SECRETARY'S REPORT

Dr. Bayly, our President, was granted leave of absence from late February till late October for study leave in Stuttgart, Germany. Mr. A. Tabone was elected acting President and carried out his duties with distinction. Mr. R. Grattidge was elected as acting Vice President. Mr. W. Woolcock resigned as a Committee member due to family and business reasons and also to his duties with Caulfield TTC.

The Executive Committee voted to have an Executive meeting once per month instead of 6/7 week intervals to allow more participation in the day to day activities of the Association. The Executive Council did not meet as often due to the above decision.

The Table Tennis Centre continued its increased usage which enabled some renovations to be made to staff and Committee areas. The Centre is now the home of the Australian Table Tennis Academy and boasts a Sports Training Centre which is available to all members for a modest fee.

The State Government enquiry into the use of Albert Park and the development of existing facilities has not made any progress. We must continue to maintain the Centre for our members and patrons but obviously avoid major projects in the short term. Mr. Lau as proprietor of the canteen continues to provide excellent service to members of the public and our players.

The Victorian Table Tennis Umpires League have been provided with their own area and we trust this will eventually lead to an increase in their membership. The newly developed Committee Room will be of benefit to the Committee members who perform the majority of their duties at the Centre. The former Committee Room is now available for groups to use for meetings or small functions. During tournaments it will act as an additional dining area.

In other parts of this report you will find listed performances of our State Teams who again took out the majority of National titles. The annual clash between Victoria and New South Wales Under 12/Under 14 teams in Wagga Wagga for the Riverina Trophy saw another convincing win by our young players. Discussions are taking place with the South Australian TTA to try and promote a similar event between the two States but early in the year.

It is pleasing to advise that two new life members of the Table Tennis Centre of Victoria were inducted in 1987. Mr. J. Huysmans and Mr. Owen Davies have had long playing careers with the Association, but they have made outstanding contributions to the Centre in 1987 and the Executive Committee was pleased to recognise their worth to the sport.

A new competition has been planned and is to be known as the 1988 Bicentennial State League with the State Selectors inviting selected clubs and associations to sponsor teams. All leading and promising players were invited to compete in teams formed by the selectors (to provide a balanced competition). If the competition is accepted the results will be found elsewhere in this report. It would appear the more conservative elements in our sport found the innovative scoring and game format more than they could accept.

I recommend you read the many items in the body of the report, particularly the expanding school participation in the Commonwealth Bank Victorian Schools Championships, Tabten and Mini Tabten, all of which provide potential players in your local competitions. The promotional work done by our Sports Promotions Officer Alois Rosario, both in the country and metropolitan areas, is for your benefit. Make use of his efforts.

The Bicentennial year should see the staging of an International series for the Victoria Cup and the Australian Veterans Championships should see a record entry.

We are sad to report the untimely death of one of our State Selectors, Edward (Ted) Sokolowski. Ted had been a member of both Junior and Senior State teams, and carried on into the Veterans, where he had been a member of the Over 50 team last year. Ted was always the gentleman, and will be remembered as such by all players and officials who came in contact with him.

It would be presumptuous to say "Table Tennis is Bouncing Back" but the signs are there to see. We have at least levelled out. At VTTA level our pennant competition needs a boost, but tournaments are still showing good support.

Let us all work together so that 1988 will be a year to remember.

(Addendum. At the 1987 AGM, Mr. Peter Mascall was elected a Life Member of the VTTA in recognition of his many years of service to Victorian table tennis. R.Bayly, President).

2.2 THE TABLE TENNIS CENTRE OF VICTORIA

Many improvements were made to the Table Tennis Centre. Owen Davies and John Huysmans spent literally hundreds of hours upgrading and refurbishing the Centre, both men donating their services to the VTTA.

Improvements include -

- * The old Victoria rooms have been turned into a large committee room, secretary's office, umpires room and academy office.
- * What used to be Hakoah clubrooms is now used almost exclusively by the Australian Table Tennis Academy.
- * The store room (formerly known as 10c) is now the "Sports Conditioning Centre".
- * The Executive Director's Office has been upgraded.
- * A new office has been provided for the Table Tennis Promotion Officer.
- * The office area has been enlarged.
- * Many areas have been newly carpeted.
- * The amusement machines were withdrawn in June but re-instated in November.
- * There have been many improvements to the electrical system. This includes power points to the rear of the building, doubling of the light intensity to each table in the Academy and an infra red detection system on the back door.
- * A new telephone line has been installed to The Academy and a new extension to the Secretary's office.
- * Coca Cola have repainted the clock face area and provided signs at the front of the building.

We record in this Annual Report an acknowledgement of the outstanding efforts of Owen Davies and John Huysmans. Thanks are extended to both men for an excellent job very well done.

During the year, patronage of the Centre increased dramatically. This resulted in a pleasing increase in revenue, which enabled building improvements to be undertaken.

The Canteen, under Mr.Lau's very capable management, has progressed enormously. The business is increasing all the time, due solely to the excellent quality of Mr.Lau's service and food quality. The canteen also has benefited from renovations. The VTTA records it's appreciation of the excellent job done by Leon and his staff.

The Mens team finished in 19th position, up from 28th in the last Worlds in Sweden. The Women's team finished in 28th position, down from 23rd.

The highlight was the performance of Kerri Tepper and Nadia Bisiach, who won six out of eight doubles matches including a fine win over England. In the individual events the best performance was Tommy Danielsson and Kerri Tepper in the Mixed Doubles. They defeated a French pair in the first round, an Indian pair in the second and finally lost to a World ranked Czechoslovakian pair in the third round.

2.4.6 AUSTRALIAN VETERANS TOUR TO NEW ZEALAND

A large contingent of Australian Veteran players competed in the 1st New Zealand Masters and the North Island Championships.

They competed in 0/40, 0/50 and 0/60 Mens and 0/40 and 0/50 Womens Teams, as well as the individual events, and achieved a great measure of success.

Highlights were - our 0/40 and 0/50 Womens and 0/60 Mens teams were undefeated. In the individual events Pam Holden won the 0/40 Womens Singles and Joan Guggenheim won the 0/60 Womens Singles. The manager was Joan Guggenheim.

2.5 COACHING

Following on last year's report that coaching today has become an integral part of any sporting program, I would like to qualify the word 'coaching' as an all round training program, including skills and conditioning.

2.5.4 SCHOOLS

The schools program in 1987 was once again a great success. There were 185 visits to schools during the year, many of them being regular bookings.

The program involved schools from all over Victoria including Camperdown, Rushworth, Geelong, Piangil, Yarrawonga, Wangaratta, Warragul and Longwarry North.

Once again Wednesday proved to be the most popular day for schools, which often created problems of obtaining coaches.

Several of the old customers came back on a regular basis, and there were inclusions such as Knoxfield College with some promising players. Hopefully we are now starting to see an increase in the number of School aged children participating in our clubs and tournaments.

8. ADDENDUM

1987 saw a welcome increase in the income derived from the use of the Table Tennis Centre at Albert Park. As noted elsewhere in this report, significant changes in the accommodation for the administrative staff, Executive Committee, umpires and the National Table Tennis Academy have given a fresh impetus to work in all these areas. The Association is greatly indebted to Mr. J. Huysman and Mr. O. Davies for the amount of work which they have donated to us in the alteration mentioned above.

I must place on record my appreciation to those on the Executive who carried out extra duties during the several months in which I was absent from Australia on business. In particular it is apparent that Mr. Tabone was very effective in his role as Acting President. We are also fortunate to have had Mr. Beer serving as Treasurer and Mr. Mascall as Secretary.

I regret that the V.T.T.A. has omitted previously to record in its Annual Report of 1983 the death of one its former stalwarts, Mr. Kurt Defris. Kurt was a long time player and committee member of the Hakoah T.T.C. and was the driving force behind that Club's successes in V.T.T.A. pennant competitions. He also served for many years on the Executive Committee of the V.T.T.A. and was Vice-President for several years.

Of course the efforts by our leading players in all the National Championships, contributed markedly to making Victoria the premier Table Tennis State. However, the players and officials at both Affiliated Association and Club level continue to be the backbone of the V.T.T.A., for without them our sport could not continue.
