VICTORIAN TABLE TENNIS ASSOCIATION

52nd ANNUAL REPORT - 1981

1. INTRODUCTION

The 1981 year saw Victoria continue to be prominent in competition within Australia and in Australian teams abroad.

At the Australian Championships (Senior) in Brisbane, Victoria's women retained the R.H.Jones Shield, Adele Morrow won the Australian womens singles and Victoria's mens team came second to New South Wales.

At the Australian Junior Championships in Hobart, Victoria won the girls under 17 and under 15 teams shields, and our under 17 boys finished second to New South Wales.

Karl McKernan won the Australian Junior (under 17) singles title defeating P.Jackson of New Zealand. Kerri Tepper was unbeaten in the under 15 teams event and won all three titles in her age group.

Table tennis in Victoria had a year of mixed fortune. Affiliations were a record at 78 - 61 country and 17 metropolitan - and on figures reported by States to the Australian TTA, Victoria had three-quarters of all the registered players (senior and junior) in Australia.

The Country Championships 1981 were a great success, as was the Metropolitan Schools Teams Championships, but Melbourne pennant, VTTA-run tournaments, country tournaments and junior pennant all declined. The high cost of petrol may be a factor in the falling off of tournament entries. However, those affiliated associations who have the benefit of the use of either their own stadium or areas within multi-sports centres continue to grow.

The visit of a Japanese team was beneficial to the sport, but it was disappointing that audiences outside Melbourne and Geelong were poor.

Association coach Igor Klaf made many visits to schools. His coaching of State Squads contributed largely to our teams' success.

There are now in Victoria three schools table tennis competitions with 12,000 competitors and every effort must be made to bring these young players into our junior and senior competitions.

The Department of Youth, Sport and Recreation provided an increased grant

of \$16,000, largely for sport in schools, coaching and development.

Your executive committee contains many very experienced officials but some of them are nearing the end of their long careers in table tennis. There is therefore an urgent need for younger persons to prepare themselves to pick up the burden of conducting our sport when the older officials retire.

2. MANAGEMENT

2.1 EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE

During Dr. Bayly's absence on study leave, Mr. Rockefeller was appointed Acting President.

Mrs. Walsh's resignation as Hon. Secretary as at 31st December, 1980 was filled from the Executive Committee by Mr. Cleaves.

At the 1981 AGM Messrs. A. Tabone, E. Leder, J. Beer, L. Haycraft and P. Mascall retired in accordance with the Constitution and were elected, unopposed, for new terms of office.

Mr. Cleaves was elected unopposed to the Secretary's position for a period of one year, this being the unfilled portion of Mrs. Walsh's term of office.

Newcomer to the Executive Committee, Mr. Nedeljkovic (Western Suburbs) was elected unopposed for a one year term of office.

From 1st November, 1980 to 31st October, 1981, the Executive Committee met on 16 occasions, plus 3 adjourned meetings. The attendances, not including adjourned meetings, were as follows:-

2.2 TABLE TENNIS CENTRE OF VICTORIA

This year saw an improvement in public hire in non-pennant periods, thus reversing last year's trend. Although a slight drop in the number of VTTA pennant teams continued, this was hardly reflected in the number of teams using the Centre as their home base.

On the bright side the Victorian Insurance TTA and the Victorian Railways Institute TTA used the Centre on Monday nights exclusively for the conduct

of their pennants.

The Victorian Public Service TTA continued to use Thursday nights exclusively for their Winter and Summer pennant competitions. Eastern Suburbs & Churches TTA again played all their pennant grand finals at the Centre. The Victorian Public Service TTA, the Victorian Railways Institute TTA and the Victorian Insurance TTA all held their Closed Championships at the Centre.

Mr. Leon Lau continued with his excellent management of the combined snack bar and table tennis equipment shop. The VTTA appreciates his excellent service to our patrons and he is regularly called upon by the VTTA to cater for our various tournaments, training camps and seminars.

The VTTA has obtained a new imported Stiga table tennis table for permanent use on our Centre Court, and again installed several new tables in the Centre.

The Victorian Table Tennis Coaches Association purchased a video camera recorder and a colour television for use as a monitor, and these are kept in the Centre for use by all their coaches.

The security arrangements have managed to almost completely deter break-ins at the Centre.

The front of the Centre has been repainted and a table tennis logo has been painted above the entrance.

We are in the process of arranging with the SEC to lay underground cables through the car parking lot so as to enable us to increase our power supply which is insufficient to meet all our needs.

2.2.1 STAFF

Mrs. Joan Guggenheim once again efficiently led our office staff whilst at the same time continuing to increase her duties as Development Officer. We obtained a new member in Amina Efthimiou during the year. Unfortunately Kerrie Freeman left us during the latter half of the year. Judy Dougall continues to give good service in all the various tasks required in the office in her part time position. Unfortunately our other part time employee, Diane Kilderry, resigned during the year.

Building Superintendent, Max Guggenheim, continues to look after the Centre and make repairs, improvements etc., as required.

2.2.2 RECEPTIONISTS

We have had a stable year with out receptionists Rosanne, Lorraine, Kathryn, Carol, Dorothy, Gay, Charles and Peter, who have given service to our patrons in a pleasant and efficient manner. We were sorry to lost Gina and Jennie during the year.

2.2.3 ALBERT PARK COMMITTEE OF MANAGEMENT

We regret the death of the long time Chairman of the Committee, Mr. P. J. Kennelly. The VTTA owe a great deal to Mr. Kennelly as he was responsible for making the Centre, formerly an Army truck depot, available to the Association. A new chairman has not yet been elected to succeed him. The Secretary, Mr. R. Burke, has helped us when required during the year, and we are grateful for his support.

2.3 NEW CENTRES

The highlight of the year was the opening of the new centre at Dandenong. This centre has set a new standard in comfort and convenience with the innovation of portable stands that will enable international matches to be played in the future.

Work is progressing in various stages of planning for new centres in Bendigo, Werribee, Queenscliff and Kilmore.

2.4 AFFILIATED ASSOCIATIONS

In 1981 there were 61 country (an increase of five) and 17 metropolitan (unchanged from last year) associations affiliated. The total of 78 affiliates, five more than last year, was a record.

The increase in country affiliations has been contributed to by the work of VTTA district representatives, visits by the VTTA Development Officer, Mrs. J. Guggenheim, and the steady publicity on table tennis in the "Weekly Times" newspaper.

After being out of action or unaffiliated for many years, Ballan, Numurkah, Maryborough, Southern District, Wahgunyah-Corowa and Wodonga returned to affiliation. New associations which affiliated for the first time were Smythesdale and Wedderburn. Lilydale disbanded but most players were absorbed by nearby Croydon. As usual, a few country associations failed to affiliate and this is often due to changes of secretaries.

In the metropolitan area, Sandringham went into recess, but Tramways affiliated for the first time.

The three school associations who affiliated have almost 12,000 players in organised competition.

The number of registered players in Victoria was 9828 seniors and 13,012 juniors, a total of 22,840 an increase of 1,806 since last year.

There is an urgent need to draw into the VTTA and affiliated associations competitions the thousands of young players who play table tennis as a school sport.

2.4.2 METROPOLITAN ATLAS SHIELD

Last year metropolitan associations expressed dissatisfaction with the 'visiting' form of 'Atlas Shield', the inter-association teams contest. A majority voted for a return to playing the contest over one weekend at Albert Park. However, when entries were called for such a weekend contest, few entries were received and of those who had favoured a change, few associations gave any support.

It would appear that this competition begun in 1939, may have come to an end. It is probable that with so many strong suburban associations and the tendency of keen players to play in several of these, there is sufficient variety of competition already available making Atlas Shield redundant.

2.5 PROMOTION

Mrs. Guggenheim, as Development Officer, regularly kept the Committee informed of her progress, particularly of visits to schools and affiliated associations.

A particularly successful promotion was the 1981 'Tabten' Schools Tournament which attracted a record entry of 120 teams - the maximum that can be accommodated in the time available.

The Promotion Committee strongly recommended to the appropriate subcommittees that Junior Pennant competition be re-introduced in 1982.

As foreshadowed in last year's Annual Report, a float featuring 'Ping and Pong' was entered in the 1981 Moomba procession, and was generally well received. The Acting President expressed the thanks of the VTTA to all who assisted, and in particular to Mr. John Williams. We were fortunate in receiving sponsorship from 'Acton' towards the costs of this promotion. The Committee regards the net expenditure of slightly over \$1000 as money well spent.

A media reception to launch 'Ping and Pong' and to welcome the Japanese touring team was held at the Commodore Motel and was well attended. The Committee is in favour of the continuance of this type of function to enable table tennis to receive greater media coverage.

2.6 PUBLICITY

Mr. Nick Klotz was appointed Publicity Officer and was able to obtain publication of the results of major tournaments played at the VTTA Centre.

Our thanks go to Graham Burke of the Melbourne 'Herald', Peg McMahon of 'The Age' and Dick Mason and Clark Hanson of the ABC for their continued assistance.

Our thanks also to Channel 0/28 who video-taped the Test Match between Australia and Japan, and to Stephen Knapp for his commentary of this match.

2.6.1 JAPANESE TOUR

This tour was in March 1981 and proved too early in the season for many table tennis enthusiasts, but was voted as highly successful by the Australian players. The Test series was won by the Japanese team 5 matches to 1. The Test played at the Albert Park Centre was won by the visitors 3 rubbers to 2 and attracted a large and enthusiastic audience. Matches were conducted by Geelong, Ballarat and Croydon Associations, and officials at each of these Centres expressed their appreciation of the standard of the matches.

G.J. Coles & Coy. Limited sponsored this tour on a National basis and we are indeed indebted to this company for their support. The Australia-Japan Foundation also assisted, with payment of the International air fares of the tourists and this made a major contribution to the financial success of the tour.

2.6.2 OVERSEAS TOURS

The 36th World Championships were held in Novi Sad, Yugoslavia, and Australia was represented by both mens and womens teams.

The mens team, weakened by the retirement of Stephen Knapp, failed to win a match, and were relegated to 2nd category with a ranking of No.18. The womens team finished in 29th position, and so both teams will play in the 2nd category at the next World Championships to be played at the National Gymnasium, Tokyo in March/April 1983.

VTTA Life Member, Len Haycraft, was re-elected to the ITTF Council, and to the Rules Committee.

New Zealand Championships 1981 - For the first time, Australia sent junior teams, both boys and girls, to these Championships, which were played at Napier in August.

Victorian players selected were Karl McKernan, Alois Rosario, Wendy Hughes and Shelley Munday. They all achieved good results with Karl McKernan winning both the Under 16 and Under 18 Singles; Wendy Hughes won the Under 16 Girls and was defeated in the final of the Under 18 by Shelley Munday.

2.6.3 OLYMPIC GAMES

The President of the ITTF has announced that table tennis has been accepted into the program for the 1988 Olympic Games to be held in Seoul, South Korea. Details of the format are still to be decided, but it is expected that mens and womens singles, but not team events, will be played.

2.7 COACHING

1980/81 was once again a very busy year trying to satisfy the demands of associations and clubs, as well as various community groups. The regular Saturday afternoon mass coaching continued to meet the needs of newcomers to the sport, the regular players wishing to improve their standard, and leading players who require regular instruction by top coaches. These continued programs are staffed by members of the Table Tennis Coaches Association and we thank them for their co-operation.

Country associations are beginning to appreciate the need to cater for their younger players, and that they must offer them the opportunity to match the metropolitan players. Visits were made to many associations and it is to be hoped that they will continue to avail themselves of the VTTC services.

It is anticipated that the forthcoming season will see a further step forward in the 'coaching of coaches' program which is the best method of improving the standard of any Association.

2.7.1 NATIONAL COACHING COMMITTEE

This Committee held its annual meeting in Port Stephens, NSW, and many matters pertaining to the development of a National Coaching Program were discussed. A budget was prepared for the National Coaching Forum, National Junior Training Camp and the overseas Junior Coaching Tour to Hungary. Regretably the Federal Government found they were unable to provide funds for any of the coaching items planned, and only funded the salary of the National Director of Coaching; a very disappointing situation for Table Tennis. One further item of importance was finalised during the year, and that was the adoption of the Australian Accreditation Scheme approved by the Commonwealth Government. The scheme has been circulated to all State Coaching co-ordinators and members advised of its acceptance. Reclassification of all registered coaches will have been completed and they will be advised of the new levels by the end of 1981.

2.8 TRAINING CAMPS IN VICTORIA

The annual junior camp was conducted in January with an emphasis on the new age groups of the National Titles (under 15 and under 17 years). This camp continues to give concentrated practice and training to the leading players of the future. The State junior teams had another successful camp at Geelong prior to their departure to Hobart, and the teams achieved good wins for Victoria. The National Director of Coaching, Mr. M. Johns, held another junior camp in Melbourne for junior players on the fringe of higher levels and they appreciated the work of the coaches assisting the NDC. Later in the year a further camp was held in Geelong to cater for country juniors who would normally not make a State selected camp. This was conducted by the Association coach and Mr. J. Williams.

The National Director of Coaching visited Victoria and spent a week in the South-western area visiting Camperdown, Warrnambool and Geelong.

2.8.1 NATIONAL JUNIOR TRAINING CAMP

The New South Wales Table Tennis Association planned and conducted this camp in Port Stephens following the meeting of the National Coaching Committee. Coaches from different states were under the direction of the NDC, and they trained a squad of 20 top junior boys and girls for one week. The benefit of these camps are reflected in the success of our players in New Zealand and the titles won by players who participated in the camps. The 1982 camp will be held in Adelaide in January.

2.9 COACHES ASSOCIATION

The Table Tennis Coaches Association of Victoria which has been operating since June 1979 has as its main objective the education of players in the skills of coaching in table tennis.

Within the last year three players have done the Level One course and six players the Level Two course. Registered coaches now number 115, and the Coaches Association has 31 members.

We endeavour to work in liaison with the VTTA coaching committee in the running of the Saturday afternoon junior coaching, and in weekend coaching outside the metropolitan area, and our coaches have assisted the NDC at the Victorian training camp.

This Association has had the distinction of coaching at Junior and Senior International Championships viz. The New Zealand Junior and Senior Open, the Oceania, The Asian and the World Championships.

We appreciate the fact that the VTTA looks to our Association to provide the coaching expertise at National levels, thus enabling our coaches to be observed and selected for International matches.

This year saw the first weekend Seminar for our coaches, which was held at the Table Tennis Centre. The Seminar was well attended by members and interested players who had two days of a program that included video taping, a discussion panel with Junior players, a meeting with Trish Arland an executive member of CASCA (Confederation of Australian Sports Coaches Assembly), a lecture by Jeff Bond a Sports Psychologist, a paper delivered by a member of the Association termed 'What it is to be a Coach', and a talk on the structure of coaching in Victoria by the Chairman of the Coaching Committee. Both Trish Arland and Jeff Bond were impressed with the calibre of the coaches, and the interest they showed in the game.

The Association has purchased a Video Taping Recorder, Camera, Tripod and a Monitor. This equipment was first used at the World Championships in Novi Sad to record the highlights of the Championships, which have been shown at various coaching camps. Coaches are being trained to use this equipment so that they will get maximum benefit from it.

Several coaches have done the recently conducted umpires course, which shows the interest our members are taking to improve every facet of their game.

We are proud to mention that Karol Javor has been assessed as a Master Coach in the new National Accreditation Scheme. It is not known at this stage what levels the other coaches have achieved, but judging from the interest they take in trying to improve themselves in various ways, it will not be long before many more achieve the highest National accreditation.

2.10 UMPIRES LEAGUE

Once again the Victorian Table Tennis Umpires League has been kept busy. Referees have been provided for VTTA Winter, Spring and Summer pennant on Tuesday, Wednesday evenings, and on Thursday evenings during the first two weeks and finals of each pennant competition.

Referees and umpires were provided for all VTTA-conducted championships and tournaments, as well as most of the Victorian affiliated associations open tournaments.

Other events for which referees and umpires were provided were the Test Match with New Zealand just prior to the World Championships, and matches with the touring Japanese players.

Mr. Clive Gadd from the VTTUL was re-appointed as Chairman of the ATTA Umpires Committee.

Probationary umpires who attained full State Umpire status were Mr. R. Keyhoe and Mr. Ralph Campisi, while Mr. P. Nedeljkovic qualified as a Probationary Umpire.

The VTTUL conducted a course for prospective umpires in the metropolitan area. Information on becoming a State umpire, or on umpiring matters generally may be obtained by contacting the Secretary, VTTUL at the Table Tennis Centre, Albert Park.

2.11 FINANCE

2.11.1 STATE GOVERNMENT GRANTS

The VTTA was again the recipient of a grant from the Department of Youth, Sport and Recreation. \$15,600 was received to assist in many facets of the Association's activities. These include the salary of the Development Officer, coaching at the Centre, in affiliated associations and schools, play-again activities, training of coaches and assistance for travel of Victorian State teams.

2.12 AUSTRALIAN TABLE TENNIS ASSOCIATION

2.12.1 FINANCIAL

The Treasurer reported a surplus of \$3255 for the year 1980/81, due primarily to financial assistance from the Commonwealth Government, Rothmans National Sports Foundation Grant and the Australian/Japan Foundation.

The ATTA financial position is bleak at the present time due to cutbacks in travel allowances by the two airline policy and declining grants from the Federal Government. The ATTA Council has implemented new ideas to increase revenue for the next financial year.

2.12.2 PROCEDURAL CHANGES

1. National Training Camp participants will have to pay fees to the ATTA prior to departure for the camp.

2. No Australian representative may receive more than one track-suit during one calendar year unless he/she can prove 'wear and tear'.
3. ATTA Regulations will prohibit the wearing of tracksuits or shirts of other national teams unless entitled to do so (as a former team member).
4. Umpires and Coaches Associations/Leagues may affiliate with States, but not directly to the ATTA.
5. Any Classified Member suspended for non-payment of fees shall remain suspended until ATTA Council approves the lifting of suspension.

2.12.3 NATIONAL DIRECTOR OF COACHING

Mr. Mike Johns contract as ATTA National Director of Coaching has been renewed for 1981/82. During the past year Mr. Johns has visited all States conducting seminars, training state squads and doing promotional work in schools.

2.12.4 BALL APPROVALS

The ATTA has approved the following balls for use in Australia for 1982: Barna 3 Crown White, TSP Astoll 3X white and yellow, Halex Ultra 3X white and yellow and 2X white, Nittaku 3X white and yellow and 2X white.

The Nittaku 3X white has been adopted for the Australian Open and Junior Championships in 1982.

2.12.5 OTHER

South Australia will conduct the Australian Junior Championships in Adelaide, May 16-21, 1982, at Prince Alfred College, Kent Town. The National Championships will be hosted by New South Wales and the venue is expected to be located in Sydney. The ATTA accepted a donation from the Brisbane Trophy Centre of a Shield for the Australian Veterans Singles, to be known as the Russell Bond Memorial Shield.

2.12.6 ATTA COUNCIL

After the General Personal Meeting Mr. Alan Cleaves, Honorary General Secretary of the ATTA for the past two years, tendered his resignation effective from October 31st, 1981. He will attend future meetings as a Life Member.

During the year Miss Norma Callinan replaced Mr. Dennis Galvin as New South Wales delegate. The ATTA Council now consists of the following:

There were 27 womens and 106 mens team entries, a total of 133, 19 more than last year. One team withdrew, leaving 132 to contest 16 grades.

Sponsors were the 'Herald and Weekly Times' for the 13th year, Chabek Sporting Enterprises of New South Wales, which supplied the TSP Astoll balls used, and Acton Table Tennis. Once again the ANZ Bank provided a magnificent floral display in the Centre foyer.

A welcome feature of the Championships was the increased support from North-eastern Victoria. Wodonga, Wangaratta and Benalla were new contestants this year, and Shepparton doubled its entry to eight teams. But the small number of womens teams in a 'boom' year continues to cause concern, and only five womens grades were contested.

Geelong men retained the Atlas Shield for Mens A grade teams for the 11th year in succession, but Geelong's women lost the Atlas Shield to Horsham in a very close match.

Special prizes of TSP bags awarded by Chabek Sporting Enterprises for best junior performances went to Wendy Hughes of Geelong and Iain Douglas of Wodonga.

Results of matches in order were: South Australia Country defeated Horsham 7/4, Ballarat 8/3, Geelong 6/5, lost to Victorian Juniors (4 player sides) 3/7, lost to Bendigo (mixed) 3/7, defeated Kerang 9/2.

3.6 FRENCH AWARD

Commencing with 1981 the VTТА decided to have separate French Awards for the best and fairest man and woman in senior competition.

The French Award for the Victorian woman player of the year was awarded to Miss Adele Morrow of Hakoah Table Tennis Club. Adele had an outstanding year, having won the three main women's singles events namely, the Australian, Victorian Open and the Victorian Closed championships, as well as the Leongatha Tournament. Adele was a member of the Australian team at the New Zealand Games and a member of the Australian team at the 1981 World Championships in Yugoslavia. She was a member of the Victorian womens team at the Australian championships which successfully retained the R.H. Jones Shield, and was also a member of the Hakoah Table Tennis womens team that won the Winter A grade pennant. Adele also played for Australia in Tests against the visiting Japanese team and had an excellent win over Miss K. Yamashita. She is currently ranked No. 1 in Australia and Victoria.

The French Award for the Victorian man player of the year was awarded to Glen Tepper of St Kilda Cricket Table Tennis Club.

This is the third year in a row that a St Kilda Cricket Table Tennis Club has won this award, following in the footsteps of International players Bob Tuckett (1971) and Miss Kerry Thompson (1980). Glen is the first country player to win this award and came to Melbourne from Murtoa. He represents Horsham in the Victorian Country Championships.

Glen won the Victorian Closed Men's singles championships as well as the Moomba and Leongatha Mens Open singles tournaments. He was a member of the Victorian Mens team to the Australian Championships in Brisbane, and had an excellent win over Australian Champion Paul Pinkewich (NSW) in the teams matches. Glen also represented Victoria against the visiting Japanese team. He is currently ranked No.3 in Victoria and No.7 in Australia.

4.5 JUNIOR PLAYER OF THE YEAR

Commencing in 1981 the VTTA has elected to have two separate Junior Player of the Year awards annually, one for boys and one for girls. The two recipients each receive a perpetual award as well as a replica, all donated by the Coburg Table Tennis Club.

The 1981 Coburg award for the junior girl player of the year was awarded to Miss Adele Morrow of the Hakoah Table Tennis Club. Adele has had an outstanding year having won the two main junior girls singles events, namely the Victorian Open and the Victorian Closed as well as the Leongatha Junior Singles.

This is Adele's second win, having previously won in 1980 jointly with Robert Rockefeller.

For only the second time since the inception of the Junior Award and the French Award the same player has won both. The other player to achieve this was Adele's sister Leanne in 1974.

Adele was chosen for both the Victorian Junior team to the Australian Nationals, as well as the Australian Junior team to visit New Zealand to compete in their Senior and Junior Championships. However, she had to withdraw from both because of her studies.

The Coburg Award for the junior boy player of the year went to Karl McKernan of Croydon & District Table Tennis Association. Karl also had had an outstanding year, winning several National and International junior titles including the Australian National Junior Singles and the Victorian Closed singles event. He also won the Moomba and the Croydon Masters junior singles, and was the only undefeated player in the Victorian Junior Round Robin. He teamed with Alois Rosario to win the Victorian Junior Teams Championship, being undefeated in the singles matches.

Karl was chosen in the Victorian team to play at the National Championships and in the Australian Junior team which visited New Zealand. In New Zealand he was successful in both the Under 18 and Under 16 Singles, the Under 18 Boys Doubles with Alois Rosario, the Under 16 with Gary Jordan (NSW) and the Under 16 Mixed with Wendy Hughes. Combining with Alois and Gary they also won the Under 18 Teams championship.

Karl is ranked No.2 in both Australia and Victoria.

5. AUSTRALIAN AND INTERSTATE COMPETITION

5.1 AUSTRALIAN TEAMS CHAMPIONSHIPS

The 36th National Championships were conducted by the Queensland Table Tennis Association from September 27th to October 2nd, at the Brisbane Table Tennis Centre.

This year for the first time only senior teams competed at these championships. Another first was the inclusion of Papua-New Guinea teams who entered both the mens and womens events. This made 8 teams in the men and 7 in the women. Northern Territory did not field a Womens team.

Victoria retained the womens teams championships which they had regained in 1980. This was the youngest team ever to represent Victoria, average age being under 18.5 years.

Victorian players had mixed success whilst competing in major interstate Open Championships.

In the South Australian Open Championships the three top Victorian men competed with Rodney Carlyle having a great win over Bob Tuckett in the final of the Mens Singles. Glen Pepper lost to Bob in a semifinal. Pepper and Carlyle also won the Mens Doubles.

In the New South Wales Mens Singles Glen Tepper reached the quarter-finals which he lost to the Australian Champion, Paul Pinkewich, the eventual runner-up. Jamie Bartolo also reached the quarter-finals and lost to former Victorian, now Queenslander Robbie Javor, the eventual winner of the event.

In the Womens events Shelley Munday was runner-up in the singles, and both the Womens and Mixed Doubles.

In the Queensland Mens Singles both Glen Tepper and Rodney Carlyle lost to Robbie Javor. Glen lost in a quarter-final and Rodney lost in a semi-final. Robbie Javor lost to Neil Ward (SA) in the final. Rodney Carlyle won the Mens Doubles with John Cooney (Qld) as his partner.

6. ADMINISTRATION REVIEW

At the 1981 AGM a report was presented on investigations into the formation of an affiliated association to conduct the pennant competition currently run by the VTTA.

Due to the resignation of the Chairman of the sub-committee investigating this matter and the absence of the President on extended overseas leave, there has unfortunately been virtually no progress on this matter.

And far afield, we thank our Country District Representatives, country selectors, association and club officials, coaches, referees, umpires, and of course, the players who together make our sport the great game it is.

8. ADDENDUM

The foregoing report shows that 1981 has been a year of mixed fortunes for the Association. While there has been some falling off in entries for events conducted at the Table Tennis Centre at Albert Park, reports from our Development Officer show that there is increased interest and participation in our sport within schools and community groups, and Associations who control their own Centres continue to thrive. These facts indicate that the decentralisation of table tennis away from Albert Park is a continuing feature and one that your Executive Committee must adapt to.

On the financial side continued escalation of costs incurred by essential operations of the Association is a cause of great concern to the Executive Committee. We have been able to hold our financial position at a stable level only by continued support from the Department of Youth, Sport and Recreation, sponsorship for certain events and interest from our reserves. While this situation remains it will be difficult to expand our activities without further increasing the charges for services that the VTTA gives to players and affiliated associations and the public.

In a year in which I was on leave of absence for an extended period, due primarily to business commitments overseas, I wish to thank all those Committee members who undertook extra duties to cover my absence, but in particular Mr. Herman Rockefeller who capably acted as President, and Angelo Tabone who has taken on the often onerous task of Chairman of the Centre subcommittee, and Alan Cleaves who added the duties of Secretary to the many facets of administration he has done for Table Tennis.

Present and past members of the Executive can testify that there is always work to be done, and on behalf of all concerned I thank both committee and subcommittee personnel for their efforts during the year.
