25TH ANNUAL REPORT

To be presented to the Annual General Meeting of the Association to be held at Earl's Court, St. Kilda, on the 9th March, 1955, at 8 p.m.

Ladies and Gentlemen.

The following is a report of the work undertaken by your Association for the season 1954.

This was our Silver Jubilee year, celebrating 25 years of Table Tennis in this State and it was a momentous year.

One main feature of this season was the appearances of former World champions Richard Bergmann and Johnny Leach, at Earl's Court, St. Kilda and in some Victorian country centres.

During the year it was decided to make Earl's Court, St. Kilda the Headquarters of the Victorian Association and we feel sure you will agree it is something of which we can all be very proud. On its success depends the support of all table tennis enthusiasts.

Bergmann and Leach played three nights at Earl's Court, the main night being a test match between England and Australia. For this event your Committee brought to Melbourne the selected Australian Team, Phil Anderson, National champion from Queensland, and Geoff Jennings from N.S.W. Ken Evans of Victoria was the third member of the Australian team.

Although defeated, 5 rubbers to love, it was a memorable night of Table Tennis, and we were honored by the patronage of Sir Dallas and Lady Brooks.

BERGMANN - COACHING.

For the first time in Victoria, arrangements were made by your Committee for all affiliated clubs and Associations, to participate in a coaching scheme by a world famous player.

Richard Bergmann, when his tour finished with Johnny Leach, was brought back to Melbourne to do individual coaching at Earl's Court, St. Kilda and he also attended a number of clubs at their own rooms. It was unfortunate that his visit had to be curtailed owing to Overseas commitments, but the time spent here is sure to improve the already high standard of play.

PENNANT COMPETITIONS.

The Pennant Competitions this year saw a record entry of both men's and women's teams, 264 teams competed in 63 grades. (27 men, 6 women). The standard of play improved considerably and

HEADQUARTERS CLUB.

Season 1954 turned out to be a land mark in the history of table tennis, as it saw our long awaited dreams turn into reality. Your committee after many discussions with the late Mr. John Brennan of Earl's Court, St.Kilda, eventually decided that our new Headquarters would be established at Earl's Court. There are 22 tables installed for the use of table tennis players including general public who only wish to have an occasional game. Both the top and bottom floors are completely devoted to Table Tennis and this in itself denotes the tremendous surge of popularity this grand game of ours is experiencing.

It is hoped that all our Table Tennis Fraternity will patronize Earl's Court and give us the support that is so necessary to carry on. With our Headquarters firmly established it is hoped to be able to have more functions, both competive

and on the social side. It is interesting at this stage to make mention of the fact that both Richard Bergmann and Johnny Leach, made special mention that nowhere else in the world, had they seen anything to compare with our Earl's Court and the perfect playing conditions that exist. The 22 tables are available for use every day and night of the week including Saturday and Sunday and each table has its own set of championship lighting.

WORLD CHAMPIONSHIP TABLE.

Used for the first time in Australia was the famous table that the actual final of the World's Open Championship 1954 was played upon. This table was purchased by your Association and shipped out from England to replace the unfortunate loss we incurred by the disastrous fire that destroyed all our equipment at Wirth's Olympia.

SPECIAL GRAND STAND.

To match our new Headquarters, and to accommodate table tennis fans for the Bergmann - Leach matches, a special wooden stand was purchased by your Committee. This stand is a portable type and has been approved by the Health Authorities. If any Clubs are desirous of hiring the stand at any time, further details may be obtained from the Hon. Secretary.

DEATH OF MR. JOHN BRENNAN.

It is with sincere regret that we record in this Annual Report the death of Mr. John Brennan, the Proprietor of Earl's Court.

Although most of our Officials and players had only known Mr. Brennan since our Headquarters were established at Earl's Court early last year, he won the admiration and affection of us all.

As a successful promoter of outstanding sporting events in many fields of sport, Mr. Brennan will long be remembered.

The Association extends to the family of Mr. Brennan our deepest sympathy in their severe loss.
