#### 24th ANNUAL REPORT.

To be presented to the Annual General Meeting of the Association to be held at M.S.M.A. Elizabeth Street Melbourne on 31st March, 1954 at 8 p.m.

Ladies and Gentlemen,

The following is a report of the work undertaken by your Association for the season 1953.

Features of the season were the appearances of Diana and Rosalind Rowe, former Women's Doubles World Champions and popularly known as the "Rowe Twins".

This was arranged in conjunction with the A.T.T.A. and all proceeds of their matches played in Melbourne were donated to the Queen Victoria Hospital Building Appeal, this included proceeds from a test match, England v Australia played at Wirth's Olympia on Tuesday 28th July, 1953.

This was the first womens test match ever to be played in Australia and Dora Beregi (N.S.W.) Australian Champion and Aldona Snarkyte, South Australian champion were chosen by the A.T.T.A. selectors to represent Australia, and although defeated by England, put up a very creditable performance.

The Rowe twins also played with our affiliated Associations at Geelong, Hamilton and Warrnambool.

Our thanks are recorded to these girls for the good publicity they accorded the game whilst here. They were champions in every sense of the word, both on and off the court, their charming gracefulness and obvious sincerity won the generous applause of all.

#### PENNANT COMPETITIONS:

The pennant competition this year was notable for many outstanding items, it was a record entry of teams, 222 teams competed in 28 grades (23 men 5 women), standard of play was particularly high and most clubs, even when at times they found it extremely hard to carry on, were united in their endeavours to always field a side and not give forfeits for any match, this in itself speaks well for the spirit in which the game is played and made for a most successful season. It was also most impressive to see the various clubs wearing neat uniform dress, complete with their particular club badge on shirt.

Facilities for playing were much improved and Mr. Bill Harratt our Match Supervisor was again at the disposal of clubs for advice regarding playing conditions.

It is regretted that once again it was found necessary to penalize a number of clubs for various breaches of Match Regulations particularly late results, and it is requested that all club secretaries and players become more conversant with these Regulations, they are obtainable from all Sports Stores, or in the case of Affiliated Associations direct from the V.T.T.A.

All Clubs should realize that these Match Regulations are formed purely and solely to protect the interests of the game in general and every individual club in particular.

Relevant to this was an occurrence that happened in the Semi-final of C. Grade, Section 1 between Coburg Harriers and Royal South Yarra Clubs.

Coburg Harriers Club were found guilty of having played a member of their C.l. team under an assumed name, they were severely reprimanded and fined £5.

- G. Benzil who played under the assumed name was suspended for 6 months.
- R. Pearce, Captain, for signing the score sheet was also suspended for 6 months.

The match which was originally won by Coburg Harriers was taken from them and awarded to Royal South Yarra Club.
