27TH ANNUAL REPORT

Ladies & Gentlemen:

The following is a report of the work undertaken by your Association for the Season 1956.

PENNANT COMPETITIONS :

The pennant competitions this year saw an entry of 256 teams competing in 26 grades (21 men, 5 women).

The standard of play was very high, and all matches were played in a most sporting spirit; it was also noticeable that dressing of the players was much improved; during the season full benefit was taken of your committee's experience in regard to playing conditions.

It was found necessary on some occasions to penalize clubs for various breaches of match regulations, particularly late results, and it is requested that all clubs and players bring themselves up to date by obtaining copies of the Regulations from any sports store, or in the case of Affiliated Associations direct from the V.T.T.A.

This year we played 10 teams to each grade - this made the season longer and proved very popular; it is likely this practice will be continued. Another new venture was the New Clubs! Night at Earls Court. An invitation was extended to all the new clubs to attend, a special exhibition was given and all questions were answered. This enabled the newcomers to feel as though they were not strangers.

Our team did very well and, with the experience gained, hope to do even better next year. We congratulate and are proud that Mossrs. Jennings, Matison and Cooper are Victorians who helped make history in this sending of the first Australian team everseas. Your Association paid £300 to help the expenses of the Victorian players on this tour.

JUNIOR CARNIVAL:

Your Executive committee were again to the fore inaugurating the first Junior Carnival to be held. In order to make this possible, your Association had to guarantee each State certain expenses for their players. We are pleased to record this was held at Earls Court and was a great success. N.S.W. won this event played in Molbourne between 25th and 27th July, and a Shield was donated for this event by Mr. J.P. Oliphant. 17 Juniors represented their States. This will be an annual affair.

COUNTRY REPRESENTATIVES REPORTS

Table Tennis is making rapid progress in the country areas of Victoria and the following are extracts from the annual reports of District Representatives:

BALLARAT (MR. G. PETCH).

At the end of last season our Association, in an endeavour to secure affiliations from all Associations in the area and to foster Table Tennis within our region, held what might be called a Regional Teams Championship. All known Associations within our region were invited to Ballarat to compete. This venture proved highly successful and will undoubtedly be held on an even larger scale this year.

SHEPPARTON (MR. A. HAMILTON).

Table Tennis is gradually expanding in this area and the number of players taking part in competitive matches is increasing. Shepparton Association has 400 registered players - the highest in the Country areas of Victoria.

Bonalla, Kyabram, Echuca and Shepparton, all conducted annual tournaments. Benalla T.T.A. had a successful tournament and was one of the bost as it attracted the largest number of metropolitan players. Highlight was the defeat of W. Bates by C. Balint 3 - 1, after former had led 20 - 13 in the 4th game. Trophics were a decided improvement on past years.

Shepparton T.T.A. also had a good tournament and spectators were thrilled by the mon's singles final, which produced excellent table tennis of an all round nature and resulted in a 2 - 1 win by R. Bayly over I. Foster.

TRARALGON (MR. S. BONIGHTON).

I am pleased to report that Table Tennis in Gippsland during the past season has been one of the best for a number of years. Gippsland was represented at Country Week by Wonthaggi, Mirboo North, Narracan-Thorpdale and Traralgon in the men's events, and in the women's events by Bairnsdale, Narracan-Thorpdale, Mirboo North and Traralgon, with Traralgon No. 1 eventual runners-up.

Gippsland were very fortunate to be represented by Drewe Hunter in the Junior Interstate matches and the experience gained will be of great benefit to him. Warragul anticipate affiliating with the V.T.T.A. this year and both Morwell and Yallourn have high hopes of once again reforming.

I wish to thank all who have given so much to Table Tennis, and also thank you for the support given to Gippsland.
