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TREASURER'S REPORT

HONOUR ROLL

1. SECRETARY'S REPORT

Olympic year 1988 was an important year for table tennis despite the poor coverage given by Olympic Television Channel 10. It saw our sport competing in the world's largest and major sporting spectacle.

We in Victoria should be proud of our two Olympians, Nadia Bisiach and Kerri Tepper, and also our Olympic Umpire, Angelo Tabone.

The sport within the State appears to have stabilised in Affiliations and Registrations. Our current statewide promotion of Schools Table Tennis through the Commonwealth Bank Victorian Schools Table Tennis Championships - Tabten - Mini Tabten should filter through to associations and clubs over the next few years.

In meetings both formal and informal between your Executive Council and Clubs/Associations it becomes clear that there are two areas to be improved on before we can show the sport's full potential. The first problem is "Manpower", or, as we should say, "Personpower" at local levels, be it Clubs or Associations. This applies in the country and metropolitan areas. If we cannot find people who will organise and promote the sport they play within their own areas, we are in trouble.

Your Executive cannot go to Sponsors/Government Departments, asking for funding for major events such as International Championships, new and better playing facilities, recruitment of International standard coaches, when our members cannot find stable committees to promote the grass roots of our sport.

Our major need is for those outside the 32km radius of the G.P.O. to promote themselves, to be in V.T.T.A. conducted events, join in visiting tours, promote their junior players, let their grass root player see and meet visitors to Victoria.

1988 did see some of that action and participation, but more is needed.

The second area this Association needs to improve on is the development of our Headquarters in Albert Park. There has been a suggestion that international events may not be allowed at our Centre because the courts do not conform with the regulations. When you see in the daily press any mention of redevelopment of the Albert Park Reserve, put pen to paper and urge the authorities to speed up their plans - add your voice to your Executive's.

The Table Tennis Centre of Victoria has been utilised by our public patrons at a very high rate in 1988. The result has been most welcomed by our treasurer.

Two International series Vs Guang Dong Province early in the year and the International Classic-Victoria Cup event in October were great successes. The Bicentennial Australian Veterans Championships were most successfully conducted by the Veterans Committee.

One of the more pleasant functions held in 1988 was the presentation of badges to Life Members of the Table Tennis Centre of Victoria. It was the occasion for a reunion of past servants of the sport.

On a sad note, we lost "Mr. Table Tennis", Ron Jones, who passed away this year. A resume of Ron's career in Table Tennis will appear elsewhere in this report.

The proposed State League failed to be conducted in 1988. It would appear that the departure from the "norm" is not easily grasped by some administrators.

Your Executive Committee remained unchanged except for the departure of recently elected member Mr. Peter Nedeljkovic due to business reasons.

The Australian Table Tennis Academy is now firmly established within our Centre, and each year the A.T.T.A. reviews the personnel who are invited to be "Academy Members". Mr. Zhou Lan Sun has had an assistant coach appointed to assist him, Mr. Chen Xuan.

I recommend you take time out to read the record of activities conducted within the Association.

2. MANAGEMENT

2.1 EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE

The Executive Committee of fifteen members was complete following the 1988 Annual General Meeting.

The Committee members have many duties in conducting V.T.T.A. Table Tennis affairs. Any member considering joining the Executive Committee should consider what area of interest and expertise they can offer the Committee. They should be wary of over-committing themselves should they retain a major club or affiliated association, and avoid failing to satisfy both institutions to their own satisfaction.

A recommendation from the meeting was that a sub-committee be appointed to review the rules of the association and to clarify the classes of membership.

2.2 TABLE TENNIS CENTRE OF VICTORIA

Following the extensive work carried out in 1987, further work has been done. The General Office has had an air conditioner installed for the benefit of the day staff, and the Board Room also had an air conditioner installed for meetings, seminars, etc.

The Gymnasium has had new equipment fitted and members have the use of this facility at a very modest fee.

A new garbage storage area and workshop has been created within the Centre.

With two Australian Championships to be played in Melbourne in 1989, a policy of upgrading to Stiga tables has been started.

The major events in 1988 were the International Classic for the Victoria Cup, which saw China, Japan and Australia in action, as well as the Bi-Centennial Veterans Australian Championships, all taking place in October.

The public use of the Centre increased, and revised hours of business will be considered, to cater for this extra patronage.

2.4 INTERNATIONAL EVENTS

2.4.1 OLYMPIC GAMES

Three Australian players had the honour of competing in the Seoul Olympics.

These were our own Kerri Tepper and Nadia Bisiach, who both competed in the womens singles, womens doubles, and Gary Haberl (NSW) competed in the mens singles.

64 men and 48 women competed in the Singles events, which naturally included the cream of the world's players. They were chosen on a continental zone basis qualification and on World Rankings. There were 32 pairs in the Mens Doubles in which we were not represented, and 15 pairs in the Womens Doubles. There were no Teams or Mixed Doubles events. Our players performed creditably, and in particular, our girls defeated a strong Hong Kong pair.

2.5 COACHING

2.5.1 COACHING FOR ALL

Adult Coaching is made available to players of all levels of ability on Friday and Monday nights.

2.5.2 JUNIOR COACHING

Junior Coaching is undertaken under two sections:

1. Squads
2. General Public

The squads have trained under I. Klaf and several other Level 1, 2, and 3 coaches since the beginning of the year. During these sessions, which are held on Saturday mornings, the players are put through skills and fitness work and physical tests especially pertaining to Table Tennis. The players were also given the opportunity to listen to a nutritionist and to experience practical good eating habits.

The coaching for players of all levels is being conducted on Saturday afternoons. These sessions have an exceptionally high attendance.

Camps: Two have been held during the year, one for the 12 - 15 year old age group and the other was for Victorian Team members.

Coaches: For the first time, the Level 0 course was conducted by R. Moule, Coaching Director, A.T.T.A. It was undertaken by 8 players consisting of students, teachers and parents. Several of our coaches were on hand to help.

Brian Berry conducted a Level I course in Ballarat and Keith Mundy in Traralgon.

Ten Level I coaches received their certificates from Peter Wright of Sport and Recreation at a special presentation ceremony held at the Table Tennis Centre.

2.5.3 CAMPS

The first Junior Camp was held on 15th - 17th January. This camp, unlike ones held in previous years in January, was geared to Under 15 players who had participated in tournaments and placed well on the computer ranking.

Invitations were sent to 38 players out of whom 24 attended.

I. Klaf, R. Pappalardo, T. Barr and P. Rosario were the coaches.

The players showed enthusiasm at all training sessions in spite of the hot weather conditions, which can be distinctly oppressive at the Centre.

The table work and conditioning program gave the players a lot to think about, and hopefully added an incentive to their game.

2.5.4 SCHOOLS

The Schools Program continued to grow in 1988.

Again there were many country trips undertaken, and several schools benefited from coaching and exhibitions. These included places from Cohuna to Warracknabeal, Leongatha and Traralgon.

There seems to be an increased awareness of Table Tennis in schools. The general level of competence is higher than a few years ago. This is also reflected in the greater numbers of competitors in all the School Competitions in 1988.

During the year Peter Ward had to step down due to ill health and Lloyd Fox replaced him as President.

League members participated as referees and umpires many times during the year.

Also during the year, long-serving National Umpire and Life Member, Richard Hutson retired as Treasurer after many years on the job.

A new trophy, in memory of our late Ron Chadband was inaugurated. This is a best and fairest trophy, and is named "The Ron Chadband Memorial Trophy". The inaugural winner for 1988 was Alois Rosario.

At the 1988 Australian Bi-Centennial Open Championships in Sydney, Dr. Rob Godfrey from Kerang successfully sat for his National Umpires Badge. Congratulations, Rob.

Angelo Tabone, together with Phil Males of New South Wales, officiated as umpires at the 1988 Seoul Olympics. The only other country, other than Korea and Australia to have more than one umpire was Canada, who also had two.

Yukako Braun umpired in the 1988 Asian Championships in Japan and was in charge of the crucial Womens Teams Final between the two Koreas.

At the conclusion of the 1988 Australian Bi-Centennial Open Championships in Sydney there was an Umpires Seminar to discuss various matters. Several umpires from Victoria attended. One of the main problems is implementing and policing the new service rule which requires the ball to be projected up at least 15 centimetres.

During the year, in Victoria there were several International and National events conducted with our league members officiating.

The International Table Tennis Classic, featuring teams from China, Japan and Australia was conducted at the Table Tennis Centre of Victoria. The referee was Yukako Braun.

The Australian Closed Table Tennis Championships were conducted at the Table Tennis Centre of Victoria. The referee was Ron Keyhoe.

The Australian Veterans Table Tennis Championships were conducted at the Table Tennis Centre of Victoria. The referee was Clive Gadd.

The Australian and New Zealand Railways Institutes Intersystem Table Tennis Carnival was conducted at the Table Tennis Centre of Victoria. The referee was Yukako Braun.

Also, there was a visit from the Guang Dong Chinese Province which played several matches throughout Victoria, in which our members officiated.

As well, we had to officiate at V.T.T.A. pennant matches throughout the year as well as at V.T.T.A. and affiliated Associations conducted tournaments (Senior, Junior and Veterans).

The V.T.T.U.L. is urgently needing more umpires, so if any persons are interested, we would like to hear from you.

Also, the distinct possibility that Melbourne could get the 1996 Olympic Games makes this extremely urgent that we need new umpires.

Finally, the V.T.T.U.L. again wishes to thank the V.T.T.A. for its support and the use of our own umpires' room at the Table Tennis Centre of Victoria.

3.5 VETERANS COMPETITION

3.5.1 FORTY AND OVER TABLE TENNIS PROGRAM

Early in the year the Victorian Table Tennis Association placed a submission before the Victorian Health Promotion Foundation, for financial assistance to conduct a one year program aimed at Forty and Over Table Tennis in conjunction with the promotion of an awareness of arthritis.

This submission proved successful, and an amount of \$50,000 was allocated for an eight month period, with a possible additional amount of \$27,500 for a further four months.

Mrs. Joan Guggenheim was appointed to the position of Executive Officer of the Program. This is a salaried position for one year on a half-time basis.

As at the time of this report, the Program is progressing most satisfactorily, with new Table Tennis players being recruited, and a greater awareness of arthritis being generated amongst the community.

8. VALE - RONALD H. JONES

Vale - Ronald H. Jones - Deceased 25/2/88

He has been called the father of Australian Table Tennis - the man who almost single-handed introduced the game to this country.

On the local front he was Secretary of the Victorian Table Tennis Association from 1936 until 1951, and Vice President until retirement in 1963.

The 1960 Australian Championships was the occasion of a tablet to be placed in the foyer of the Table Tennis Centre of Victoria to mark Ron's work in the development of the building.

9. ADDENDUM

The increased usage of, and revenue from, the Table Tennis Centre at Albert Park which occurred in 1987 has been confirmed throughout 1988, and this has enabled the Association to continue all initiatives in hand.

The benefit of the Centre to table tennis in Victoria - and indeed in Australia - was clearly demonstrated when the V.T.T.A. was able to stage the largest table tennis event yet seen in Australia - the Bi-Centennial Veterans Championships. The conduct of the event was enthusiastically praised by those who attended from all parts of Australia, and the Organising Committee, led by Mr. Kevin Langridge, deserved the praise given.

By far the most significant event for table tennis in 1988 was its entry into the Seoul Olympic Games, and Victoria was honoured to have two representatives, Nadia Bisiach and Kerri Tepper in the Australian Team, as well as Angelo Tabone as an umpire. For the first time in history, the V.T.T.A. set up a special appeal to support the players, and it is pleasing to report that the appeal target was oversubscribed.

It is with deep regret that I have to record the death of Mr. Ron Jones. Ron Held senior executive positions with both the V.T.T.A. and A.T.T.A. over many years and, almost single-handed, took Australia into the I.T.T.F. His contributions to table tennis will long be remembered.

Once again Victorian players acquitted themselves well in representative teams from junior and senior to veterans level. The value of the coaching schemes conducted by the V.T.T.A. and of the specialised work of the A.T.A.A. Academy are beginning to become appreciated, and the outlook for our teams is good.

The outstanding initiative of 1988 was certainly the Association's involvement with the Arthritis Foundation of Victoria through the Victorian Health Promotion Foundation, to promote table tennis to the Over 40s in the Association and in the general community. The grant of \$82,500 has enabled this program to be a great success.

It is again my pleasure to record my appreciation, on your behalf, of the work carried out by the Executive Committee and V.T.T.A. staff during 1988. The work done by these people is why Victoria is clearly the premier table tennis State.

1989 promises to be a busy year, and we look forward to the continued support of all those who assisted Table Tennis in 1988.
