## JUNIOR ACTIVITIES

The former Junior Pennant Sub-committee was replaced this year by a new Junior Sub-committee having somewhat wider powers and responsibilities. Junior activities were conducted at the Centre on 21 Saturday mornings - from 11th April to 12th September. There were several departures from the 1963 programme. The season started later in order to avoid overlapping the Junior Coaching scheme. The Centre was kept open on the Saturday mornings of the schools vacations. A Junior Pennant Competition was conducted during the second term (30th May to 15th August), the remaining Saturdays being devoted to new players' morning and tournaments - mostly of the round robin type.

The Junior Sub-committee assisted in running the junior and sub-junior events of the Victorian Championships on Saturday 25th July (all day). The number of sub-junior events was increased from 2 (in previous years) to 5. There was a large increase in total entries (207), partly caused by the participation of contingents from Adelaide and Warrnambool.

On Friday 11th September, an inaugural Victorian Junior Teams Carnival was held. 35 country juniors from Ballarat, Geelong, Traralgon, Warrnambool, Marysville and Mildura (6 boys teams, 5 girls teams and 1 mixed team) competed against teams of Melbourne metropolitan players on a friendly basis. On the following day (Saturday 12th September) the first Victorian Closed Junior



Championships were held. The committee appreciates the co-operation of the country officials who helped to make these events such a success. Thanks are also due to the parents of those Melbourne players who assisted in billeting some of the country juniors.

For the Junior Pennant Competition there was an entry of 60 teams. A record number of boys teams (48 teams, 6 grades) entered. It was particularly encouraging that a large number of the new players come from the under 12 age group. However, a revival of interest in table tennis in girls schools is badly needed. Only 12 girls teams (1 grade of 8 teams and 1 grade of 4 teams) competed in the pennant competitions.

Aarons (SA) will be attending as observers. This team of officials will study all aspects of the organisation and on their return the personnel for the various sub-committees will be appointed.

An invitation is extended to all Victorian members who feel that they could serve on the organisation as sub committeemen or as umpires.

#### AFFILIATED ASSOCIATIONS

During 1964 the number of Affiliated Associations remained at the same level as 1963. It is again pleasing to report that Victoria still leads the way in the number of Affiliated Associations. These associations conducted competitions within their areas and these were of an extremely high calibre.

In many of the country areas the emphasis seems to have been on youth, and in particular thanks should go to Associations such as Warrnambool, Traralgon, Geelong and Mildura for the attention they give to these up and coming players.

It is disappointing to report that a number of Associations which were affiliated for some years do not appear on the list this year. A number of new areas affiliated and seem to be on a well organised basis.

The Victorian and New South Wales affiliated associations again exchanged representative Country teams which toured the country areas of the two states.



The Victorian Mens team - G.Puchlenko (Ballarat) E.Rea (Warrnambool) P.Humphries (Hamilton) and K.Varley (Geelong) toured New South Wales covering a greater distance than any previous team. They were successful on four occasions defeating Armidale, Maitland, Newcastle and Canberra but lost to the combined NSW team.

The New South Wales womens team touring Victoria consisted of B.Jenkins (better known as Barbara Neal) a former Victorian A grade player, K. Fahernhorst, and M.White. The only defeat suffered by the visitors was by the combined team which comprised L.Gilbert (Ballarat) J.Hewnam (Numurkah) and E. Pitcher (Ararat). Their wins were against Bendigo, Geelong, Shepparton and Traralgon.

#### UMPIRES LEAGUE

Interest in the League was maintained at a high level and all members should be congratulated on their efforts during the year. Unfortunately, there were very few new members enrolled and with this State's commitment of one hundred umpires required for the 1967 World Championships the need for new members is pressing.

For the first time financial subsidies were made available by the League to its members so assisting two of its number to go to the Australian Championships in Perth. A concentrated drive was made to build up League funds and the cost of the subsidies given was more than covered by the efforts of



the members.

Following a decision by the V.T.T.A. Annual General Meeting to appoint official referees for each pennant night, the League was asked to supply qualified Umpires to undertake this task. Further support was given by the League in non-umpiring matters when it again supplied a Returning Officer and Scrutineers for the V.T.T.A. Annual General Meeting.

The League extends its congratulations to Mr. Neil Stobie who in Perth this year was one of the two candidates to pass the National Umpires Examination.

The League also appreciates the valuable assistance given at tournaments by a number of interested people who are not members.

### COACHING

The Junior Coaching sessions started in February and finished in the middle of April, there being 10 sessions. Approximately 100 pupils attended each session with 28 experienced players acting as the coaches. A plan was prepared by the Head Coach Mr. K.Javor and the coaches were advised at regular meetings about the methods to be adopted.

Many country girls and boys, from as far away as Warrnambool and Numurkah came to these classes.

It was gratifying to know that participants were very keen and the coaching committee here expresses its thanks to all the coaches who gave their time and knowledge to help the youngsters.

### SPECIAL COACHING - SUB-JUNIORS

The Coaching committee with the approval of the V.T.T.A. established a coaching class for promising juniors. Boys and girls from 9 to 13 attended the classes run by K.Javor and those over 13 were coached by W.Bates; and it is hoped that the results will be shown in 1967, when Melbourne will stage the World Championships.

In conclusion, it is good to be able to state that a number of players have graduated from the coaching classes in the last few years to become top players of A grade or near A grade standard.

### STATE SQUADS

Many of the successes gained by Victorian players may be attributed to the many hours of practice and training at the Training Squads organised by your Association. From April to the end of August, State squad practices were held under the direction of V.T.T.A. State Coach, Mr. K.Javor.



## SPECIAL EVENTS

### MOOMBA

Twelve teams representing their former countries competed in the Skolnik Cup which was won by Ireland.

Players who competed in the Skolnik Cup contested the Lord Mayor's Invitation Singles which was won by Graeme Stirling, who defeated Len Hayes in the final.

### EXHIBITIONS

Again top players participated in numerous exhibitions and went as far a field as Ballarat. Exhibitions are an excellent medium for promoting our sport and they help to bring new clubs into the pennant competitions and junior ranks. We thank all players who gave up their time to make these exhibitions possible.

### A.T.T.A.

At the Australian Table Tennis Association's Annual Meeting at Perth in September, Mr. R.H. Jones of Victoria was re-elected as Australian President.

During 1964 the Committee were unfortunate in losing the services of Mr. B. Preston (Secretary) and Mr. W. Thomas (Committeeman) both because of the increased demands made upon them following promotions in their employment.
