable promotion of table tennis to the public is one in which the Association thanks all those who gave their services so readily.

5.2 VICTOR BARNA VISIT

Victor Barna, five times World Singles Champion and currently Dunlop, England, Export Sales Manager arrived in Melbourne on Tuesday 18th November for a six day visit. During this visit a function was given by Slazengers (Aust.) Pty.Ltd. in Victor Barna's honour, to which the Victorian Executive Committee was invited, so enabling close contact to be made between officials of Slazengers and the VTTA.

On Friday evening 21st November, a meeting was held to discuss the formation of an Australian branch of the world-wide Swaythling Club. ATTA President Dr. J.Jackson presided with the help of ATTA Secretary, Mr. K.Bowler, and Mr.Barna. Twelve Victorians, who have been to World Championships as players or officials, attended.

Also on Friday evening an invitation tournament was held. Eight players were invited to compete in the Mens Singles and four in the Womens Singles.



Based on the state of the ladder before each of the Shepparton, Horsham, Traralgon and Warrnambool tournaments the top eight men and top five women are entitled to a \$4.00 payment from the VTTA each time they attend one of the above championships.

8. TABLE TENNIS CENTRE OF VICTORIA

During the year the Centre was again the venue for most major events in the Victorian Calendar. These included the Victorian Open Championships, Country Championships, Victorian Closed Championships, Riversdale-Halex, Moomba and the City of Melbourne Tournaments.

8.1 BUILDING

The main improvement in the building this year was in alterations to the Duty Office to present a better reception area for the public. Along with this change the public address system was altered to operate from this area. These changes also enable tournaments to be controlled from this area.

Donations of 100 square yards of floor tiles enabled a further area of the main passage to be covered.

The accounts for the Centre are recorded in the Revenue Account printed at the end of this report.

8.2 STAFF

After the changes of the previous year our staff position has remained stable. Mrs. J.Guggenheim has continued to give capable and efficient service and she is assisted by Miss L.Simpson. Mr. N.Katsiris continues as Building Superintendent.

8.3 DUTY OFFICERS

In a major change, part-time week night duty officers were replaced by a permanent appointment and Mrs. B.Richards has capably filled this position. We extend our thanks to those who officiate at the weekends.

8.4 ALBERT PARK TRUST

We extend our thanks to Senator P.J.Kennelly (Chairman), Mr.Burke (Secretary) and other members of the Albert Park Committee of Management for their cooperation throughout the year.

9. PROMOTION OFFICER/COACH

Once again the demands on the services of Mr. Harry Venner were very heavy. During the relatively quiet portion of the year in January, Mr. Venner was engaged in visiting business houses with the aim of obtaining more pennant teams. The first approaches to business houses were made by telephone, followed by personal visits by Mr. Venner. Unfortunately the amount of success was very limited.

The main efforts by Mr.Venner were again aimed at school children. During school term the number of hours spent in visiting schools averaged 14 per week and, with mass junior coaching programmes on Saturdays, more than half the week's work was utilized in this way.

It is fair to say that Victoria has the greatest depth in strength of junior table tennis players and much of the credit for this is due to the Association's policy in concentrating Mr.Venner's activities in this field.

Special programmes in which Mr. Venner played a major role included the Melbourne City Council's Holiday Sports and Recreation Programme, Mordialloc Youth Week, Springvale Youth Exposition.

As a coach Mr.Venner was of course in charge of the Victorian Senior and Junior State Squads, and went with the teams to Brisbane, where Victoria made a clean sweep of all teams events.

Visits to the country centres of St.Arnaud, Echuca and Kerang were made in 1969, as they were in 1968. It is unfortunate that not more country centres were able to take advantage of our coach's services, as one weekend per month had been allocated for these visits. In an endeavour to recoup a part of Mr.Venner's salary, a charge of \$5 per day was made in addition to travelling expenses. The charge seems small enough when the value of the coaching is compared with the costs of similar coaching in other sports.

The weekly coaches class was continued in 1969 and a scheme of qualifications for coaches is to be instituted. The ATTA is also interested in such a scheme for an Australia-wide application.

Individual and group coaching were fitted in according to the demand and time available. Charges made for this coaching were income for the Association and helped to offset the salary paid.

Finally Mr.Venner had many calls to organize and play in exhibition matches. These are most important to table tennis as they publicize the game in the best way by letting people unfamiliar with table tennis see the champions in action. The Association is most appreciative of the willingness to help shown by all players asked.

10. AFFILIATED ASSOCIATIONS

1969 was the greatest year in affiliated table tennis in Victoria's history.

Affiliations were a record in the country (56 Associations) and unchanged in the City (14 Associations). The first Country Championships to be conducted over the Queen's Birthday weekend in Melbourne drew a record entry of 82 teams.

District Representatives of the VTTA continued to do excellent work in developing the game in their zones. They were: Messrs. C.O'Brien, Swan Hill (Kerang and North-east); R.Snibson, Horsham (Wimmera); W.Edwards, Warrnambool; K.Eyers, Ballarat; G.McIlvena, Geelong: W.Freeman, Donald (Bendigo); G.Ward, Shepparton; G.Puchlenko, Traralgon (Gippsland North); C.DeBondt, Tarwin Lower (Gippsland South); B.Goodchild, Myrtleford (North-east); L.Bassett, Yea (Highlands) and A.Walker (Metropolitan).

In the Metropolitan area, entries in the annual Atlas Shield contest leapt to a record of 24. State Coach Harry Venner continued to visit country centres. Exhibitions were given by leading metropolitan players for Associations at Creswick, Yea, Dandenong, and Sandringham and to many suburban Clubs and schools.

Former or present country players constituted three-quarters of the 1969 State Women's team and the whole of the Girls' team.

Country teams again played a large part in the Junior Teams Championships of Victoria, and a very successful sub-junior teams championship was held at Warrnambool.

Open tournaments were successfully held by the following affiliated Associations: Geelong, Ballarat, Shepparton, Horsham, Traralgon, Warrnambool, Yea, Donald and Mildura.

A Victorian Country Women's team toured New South Wales from 25th-29th August, playing matches at Newcastle, Sydney, Bowral, Goulburn and Canberra. The team of Mrs. D.Gilbert, Misses J.Goosens, P.Woodward (all of Ballarat) and J.Whitehead of Geelong won all matches except at Goulburn. Mr. Frank Woodward of Ballarat was manager-driver.

A New South Wales Country Men's team consisting of Messrs. T.Kolleth (Canberra), K.Sands (Goulburn), G.Spackman (Berrima) and T.Cottier (Goulburn) toured Victoria from 15th-19th September, visiting Traralgon, Melbourne, Geelong, Ballarat and Shepparton. It lost 4-7 to Traralgon and to a combined country team in Melbourne. NSW defeated Geelong, Ballarat and Shepparton.

Separate annual meetings of Country and Metropolitan Affiliated Associations were held at the Table Tennis Centre of Victoria.

The VTTA is grateful to the hundreds of officials in affiliated Associations who are doing so much to expand the game in their districts.

It is aware that there are still numbers of Associations in both country and suburbs, which are not as yet affiliated. When the VTTA can speak on behalf of all table tennis organisations in the State, it will be able to command more attention from Press, Radio, Tele-

The VTTA hopes that 1970 will take it still further towards that objective. The following Associations were affiliated in 1969:-

PROMOTION

Promotion this year has been directed in seven areas.

1. Sponsorship: Progress has been made in convincing leading firms of the worthiness of our sport and we hope that Weekly Times, Shell, Riversdale and Myers have been satisfied with the tournaments they supported. We certainly are grateful to them.

2. Trophy Donations: Friends of table tennis who have assisted with trophies are:- Messrs. W.Knapp, A.Kiven, R.French, R.Atkin, P.Lawrence, G.Bruckner, L.Schetzer, K.Defris, M.Fonstein, K.Fahey, P.Woolley, J.Mack, M.Witt, D.Wang, A.Robinson, V.French, W.Savige, P.Mascall, W.Baulch, F.Mills, Wardrops, Mrs. Maria Leber, Crusader Plate, Malleys, Myttons-Grosvenor, Nelson Lampshades, Seafoam, Slazengers, Melbourne Sports Depot, Coca-Cola, Hartleys, Dunlop, Kodak, Revlon, Riversdale, Brooklands, Toppa-Devondale and Brashs. Their help is invaluable and we greatly appreciate it.

3. Centre Improvements: Several friends have donated materials to improve the Centre - Gunnersen-Marbut, Laminex Industries, Dunlop, Yencken Glass, Atkins Timber and Mr. Trainor. This wonderful assistance is really valued.

4. Pennant Teams: We have tried to interest new groups in playing pennant and to revitalise the interest of those already participating. We haven't succeeded. Next year this must be No. 1 priority and any help or suggestions would be appreciated. 5. Improvements to Williamstown Centre: Walpamur, Spartan Paints, and all who worked so hard to redecorate the Western Suburbs Centre deserve a special thank you.

6. Victorian Championships: A start was made in promoting this event which means such a lot to Association finances. 1969 attendances were much better and in 1970 we must aim to fill the three stands on Finals Night.

7. Centre Promotion: Several ideas were tried to attract more people to the Centre. They didn't succeed. We need all our players to "sell" the Centre for us. Every penny it makes goes into developing our sport and we certainly need finance.

I feel that we have laid foundations this year; the challenge is to see what we can build on them.

12. PUBLICITY

It is doubtful if one could ever obtain sufficient publicity, and the constant effort to try to do so gives the Publicity Sub-committee a permanent job. We started 1969 with some very good publicity and frequent photos in the daily press, but have been unable to maintain the pace.

There are many ways in which we can obtain publicity, but they all require a good deal of time and effort - more than the average person can give. We are very much in need of volunteers who are prepared to look after one small segment of the work each week. If we could get eight or ten such people we could have table tennis news in all the daily papers - morning and evening, all the suburban papers as well as radio and television. This alone would help to build up our public image as a major sport. Once we are able to do this we will find sponsors for our tournaments much easier to obtain. Anyone who would like to help us in this work should contact the office at the Table Tennis Centre.

We acknowledge the assistance given us during the year by the Press, Radio and Television. Without the co-operation and assistance of these people, our task would be impossible.

The weekly "News Sheet" was again widely distributed amongst players, clubs and the Press. This serves as a simple and quick way to inform clubs and players of important events and news items.

13. VICTORIAN TABLE TENNIS UMPIRES LEAGUE

The V.T.T.U.L. has again provided umpires and referees for all major Metropolitan Tournaments and Championships. In addition, we have provided two referees and two umpires each week for Winter Pennant. As an appreciable number of our umpires are playing pennant they are not able to share these duties and a heavy load has fallen on the other members of the League who are not playing pennant. We have had a number of new umpires join the League during the year and we would like to see many more players, present or past, maintain their interest in table tennis by becoming State Umpires.

Only one of the country Associations took advantage of our offer to supply a referee for any 3-star country tournaments. We feel that country Associations could derive a good deal of benefit from having an experienced referee controlling their tournaments. Perhaps more Associations will take advantage of our offer next year. Good umpires and referees lift the standard of tournaments and we would like to see country Associations persuade more of their players and officials to become qualified umpires.

14. STATE SQUADS

The Selectors after very careful consideration picked the State teams in accordance with performances of pennant, tournament and co-operation at practice sessions for both seniors and juniors. They were rewarded by the fact that Victoria won all four shields for team events at the National Championships.

The State Coach invited some A Grade players and juniors for practice sessions and also arranged some sessions at weekends to give the country players and students a chance to participate. Training commenced in May and continued weekly until September, under the guidance of State Coach, Mr. Harry Venner, who did a first class job of preparing all players for the National Championships.

15. A.T.T.A.

Mr. K.Bowler (Honorary Secretary ATTA) represented Australia at the 1969 meeting of the International Table Tennis Federation in Munich, Germany. The Federation approved the admission of Australia as an Associate Member of the Asian Federation.

'Unofficial' teams represented Australia at the 1969 World Championships. The Mens team was P.Pinkewich (NSW), P.Powell (SA) and K.Javor (VIC) as player-manager. It finished 39th out of 54 entries. The womens team of J.Lane (SA), J.Brown and V.Wheller (NSW) finished 19th out of 41 entries.

An Australian team composed entirely of Victorians - G.Stirling, L.Pascoe and Misses L.Gilbert and M.Cleaves, toured New Zealand in late July-August. It lost the Test Series by one match to two, but was not defeated in provincial matches. Mr. & Mrs. E.Amos of SA acted as manager and chaperone. The women players won 322 of the 50 rubbers won by Australia on the tour.

Following our women players better performances at the World Championships and in New Zealand, the ATTA decided to give first preference to sending a womens team to the Asian Championships in Japan in 1970. The team selected was Misses M. Cleaves and L. Gilbert, both of Victoria. Another new and successful venture for the ATTA was the holding of the first Sub-Junior Championships in Melbourne in May 1969.

The 1969 Australian Championships - senior and junior - were successfully conducted in Brisbane.

Principal business of the ATTA General Personal Meeting in Brisbane in September was the adoption of a new Manual comprising a revised Constitution and Special Regulations.

Only change in the annual election of ATTA office bearers was the election of Dr.W.Savige (Vic) as a selector in place of Dr.J.Jackson (SA) who had not sought re-election. Other selectors are Messrs. K.Bowler (NSW) and L.Wharmby (Tas).

Other recent changes on the ATTA Council were that Mr.D.Tucker replaced Dr.Jackson as SA delegate and Mr. W.R. Blundell replaced Mr. J.Ferguson as Queensland delegate. Dr.Jackson continues as Australian President, Mr.K.Bowler as Honorary Secretary, Mr.L.Haycraft (NSW) as Honorary Treasurer, Mr. J.Hannon (Tas) as Honorary Assistant Secretary and Mr. L.Hitchen (WA) as Vice President. Victoria's delegate to the ATTA is Mr. Alan Cleaves.

16. EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE

Following the many changes in 1968, the year 1969 was very stable indeed. For the first time in many years all sitting members were re-elected unopposed at the Annual General Meeting. In fact, due to the retirement of Mr.W.Bates, the number of candidates was one less than the number of positions, so creating a vacancy which was subsequently filled by the very welcome return to the committee of Mr.A.Walker.
