TTV Chief Executive Officer Report



2023 has been a big year for table tennis in Victoria which would not have been possible without our wonderful affiliates and members.

Reflecting on our key strategic objectives it has been an excellent year of table tennis growth and development across Victoria.

Participation

- Participation numbers for 2023 were 62,730.
- Membership increased by 13% from 2022 with 4,548 members at the end of 2023.
- We welcomed nine new affiliates to the TTV family which included 6 new Victorian table tennis venues.
- We completed a Victorian Membership Model Review which will be the basis for a national review in 2024 with the view of implementing a new membership model in 2025.

Profile

- Increased the number of TTV commercial partnerships from two to five partners resulting in funding to invest in Victorian Open prize money, the 2022 Awards function and the 2023 Corporate Cup.
- Launched our Take it to the Table Marketing Campaign activated through branding, messaging, a video, merchandise and a pop-up event at Grazeland.
- TTV digital channels grew by an average of 19% across Facebook, Twitter, Instagram, LinkedIn & eNewsletter.
- Explored new ways to build our profile including collaborating with Nova radio station, Fox Footy and Grazeland.

Pathways

- Established a new State Pathways Program led by Olympian and State Pathways Coach David Powell with sessions conducted at MSAC and piloted with regional clubs in late 2023.
- Delivered another robust year of State Tournament Circuit events with a total of 29 tournaments.
- Maintained strong representation of Victorian athletes in National Squads and had outstanding results at the Junior, Senior, Youth & Para National Championships and the National Veterans Championships.
- Had 64 individuals complete TOPS, Level 1 and State Umpire courses with 36 gaining accreditations so far.

Potential

- Diversified our revenue streams with both commercial partnerships and successfully received three different government grants (coach/official support, pop-up event & regional participation).
- Ensured there were multiple opportunities to connect with affiliates throughout the year through in-person forums, online sessions and surveys.
- Strengthened our collaboration with Table Tennis Australia through signing an MOU committing to explore how we can work together for the greater good of table tennis in Australia.

These results in 2023 could not have been achieved without our fantastic TTV staff team of Events and Club Officer Oscar Yam, Participation and Marketing Officers James Maxwell and Noah Newnham and State Pathways Coach David Powell. We also thank all of our TTV partners, plus those who sit on TTV committees and those who take on voluntary leadership and officiating roles, for their support during 2023.

Lastly, I would like to thank the TTV Board for their guidance and trust in me as CEO of this great organisation. Although I will spend the majority of 2024 on parental leave, I know the organisation will be in great hands with interim CEO Andrew Weiss and I look forward to following another great year of growth and progress.

It has been a great pleasure to serve the Victorian Table Tennis Community as the Events and Clubs Officer at TTV throughout 2023. This role holds special significance for me as it marks my inaugural full-time position in the realm of sports.

I would like to extend my gratitude to my team and the TTV community for entrusting me with your support. I would also like to acknowledge my predecessor, Claire, for establishing a strong foundation and providing me invaluable guidance during my internship last year, which facilitated a seamless transition for me.

State Tournament Circuit

With a focus on enhancing event delivery, I have been working continuously with affiliates, officials, councils, and venues to refine the tournament experience. I specifically want to highlight the remarkable team effort in preparing for the Victorian Open and Country Championships at the Gippsland Regional Indoor Sports Centre in Traralgon, a first time endeavour that proved to be immensely successful with players joining from both intra- and interstate. It was also special to bring together our country affiliates in a booked-out hotel for dinner during the Country Championships.

I am delighted to have received gratifying feedback from the community regarding this year's tournaments, and these accomplishments would not be possible without the unwavering support of our State Tournament Committee, Umpires League, event partners and affiliates. Special thanks also goes to our event interns who contributed to the smooth operation of our 2023 tournaments. I look forward to working with you all again in 2024 as we continue to strive for excellence.

Affiliate and Membership

TTV has welcomed nine new affiliates over the past year, a significant increase that brings our total to 65. Meanwhile, membership number has surpassed 4500 this year, exceeding the set target for the year and reaching the highest level since 2019. It is great to see that the number has returned to pre-COVID level with more Victorians rediscovering and enjoying the sport.

Coaches and Officials Development

Victoria has the pleasure to host multiple coaching and umpire courses in 2023. With the support of a Sporting Club Grant in May, TTV attracted over 60 course participants, with impressive accreditation rates for TOPS Coaching Course and State Umpire Course.

We aim to further expand the number in the coming year, by working closely with the national body to establish clear pathways at all levels. My sincere thanks to all course presenters who have committed to growing the number of coaches and officials in Victoria.

TTV Events & Clubs Officer Report

State Team and Pathways

As Gen mentioned, we had another highly successful year in the National Championships this year. A huge thanks to our dedicated State Pathways Coach David for leading the State Pathways Program and State Team Training Sessions, and State Team Managers Frank Pearce, Mick Tomlinson, Adam Pegg and John Wright for coordinating with the teams at the Nationals and contributing to the achievements of #TeamVIC.

Looking ahead, I am excited to introduce the development of the State Team Handbook for 2024 and beyond which aims to provide comprehensive guidance on requirements, processes, and policies for State Team representatives.

In summary, it has been a pleasurable and enlightening year at TTV overall. I am delighted to conclude this rewarding period by joining the Premier League and starting to play the sport again after a decade. Once again, I would like to extend my heartfelt thanks to my team for all their support over the past year, and am optimistic about the continued growth of the sport in Victoria. I look forward to improving constantly and continuing to contribute to the Victorian table tennis community.

TTV Participation & Marketing Officer Report



2023 was a very exciting year for table tennis for both participation aspects and for TTV's digital presence. With multiple events and media campaigns, there was a lot of positive growth seen for the table tennis community.

Participation

In 2023 it was very exciting to see our participation numbers at 62,730 for the year. I am really proud of how we have been able to engage people to play table tennis this year for all individuals who picked up a bat.

Pop-Up Events

TTV attended and ran multiple pop-up events throughout 2023 to bring our sport to as many Victorians as possible. In October TTV ran an activation at Grazeland which saw over 10,000 people embrace TTV's 'Take it to the Table' concept throughout the weekend. It was a great experience for everyone who took part with eight Pongo tables set up throughout the trendy venue. TTV also ran activations at events such as the National Sports Convention, the Disability Sport & Recreation festival, the Toyota family fun run, NOVA 100 and many more.

TTV Corporate Cup

It was also amazing to see 16 teams attend this year's Corporate Cup for an afternoon of friendly but fierce competition. Congratulations to CSIRO for winning the 2023 Corporate Cup!

School Sport Victoria Primary School Cup

In October, TTV was able to host the Primary School Cup final at MSAC with multiple schools and over 100 students participating it was a great event for all the students in attendance.

Social Media

Our digital channels in 2023 saw 19% growth across Facebook, Instagram, Twitter, LinkedIn & our eNewsletter. Our top post for 2023 was Melissa Tapper's interview with Channel 10 which reached 190,000 people and is TTV's top performing post of all time. Our Facebook following increased from 2,800 in January to 3,400 in December with the Instagram followers increasing from 1,049 to 1,275. The TTV monthly newsletter has also grown drastically in recipients from 4,600 in January to 6,375 in December which is a great result for the community.

2023 was a great year for TTV and I look forward to hopefully contributing to another successful year of growth and improvement for the table tennis community.

TTV State Pathways Coach Report



2023 was filled with some great performances and development from Team Victoria and it was really exciting to be involved as the State Pathways Coach.

State Pathways Program

The State Pathways Program was implemented in 2023 to deliver high quality coaching and training opportunities for athletes in Melbourne to continue to develop aspects of their game in a high-performance environment. The program has made significant strides in fostering the development of Victorian athletes by providing access to high-level coaching and training opportunities throughout 2023.

Recognising the importance of inclusivity, Table Tennis Victoria prioritised ensuring that junior athletes across the state, not just those in Metropolitan Melbourne, had access to coaching opportunities. This commitment materialised through three coaching sessions conducted over three months in country clubs, namely Geelong Table Tennis Association, Mornington Frankston Table Tennis Association, and the Bendigo Table Tennis Association. Participants were charged an \$18 fee for these three-hour sessions.

The response to these sessions has been exceptional, reflecting a strong demand for such opportunities. Importantly, these initiatives enable local coaches to actively participate, gaining valuable insights into the dynamics of running professional group sessions. The overarching goal is to empower these local coaches to independently conduct similar sessions on a more regular basis.

Looking ahead, the State Pathways Program remains dedicated to collaborating with clubs and ensuring the provision of excellent coaching for individuals seeking to elevate their game.

Competitions

The 2023 Australian National Championships were held in July 2023 in Sydney. In 2022, Victoria won 4/12 Teams Gold Medals in Junior/Senior and 1/3 Teams Gold Medals in Para categories. In 2023, Victoria won 8/14 Junior/Senior Teams Gold Medals and 3/4 Para Teams Gold Medals. We have made a significant improvement in results this year in comparison to 2022. Victoria also won 14/20 Best Player Awards which was incredible to see.

I am extremely proud of what we have achieved in 2023 and I am extremely excited to continue this role going into 2024.

2. GENERAL BUSINESS

2.1 MOTION TO ACCEPT MINUTES OF THE 2021 ANNUAL GENERAL MEETING

RESOLUTION: *That the Minutes of the TTV Annual General Meeting held on 9 April 2022 provide a true and accurate reflection of the meeting.*

Peter Myszka (Mornington Peninsula & Frankston City Table Tennis Association) moved that the minutes of the 2021 Annual General Meeting be accepted as submitted. Gary Warnest (Bendigo & District Table Tennis Association) seconded the motion. There being no objections to the resolution, it was unanimously passed.

2.2 TTV ADDRESS

The Deputy Chair noted the following:

- Thank you to all TTV clubs and associations for weathering the COVID-19 storm and providing players with opportunities to play, improve and reconnect with table tennis in 2022.
- Appreciation of the TTV Board of Management over last twelve months for their input and continuing effort throughout the year of 2022 and ongoing into the future.
- Congratulations to Gen Dohrmann on her first year of being TTV's CEO and her commitment to table tennis and personal growth in the role.
- Thanks and appreciation to TTV outgoing staff members Sean Sturrock, Jason Bast, Yugandh Zende and particularly Claire Montgomery.
- Welcome to new staff members Oscar Yam, James Maxwell and David Powell who have all hit the ground running in 2023.
- Acknowledgement of the impressive results of Victorians in the Australian Championships and international events, especially the highlights of medals at the Commonwealth Games, World Para Championships and World Youth Championships.

- Fantastic to have a full year of the TTV's State Tournament Circuit and see Victorian players success at the National Championships.

2.3 PRESENTATION OF 2022 TTV ANNUAL REPORT, INCLUDING 2022 TTV AUDITED FINANCIAL STATEMENTS & AUDITOR'S REPORT

The Deputy Chair noted that copies of all documents had been distributed in advance and provided an overview of the various reports.

Financial performance summary:

- There was a deficit of \$71,578 for the FY which was in line with the approved operating budget.
- In 2022, the key focus was delivering the sport of table tennis after two COVID affected years and providing competitions and events as they had been provided in the past at comparable prices – CPI increases and inflation on costs were largely absorbed by TTV.
- Spending in the delivery areas of participation programs and club governance workshops took place to ensure we could acquit significant portions of the Victorian Government's 'Together More Active' program funding which was largely untouched in 2020 & 2021.
- Membership numbers increased from 3,464 in 2021 to 3,920 in 2022. However, numbers were down from budgeted targets based on 2019 figures as a result of losing players due to COVID, resulting in reduced membership revenue. Event entry numbers and budgets were similarly affected.
- As noted in a financial bulletin sent to all members in February 2023, to bring the organisation back to an operating surplus in 2023 several measures have been implemented to assist with reducing costs. Many of these changes are only in place for 2023 and will be reviewed when budgeting for 2024.

RESOLUTION: *That the 2022 TTV Annual Report, including the 2022 TTV Audited Financial Statements and the 2022 Auditor's Report be accepted.*

Chris Mainland (South Eastern Table Tennis Association) moved that the resolution be accepted and was seconded by Daisy O'Bryan (Melbourne Veterans Table Tennis Association). There being no objections to the resolution, it was unanimously passed.

2.4 Special Resolutions

Special Resolution 1 – a motion to update the TTV Constitution to reflect that affiliates of Table Tennis Victoria may be either Incorporated Associations or other legal entities as agreed by the Board.

The Deputy Chair noted this is a proposed constitutional change to grow the sport of table tennis to be more inclusive by enabling more business types to affiliate with TTV.

Gary Warnest (Bendigo & District Table Tennis Association) sought clarification that the new entities will be bound by the same operating principles and checks as incorporated entities. Deborah Bruce (TTV Board) responded that initial work has commenced on the extra checks TTV will be putting in place to ensure all entities who affiliate with TTV are fit to operate. It was agreed the motion would be accepted provided that the affiliation by-law is updated with checks for all affiliates to abide by and provided to affiliates for feedback before being approved by the Board.

Gary also noted that if new affiliates operate for profit that they don't disadvantage TTV from grant access.

Motion that:

"The Table Tennis Victoria constitution be updated to reflect that affiliates may be either Incorporated Associations or other legal entities as agreed by the Board."

All pre-cast votes supported the motion and there were no objections from the room.

Special Resolution 1 was therefore **approved** unanimously.

Special Resolution 2 – a motion to update the TTV Constitution so that that the positions of Chair and Deputy Chair are elected by the Board instead of by the affiliates in line with the Sport Australia Sports Governance Principles.

The Deputy Chair noted that Principle 4 of the Sport Australia Sports Governance covers the benefits of having a diverse Board to enable considered decision making. A recommendation as part of this principle is that the board should elect its chair from among

the directors. This will ensure smooth succession planning and allow the Board to adequately plan for the future. This recommendation will also mean TTV is in line with Table Tennis Australia who has the President and Deputy President elected by the Board as per clause 15.7 of the TTA Constitution.

With permission to speak granted, Rachel Peat (Melbourne Veterans Table Tennis Association) questioned if there were issues with the current process of affiliates electing positions. The Deputy Chair responded that it was to ensure smooth succession planning in the instance of Board changes. Neville Young (Eastern Suburbs & Churches Table Tennis Association) noted the process of the Board electing their own leaders is in line with local Council. Gary Warnest (Bendigo & District Table Tennis Association) noted that while not against the motion, there has been some Board turbulence in the past couple of year and there is some affiliate concern around Board positions and connection to the community.

Motion that:

“Table Tennis Victoria constitution be updated so that the positions of Chair and Deputy Chair are elected by the Board instead of by the affiliates in line with the Sport Australia Sports Governance Principles.”

All pre-cast votes supported the motion and there were no objections from the room. Special Resolution 2 was therefore **approved** unanimously.

2.5 ELECTION OF BOARD MEMBERS

The Deputy Chair noted two spots were due for election, relating to the Deputy Chair position plus one Elected Director position. TTV CEO took over proceedings for the election.

- Re: **Deputy Chair** position, only one nomination was received, that being from Ms. Meredith Kelly.
- Regarding the **Elected Director** position, only one nomination was received, that being from Ms. Melissa Lok.

By virtue of pre-cast voting, all nominees had secured the necessary votes and there were no objections from the room.

For the sake of completeness Ms. Meredith Kelly's nomination was endorsed by Daisy O'Bryan (Melbourne Veterans Table Tennis Association) and Ms. Melissa Lok's nomination was endorsed by Neville Young (Eastern Suburbs & Churches Table Tennis Association).

Therefore:

Ms. Meredith Kelly was therefore duly elected for a further 3 -year term as Deputy Chair until the AGM in 2026.

Ms. Melissa Lok was therefore duly elected for a 3 -year term as an Elected Director until the AGM in 2026.

2.6 APPOINTMENT OF AUDITOR

The Deputy Chair noted that Mr. Geoff Morris and Mr. Graham Morris of Billings & Ellis Pty Ltd had provided a professional service in the preparation of the required audited accounts in the past, and therefore recommended the following:

RESOLUTION: *That Billings & Ellis Pty Ltd be approved as the TTV auditor for the calendar year ending 31 December 2023.*

This resolution was moved by Phillip Savage (Werribee Table Tennis Association) and seconded by Gary Warnest (Bendigo & District Table Tennis Association).

A show of hands in support of the motion was sought, with all Members in favour.

The resolution was therefore **approved** unanimously.

4. Q & A

The Chair invited questions to be asked on any subject to TTV, whether in front of the

audience or personally during light refreshments.

- **Chris Mainland** (South Eastern Table Tennis Association) asked on behalf of **Kameron Chan** (Albert Park Table Tennis)

Question – “The current TTV board possesses experiences that other boards would love to have. However, some continue to remain at arms length with the wider Table Tennis community. Given the current TTV office runs as a lean team, will the incoming board consider greater community engagement beyond formal meetings like these (such as visiting tournaments) and lend their expertise to the office outside of the their regular meetings on matters, such as financial, marketing and sponsorships?”

A – The Deputy Chair acknowledged that the TTV Board would like to make a greater effort to get out and about in the community more and that she will try to keep the Board accountable. The CEO acknowledged we would like more community voices on the Board so encouraged applications for future Board positions. Peter Myszka (Mornington Peninsula and Frankston City Table Tennis Association) noted that governance and policy support from TTV has increased recently as a result of the current Board and staff. Andrew Weiss (TTV Board) reaffirmed a commitment to the Board trying to attend more community events and also spoke of how the TTV Board use their skills to support TTV through Gen as the CEO so that she can support affiliates.

Question – Quite a few affiliates are located quite far from Melbourne and MSAC, how can State Pathways programs and coaching courses be delivered in regional areas?

A – Claire Montgomery (Albert Park Table Tennis) noted that there has been an effort to make more online training available. Phillip Savige (Werribee Table Tennis Association) referenced the EPIC.TT workshops that were delivered in clubs by Claire as well as the online club development sessions that Table Tennis Victoria has offered. In regards to decentralising coaching courses the CEO spoke about the plan to trial how they can be offered in regional areas in conjunction with state tournaments and other major events.

Question – In reference to the TTV financials and the bulletin that was provided to members in February 2023, could we see continuous monitoring of the financial position instead of waiting until the end of the year for the next update?

A – The Deputy Chair referenced that the TTV Board monitor the financials closely at each Board Meeting and striving towards financially better outcomes. She highlighted that TTV is looking at revenue diversification options as well as better alignment options with Table Tennis Australia so that we can continue to grow the sport. The CEO added that discussions are already taking place around some partnership opportunities which will be communicated to the community if locked in.

NOTES TO THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS FOR THE YEAR ENDED 31 DECEMBER 2023

NOTE 1: SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

The financial statements are special purpose financial statements prepared in order to satisfy the financial reporting requirements of the Associations Incorporation Reform Act 2012 (Vic). The Board has determined that the association is not a reporting entity.

The financial statements have been prepared on an accruals basis and are based on historic costs and do not take into account changing money values or, except where stated specifically, current valuations of non-current assets.

The following significant accounting policies, which are consistent with the previous period unless stated otherwise, have been adopted in the preparation of these financial statements.

a. Income Tax

The association is a not for profit entity and is exempt from income tax.

b. Property, Plant and Equipment (PPE)

Leasehold improvements and office equipment are carried at cost less, where applicable, any accumulated depreciation.

The depreciable amount of all PPE is depreciated over the useful lives of the assets to the association commencing from the time the asset is held ready for use.

Leasehold improvements are amortised over the shorter of either the unexpired period of the lease or the estimated useful lives of the improvements.

c. Impairment of Assets

At the end of each reporting period, the Board reviews the carrying amounts of its tangible and intangible assets to determine whether there is any indication that those assets have been impaired. If such an indication exists, an impairment test is carried out on the asset by comparing the recoverable amount of the asset, being the higher of the asset's fair value less costs of disposal and value in use, to the asset's carrying amount. Any excess of the asset's carrying amount over its recoverable amount is recognised in the income and expenditure statement.

d. Employee Provisions

Provision is made for the association's liability for employee benefits arising from services rendered by employees to the end of the reporting period. Employee provisions have been measured at the amounts expected to be paid when the liability is settled.

e. Provisions

Provisions are recognised when the association has a legal or constructive obligation, as a result of past events, for which it is probable that an outflow of economic benefits will result and that outflow can be reliably measured. Provisions are measured at the best estimate of the amounts required to settle the obligation at the end of the reporting period.

f. Cash on Hand

Cash on hand includes cash on hand, deposits held at call with banks, and other short-term highly liquid investments with original maturities of three months or less.

g. Accounts Receivable and Other Debtors

Accounts receivable and other debtors include amounts due from members as well as amounts receivable from donors. Receivables expected to be collected within 12 months of the end of the reporting period are classified as current assets. All other receivables are classified as non-current assets.

h. Revenue and Other Income

Revenue is measured at the fair value of the consideration received or receivable after taking into account any trade discounts and volume rebates allowed. For this purpose, deferred consideration is not discounted to present values when recognising revenue.

NOTE 1: SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

Interest revenue is recognised using the effective interest method, which for floating rate financial assets is the rate inherent in the instrument. Dividend revenue is recognised when the right to receive a dividend has been established.

Grant and donation income is recognised when the entity obtains control over the funds, which is generally at the time of receipt.

If conditions are attached to the grant that must be satisfied before the association is eligible to receive the contribution, recognition of the grant as revenue will be deferred until those conditions are satisfied.

All revenue is stated net of the amount of goods and services tax.

i. Leases

Leases of PPE, where substantially all the risks and benefits incidental to the ownership of the asset (but not the legal ownership) are transferred to the association, are classified as finance leases.

Finance leases are capitalised by recording an asset and a liability at the lower of the amounts equal to the fair value of the leased property or the present value of the minimum lease payments, including any guaranteed residual values. Lease payments are allocated between the reduction of the lease liability and the lease interest expense for that period.

Leased assets are depreciated on a straight-line basis over the shorter of their estimated useful lives or the lease term. Lease payments for operating leases, where substantially all the risks and benefits remain with the lessor, are charged as expenses in the periods in which they are incurred.

j. Goods and Services Tax (GST)

Revenues, expenses and assets are recognised net of the amount of GST, except where the amount of GST incurred is not recoverable from the Australian Taxation Office (ATO). Receivables and payables are stated inclusive of the amount of GST receivable or payable. The net amount of GST recoverable from, or payable to, the ATO is included with other receivables or payables in the assets and liabilities statement.

k. Financial Assets

Investments in financial assets are initially recognised at cost, which includes transaction costs, and are subsequently measured at fair value, which is equivalent to their market bid price at the end of the reporting period. Movements in fair value are recognised through an equity reserve.

l. Accounts Payable and Other Payables

Accounts payable and other payables represent the liability outstanding at the end of the reporting period for goods and services received by the association during the reporting period that remain unpaid. The balance is recognised as a current liability with the amounts normally paid within 30 days of recognition of the liability.
