51st ANNUAL REPORT - 1980

1. INTRODUCTION

Once again we have come to the end of another year of table tennis, and it is time to review and report on 1980 happenings.

Following the most strongly contested election for five years, your Executive Committee continued to handle effectively the day-to-day running of table tennis in this State, as well as seeing that we bring our sport to the general public which, we hope, will be attracted to play in pennant competition at Albert Park, or in local Associations. More particularly there is the need to introduce table tennis into the schools sports programs; to this end a number of schools have benefited by our subsidy towards the cost of purchasing a table. These school programs are also essential to bring younger players to the attention of our coaches, to swell the ranks of our junior players.

Other areas of administration which make demands on members of the Executive Committee include tournaments, getting teams to the various National Titles and organising overseas trips and visits, and seeing that we present our best players with opportunities for top-class competition.

The National Titles held in Tasmania for 1980 saw Victoria's 1979 Australian Champions, Bob Tuckett and Kerry Thompson, unable to retain their titles. However, with Kerry ranked No.1 and Bob No.2 in Australia, we are still maintaining our position as the top table tennis State. In the Teams we gained much ground by taking all four groups - Mens, Womens, Junior Boys and Girls - for the 'grand slam'.

A visit to Melbourne by a brilliant young Chinese team was an exceptional highlight for 1980. Many of the people who support Table Tennis witnessed the outstanding skill of these players. Aided by sponsorship provided by G.J.Coles & Coy.Limited, the visit was also a financial success. Special guests included the Hon.Brian Dixon, Minister for Youth, Sport and Recreation, representatives of the Chinese Diplomatic Staff, Department of Home Affairs, Canberra, and G.J.Coles & Coy.Limited, as well as many of our former officials and players.

The finals of the Samboy National Under 15 Championships were held in Adelaide for 1980. Victoria retained the Girls title, with Nadia Bisiach winning, but lost the Boys with Lyall Johnson losing to Gary Haberl of NSW. Victoria won the Westfield aggregate trophy for the third year on end.

Winter Pennant this year saw the re-introduction of Women's Pennant after a break of six years. The response by women players was most encouraging, after an attempt a couple of years ago to recommence had brought a very small entry. Two-player teams were entered to even out grading. However 1981 season will probably return to three-player teams with six teams per grade, and three rounds being played. This is again an attempt to make grading more even and thus matches more interesting.

A pleasing conclusion to this Pennant year was the award of Pennant Player of the Year to our promising young Nadia Bisiach, the first time that a woman player has received this award.

Table Tennis in Victoria is, as in many past years, indebted to the Department of Youth, Sport and Recreation for its annual grants to sporting associations. Our grant for 80/81 was \$15500, a slight increase on last year. This amount with the major portion of \$9000 towards the salary of our Development Officer, will be disbursed for various coaching and promotional programs put forward by a number of Affiliated Associations and Clubs.

Coaching has as always been considered as a major part of our sport, and your Executive Committee has engaged Mr. Igor Klaf as 'Association Coach' on a regular part-time basis. There are several other top-line coaches who are heavily involved in the official coaching programs conducted by the VTTA and the benefits of their efforts are shown by the improvement seen in many of our younger players.

The Ansett Tournament for 1980 suffered delays, being played in November, a later time-slot which caused some withdrawals from the best field that should have been available. Ann Middleton (South Australia) won the Women's and Paul Pinkewich (New South Wales) the Men's section.

We can also report with pleasure that again women are to the fore, with Kerry Thompson winning our own coveted French Award. Kerry, Nadia Bisiach and Mary LeGassick were also considered, though without success, for monthly awards presented by the Australian Sportswomen's Association (Victorian Division) for Australian Sportswoman of the Year.

2. MANAGEMENT

2.1 EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE

Following the retirement of Dr. Wal Savage at 31st December 1979, Dr. Bayly was elected from the Executive Committee to fill this position.

Vic Dye who had filled an earlier casual vacancy, Len Haycraft and Peter Mascall retired in accordance with the Constitution. There was also an extra committee position to be filled due to Mr. Fred Walsh, who had also filled a casual vacancy, not seeking re-election.

At the 1980 A.G.M. the elections were contested by a number of interested people from table tennis - Val Gay (Geelong), Prisca Rosario (Diamond Valley), Frank Brunt (Western Suburbs), Kevin Langridge (Croydon) and Peter Ward, a former Committeeman. All were nominated for positions on the Executive Committee, eight people in all from which five would be elected.

The position of President was contested between Ron Bayly and Alby Walker, with Dr. Bayly being elected for the following three years. Alby Walker was elected un-opposed as Vice-President.

The ballot for committee positions resulted in the following candidates being elected:- Val Gay, Vic Dye and Prisca Rosario for 3 year terms, with Len Haycraft and Peter Mascall being elected for one year.

From 1st November, 1979, to 31st October, 1980 the Executive Committee met on 15 occasions, plus four adjourned meetings. The attendances, not including adjourned meetings, were as follows:

2.2 TABLE TENNIS CENTRE OF VICTORIA

For the first time in many years there was a definite decline in usage of the Centre in the non-pennant periods. While the reasons for this decline have not been established definitely, it is probable that the success of centres in other areas is a major reason.

As the revenue from the Centre is by far the most significant factor in the VTTA's ability to further the sport throughout the State, any decline is worrying and the Centre and Finance Sub-committees are seeking ways to reverse the trend.

During the year the management of the snack bar changed from Maureen and Roy Melsom to Leon Lau. The VTTA appreciates the excellent service the Melsoms gave over their four years of tenancy and hope that the Lau family will be equally well-supported by our patrons.

Office equipment was further upgraded during the year with the purchase of a new cash register and an off-set duplicator, and our facilities in the office are now excellent.

The installation of the security arrangements appears to have been successful in alleviating the spate of break-ins that occurred in the previous year.

2.2.1 BUILDING

As reported last year a feasibility study on improvements to the Centre was commissioned and this report is now to hand. It details how the playing, spectator and administrative areas could be up-dated to give better service to all, and the Executive Committee is still considering what aspects of the report can be implemented. Before large sums are expended it is considered that the VTTA should obtain a long-term lease of the Centre and an application for such a lease is now with the State Government.

The re-painting of the playing courts was completed and new seating provided in most court areas. A further fifteen new tables were obtained and the playing facilities are now the best that they have been since the Centre opened.

2.2.2 STAFF

Mrs. Joan Guggenheim once again led our office staff while continuing to give increased time and effort to her role as Development Officer. Kerrie Freeman and our part-time staff, Judy and Diane, continue to give good service in the multitude of tasks that flow into the office.

2.2.3 RECEPTIONISTS

There were several changes in this area during the year and we now have a fairly stable staff who have given service to our patrons in a pleasant and efficient manner.

2.2.4 ALBERT PARK COMMITTEE OF MANAGEMENT

With the complete maintenance of the Centre now being the responsibility of the VTTA our calls on the Chairman, Mr. R. J. Kenelly and the Secretary, Mr. R. Burke have become less frequent. However they have given their support to our request for a long-term lease of the Centre and we thank them for their support.

2.3 NEW CENTRES

During the past year, the VTTA has been involved in various aspects concerning the establishment of new table tennis facilities throughout Victoria and including inquiries from Queensland and Enfield, South Australia.

An in-depth kit is available for presentation to governmental departments showing the most desirable recommendations for a successful operation with considerations to quality of lighting, floor requirements, size of courts, back-up facilities like Control Centre, storage space and suitable equipment to make the new facilities a success at the most economical price.

2.3.1 MILLER ROPE WORKS, BRUNSWICK

Investigations are continuing into the possibility of opening this Centre some time in 1981.

2.3.2 LARA

A presentation is being prepared for Corio and State Government financial consideration in late 1981 or early 1982.

2.3.3 OTHER CENTRES

Various stages of investigation during the past year have been given by the VTTA to members and associations involved with Bundoora Industrial Park, Kilsyth Centre, Bellarine Shire, Queenscliff multi-sporting complex.

2.4 AFFILIATED ASSOCIATIONS

In 1980 there were 56 country associations and 17 metropolitan associations affiliated, a total of 73, the same as last year.

New affiliations were Daylesford and Wycheproof, with Benalla and Mount Beauty re-affiliating after years of absence. Ararat, Churchill, SEC Social League and the Victorian Blind TTA's did not affiliate this year. Mt. Gambier affiliated with both South Australia and Victoria.

Several new associations were formed during the year and many of them are expected to affiliate in 1981. They include Seymour, Heywood, Ballan, Learmonth, Smythesdale and Mt. Wallace.

Great work is being done in country districts by VTTA district representatives in promoting table tennis and increasing affiliations in their districts.

The number of registered players in Victoria was 10,246 seniors and 10,788 juniors in 1980, a total of 21,034, an increase of 2,500 in a year. Nearly every affiliated association reported an increase.

2.5 PROMOTION

Mrs. Guggenheim, as Development Officer, kept the Committee informed of her progress particularly with visits to schools.

A film was purchased in U.K. at a cost of \$306; this film is entitled 'Table Tennis Techniques' and is reported to be excellent for school viewing.

Following a request from the VTTA Executive regarding a new slogan, Mr. J. Williams suggested the slogan 'Ping Pong is Table Tennis'. This was subsequently adopted by the VTTA, and an order was placed for 1000 buttons at a cost of \$229.

Mr. Williams also presented suggestions for a float featuring 'Ping and Pong' in the 1981 Moomba Procession and for a marquee in the Alexandra Gardens during the period of 'Moomba'. The Committee is endeavouring to obtain sponsorship for both these promotions.

Statistics available on equipment sales show that these have increased substantially in Victoria over recent years, but there has not been a corresponding increase in the number of players competing in the VTAA and affiliated associations. This Committee is endeavouring to do something to obtain more players at the 'grass roots' level and asks for the support of everyone interested in the development of table tennis.

2.6 PUBLICITY

The Publicity Committee hosted a Media luncheon at William's Grand Palace in April, at which there was a large attendance of Press, Radio and Television journalists. The Committee considers that such a function should be held at least once each year.

Publicity coverage in the early part of the year was reasonable and was excellent during the Chinese Tour. However, publication of results fell away later in the year due in some cases to late finishes, and in others to lack of personnel. It is recommended that this Committee should be strengthened, and should include several members who are prepared to attend pennant matches regularly and also minor tournaments.

2.6.1 CHINESE TOUR

On 6th August 1979, the Australian TTA wrote to the Table Tennis Association of the Peoples' Republic of China urging that they include matches in Australia in a proposed tour of New Zealand in the months of May/June 1980.

Subsequently, our Department of Foreign Affairs in Canberra advised that under the Cultural Exchange program agreed between the two countries, a visit by a Chinese Table Tennis team would be included in the 1979/80 financial year.

Following correspondence regarding the itinerary, the Chinese Association advised that, because of heavy commitments of their players, the appearances in Australia would be limited to matches in Sydney en route to New Zealand and in Melbourne on the return trip.

The Chinese team arrived in Sydney on 20th May and left for New Zealand on the 25th. Their team defeated Australia in an International Match 6/1, and their players won two Invitation Tournaments played in the Sydney Town Hall.

The team then went to New Zealand where in 8 appearances, they did not lose a rubber, in fact they lost one game only on this section of their tour.

The team, under the distinguished leadership of the 1973 World Champion, Xi Enting, arrived at Tullamarine on Tuesday, 10th June and was welcomed at a brief reception hosted by Ansett Airlines. That evening they attended a reception given in North Melbourne by the Federation of Chinese Clubs and were given a rousing reception by the several hundred members present.

On Wednesday, 11th June, the Victorian branch of the Australia-China Society hosted a reception at the Zoological Gardens, and this was followed by a reception given by the Government of Victoria at which gifts were exchanged. The Acting Premier of Victoria, Mr. Lindsay Thompson, warmly welcomed our guests, and expressed the hope that the next visit by a Chinese team would not be 8 years away.

An International Match was played at the Basketball Stadium on 12th June and this was video-taped by the A.B.C. Unfortunately, the visitors proved far too strong for our players and won by 8 matches to nil. However, an exhibition mixed doubles brought the house down and sent the spectators home satisfied.

The stadium was fairly well packed, but it was disappointing that more of our players did not take the opportunity to learn from the Chinese.

On Friday, 13th June, the Coles Invitation Tournaments for Men and Women, with total prize money of \$1100, equally divided, were played at the Table Tennis Centre.

The Centre Court was packed for the final matches, which were won by Fan Changmao and Li Chunli. All Australian players were easily defeated in the first round except Kerry Thompson who won one game in the semi final against the ultimate runner-up, Tian Yujing.

The umpiring of the matches was first class and the presentation over the two nights excellent, with the only failure being the playing of the Chinese National Anthem. The Chinese players and officials were co-operative at all times, and their visit, although brief, has given an undoubted fillip to table tennis in Victoria.

Our thanks must go to our sponsors, G.J.Coles & Coy.Limited and to all who assisted, particularly to Mr.S.Williams who gave up his week to drive the visitors to each of their functions.

2.7 COACHING

1980 was a busy year of coaching activities throughout Victoria, and a pleasing feature was the number of visits to country associations.

The appointment of Mr.Igor Klaf has filled a gap which enables us to start visiting schools once again. We must look to taking table tennis into the schools, not only in the metropolitan area, but into country schools. All country associations should make efforts to obtain an opportunity for table tennis in local schools.

The Executive Committee can assist all associations when approached, but the initial drive must come from local associations. The Coaching Chairman has recently asked for all Affiliated Associations to consider appointing a Coaching Co-ordinator, who could undertake the single role of developing coaching programs. It is hoped that the suggestion will receive serious consideration by both large and small associations.

For 1981 we have instituted a program of 'Regional Coaching Weekends' and the following associations have already supported the proposition and reserved at least two weekends for their area:- Ballarat and Shepparton started off the scheme in November 1980, and Horsham, Hamilton, Warrnambool and Traralgon are in line for visits. It is anticipated that Yarrawonga and Geelong will join at a later date. Each of these associations will contact the smaller table tennis associations in their area and invite them to participate by sending junior players, seniors and persons interested in learning coaching techniques and programs. Through this program, it is our aim to reach these players who are unable to get to Melbourne on a regular basis, but by taking coaches to them, the overall standard of country table tennis will be boosted.

A new innovation for State team players was a live-in weekend at the Geelong Centre for the Under 14 and Under 16 teams, along with the coaches, Igor Klaf and John Williams. We must thank all those people in Geelong, who provided the catering services, billeting and accommodation for the Coaches. The camp was a successful venture and the excellent results achieved at the National Subjunior titles reflected the efforts of all concerned.

The junior camp conducted at Albert Park over the January holidays has been referred to separately.

State practice squads have been conducted regularly throughout the year and squads for those players on the fringe of making the top level have made a significant improvement on many promising players.

The usual Saturday afternoon coaching open to the public has continued to offer the opportunity for beginners and more advanced players to receive regular coaching at a modest fee, under first class guidance. A feature of this particular program is the influx of 'mini players', namely the five to nine year olds. This is something quite new, and is being taken very seriously. It is most important that we look at this group in a new light, and ensure that they are enjoying the 'play and learn' process.

The regular Sunday morning program held at the Table Tennis Centre continues to prosper and a new group recently commenced on Friday nights has built up into a significant source of activity under Mr.Klaf.

The Table Tennis Coaches Association of Victoria continues to work smoothly with the VTTA Coaching Committee by making available its members for all our programs, and developing a pool of coaches which will slowly move through the various levels of the National Coaching Scheme.

The arrival of Mr.Mike Johns, as the new Australian Director of Coaching, will see Victoria regularly obtain the latest news of overseas techniques. We welcome Mike, and look forward to frequent contact with him, both through seminars and camps.

It would be remiss not to thank the previous N.D.C., Mr.Eric Coster, for his association with Victoria's coaching scheme. Eric had the onerous task of establishing the National Coaching Program and the development of the Acton Proficiency Awards Scheme. We wish Eric well in his new venture.

It must be emphasised that the coaching programs are available for all those who wish to participate in them. The cost per player is modest, but it all depends on table tennis officials so that these programs are brought to the attention of players.

The Department of Youth, Sport & Recreation has once again provided invaluable funds to assist those associations who applied for assistance. Naturally, only a portion of the amount applied for is made available. It is always a source of amazement that all associations do not apply for some funding. Each year associations are circularised well in advance but only a small number ever make the effort to send in a request for a grant. It is becoming obvious that some associations will continue to improve while others stand still, because planning for the future is not undertaken. The people who are affected most are the young players of the future, particularly country players.

Earlier in the year we had the services of Munihara Yasu, who was in Australia by courtesy of the Armstrong Co. and the Japan-Australia Foundation. This young coach created a big impression while teaching the Victorian players.

The visiting Chinese team had a brief session with selected schools at the Table Tennis Centre.

2.7.1 NATIONAL COACHING COMMITTEE

The newly reorganised coaching arm of the ATTA is composed of one coaching co-ordinator from each state under the chairmanship of the National Director of Coaching.

The National Coaching Forum was held from Friday 11th January to Sunday 13th January 1980, at the Table Tennis Centre of Victoria.

Mr. Eric Coster (NDC), Mrs. Joy Brown (NSW), Messrs. Jim Bond (QLD), Bill Oatey (SA), Neil Kerrison (TAS), Mike Andrews (WA) and Peter Mascall (VIC) made up the 1980 committee.

Matters discussed included the ATTA National Coaching Award Scheme, Confederation of Australian Sport Coaches Assembly, Acton Proficiency Awards, States' usage of the National Director of Coaching, Coaching opportunities overseas, interchange of Coaches between States, National Coaching Seminar, Coaching Awards, National Junior Training Camp, 1981 National Coaching Forum and preparing the 1980/81 Coaching Budget.

Special emphasis was placed on the development of the National Coaching Scheme to widen the grass-roots base of coaching, and the encouragement of coaches to progress from Level 1 through to higher levels, up to Level 4, (State Coach - now State Diploma Coach), and on to National Diploma Coaches Level 1 and Level 2.

Associations, clubs and teams should develop skills through the Acton Proficiency Award Scheme at bronze, silver or gold badge level. The special schools (white) Award is proving very popular.

2.8 TRAINING CAMPS

2.8.1 VICTORIAN JUNIOR CAMP

A Victorian junior training camp was conducted at the Table Tennis Centre of Victoria from Monday 21st to Friday 25th January, 1980.

A total of 34 players attended, under the guidance of Mr. Igor Klaf, the Association coach, assisted by Mrs. Prisca Rosario, John Williams and Greg Thomas. It was good to see country players attending as well as metropolitan association players.

Many country associations still fail to encourage junior talent within their associations, and attending a training camp would boost the interest and standard of young players.

2.8.2 NATIONAL JUNIOR TRAINING CAMP

The National Junior Training Camp was conducted by the National Director of Coaching, Mr. Eric Coster, at the Table Tennis Centre of Victoria from Saturday 12th, to Sunday 20th January, 1980.

A total of 32 players from all States and five coaches attended this camp. Thirteen Victorian players were included. The coaches were Mr. Igor Klaf, Mrs. Prisca Rosario (VIC), Mr. Brenton Buckby (SA), Mr. Martin McGrevy (NSW) and Mr. Muniyara Yasu (Japan).

The course included video-replays of all players, films, physical training and plenty of practice. Eight of the players were members of the highly successful Victorian Under 16 boys and girls teams.

The 1981 camp is planned to be conducted by the NSW TTA.

2.9 COACHES ASSOCIATION

The Table Tennis Coaches Association of Victoria has been operating since June 1978. From its membership of 23 in 1978, the numbers have swelled to 46. There are 109 Registered Coaches of whom one is National Coach 2 Star, three are National Coaches 2 Star, six are Level 4 State Diploma Coaches, four are Level 3 Regional Coaches, three are Level 2 Club or District Coaches, and 92 are Level 1 Student Coaches.

During the year the Association has conducted two Level 1 courses and two Level 2 courses. 27 players did the Level 1 and 12 the Level 2 course.

The cost of conducting these courses has been recovered from fees charged and a subsidy from the Department of Youth, Sport and Recreation. Coaches are involved in all levels of coaching in the Metropolitan and Country areas.

The TTCAV endeavours to give coaches every opportunity to improve their coaching capabilities by offering seminars and lectures. One such lecture was given by a Physical Education expert.

The CASCA Seminar was, unfortunately, attended by only one member. However, seven of our members have been accredited with the Sports Coaches Education General course, Level 2, conducted by Y.S. & R. and six of our members are qualified to use Video-Taping equipment.

The TTCAV thanks the VTТА for the support given and hopes that it will continue to do so especially in regard towards financial assistance for equipment which is an important facet of coaching today.

2.10 UMPIRES LEAGUE

The Victorian Table Tennis Umpires League has enjoyed yet another very busy year. It has provided referees for VTТА Winter, Spring and Summer pennant on Tuesday and Wednesday nights, and also on Thursday nights Winter and Spring during the finals.

It has also provided referees and umpires for all VTТА-conducted Championships and tournaments as well as most of the Victorian Affiliated Associations Open Tournaments.

The Ansett Tournament of Champions was again held in Victoria this year at the Table Tennis Centre of Victoria. Referee was Mr. P. Ward. The VTТUL also provided the umpires.

The Chinese National team played two matches in Melbourne, a Test Match at the Albert Park Basketball Stadium and an International Tournament at the Table Tennis Centre of Victoria. Referee was Mr. Clive Gadd. The VTТUL also provided umpires, also several interstate umpires officiated.

The 12th National Subjunior Championships were conducted by the Geelong TTA in conjunction with the VTТА at the Geelong Table Tennis Centre. Referee was Mrs.V.Gay. Deputy Referees were Mr.R.Rowe and Mr.K.Allen. The VTTUL also provided the umpires.

Mr.C.Gadd was again appointed as Chairman of the ATTA Umpires Committee.

The following umpires qualified as probationary State Umpires:-

Miss S.Johnson, Miss P.Rowe, Mr.R.Keyhoe, Mr.R.Campisi, Mr.R.Thomas.
Dr.R.Godfrey qualified as a full-status State umpire.

Also pleasing to report is that Miss Ruth Singer, the VTTUL hard working Hon.Secretary passed her International Umpire's test, conducted by the ITTF thus becoming Australia's first woman international umpire, and the sixth International Umpire in Australia.

A course for prospective umpires was conducted early in the year by Mr.Peter Ward.

Mr.Ron Chadband was honoured by the VTТА with a Life Membership of the Table Tennis Centre of Victoria for his services to table tennis over the years as Referee, Umpire and currently the State Examiner and Umpires' Coach.

Obituary: We regret to report the passing away of one of our stalwarts, National Umpire, Mr.W.Harratt.

The VTTUL held several informative meetings during the year and had another excellent Christmas break-up at the Victoria Hotel, Albert Park.

2.11 FINANCE

2.11.1 STATE GOVERNMENT GRANTS

The VTТА was again the recipient of a grant from the Department of Youth, Sport and Recreation. \$15,500 was received to assist in many facets of the Association's activities. These include the salary of the Development Officer, coaching at the Centre, in affiliated associations and schools, training of coaches and assistance for travel of Victorian State Teams.

This year more affiliated associations applied for grants and as the allocation was increased only slightly from 1979, it has meant that the allocations for some groups was below that of 1979.

It was particularly gratifying to find that the VTТА grant was increased (although slightly) at a time when the Department of Youth,Sport and Recreation had to fund several more bodies in 1980 from a total fund which showed almost no increase on the previous year.

2.12 AUSTRALIAN TABLE TENNIS ASSOCIATION

2.12.1 FINANCIAL

The Treasurer reported a surplus of \$3928 for the year 1979-80, due primarily to financial assistance from the Commonwealth Government, the Australia-Japan Foundation, Rothmans National Sports Foundation and a successful tour by a Chinese team.

The ATTA's financial position increased from an overall deficit of \$678 last year to a credit of \$3254.

2.12.2 PROCEDURAL CHANGES

The most important change was in the Australian Championships. From 1981 there will be an Australian Open Championships with mens and womens team and individual events, but no junior events. Under 21 mens and womens singles will be played at this tournament.

Replacing the former Australian Subjunior Championships will be the Australian Junior Championships with boys and girls team and individual titles in under 17 and under 15 age groups, replacing the former under 18, under 16 and under 14 categories.

2.12.3 NATIONAL DIRECTOR OF COACHING

The former N.D.C., Mr. Eric Coster, resigned as from March 31, 1980 to enter business on his own behalf.

Council advertised for a replacement and appointed Mr. Mike Johns, former English international and an experienced coach.

Mr. Johns arrived in Australia on July 1st and is now based in Melbourne.

2.12.4 BALL APPROVALS

The following balls were approved for competition within Australia:-

Nittaku 3X white and colour and 2X white, TSP Astoll 3X white and yellow, Hallex 3X white and yellow, Barna 3 crown white, Yasaka 3 star white.

2.12.5 OTHER NEWS

Two new trophies were donated for the Australian Championships. They were the Suzy Javor Cup for womens doubles (donated by Victoria), and the Laurie Wharmby Cup for mixed doubles (donated by the Southern Tasmanian TTA).

The number of registered players in Australia increased to 17,586 seniors and 11,774 juniors, a total of 29,360 which is an increase of around 3000 on last year. Victoria has 71 per cent of these players.

Mr. A.W. Cleaves was honored with a Life Membership of the ATTA for services to national table tennis.

2.12.6 COUNCIL

3.1.4 PENNANT PLAYER OF THE YEAR

The winner of this year's award is Nadia Bisiach of the Coburg Table Tennis Club. Nadia is the first woman to achieve this honour. Each year this award is made by the Pennant Subcommittee to a pennant player who, by his or her actions, sets the best example for others to follow and is the most outstanding in the following attributes; improvement, appearance, dedication, sportsmanship, enthusiasm and team spirit.

Nadia is the current Victorian Junior Champion, has shown tremendous improvement over the last twelve months, and is a worthy winner of this award.

3.2 VICTORIAN OPEN CHAMPIONSHIPS

The 52nd Victorian Open Championships were held at the Table Tennis Centre of Victoria on Sunday, 29th June and from Tuesday 1st July, to Thursday 3rd July, 1980.

This year's Championships were generously sponsored by Berri Fruit Juices Pty.Ltd. who provided \$1000 cash, plus drinks for the competitors.

Total prize money was a record \$1672.50. Last year's total prize money was \$1060.

The VTTA invited four top interstate players to compete by providing them with return air fares and free entry to the Championships.

Only two players accepted, Paul Pinkewich (NSW) and Neil Ward (SA). Mrs. Ann Middleton (SA) and Miss Denise Millikan (Tas) were unable to accept.

Paul Pinkewich won his fourth Mens Singles title by defeating Bob Tuckett in the final. Semi-finalists were Robbie Javor and Rodney Carlyle.

Mary LeGassick won her sixth Womens Singles title by defeating Adele Morrow in the final. Semi-finalists were Australian Champion, Kerry Thompson, and Wendy Hughes.

3.4 COUNTRY EVENTS

3.4.1 VICTORIAN COUNTRY CHAMPIONSHIPS

The 29th Annual Country Championships were held over the Queen's Birthday weekend June 14-16th at the Table Tennis Centre of Victoria and the adjacent High School gymnasium and canteen area in the Badminton Centre, a total of 49 tables being used.

It was possible to play the Championships on fewer tables by cutting out one mens and one womens grade and condensing all but the three highest mens grades into ten teams per grade, with a bye in each section of five. Having all play at Albert Park increased the friendly 'reunion' atmosphere. There were 88 mens team entries and 26 womens, a total of 114, three fewer than last year. This was largely due to the absence of Mt.Gambier which entered last year with four teams but was playing in Adelaide Country Championships at the same weekend this year.

Sponsors were the 'Herald and Weekly Times' for the twelfth year, APD Snack Foods Pty.Ltd. (marketers of 'Snack' potato chips) and Acton Pty.Ltd., distributors in Victoria of the TSP Astoll balls used in the tournament.

The ANZ Bank provided a splendid floral display in the foyer of the Table Tennis Centre for the Championships.

Entries in individual events were lower than last year. There is a demand for more junior events, but not time in which to conduct them.

Geelong men retained the 'Atlas Shield' for mens A grade teams for the tenth successive year, but were closely pressed by a composite Horsham side. Geelong was awarded the 'Snack Trophy' for this victory, a silver dish donated by APD Snack Foods Pty.Ltd.

Denise Millikan became the darling of Tasmania when she won the womens singles, thus becoming the first Tasmanian to win a National singles title. She defeated Pam Whitehouse (Qld) in the final. Losing semi-finalists were Kerry Thompson and Mary LeGassick.

Gary Haberl (NSW) narrowly defeated Barry Griffiths (New Zealand) in the junior boys singles final. Losing semi-finalists were Robert Rockefeller and Kevin Malyschko (SA).

Pam Whitehouse (Qld) recorded her third title in successive years in defeating Adele Morrow in the junior girls singles final. Losing semi-finalists were Shelley Munday and Lynette Buckby (SA). Victorian players fared better in the doubles with Robbie Javor and Warren Vickery (NSW) easily retaining their mens doubles title. Runners-up were Bob Tuckett and Paul Pinkewich (NSW). Kerry Thompson and Ann Middleton (SA) won their third womens doubles, and Robbie Javor and Kerry Thompson won the mixed doubles.

5.5 CHAMPIONSHIPS IN OTHER STATES

Victorian players took part in tournaments in other States but without success.

Rodney Carlyle played in the Queensland Open, losing in a semi-final to Neil Ward (SA), who lost in the final to Paul Pinkewich (NSW).

Rodney also competed in the Whyalla Open (SA), again losing to Neil Ward, this time in the final.

Glenn Tepper also lost to Ward in the final of the South Australian Open.

Adele Morrow played in the Tasmanian Open but lost in the semi-final to Loretta Bonham who was runner-up to Denise Millikan.

5.6 ANSETT TOURNAMENT OF CHAMPIONS

The fifth Ansett Tournament of Champions was conducted at Albert Park by the Victorian Table Tennis Association on behalf of the Australian TTA on Saturday-Sunday, 15th and 16th November 1980.

Ansett Airlines of Australia again provided air transport for interstate competitors and to the two winners a double-voucher to an adjoining state.

As recommended in 1978 by the National Selectors, the ATTA agreed to make the field the top eight available men and top eight available women in Australia. However, in the men's field Bob Tuckett (overseas) and Robbie Javor were unavailable and Neil Ward (SA) withdrew due to university exams, being replaced by Warren Park, after Robert Rockefeller declined.

In the women's field, Pam Whitehouse (Qld) withdrew at the last minute and as no other ranked player was available, Shelley Munday (Vic) was added.

Winners were Paul Pinkewich (NSW) and Ann Middleton (SA).

Hot and humid conditions made play difficult. Yasaka white balls, provided by International Table Tennis, Sydney, were used in the tournament.

5.7 SAMBOY NATIONAL UNDER 15 CHAMPIONSHIPS

The third 'Samboy' National Under 15 Championships sponsored by APD Snack Foods, marketers of 'Samboy' potato chips, embodied several changes; tournaments were conducted at three levels, novice, State unranked, and State ranked, with winners of the lower levels feeding into the next level; host State for Nationals paid to provide YMCA-type accommodation for visiting teams and managers. Queensland, West Australia and New South Wales had intra-state travel subsidised.

Overall in Australia the entry was greatly increased (1500 total). In Victoria the total entries were 500 against 100 last year, with Level 1 tournaments at 16 centres, Level 2 at seven centres and State finals at Albert Park concluding at Doncaster Shopping town. Publicity gained was much better this year, the promotion by Mornington Peninsula TTA at Karingal Hub Shopping Centre being outstanding.

Unfortunately some of the largest affiliated associations virtually ignored this opportunity to bring new young players into table tennis.

State winners were Karl McKernan and Nadia Bisiach, runners-up Lyall Johnson and Wendy Hughes also going into the National finals at Westfield Shopping Centre, Marion, Adelaide. Teams stayed at Norfolk Motor Inn, Glenelg. The Victorian team was managed by Mrs.B.Hughes of Geelong.

All Victorian contestants reached the play-off stage. The boys' National champion was Gary Haberl, of New South Wales, who beat Karl McKernan 2/- in a semifinal and Lyall Johnson 2/- in the final.

In the girls' play-offs, Wendy Hughes lost 0-2 to Kerry Walsh (WA) in one semifinal. Nadia Bisiach beat Sue Magarry (Qld) 2/1 in the other semifinal and won the National final 2/- from Kerry Walsh.

Victoria easily retained the Westfield Trophy for the highest aggregate of points gained in the National round-robin stage.

7. ADMINISTRATION REVIEW

This sub-committee was revived as a result of a resolution passed at the 1980 Annual General Meeting that instructed the Executive Committee to give urgent consideration to the formation of an affiliated association to conduct the present metropolitan pennants.

All clubs and associations were circularised to ascertain their attitude to this proposition. Based on voting entitlements at the 1980 AGM 87.9% of those who replied were in favour of the proposition.

A meeting was held with the largest clubs, which favoured creation of a new association.

Details have still to be worked out and approved by the VTTA Executive Committee.

8. IN APPRECIATION

As usual at the end of any year, there are many thanks which must be made. This year we must especially thank G.J. Coles & Coy Limited, for not only did they sponsor the Chinese Tour, but also provided \$3,000 sponsorship of the 1980 Pennant competition.

Other sponsors included Berri Fruit Juices, Riversdale Manufacturing Co., and many other suppliers of table tennis equipment.

Thanks must also be expressed to all members of the sub-committees who are not Executive Committee members, to members of the Umpires League and the Coaches Association.

Our sport in general must thank the many volunteer helpers throughout the State who keep the ball bouncing from season to season.
