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INTRODUCTION

1986 saw new members join the Executive Committee and long serving members leave. A keenly fought campaign saw the election of two female Vice Presidents and two new Committee Members.

Due to a misinterpretation of voting method, and an appeal by a defeated candidate it was necessary to conduct a new ballot to fill the positions vacant. Two vacancies were filled later in the year, and also a new Treasurer. A full Executive Committee carried out its duties for the year.

The Executive Council met regularly between Executive Committee meetings to carry out the day to day functions as required under the new articles of Association. The sub-committees appointed now have full responsibility to function within budgetary guidelines and report to the Executive Council. This system will gain strength as stability is secured within the Executive Committee.

The Executive Committee was pleased to hear our long serving Honorary Legal Officer Mr. Joseph Kay was appointed as a Judge of the Family Court of Australia. Mr. Paul Brenner has agreed to take up the position vacated by Mr. Justice Kay. We thank both parties for serving Table Tennis in their own way.

The Association did not conduct an International Event in 1986 but the A.T.T.A conducted the Oceania Championships at Ballarat.

Mr. Lindroth was promoted to the position of Executive Director, and Mr. T. Danielsson resigned his position as part time Sports Promotion Officer when the State Government upgraded the position to full time. (Mr. Danielsson is A.T.T.A Coach and operates his own retail business). Mr. Alois Rosario was appointed the new full time Sports Promotion Officer.

The State Government also made available to us a "Cadet" for a twelve month period. Miss Sharon Graham has been an asset to administration.

A pleasing feature of the year has been the increased usage of the Centre as reflected in our budget figures for table hire. It is imperative that this trend continues, as the Centre is our main source of revenue to cover the costs our members take for granted.

The sudden death of our long serving Treasurer Mr. Eric Leder, immediately prior to the Annual General Meeting left the Association with a problem. We were most fortunate that we were able to persuade Mr. John Beer (a former assistant treasurer) to take up the vacancy. A Life Member and Vice President of the Association, Mr. Alby Walker was defeated at the election but has still continued to show his interest in Table Tennis by visiting Piangil on two occasions on our behalf, to ensure that this fledgling body is given every opportunity to flourish.

The Association's success on the Table at all levels is listed elsewhere in this report.

It would be remiss of me not to point out to members and those prospective members of this Executive Committee that when seeking office, that some research is made as to how the Executive Committee works. The clash of interests are not always anticipated prior to election, and often means a diluting of interests to suit the need of the position. However, given time to adjust the new responsibilities take on greater effort and enjoyment while serving Victorian registered players. Mrs Joan Guggenheim and Mr. Bob Grattidge were made Life Members of The Table Tennis Centre of Victoria in recognition of their services to Table Tennis.

EXTRAORDINARY BALLOT

Following an appeal by Mr. A. Walker and letters concerning the ballot for election of office-bearers and Executive Committee Members, the matter was referred to the Association's Legal Officer for advice.

The advice recommended an extraordinary ballot for the positions of Vice-President and Executive Committee.

As a result of an appeal by Mr. A.Walker and correspondence from Ballarat T.T.A., our Honorary Legal Officer, Mr. J.Kay, advised a new ballot for Vice-Presidents and Committee Members should be held and it should be a Postal Ballot.

The Executive Committee agreed (the newly-elected members did not vote on this issue but agreed verbally on the course of action).

The new ballot saw Mrs. Keyhoe and Mrs. Rosario elected as Vice-Presidents and Mrs. Holden, Mr. Tuckett and Mr. Woolcock elected as Committee Members. The position of Treasurer and two Committee vacancies were filled at a later date.

2.2 THE TABLE TENNIS CENTRE OF VICTORIA

As regular patrons of The Table Tennis Centre of Victoria will be well aware, the building is in desperate need of replacement. During the year, discussions and many meetings took place concerning the rebuilding of all four sporting complexes in the area. The most recent action is that the 1983 feasibility study is being up-dated and efforts are being made to solve the problem of the cost of the new Centres.

On a brighter note, revenue from the Table Tennis Centre showed a pleasing increase for the first time for several years.

No major repairs or renovations had to be done. However, electric hand-dryers and a new hot water service were welcome improvements. During the year many repair and improvement tasks were undertaken by Owen Davies and Ron Thomas. We extend our thanks to both men for doing a first-class job.

The Canteen continued to provide an excellent service to our patrons. Mr. Leon Lau and his staff are to be congratulated on the standard of service and quality of product, that continues to attract business from all of the other nearby sporting centres. The V.T.T.A. appreciates the work done by Leon.

2.4 INTERNATIONAL EVENTS

Australian teams competed in the Asian Championships in Shenzhen, China, and the Asian Junior Championships in Nagoya, Japan.

Australia conducted the 3rd Oceania Championships in Ballarat at the Ballarat Table Tennis Centre. At the conclusion of the Oceania Championships, Australia played Test matches versus New Zealand, at Geelong and Traralgon at their respective Table Tennis centres.

On an individual level, Tommy Danielsson as the Oceania Singles Champion, was chosen to represent the Oceania Zone in the World Cup in Port of Spain, Trinidad. Also on an individual basis, thirteen Australian players participated in the 3rd World Veterans Championships in Rimini, Italy.

The A T T A announced an inaugural Olympic Squad. The players in this squad are the ones most likely to represent Australia in the 1988 Olympic Games in Seoul, Korea. The players will be granted maximum subsidies as an incentive for rewarding performance.

2.4.4 AUSTRALIA v/s NEW ZEALAND TESTS

The first test played at Geelong resulted in a win to Australia by 6 sets to 3. This was a combined Mens and Womens match.

The next contest, which was played at Traralgon, consisted of separate Mens and Womens Test Matches. Both Australian Teams were successful. The Men won 3 sets to 2, whilst the Women won 4 sets to 1.

2.4.5 7TH WORLD CUP

Tommy Danielsson finished a very creditable 11th out of 16 players in the World Cup. He defeated the following World-ranked players:- Eric Boggan (U.S.A.) No.31, and Atanda Musa (Nigeria) No.54. He finished ahead of the following World-ranked players: Kim Ki Taek (Rep. of Korea) No.14 and Dragutin Surbek (Yugoslavia) No.33. This is the highest place achieved by an Australian player.

2.4.6 3RD WORLD VETERANS CHAMPIONSHIPS

Thirteen Australians competed in these Championships, which consisted of individual events.

Australian players won 3 bronze medals. This is indeed a tremendous achievement. A total of 1100 players competed in these Championships, some of them former World Champions.

2.5 COACHING

Coaching today has become an integral part of any sports program and Table Tennis in Victoria has made every effort in providing assistance in this area to all players from the beginner to the elite level.

Our Juniors have the opportunities to be coached at Albert Park and various other Metropolitan and Country Affiliated Associations. With the acquisition of a full-time Sports Promotion Officer, Primary and Secondary Schools are reaping the benefits of coaching more than at any time in the past.

2.5.1 COACHING FOR ALL

Adult coaching is made available two nights of the week for all grades of players.

Junior mass coaching is provided every Saturday afternoon throughout the year.

2.5.2 SQUADS AND TEAMS

Squads were named at the beginning of this year in the Under 13, Under 15 and Under 17 boys and girls age groups. Victoria has certainly reaped the benefits of all this long-term planning and hard work on the part of the players. This has been evident in the results achieved at Wagga in the Under 12 and Under 14, where we made a clean sweep of all events and also at the Australian Junior Championships held in Adelaide in 1986.

Squad and team training sessions have been under the Association Coach, Mr. I. Klaf.

2.5.3 CAMPS

There have been four Junior Camps this year and one Team Training Camp. Having had the players billeted out has proved to be a very satisfactory arrangement, as compared to a live-in camp at the Centre.

Two Junior Country Camps were also held. One at Hamilton by I. Klaf and R. Pappalardo and the other at Warrnambool by T. Danielsson, A. Rosario and T. Barr. Conducting these camps at country centres has helped to create a lot more interest in the game.

2.5.4 SCHOOLS

During 1986, once again there was a lot of time and money put into schools coaching with good results.

There were about 85 schools visited during the year from all over Victoria, including Warrnambool, Shepparton and Mount Beauty.

Our busiest days were normally on Wednesdays, as most schools have their sport on that day. This often called for 3 or 4 people to be used at the same time as coaches and for exhibitions.

Several schools had coaching on a regular basis and improvement in their players was noted.

Clubs need to be more aware that involvement with the Schools Programme creates an avenue for the students to enter into regular competitive Table Tennis.

2.5.5 THE COACHES ASSOCIATION

The Coaches Association has as its new President, Mr. T.Barr; Secretary, Mr. R.Pappalardo and Treasurer, Mr. O.Davies. All coaches for coaching sessions through the V.T.T.A. are drawn from members of the Coaches Association.

2.6 UMPIRES LEAGUE REPORT

Two rule changes will come into effect in Victoria from 1/1/87.
They are:-

1. Relating to advertising on clothing.
2. The other relates to towelling down during a game.

The only umpires course during 1986 was held at Croydon, and to date only one member passed - Mr. Barry Williams.

The Umpires League suffered a great loss with the death of Mr. Ron Chadband he was a member of the League for quite a number of years and he was also a Life Member - he will be sadly missed.

During 1986, Miss Ruth Singer refereed the Oceania Championships and travelled to Adelaide to referee the Senior National Championships. Mr. Ron Keyhoe refereed the Junior National Championships in Adelaide.

The League at the moment has 20 Financial Members and 4 Life Members.

2.9 NEW CENTRES

The current economic climate has seen a slow down in the development of additional centres in Victoria. The redevelopment of the Table Tennis Centre of Victoria, would appear to be sometime in the future.

6. EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR/SPORTS PROMOTION OFFICER

Following several discussions in the Executive Committee, Mr. Rod Lindroth was appointed as Executive Director of the V.T.T.A., effective from 18th April. The appointment was more than a change of name for Mr. Lindroth's previous position as Development Officer, as he now has responsibility for all the day-to-day administrative duties of the V.T.T.A. as well as liaison with the various Sport & Recreation Department's representatives.

Our staff, and hence our services, were further increased when the V.T.T.A. was offered a subsidy from the Department of Sport & Recreation to appoint a part-time Sports Promotion Officer. Mr. T. Danielsson was appointed to this position; this involved, in particular, the development of our sport at the Junior level. Later this position was upgraded by Sport & Recreation to a full-time appointment and, when Mr. Danielsson was unable to accept that position, Mr. A. Rosario was appointed. This appointment has enabled the V.T.T.A. to spread the sport to a large number of schools and community areas.

The V.T.T.A. is greatly indebted to the Department of Sport & Recreation for the subsidy towards the cost of these two important positions.

8. ADDENDUM

1986 will go down in the V.T.T.A's history as one in which substantial changes occurred in the administration of our sport. As has been reported elsewhere, the Committee appointed both a full-time Executive Director and a Sports Promotion Officer. These appointments brought about a great change in the day-to-day operations of the Association and have meant modifications in the roles of some office-bearers, particularly those of the Honorary Secretary and the President.

As recorded elsewhere in this report, the Association suffered a grievous loss when our Treasurer, Mr. Eric Leder, died just prior to the Annual General Meeting. Eric served the V.T.T.A. for many years, the last 25 being as Honorary Treasurer, and his hard work and integrity became legend among those who served with him. We have been fortunate to regain the services of a previous Assistant Treasurer, Mr. John Beer, who offered to fill the position as Treasurer.

The elections for several positions on the Executive Committee saw the hardest fought election campaign since the infamous split of 1961. We also witnessed the unfortunate situation where a further ballot had to be conducted for some of the positions. As a result of the elections, long-serving Vice-President, Mr. A. Walker, lost his position on the Committee. Alby's considerable experience and approach to Table Tennis matters will be missed and we thank him for the many years of service to the Association.

As a result of the elections and other resignations during the year, the Executive has a distinctly new look about it and we look forward to the new members serving the Association in several areas. I am sure that they will find their duties can be quite demanding, but the rewards in making Table Tennis progress can be great.

The long-running saga of redevelopment of the four sports centres continued to run into obstacles, due to both financial reasons and Government inaction. At the time of writing this report, two enquiries were in progress to try and determine what, if any, action would be taken by the State Government. It surely must be time when the Government realized that the Sporting Centres at Albert Park should be regarded as having great community value and that they should be funded accordingly.

Congratulations must again go to those players and officials who represented the State at various National and International events. These people make great sacrifices to keep Victoria at the fore-front of Australian Table Tennis and deserve all the success they gain.

Again I wish to thank all those members of the Association for their support in 1986.
